HASKELL HOPEFULS WORK Menifee (Harlan), getting ready for the \$1 million GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park Aug. 8, worked five furlongs in a co-bullet :59 4/5 at Churchill Downs yesterday. The Kentucky Derby and Preakness runner-up, who was eighth in the Belmont S. last time out, galloped out six furlongs in 1:13 4/5. "He's on target for the Haskell," trainer Elliott Walden said. "He worked super. He has really grown and physically matured." Also breezing at Churchill yesterday was MGISW Vicar (Wild Again), who went the same distance in 1:01 4/5. Trainer Carl Nafzger said yesterday that the colt could make his next start in the Haskell as well. The three-year-old captured the GI Fountain of Youth S. and GI Florida Derby and ran third in the GI Blue Grass before finishing 18th in the Kentucky Derby and 10th in the Preakness. "He's doing good," Nafzger said. "He will run in either the Haskell or the Jim Dandy (at Saratoga, Aug. 8). It will just depend on how he is training. Right now, we are looking very seriously at the Haskell."

ELMHURST BACK ON TRACK Elmhurst (Wild Again), winner of the 1997 Breeders' Cup Sprint, has been returned to the barn of trainer Jenine Sahadi after a year of retirement, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The nine-year-old gelding has had six published workouts, including a five-furlong drill at Santa Anita last Saturday in :59.2. "I don't know if he'll make the races, but he's moving right along," Sahadi told the *Form*. "The question is whether he wants to be a racehorse." After his victory in the Breeders' Cup, Elmhurst was winless in five 1998 starts, finishing on the board only when third in the GII Palos Verdes H. He has not raced since finishing ninth in the June 28, 1998 GII Triple Bend Breeders' Cup H., and currently has a record of eight wins in 48 starts with earnings of \$1,080,455.

Anziyan (Danzig), a full brother to Danehill, will stand in New Zealand for the Southern Hemisphere season. A 50-percent share in the six-year-old has been bought by a partnership which will stand him at Newbury Park in Palmerston North at a fee of NZ\$7,000 (\$3,690). He is at present serving his first season at stud in California at Creston Farms owned by the *Jeopardy!* game show host Alex Trebek. Anziya, who was bred by and raced for Khalid Abdullah, won a maiden race and was Group 3-placed at two and landed an allowance race at Del Mar at four. Wayne Larsen, stud manager at Newbury, said, "Anziyan has enormous physical presence and has all the muscular power, quality, correctness and precocity expected of the very best sons of Danzig."

RACING NETWORK LIVES UP TO ITS NAME

A race was going off at Philadelphia Park, then at Laurel. A flip of the dial takes you to Monmouth, another flip to the harness racing channel, another to the dogs. That's just the start. On the busiest days, the Racing Network will show up to 400 races from 40 pari-mutuel venues of some sort or the other. Like action? Hate fluff? The Racing Network may be for you.

While the TV Games Network, with all its bells and whistles and backed by the National Thoroughbred Racing Association and some of the deepest pockets in the cable TV industry, was busy gearing up for its Wednesday debut, Brand X was busy churning out race after race after race to its 2,100 subscribers who have paid \$320 for a specialized dish and another \$14.95 a month for the service.

From several small studios in what used to be the Philadelphia Park press box, the action is hot and heavy. A host is in place, more or less to play traffic cop as the viewer is taken back and forth from track to track. With four separate channels, each one able to carry as many as four tracks, the Racing Network can show as many as 16 signals at once.

Hoping to reach 50,000 subscribers, the Racing Network is selling its dishes to a 50-50 split of horsemen and gamblers. It does not directly accept wagers, but fans can bet through telephone betting systems operated by Racing Network partners, such as Philadelphia Park. Greenwood Racing, the parent company of Philadelphia Park, is a Racing Network partner, along with the Ontario Jockey Club, Ladbroke Racing and International Investment and Underwriting Ltd.

It's the meat-and-potatoes approach of bringing racing into the home, which may appeal to the hardcore horseplayer, but not necessarily to an industry trying to expand its fan base.

The great TVG-versus-Racing Network debate heated up this week with the July 14 launch of TVG. TVG hopes to do much more than just show races. The fledgling network will try and present racing as entertainment with an eye on attracting new fans. It will show just four-to-six races an hour, concentrating on the major tracks and filling the in-between time with commentary and racing features. That's one way of doing it.

The other is the Racing Network way: the more action the better.

"We believe the players want action," said Racing Network President and CEO Bill Hogwood. "Owners and trainers want to see their horses run, even if they're not competing at a top-level track. I think we're going for two different markets. I agree that our product might confuse non-racing fans, but their product will frustrate current fans. Their approach is realistic for certain times during the week. I've seen it work to a degree in the U.K., but, basically, that's more of a Saturday afternoon-type thing. Whether it can work 12 hours a day, seven days a week, time will tell."

While the horseplayer will probably prefer the Racing Network approach, he or she will definitely prefer TVG's menu of racetracks. Because many top tracks have signed exclusive agreements with TVG, the Racing Network cannot show the New York Racing Association tracks (Aqueduct, Belmont and Saratoga), Hollywood Park, Churchill Downs and some other top circuits. It does have Monmouth, the Meadowlands, Santa Anita, Fair Grounds, Maryland and dozens of other smaller tracks that probably would never see the light of day on TVG.

Still, TVG clearly has the better product, which could give it an edge over its rival in the battle to win the in-home viewer.

"We don't think we should be seen as a competitor to them," Hogwood said. "These are two separate concepts. We think we complement them. They want to show the very best of racing and in doing that there will be tracks left out."

"We should be working together. It's a shame that we don't. It's frustrating. In the end, it's all about increasing handle for everyone."

Hogwood would like to see tracks give their signals to both networks, believing that's the best way to maximize exposure and therefore handle. As for now, though, that's probably not going to happen. In the meantime, the Racing Network will continue to do what it does best, show lots of races.
