CHARISMATIC TO LANE'S END Charismatic (Summer Squall--Bali Babe {Drone}), the winner of the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness before suffering a career-ending injury when finishing third in the GI Belmont S. June 5, will enter stud next year at William S. Farish's Lane's End Farm near Versailles, Kentucky. Owned by Bob and Beverly Lewis and trained by D. Wayne Lukas, the colt was dropped into a \$62,500 claiming race in February, but went on to set a stakes record in the GII Lexington S. before heading onto the Triple Crown trail. He was retired with a record of five wins, two seconds and four thirds from 17 starts and

earnings of \$2,038,064. Charismatic will stand the

2000 breeding season for a fee of \$35,000, live foal.

EXPELLED TO WIMBLEDON FARM Expelled (Explodent--Social Lesson (Forum)), the winner of the GI Eddie Read H. at Del Mar in 1997, has been retired and will begin a new career at stud at Wimbledon Farm in Lexington, Kentucky next year. The seven-year-old will stand as the property of a syndicate that includes his owner/breeder, Juddmonte Farms. Expelled raced in France as a two-year-old, winning the G3 Prix du Bois and running third in the G2 Prix Robert Papin despite losing a shoe. Overall, he won seven of his 17 starts, with one second and three thirds. He earned \$406,188.

HOST TRACKS ANNOUNCED FOR "AMERICA'S DAY AT THE RACES" The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association has selected the three host tracks for the 1999 renewal of "America's Day at the Races." He cited "personal and business" reasons when tendering the resignation. Durkin will be at Gulfstream to call the Breeders' Cup meet, Nov. 5-7. "Leaving Gulfstream will allow me more time to focus attention on my two most important professional priorities, New York racing and the Breeders' Cup," Durkin said. "Equally important, the lighter work load will allow me more time at home in New York and more time for personal development. Obviously, leaving Gulfstream was a very difficult decision. It is one of the best jobs I have ever had." Durkin will not call the races in New York this winter, but may in the future. His replacement at Gulfstream has not yet been named.

Tiller reported that the horse was sound after his last start, but the decision was made to retire him. "He's a grand old horse," the trainer said. "To tell you the truth, he's been a cranky old guy since day one, but he really loved training and he loved running." The 10-year-old will be turned out at a farm north of Toronto. "He's going to have a good home," Tiller said.

Rockingham Stakes Gets Purst Boost:

The purse for the 1999 edition of the Spicy Living S. at Rockingham Park, a 1 1/8-mile grass test for fillies and mares set for Aug. 1, has been raised from \$75,000 to \$100,000. Rockingham has also added a stakes to the Spicy Living undercard, the \$25,000 Rockette S. for three-year-old fillies going a mile on the turf.
