SILVERLEAF TO DISPERSE David Hutson has decided to disperse his Silverleaf Farm breeding stock and sell the newly built 635-acre breeding complex in Orange Lake, Florida. The dispersal includes approximately 140 Thoroughbreds, some of whom are already consigned to upcoming yearling sales. An additional 68 head will be sold at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's October Mixed Sale with 46 scheduled for a special session at the Fall Breeding Stock Sale at Keeneland. Among the horses to be sold at the fall venues are three in-foal mares from the final book of Mr. Prospector and mares by Nurevey, Seattle Slew, Riverman, Mr. Prospector, Alydar, Nijinsky II, Shirley Heights (GB), Lyphard, Halo and Private Account. Plans for the seven stallions who stood at Silverleaf, including Kentucky Derby winner Silver Charm's sire Silver Buck, have not been finalized. Hutson cited conflicts with his personal and business life as the reason for the dispersal. He will maintain his racing stable of 16 horses in training with Marty Wolfson and Tom Amoss.

The award is presented annually to an unsung hero in the Thoroughbred industry. Perslweig-selected from 35 nominations by judges Anne Campbell, Pat Day and MacKenzie Miller--will receive a cash award of \$5,000 and a bronze statue of the Dogwood color bearer Dominion at a luncheon at the Saratoga Reading Room on Aug. 4. "Danny Perlsweig has spent over 50 years in racing--as a jockey and trainer--and has always appreciated the everyday backstretch worker who faithfully works at the poverty line to make our industry go," commented Dogwood President Cot Campbell. ROMERO RIDES INTO SUNSET By Bill Finley

Randy Romero went home Monday night to Evangeline Downs, to say goodbye to the sport that had bashed and battered and banged him around for 24 vears. He wasn't just retiring. He was surrendering. After 23 accidents, 21 operations and 16 fractures, Romero just couldn't do it anymore.

"I'm not going to miss it," Romero said before going O-for-3 on a farewell night that pitted him against other riding stars out of Louisiana. "I know I can't compete. It's time for me to move out."

Which is what he's done. Romero, 41, has accepted the job as the jockey agent for fellow Cajun Marlon St. Julien (who, ironically, beat him in his final ride) and has begun booking mounts for him at Ellis Park.

Quietly, a prolific career that included 4,294 wins, riding titles at 10 different tracks and so many heroic moments aboard Personal Ensign has come to an end. But Romero will be remembered as much for the tragedies as for the successes. Has there ever been an unluckier iockey?

Out of Erath, Louisiana and a product of the Cajun country bush tracks, Romero won his first pari-mutuel race ever at Evangeline in 1975 and wasted little time tearing up the smaller tracks in his home state. It was obvious from the start: the kid had it.

"Horses just ran for him; it was something very natural, like he had a gift," Shug McGaughey, the trainer of Personal Ensign, said. "I think Randy Romero was born to be a lockey.

He moved up to tougher places, like Fair Grounds and Oaklawn Park, and kept right on winning. But bad luck, even tragedy, dogged Romero's career. He got his worst taste of it in 1983 when burned over 65 percent of his body in a freak accident in the Oaklawn jocks' room. He was so badly burned that doctors gave him only a 40-percent chance to live. Fifteen weeks later, he was riding again.

A broken leg later, he came to New York in 1986 and his career took off. Riding for the powerful McGaughey stable, he racked up wins, riding titles and major stakes victories. His finest moment came in the 1988 Breeders' Cup Distaff when he somehow got Personal Ensign up at the wire to defeat Winning Colors and end her career with an undefeated record.

Two years later, he was again locked in battle in the stretch run of the Breeders' Cup Distaff, imploring Go for Wand to dig down and put away Bayakoa. Only this time, there would be a nightmarish ending.

Go for Wand shattered her leg and had to be euthanized. Romero picked himself off the track and went on to ride in a later race, not knowing then that he had broken his shoulder and eight ribs in the spill. It was the beginning of the end for Romero, a nine-year spiral in which he could never shake the black cloud that seemed to hover over his head.

His shoulder and ribs having healed after three months on the sidelines, he came back at Gulfstream Park only to break his left elbow in a spill just days into his comeback. The elbow fracture mystified surgeons, who could not properly repair it. He rode sporadically throughout 1991 and 1992, every comeback derailed when he would find that there was still something terribly wrong with his elbow. He went in for operation after operation through 2 1/2 torturous years and says now that his elbow is still so mangled that his left arm is six inches shorter than his right.

"The elbow injury crushed me," he said. "I lost all my clientele and when I came back I was never 100 percent. I should have retired after that happened, but I hadn't had enough of riding. I'm tired of trying to fool myself."

A one-armed rider for the remainder of his career, Romero's decline was sad to watch. He left New York and shuffled back and forth between lesser circuits, hoping that something would reignite his career. It just got worse. He broke his pelvis and more ribs in still another spill.

He quit once before, in 1994, but hadn't laid the proper groundwork for a second career and was soon back in the saddle. Trainers had lost all faith in him and he was powerless to restore his reputation.

This year, he had just 17 victories and won with a meager 7 percent of his mounts. Everyone knew what was wrong, that he had broken down from all the punishment, and everyone was sympathetic. But Romero has too much pride and accomplished too much in his career to scuffle around the backstretch begging for 20-1 shots to ride.

Mercifully, it's over. This sport can punish him no more.
