NEW BREEDERS' CUP LINE UP Officials of Breeders' Cup Ltd. have announced a new race order for the eight Breeders' Cup championship races run Nov. 6 at Gulfstream Park. The championship day will begin with the \$2 million Breeders' Cup Distaff, followed by the \$1 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, \$1 million Breeders' Cup Mile, \$1 million Breeders' Cup Sprint, \$1 million Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf, \$1 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile, \$2 million Breeders' Cup Turf and \$4 million Breeders' Cup Classic. The inaugural running of the Filly and Mare Turf race, for fillies and mares, threeyear-olds and up, will be contested this year at 1 3/8 miles on the turf course. "The changes in this year's championship race order reflect a collaborative effort with input from NBC Sports and our racing and wagering departments," said D. G. Van Clief, Jr., president of Breeders' Cup Ltd. "A number of factors were considered including the positioning of the new Filly and Mare turf race and the selection of races for the Breeders' Cup Ultra Pick 6." The Breeders' Cup Ultra Pick 6 wager will begin with the Breeders' Cup Mile and continue through the Breeders' Cup Classic.

MOSSFLOWER SECOND IN COMEBACK

Mossflower (Affirmed), unraced since romping home a 12-length winner in the June '98 GI Hempstead H., was bet down to 1-5 in her return to the track in yesterday's sixth race at Belmont Park, but it was Delta Music (Dixieland Band) who stole the show. Mossflower chased pacesetting Delta Music down the stretch but could get no closer than 4 1/2 lengths at the wire. "It's disappointing because she was undefeated and I really thought she was going to run a big race today," said Mossflower's trainer Richard Schosberg. "The positive from this is that she did hold off the other horses and it was her first race in a year." Mossflower may start next in the GI Go for Wand S. at Saratoga Aug. 7.

Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) hasn't let a filly finish in front of her since she was fourth in the Gll Del Mar Debutante last August. The brilliant three-year-old reeled off eight straight graded-stakes wins, including the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, GI Ashland and GI Kentucky Oaks, before taking on the boys in the June 5 GI Belmont S. A quick pace and the 1 1/2 miles proved a bit too much in the Belmont and she tired to be seventh, but the 1998 Eclipse winner could start a new streak here. Canadian invader Bag Lady Jane (Devil's Bag) was undefeated in two juvenile starts, including the Princess Elizabeth S. She returned off a five-month absence to run third in the Mar. 27 Bourbonette at Turfway and won a June 20 Woodbine optional claimer by 11 lengths in her last start. Boom Town Girl (Unbridled) ran second in the GIII Dogwood at Churchill May 22 and returned to take Lone Star Park's Mesquite Mile last time out June 12.

The winner of the GIII Canadian Turf H. at Gulfstream in January and the GII Hialeah Turf Cup H. in April, he stretches out to 11 furlongs for the first time. Chorwon (Cozzene) is four-for-five at this distance. He successfully defended his title in the Louisville H. last out, winning by a nose May 29, but finished fourth in this race last year, his only off-the-board showing at 11 furlongs.

WRITERS UP

READY TO ROLL

Jim Scatuorchio was in France when he got the call from his trainer, Todd Pletcher. The name they'd chosen for Scatuorchio's two-year-old colt--Ember--had been rejected by The Jockey Club and they had to do something fast, because his first race was coming up in eight days at Keeneland.

Scatuorchio, who'd taken his wife to Paris for her birthday, didn't feel much like sitting around thinking up a name for the horse, being in Paris in the springtime and all.

"Are you sure he's ready to run?" he asked his trainer.

"He's more than ready," Pletcher told him.

"OK then, that's his name," said Scatuorchio.

"What's his name?" asked Pletcher.

"More Than Ready," said Scatuorchio.

And he was, too. Eight days later, on a blustery day in Lexington, Kentucky, More Than Ready broke his maiden by 7 1/2 lengths.

Shortly after the race he was approached by a bloodstock agent, most likely one who was working for Sheikh Mohammed's powerful Godolphin stable. While flattered and surprised by the size of the offer, Scatuorchio was not yet ready, so to speak, to be bowled over by any large sum of money.

His restraint made him look pretty sharp when More Than Ready went on to win the WHAS S. by 4 1/2 lengths on Derby Day at Churchill. The last two winners of the WHAS were Yes It's True and Favorite Trick, in case you were wondering.

Then, on June 4, More Than Ready won the Flash S. at Belmont. But that was nothing compared to what he did a month later in the GIII Tremont. On the Fourth of July he shaved 3/5ths of a second off a Belmont track record that had been set by Raise a Cup in 1973 and equaled by Ruffian in 1974 and Salt Lake in 1991.

Now, if all goes well, the GI Hopeful at Saratoga is the ultimate goal for the summer. And then, who knows, maybe it's on to the Breeders' Cup.

"That's something I'd have to be sedated for," Scatuorchio says.

Not that he's allergic to money, but there's something about good young horses that makes men dream big dreams. Even men who've spent a lifetime doing business.

Scatuorchio is a self-made man. He retired last year at age 50, after 30 years on Wall Street. He met his wife in high school, and took her to Monmouth Park on their first date. He went straight to Wall Street from high school, skipping college altogether.

He has owned bits and pieces of horses for years, since he was in his 20s. The first one he and a friend bought for \$3,000. His name was Shootin Dash, and when they took him up to run him in New York, somebody claimed him.

"We were so upset we fired our trainer," Scatuorchio recalls. "Poor guy. We didn't know what we were doing."

Once he could afford it, Scatuorchio started getting more serious about his hobby. Long story short, he was one of the Phantom House Farm crew, the syndicate that wound up selling half of Tale of the Cat for \$7.1 million to Coolmore Stud. Not bad for a colt they'd bought as a yearling for \$375,000.

But even before that Scatuorchio had decided he wanted to be a player. So last fall he was back at the yearling sales at Keeneland. With Eddie Rosen, an expert on pedigrees; Pletcher; Pletcher's father Jake; and a veterinarian, the group set out to find some young horses that fit all the criteria, yet remained within the realm of Scatuorchio's budget.

Every day Rosen would produce a list of 30-35 horses based on pedigree, and the trainers and the vet would go around and look them over and pare the number down to five or so. Then Scatuorchio would decide how much to bid on them.

On the second day of the sale, he bought a filly for \$150,000, a half-sister to Richter Scale named Velvet's Pie after the horse in National Velvet. On the third day, he bought the colt who would be named in that trans-Atlantic phone conversation, a son of Southern Halo out of a Woodman mare. He cost \$187,000.

The same day he bought an unnamed Mountain Cat colt for \$200,000.

This is not a science, of course. It's more like Forest Gump's box of chocolates. Check out the \$5,000 claimers in your program some day and you'll notice a good many of them must have cost someone a lot of money at some point, judging from their pedigree.

"You never know--one could turn out to be a champion and one could turn out to be the horse who can't outrun the proverbial fat man," as Rosen says.

More Than Ready has already shown he can outrun the fat man. Yet he is not bred to be precocious, to win early in his career, sprinting. It is still early, though, far too early to burden him with the weight of unreasonable expectation. "He looks like a special horse, a horse the breeding farms will be interested in if he ever wins a Grade I," says Scatuorchio. "But he hasn't earned those stripes yet.

"As a business person, you've got to look at it that way. I learned a lot from the experience with Tale of the Cat. There was a time to take the money off the table.

"But sure, there's a part of me that wants to go back to Churchill Downs. Just being there at the Derby this year for the first time, with my family and my friends..."

That'll do it to you. Anyone who has ever been there could tell you that. So you weigh business against romance and there you are again, with a box of chocolates.
