MOSSFLOWER RETURNS Returning to the races after a nearly 13-month absence, **Mossflower** (Affirmed) has been entered to run in tomorrow's sixth race at Belmont Park, a seven-furlong allowance race which has attracted a field of six. Mossflower's last start came in the June 20, 1998 GI Hempstead H. in which she improved her career record to 6-for-6. She has been sidelined since with ankle problems. "I think she'll be as good as ever," said trainer Rick Schosberg. "I couldn't be happier with the way she's been striding out and hitting the ground in the morning. There's not a hint of heat or filling, so right now I don't foresee any problems." Schosberg said he would use the race as a prep for the Aug. 7 GI Go For Wand S. at Saratoga before mapping out a schedule geared to take his mare to the Nov. 6 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff.

OAK TREE RELEASES STAKES SCHEDULE
A slightly revamped schedule encompassing 29 stakes and \$5 million in purses highlights the Oak Tree at Santa Anita meeting which runs from Sept. 29 through Nov. 8. The biggest change involves the GI Yellow Ribbon S. for fillies and mares on the turf, which has been moved to Oct. 2 from the from the final weekend in order to accommodate horses that intend to use the race as a prep for the new Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf race Nov. 6. The opening day feature will be the newly-renamed Gill Senator Ken Maddy H. down the hillside turf course. Formerly known as the Autumn Days H., the race honors the contributions to Thoroughbred racing made by the California state congressman. The meeting also includes the \$1.275 million California Cup Day Saturday, Oct. 31, featuring 10 stakes restricted to California bred and highlighted by the \$250,000 California Cup Classic. Other featured races during the meet are the GI Oak Tree Turf Championship Oct. 3, the GI Oak Leaf and Norfolk Oct. 9 and 10 for two-year-old fillies and colts respectively, the Gill Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. Oct. 16 and the Gill Oak Tree Derby Oct. 23.

Continuing a good day for the French-trained horses, Ronda quickened in excellent fashion to add this to her victory in the G3 Prix de Sandringham at Longchamp June 6. Cape Verdi, making her first start since suffering defeat in last year's Derby, led at an even pace from the outset. Approaching the final quarter, the 1000 Guineas winner still led against the stand side rail, but tackling her on her outside in a line of four were Ma-Arif (Ire) (Alzao), Hula Angel (Woodman) and Balisada, as Ronda was relegated to fifth but still going well. On the run to the final furlong, Cape Verdi was digging deep as Balisada wrested the lead from her, but Ronda found a perfect split between Cape Verdi and Ma-Arif, accelerated superbly into the lead with 100 yards to go and stayed on for a comfortable win. Cape Verdi lost nothing in defeat in finishing a close third at the wire. Winning trainer Carlos Laffon-Parias, scoring his first winner in Britain said, "I had plenty of respect for the opposition and thought we just had a bit of a chance against those fillies. I knew my filly was fresh and felt the six-pound penalty the others had to carry gave us a decent chance in the race. She traveled to Germany before, so I knew the trip wouldn't be a problem."

Impressive when winning the Listed Prix la Fleche at Chantilly June 15 on his latest start, City On A Hill retained his unbeaten record here, routing a good quality field in a wire-to-wire performance to add a first Group race to his increasingly formidable portfolio. City On A Hill broke well and, despite swerving left at the start, led at a strong pace. He still held the call entering the final quarter as both Mull Of Kintyre and Sir Nicholas were ridden to challenge on the outside, but the French-based juvenile wasn't stopping in front as Sir Nicholas gave vain chase. City On A Hill switched his lead leg and quickened up the rising ground in the final furlong for an impressive win only 0.09 seconds off the track record. Mull Of Kintyre rallied gamely to regain second place from Sir Nicholas in the last 50 yards with the first three clear of the remainder. Winning trainer David Loder was scoring abroad for the first time since moving to France. "This horse is nice, but we've certainly got better ones at home," he said. "There are so few races in France for juveniles at this time of year and it is hard to gauge where you are but we've a good line now with the English colts. As we expected, it has been difficult. The horses, myself and the staff have found it hard to settle in (to their Evry racecourse base). It has been a learning process in working out how to best use all the facilities. It is a different way of training."

EMIRATES WORLD SERIES AMENDED In an effort to conduct all of the races within the calendar year, the Emirates World Series Racing Championship has been adjusted. Under the revised schedule, this year's running of the Dubai World Cup is now considered the first race of the series, which will conclude with the Hong Kong Cup at Sha Tin in December. As a result of his victory in the Dubai World Cup, Almutawakel is the current points leader with 12. The next race in the series is the July 24 G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot, which is expected to draw the Bill Mott-trained GI Manhattan S. winner Yagli (Jade Hunter).

WHY TVG IS A GOOD IDEA

Set to launch July 14 in three states and then to roll out gradually across the country, TVG is a new television network aimed at an audience of 30 million or more, devoted 24 hours a day to horse racing.

The concept is similar to the popular Golf Channel, except for a key difference that makes TVG more attractive: fans will be able to wager legally on what they see on screen.

By combining account wagering with interactive technology, network-quality programming and widespread distribution, TVG will give fans convenient access to features, news and a full menu of wagering opportunities from tracks throughout the country. If successful, it could potentially produce unmatched benefits for racing, including legions of new players for our game, increased handle and higher purses. In short, new revenue to benefit all segments of our industry.

How can TVG do all this?

First, by programming for the largest possible audience with an eye to attracting and educating new participants, TVG is fundamentally different than current account wagering systems. In addition, TVG will offer account holders three wagering options: telephone, personal computer and, by early next year, an interactive set-top remote device in markets with digital cable service.

TVG has long-term, exclusive agreements with 20-plus leading racetracks, ensuring that fans will get to watch and wager on the best that racing has to offer. While its format will be friendly and non-threatening to novices, TVG plans to let experienced handicappers access all the types of information they feel is important (pools, exotic will-pays, etc.) via a PC-based product that will be available in late fall and, soon, via the set-top device.

According to national market research conducted by the NTRA, racing's current universe of core fans is six million people, but there are another 60 million who

share the same demographic profile and tastes. There is no reason to think that TVG cannot reach these potential fans and turn them into racing fans in the same way TV exposure has helped other sports grow.

Second, by paying "source-market" fees, TVG has a unique plan that makes it easy for participating tracks to share new revenue. Based on a 20% takeout (the percentage of the wager that is not paid back to the winners), TVG will pay 10.5 cents on every dollar to the tracks and horsemen in the market where the account holder resides.

While some critics have claimed that "big tracks" will get the lion's share of the benefits, TVG has both exclusive and non-exclusive contract options that allow NTRA member tracks and horsemen to participate in these generous source market fees. In fact, some "smaller" racing markets with strong cable penetration but limited exported simulcast distribution may be especially advantaged.

Third, with the strength of its corporate family, significant outside investment and incredible distribution potential, TVG presents an opportunity that the racing industry as a whole would be foolish to pass up.

TVG's corporate family (*TV Guide*, cable TV giant TCI, AT&T and FOX) is investing \$200-\$300 million over the next few years as the network deploys in more and more states. Unlike systems that require users to purchase a dish, TVG will be distributed both via cable and satellite. Through its connections to TCI, TVG has distribution potential and access to existing technology that would take other account systems years of time and tens of millions of dollars to develop. Plus, FOX lends its state-of-the-art production values and programming savvy to round out the venture.

With budgeted revenue of \$10 million over four years, "interactive television" was a major component of the NTRA's original Business Plan, which focused on marketing and television programs to increase racing's national profile and generate economic benefit for the industry. The Plan called for "developing marketing partnerships and/or sponsorship programs for one or more of the leading companies in their category."

The NTRA is supporting TVG through a variety of marketing and communications initiatives in an effort to help the industry understand TVG and give it the best possible chance at success. Officially, TVG is a "Special Member and Marketing Partner" of the NTRA. Unofficially, it's a great way for longtime and novice racing fans alike to enjoy and participate in our sport. Assuredly, it's a great opportunity for our sport to prosper and grow into the next century.

It was a good weekend for inbreeding to the Thong family as El Condor Pasa (c, 4, Kingmambo--Saddler's Gal by Sadler's Wells) won the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. His pedigree has been covered in detail previously, but to recap briefly, he not only has the three-quarters brothers Nureyev and Sadler's Wells 3x2, but also has Special and her full-sister Lisadell 4x4x3. In addition, Endless Hall (GB) (c, 3, Saddler's Hall {Ire}--Endless Joy {Ire}, by Law Society) became a first-time stakes winner with a victory in the G1 Gran Premio d'Italia. Endless Hall is by a son of Sadler's Wells (by Northern Dancer and granddam Special) and his second dam is La Joyeuse (by Northern Dancer and granddam Lisadell).

Given the success of the Nijinsky II/Blushing Groom combination, it is a major surprise that not one of the first 38 stakes winners sired by Royal Academy was out of a Blushing Groom mare. Proof that the cross can work for him came at the weekend when Royal Shyness (GB) (f, 4, Royal Academy--Miss Demure, by Shy Groom) sped to victory in the Great Lady M. H. at Hollywood Park.
