\$2.5 MILLION GONE WEST COLT TOPS

KEENELAND JULY OPENER Hip 22, a bay colt by Gone West out of Irish champion Market Booster (Green Dancer) brought a final bid of \$2.5 million to top the opening session of the Keeneland July Selected Yearling Sale in Lexington yesterday. Consigned by Eaton Sales, agent, the colt was purchased by a partnership made up of Prince Ahmed Salman's The Thoroughbred Corporation and B. Wayne Hughes. Richard Mulhall, stable manager for The Thoroughbred Corp., said, "He is a gorgeous horse, the best-looking one in the sale. We thought he'd sell for \$2 million--I think we might have paid too much for him, but that's the way it goes." The Prince added, "I'll tell you why we bought him. He reminds me of (1999 Epsom Derby winner) Oath (Ire). To me, he is a Kentucky Derby winner." The Thoroughbred Corporation also paid the top price for a filly on opening night, going to \$1.5 million for hip 57, a daughter of Woodman out of Ubetshedid (King Pellinore). The filly, a half sister to MGISW Best Pal (*Habitony), was also consigned by Eaton Sales, agent. "This is Sharp Cat Jr.," said the Prince. "When you win a lot of races and a lot of money, you have to spend even more money to get more good ones. But she reminded me so much of Sharp Cat." Demi O'Byrne signed the ticket for the second-highest priced colt yesterday, hip 70, a son of Theatrical (Ire)--Claxton's Slew (Seattle Slew). The bay is a half brother to champion Escena, winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff and \$2,962,639. Consigned by Lane's End, agent for Brookside Farms, he was purchased for the partnership of Michael Tabor and John Magnier. "He has the pedigree--he's a half to the good filly," said Magnier. "Another thing that appealed to us was that the Paulsons are his breeders and they have been leading breeders for many years. They are our neighbors in the Blue Grass." Of the 63 yearlings offered during Monday, 23, including 10 of the first 21, did not reach their reserves, 36.5 percent of the total. But Keeneland Director of Sales Rogers Beasley said, "The July Sale is the kick-off and buyers are sort of feeling their way around on the first day. The RNAs were more than you'd want, ideally, but from a dollar standpoint, it's acceptable. How can you not be pleased with a session where the average is more than \$500,000?" The sale continues this afternoon at 1:30 p.m. and concludes with an evening session beginning at 7:30.

RECORD HANDLE AT HOLLYWOOD PARK

Hollywood Park concluded its 60th Spring/Summer meet yesterday with a record daily average total handle of \$10,384,707, up a fraction from the 1998 season. Daily average on-track attendance was 9,820, down 5.4 percent from last year, and average on-track wagering was \$2,118,823, off 4.4 percent, but the handle was boosted by a 6.5-percent increase at the track's satellite facilities. The average daily purse distribution was \$396,199, up 5.9 percent. The meeting was the last with R.D. Hubbard at the helm. Hubbard had served as chairman and CEO since 1991, but resigned after the track was sold in May. Ron McAnally led all trainers at the meet with 25 wins, while Alex Solis topped the riders with 57 winners. Both were enjoying their fourth Hollywood Spring/Summer titles. Bob Baffert had the most stakes wins with six. His Real Quiet (Quiet American) was named the "Horse of the Meeting" after his victory in the \$1 million Sempra Energy Hollywood Gold Cup.

PADUA STABLES HONORED AS TOBA "OWNER OF THE MONTH" Satish and Anne Sanan's Padua

Stables, which won no less than five stakes last month, has been named the June "Owner of the Month" by the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association. Top sprinter Yes It's True picked up two stakes wins, the GII Riva Ridge and GIII Jersey Shore Breeders' Cup S., during the month. On June 26, the stable sent out Natalie Too to take the GIII Vinery Matchmaker S. at Monmouth and Dance Master to win the GII Bashford Manor S. at Churchill Downs. On the West Coast, Padua's Magicalmysterycat took the June 6 Cinderella S. to run her record to two-for-two. But Satish Sanan said, "I didn't get into this business to make a lot of money. I got into it because I love Thoroughbred racing. I'm passionate about it."

Relishing the soft conditions, Prolix finally recorded his first Group win, leading from start to finish. Second on his latest outing when conceding 15 pounds to King Adam (Ire) in the Listed Gala S. at Kempton June 23, the colt has performed consistently well at this level, but has always managed to find one or two that were too good for him. Setting a strong pace which ensured this was a true test of stamina in the rain-soddened turf, he led by as much as five lengths at one point. As the field turned into the straight, Prolix tacked across to the stand-side rail, followed by Epsom Derby fourth Housemaster, and the pair pulled clear of their toiling rivals. The winner came under pressure 2½ furlongs from the finish, where Housemaster looked dangerous, but his challenge was labored and entering the final quarter it was clear that Prolix was not going to be denied. Winning trainer Barry Hills said, "The possibilities for him now are the [G3] Rose Of Lancaster S. at Haydock [Aug. 7], the [G2] Royal Whip at The Curragh [Aug. 14] or the [G1] Juddmonte International at York [Aug. 17]."

It didn't take Yes It's True long to prove that he possesses blistering speed. His time of :10.20 for one-eighth of a mile was the fastest by a colt at the Barretts March Sale last year and prompted D. Wayne Lukas to bid \$800,000 to buy this \$220,000 yearling for Satish Sanan.

"This colt was my pick of the sale," Lukas said at the time. "That was a lot to pay for a son of Is It True, but they said the same thing when I bought his sire and he turned out to be worth the money."

Yes It's True wasted no time in vindicating Lukas' judgement. He equalled the Churchill Downs track record of :57.66 when he got the better of Tactical Cat by a nose in the WHAS-11 S. less than two months after his purchase and then did even better in the Kentucky Breeders' Cup S. May 25, when he sliced more than 1/5th of a second off Churchill's 5½-furlong record. By the end of the year he had won five of his nine starts, his last three defeats coming when he stretched out to a mile or more.

This lesson wasn't lost on Yes It's True's connections. They rightly decided that sprinting was the colt's game and they have been rewarded this year with six straight Graded stakes victories over six or seven furlongs, culminating in last Saturday's Grade I win in the Frank J. DeFrancis Memorial Dash.

It isn't hard to discover the sources of the great speed displayed by Padua Stables' colt. Although Yes It's True's sire Is It True gained one of his best wins in the GII Jim Dandy S. over nine furlongs, he also possessed plenty of pace. When he defeated Easy Goer in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Churchill Downs, he set splits of :47.20 and 1:12.20 and he went on at three to win the GIII Riva Ridge S., setting a new stakes record for the seven furlongs.

Lukas had paid \$550,000 for Is It True as a yearling, after rating the colt 8 out of ten. The story goes that he was so surprised to discover that this impressive individual was by Raja Baba that he asked "Is it true?"

Raja Baba was one of the fast Bold Rulers, gaining all of his wins over six furlongs, and he passed on plenty of precocious speed to such as Well Decorated, Sweet Revenge, Junius and Indian King.

The name of Yes It's True's broodmare sire, Clever Trick, has become synonymous with speed. The majority of Clever Trick's 18 wins were gained at around six furlongs and he did so well as a four-year-old, when he won seven of his eight starts, that he was weighted at 121 pounds on the *Daily Racing Form* Sprint Handicap. As a son of Icecapade and grandson of Nearctic, Clever Trick was bred for speed and his son Phone Trick maintained this family tradition, suffering defeat only once in 10 starts.

Whether Yes It's True's dam, Clever Monique, possessed any speed is hard to judge from her one-race career, but she had shown enough potential at Barretts to realize \$210,000 as a juvenile. Clever Monique failed to hold her value and made only \$16,000, carrying Yes It's True in utero, in 1995.

She was certainly bred to be talented, because her dam Monique Rene was a champion in Louisiana, winning 29 of her 45 starts. As many of Monique Rene's wins were gained at around six furlongs, sprinting was the speciality of three of Yes It's True's four grandparents and this background is reflected in his powerful physique.

Ten Set for King George:

French-trained Borgia (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}) and Irish Derby third Tchaikovsky (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) were the most notable absentees at yesterday's five-day confirmation stage for Saturday's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. Ten horses have stood their ground for the Group 1 contest, with Godolphin's Nedawi (GB) (Rainbow Quest) a surprise acceptor. The St. Leger winner has been introduced in the betting at 12-1 with Ladbrokes and the Tote. Sagamix (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) is still engaged and a decision on his participation is expected today. A new jockey is being sought for Hong Kong raider Indigenous (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) after his regular pilot Douglas Whyte suffered a bout of appendicitis. Also entered in the 1 1/2-mile test are: G1 Vodafone Derby winner Oath (Ire) (Fairy King), G1 Coronation Cup champ Daylami (Ire) (Doyoun {Ire}), G2 Hardwick S. victor Fruits of Love (Hansel), English and Irish Derby runner-up Daliapour (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), Sunshine Street (Sunshine Forever), Central Park (Ire) (In The Wings {GB}) and Silver Patriarch (Ire) (Saddlers' Hall {Ire}), who won this race last year.

Large Catalogue for L'Agence Française Sale:

France's premier yearling sale, conducted by L'Agence Francaise and set for Aug. 21-26, has 565 lots catalogued. There are three colts and a filly by Sadler's Wells, including a full-brother to Festival Hall (Ire), winner of last season's G3 Juddmonte Beresford S. Sadler's Wells' late full-brother Fairy King has seven for sale, while another late star of the Coolmore roster, Caerleon, has six catalogued. Green Tune (Green Dancer) is the best-represented sire with 24 offered, while among vendors that accolade comfortably falls to Marc de Chambure's local Haras d'Etreham with 63.

Chilean Champ to Earle Mack:

Owner Earle Mack has purchased Val Gardena (Chi) (Roy), a champion filly at two and three, to race in the U.S. A candidate for her country's Horse of the Year honors, she picked up her fourth career Group 1 win in the June 27 G1 Premio Francisco Baeza S. in Santiago.

Stewards Raid Aussie Stables:

Australian stewards swooped on stables in Sydney, Melbourne and Brisbane in dawn raids last week as part of a three-state crackdown on trainers allegedly using the slow-release steroid implant Trenbolone, a preparation designed to enhance the appetite of cattle, but not registered for use with racehorses. Australia has strict rules regarding steroids, particularly in New South Wales where only vets may administer them, but ultimately there is nothing preventing horses being administered steroids providing they are not being presented to race. However, as the scandal escalated, Thoroughbred Racing Board Chief Steward Ray Murrihy called a press conference Saturday and identified Anthony Cummings as the trainer at the center of the inquiry after his mare, Yallah's Star (Aus), tested positive for Trenbolone after winning at Randwick June 12. Then Saturday at Moonee Valley, Cummings scratched Blue Music (Aus) after it was discovered she'd had the implant as well. Stewards also questioned trainer Darren Smith after the remnants of an implant were detected in his runner at Rosehill Saturday, and Smith said he had three horses racing that day that had all been given Trenbolone six months previously. Stewards ordered that all of his horses tested before they are allowed to race again. Both trainers are scheduled to appear before the stewards this week.
