SUNDAY SILENCE COLT TOPS JRHA

SELECTED SALE A weanling colt by Sunday Silence out of Ballet Queen (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) brought a final bid of \$1,463,414 to top the first session of the Japan Racing Horse Association's Selected Sale, held yesterday. Consigned by Northern Farm, the colt was purchased by Masato Kaneko. He is a half-brother to Fusaichi Concorde (Jpn) (Caerleon), winner of the 1996 Japanese Derby, as well as MSP Grace Admire (Jpn) (Tony Bin {Ire}). Three of the 140 weanlings offered brought seven figures. The second-highest price came in for a son of Sunday Silence out of Millracer (*Le Fabuleux). The colt, consigned by Shadai Farm and purchased by John Ferguson Bloodstock, brought a final bid of \$1,382,113. He is a full brother to the 1994 Japanese champion two-year-old colt Fuji Kiseki (Jpn). John Ferguson Bloodstock also bought a colt by Sunday Silence out of National Flag (Jpn) (Dictus {Fr}) from Shadai Farm for \$747,967. The third million-dollar baby was a colt by Polish Precedent out of Muncie (Sadler's Wells), a Group 1 winner in France. Purchased by T.M. International Co., Ltd., he was consigned by Shadai Farm. The two-day sale concludes today.

RETIREMENT FOR FREE HOUSE? According to the Thoroughbred Times on-line, the racing career of MGISW Free House (Smokester) may be over. The fiveyear-old has not started since injuring his back during the running of the May 8 GI Pimlico Special. He finished second by a neck to Real Quiet in that race. Free House's co-owner, John Toffan, told the Thoroughbred Times that his homebred is progressing well at his Eskay Creek Farm near Santa Anita Park, but that it is likely he will not race again. "We will scan him again in a couple of weeks, but even if everything is all right, it would take until nearly the end of the year to have him ready again and then there is nowhere to run," Toffan told the *Times*. "I don't plan to race him again next year at six." Free House won his first two starts this season, the Feb. 7 GII San Antonio H. and Mar. 6 GI Santa Anita H. The Cal-bred also captured the GII Norfolk S. at two, the GI Santa Anita Derby, GII Swaps S. and GII San Felipe S. at three and the GI Pacific Classic and GII Bel Air H. last year at four. He ran second in the GI Preakness and third in both the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont S. Overall, he has a record of 22-9-5-3 for earnings of \$3,178,971.

For a remarkably long time, the female line descending from Count Fleet's daughter Sequence has proved an impressively reliable source of high-priced yearlings at Keeneland in July. It was back in 1968 that Sequence's Fleet Nasrullah colt set a new record price for a yearling when he sold for \$280,000. Three years later, the Summer Sale was topped by Mr. Prospector, a \$220,000 colt by Raise A Native out of Sequence's very good daughter Gold Digger; Mr. Prospector's brother Elegant Prince raised the record price for a yearling to \$625,000 in 1974.

Gold Digger kept up the good work when her Northern Dancer colt Yukon made \$1,400,000, the second-best price of 1980, and the family struck again in 1997 when the top price of \$1,500,000 was paid by Bob Baffert for Forestry, a Storm Cat colt whose third dam is Bold Sequence, a three-parts sister to Gold Digger sired by Bold Ruler from Sequence.

Forestry's connections must be hoping that their Storm Cat colt will one day develop into another Mr. Prospector. The colt scored his fifth straight victory in the GII Dwyer S. Sunday, a win that improves his record to six wins from eight starts.

Baffert related after Forestry's win that "when we bought him, he was medium-sized and got big quick. That's why I didn't want to push him too early."

This growth spurt isn't surprising when one remembers two facts about Forestry.

Firstly, he was a rather late foal, with a May 9 birthday that made him only 14 months old at the time of his purchase. And secondly his dam, Shared Interest, is by the tall and leggy Pleasant Colony, who stands nearly 17 hands.

After making her debut at three, Shared Interest quickly showed she was well above average, building up a record of five wins from seven starts in 1991. But she saved the best until last, becoming a Grade I winner in 1993 on her 21st appearance when she led throughout to defeat Dispute, Turnback the Alarm, You'd Be Surprised and Paseana (Arg) in the Ruffian H. over 8½ furlongs.

She was also placed in three other Grade I events as a five-year-old. Shared Interest has obviously proved a very good servant for her breeder, Robert S. Evans, who received \$1,200,000 from Padua Stables for her second foal, Cash Run, a Seeking the Gold filly who was the highest-priced filly at last year's Keeneland July Sale. She also has a yearling sister to Forestry.

Shared Interest possessed plenty of speed for a daughter of Pleasant Colony, as she demonstrated with her victory in the seven-furlong First Flight H. as a four-year-old. This was no surprise in view of her background. Her dam, Surgery, was by Dr Fager, the champion sprinter of 1967 and 1968, and came from the female line responsible for the top sprinters Mr. Prospector and Myrtlewood.

No wonder that Surgery produced the very fast Sewickley, winner of the GI Vosburgh S. (twice) and the GII Fall Highweight H., when she was mated with the champion sprinter Star de Naskra.

Forestry's success, together with the GIII Jenny Wiley H. victory of Pleasant Temper, suggests that Pleasant Colony's daughters have a bright future with Storm Cat. His daughters have also done well with other speedy members of the Northern Dancer male line, producing Urbane to Citidancer and Dixie Pearl to Dixieland Band. Forestry, who isn't likely to stay further than nine furlongs, is inbred 4x4 to Bold Ruler, who also appears twice in the pedigrees of several other good winners by Storm Cat, including Sharp Cat and Silken Cat.
