Yesterday, Deauville, France:

RELAXING DEAD Relaxing (Buckpasser), dam of champion Easy Goer (Alydar) died May 21 after suffering complications from foaling an Unbridled colt at Claiborne Farm near Paris, Kentucky the day before, according to published reports. The 23-year-old bay was the champion handicap mare of 1981 and was broodmare of the year in 1989. In addition to Easy Goer, the champion two-year-old of 1988, Relaxing produced Grade I winners Cadillacing (Alydar) and Easy Now (Danzig). Relaxing has an unraced two-year-old filly by Danzig and a yearling colt by Unbridled.

SUNDAY SILENCE SHINES AT JRHA SELECTED

SALE Sunday Silence was a powerful presence at the recently concluded Japan Racing Horse Association's Selected Sale. During Monday's first session of the sale, two of the sire's weanling sons brought seven figures, including the sale topper, hip number 85, who brought \$1,463,414. At yesterday's final session, the highest-priced weanling was also a son of Sunday Silence. Hip number 164, consigned by Shadai Farm and out of the French champion mare Shaanxi (Zilzal), brought a final bid of \$1,422,764 from Fusaro Sekiguchi. The second million-dollar baby at Tuesday's session was hip number 174, another Sunday Silence colt, out of the Fappiano mare Fadetta. Consigned by Northern Farm, the dark bay was purchased for \$1,219,512 by Takaya Shimakawa. John Ferguson Bloodstock purchased hip number 252, a colt by Sunday Silence--Distant (Nijinsky II), for \$495,934. During the two sessions, 173 weanlings sold for \$41,099,187. The average price was \$237,567. Eighty seven horses were reported as not sold.

With a third place finish to Diktat in the Shergar Cup Seven at Goodwood, May 8, Keos was something of a disappointment when unplaced behind Bold Edge in the G2 Cork & Orrery S. at Royal Ascot, June 17. Having won this race last year, Keos proved he is back to form with a near last-to-first burst to beat another previous course and distance winner, Andreyev with a decisive turn of foot in the last halffurlong. Keos, Andreyev and Rangoon Ruby raced at the back of the field as King Country (Ire) (Fairy King) led from Pinmix (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) and Dream Chief (Holy Bull). Racing to the final furlong, Andreyev began vying for the lead with Keos rallying on the outside. Keos quickened inside the last 100 yards and ran on strongly to comfortably hold Andreyev at bay.

THINGS CHANGE RETIRED Grade I stakes winner Things Change (Stalwart--Romanticat {Gato del Sol}) has been retired from racing, according to Daily Racing Form. The three-year-old was in the top echelon of twoyear-old fillies last season after winning the GI Spinaway S. and Gll Adirondack S. She suffered a knee injury while running second in the GI Frizette S. last October and was off seven months before running third in the GIII Nassau County. She bled through Lasix in off-the-board finishes in the GI Acorn and GII Prioress, prompting her retirement. Things Change was the first Grade I winner for trainer Linda Rice.

ACCELERATOR TO HILL 'N' DALE Graded stakes winner Accelerator (A.P. Indy--Get Lucky {Mr. Prospector}) has been retired from racing and will stand as the property of a syndicate at Hill 'n' Dale Farms in Lexington, Kentucky. "Accelerator fits the profile of an exciting sire prospect," said Hill 'n' Dale President John Sikura. "Additionally, his sire A. P. Indy is one of the world's most important young sires and we feel his sons will be most sought after at stud." The five-yearold dark bay won the GIII Pilgrim S. and placed in five other graded events, including a third-place outing in the 1998 GI Metropolitan H. He will stand for \$5,000.

BREEDERS' CUP POST FOR THAYER Damon Thayer has been named the Director of Marketing of Breeders' Cup Ltd. The 31-year-old Michigan native had been the director of communications at Turfway Park. "Damon brings a history of success and a wealth of experience from his varied racing background, which will be of great value to the Breeders' Cup," said D. G. Van Clief, Jr., president of Breeders' Cup Ltd. "We will utilize his talents in organizing our marketing team and executing programs that will further establish and enhance the Breeders' Cup brand into the new century." Thayer begins his new duties July 26.

When Keen (GB) (Sharpen Up {GB}--Doubly Sure {GB}, by Reliance {Fr}) was repatriated to Europe from Australia in time for the 1991 season, there was considerable interest in the full brother to Kris and Diesis. While Keen had not matched the achievements of his famous siblings on the racetrack, he was a more than useful performer, winning his only start at two and taking the listed Easter S. by four lengths on his début at three before going on to finish fifth in El Gran Senor's G1 2000 Guineas and second in the G2 St. James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot. In addition, Keen was physically the most imposing of the trio, and if not a

Sad to say, after a year in Ireland and a longer stint at the English National Stud, Keen now stands in Yorkshire as a 'dual-purpose' stallion (covering both flat and jumping mares) at a fee of around \$2,500. Still, Keen's time in Europe has resulted in one good horse in the shape of River Keen, who on Saturday added Hollywood Park's GII Bel Air H. to a win in the 1997 GII Californian S.

runaway success in Australia had sired the G1 South

Australian Oaks winner Gamine (NZ) in his first crop.

River Keen is out of a mare by Nijinsky's son Caerleon, which recalls some earlier European debates about how well Keen's brother Kris worked with Northern Dancer-line mares. There was a stage a few years ago when Kris was going through a distinctly quiet time and it was suggested that he wasn't suited by being used as an outcross for Northern Dancer. Over the years, however, evidence for that theory has diminished and in all at least 20 of the 65 stakes winners (30%) sired by Kris are out of Northern Dancer-line mares, the most recent being Royal Ascot G1 Coronation S. heroine Balisada. Bearing in mind the cross which produced River Keen it is interesting to note that six of the 20 are out of mares by Nijinsky or sons, including three out of mares by Green Dancer. If there is a special affinity between Kris and Nijinsky, it could come down to the fact that Kris's broodmare sire Reliance is out of a mare by Relic, as Relic's dam Bridal Colors (Black Toney--*Vaila, by Fariman (GB)) is very closely related to Blue Larkspur (Black Servant--Blossom Time, by *North

Star), who is prominent in the pedigree of Nijinsky's dam Flaming Page. From that standpoint we can also note that The Minstrel (a grandson of Flaming Page and three-quarters brother to Nijinsky) is also broodmare sire of two stakes winners by Kris. Other Northern Dancer strains which seem to work well here are Lyphard, Be My Guest and Lomond.

One would think that Diesis, standing in the U.S., where the Northern Dancer line is not as all-pervading, might have worked less frequently with Northern Dancer than Kris, but in fact with 16 of his 57 stakes winners coming on the cross the percentage is virtually identical. Not surprisingly, Diesis has some similar tastes to Kris when it comes to branches of the Northern Dancer line. He's worked with The Minstrel (four stakes winners), Nijinsky II (including Halling, out of a mare by one of Kris's favorites, Green Dancer), Lyphard and Be My Guest. Diesis is the only one of the brothers to sire a stakes winner out of a Danzig-line mare, but given how well that cross works in reverse, look for that situation to change in the near future.

PEDIGREE SHORTS:

We are becoming convinced that inbreeding to the broodmare sire of the sire can frequently have beneficial effects and there was another example over the weekend in the shape of GIII Oceanport H. winner Mi Narrow (h, 5, Mi Selecto--Sioux Narrows, by Superbity). Mi Narrow is the only graded stakes winner for his sire Mi Selecto. Mi Selecto is out of a daughter of Ribot and Mi Narrow's dam is by a grandson of Ribot. Another weekend stakes winner bred on the same pattern is Sleek'n Silver (m, 5, Northern Prospect--Princess Mine, by Northrop) who took the Proud Puppy S. at Finger Lakes. Her sire is out of a Northern Dancer mare and her dam is by a son of the same horse.

The power of multiple Almahmoud struck again when Best Dressed Truck (h, 5, Walesa--Impulsive Angel, by Sunny's Halo) won the Carter McGregor Jr S. at Lone Star on Saturday. The sire Walesa (Danzig--Kennelot, by *Gallant Man) is inbred to Almahmoud through the half sisters Natalma and Cosmah (Walesa's third dam). Best Dressed Truck's dam is by a son of Halo (Hail to Reason--Cosmah, by Cosmic Bomb) and so has Cosmah 4x4 and Almahmoud 5x5x5.
