\$3 MILLION 'SURPRISE' AT KEENELAND

Last night's final session of the Keeneland July Selected Yearling Sale in Lexington, Kentucky was already red hot, but when hip number 195, a son of Storm Cat--Weekend Surprise (Secretariat) exited the ring, it was downright sizzling. Irish bloodstock agent Demi O'Byrne was forced to \$3 million to take the chestnut, a half brother to champion A.P. Indy and GI Preakness winner Summer Squall, home to Coolmore Stud. The sale's topper was consigned by Lane's End, agent. "It is a lovely pedigree," admitted O'Byrne. "It's not often that you get a chance to buy a half brother to two Classic winners. It's really kind of unique, isn't it? He's the one that was at the top of our list. He is a beautiful-looking individual and has a world of potential. He's the one we were looking for." William Farish, whose Lane's End was the sale's second-leading consignor, added, "Anytime you get a price like that, you have to be pleased. He's going into good hands, so I'm not disappointed. It's been a wonderful family for Mr. (William) Kilroy and I, so naturally I'm sentimental about letting him go, but it was a great sale for us." The highest-priced filly and second-highest-priced yearling at Tuesday night's session was hip number 167, a daughter of Gone West--Miraloma (Deputy Minister). Satish Sanan's Padua Stables was forced to \$2.8 million to buy the filly from the consignment of Denali Stud, agent for Bob and Beverly Lewis. It was the second-highest price ever paid for a Keeneland July filly, behind only the 1984 world-record price tag of \$3.75 million Darley Stud paid for Alchaasibiyeh. After the purchase, Sanan said, "I paid twice as much as I wanted to but Wayne loved the pedigree and she's one of those fillies who can make your broodmare band." Trainer D. Wayne Lukas added, "The bottom line is that it is one of the best families in the world and you have to make the most of the opportunities you get." Sanan, who purchased a half sister to Miraloma for \$700,000 at Monday's opening session of the sale, bought this daughter of the stakes winner in partnership with Coolmore. Five colts and four fillies reached seven figures, including three yearlings who fetched over \$2 million, during the final session of the three-session sale. Overall, 20 yearlings reached seven figures--the highest number since 24 hit the milliondollar mark in 1985 and the fourth highest number in sale history.

During the Tuesday afternoon session of the sale, John Ferguson went to \$1.4 million to bring home hip number 84, a colt by Deputy Minister--Good Mood (Devil's Bag). The session-topping bay was one of five horses Ferguson purchased for Sheikh Mohammed al Maktoum for a total of \$4.475 million Tuesday afternoon. The top-priced filly of the afternoon was hip number 79, a daughter of the late Mr. Prospector and the Fit to Fight mare Fit for a Queen. Consigned by Three Chimneys Farm, agent, the chestnut was purchased for \$1 million by Dan Kenny on behalf of Eugene Melnyk. "It was about what we budgeted for her," Kenny admitted. "If Mr. Prospector hadn't died, there's a chance that she would have been about the same. But it made it a little more urgent this time to get her. Mr. Melnyk is developing a broodmare band and Mr. Prospector's success as a broodmare sire is remarkable." A full brother to last year's \$4 million sale's topper, a bay colt by Mr. Prospector--Angel Fever (Danzig), brought a final bid of \$1 million from Demi O'Byrne. The yearling, hip 133, was consigned by Stone Farm, agent. Yearlings from Eaton Sales, the auction's top consignor, fetched \$8,325,000. Figures for the three-session sale were up across the board. The average price, a sale's record \$581,932, rose 20.5 percent from last year and eclipsed the previous record of \$544,681 set in 1984. The aggregate rose 6.8 percent and the median rose 11.1 percent. There were 49 horses reported as not sold. "It's a very discerning market at the top end," said Keeneland Director of Sales Rogers Beasley. "Buyers that want the top, pay for the top. It's very much a buyer's market. Overall, we're very pleased with the sale."

Livermore, Phone Trick, Quiet American, Red Ransom, Saint Ballado, Seeking the Gold and Silver Deputy. Fasig-Tipton also offers the New Sire Showcase, with leading freshman sires Cherokee Run, De Niro, Distant View, French Deputy, Mr. Greeley and Mystery Storm represented as well as the first-crop unveilings of Grindstone, Hennessy, Honour and Glory, Maria's Mon and Unbridled's Song.

BYRNE SUES STRONACH Trainer Pat Byrne, who gave up champions Favorite Trick and Countess Diana in 1998 to train exclusively for Frank Stronach, is suing the Canadian industrialist for unpaid training fees and termination fee, according to *Daily Racing Form*. In a 10-page suit filed on Friday in Fayette Circuit Court in Lexington, Kentucky, Byrne claims he is owed \$84,000 in training fees and a termination fee of as much as \$300,000. Byrne has been rebuilding his public stable since his split with Stronach earlier this year and will have a string of horses at Saratoga this summer.

Despite working well yesterday morning, last year's Arc winner Sagamix (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}), will not be lining up in Saturday's G1 King George VI And Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot. Trainer Andre Fabre made the decision because the four-year-old did not scope well after the gallop. Roland de Longevialle, racing manager to owner Jean-Luc Lagardere, said: "Sagamix worked this morning but owing to the fact that a virus has been circulating Chantilly we gave the colt a routine scope afterwards. Andre Fabre was not pleased with the result and I doubt whether Sagamix will run again before the Prix Foy three weeks ahead of the Prix de I'Arc de Triomphe."

Turtle Island to Grand Vue Lodge:

Turtle Island (Ire) (Fairy King--Sisania, by High Top) will stand the 1999 Southern Hemisphere breeding season at Grand Vue Lodge in Matamata, New Zealand. The eight-year-old stallion, winner of the Irish 2000 Guineas, will stand for NZ\$7,000 (US\$3,672). Turtle Island began stud duties at Ireland's Coolmore Stud in 1995 and, until this season, had shuttled to Collingrove Stud in Victoria. WRITERS UP

AT THE SALES ... WITH BILL OPPENHEIM

Ashford, Coolmore's American division, has had one of two dueling contenders for leading first-year commercial stallion the last two years: Dehere vs. Holy Bull in 1997, Thunder Gulch vs. Tabasco Cat in 1998. This year's Coolmore contender is Hennessy, and after the first two sessions of the July sale he had his main opponent Unbridled's Song (one RNA'd Tuesday afternoon, one well-bred filly to come last night) well and truly on the ropes. Nine Hennessy yearlings were catalogued to the sale, all in the first two sessions, and all nine--five fillies and four colts--sold. They averaged almost \$560,000, with four bringing between a half-million and a million, and a colt selling Monday night for \$1.2 million to California trainer Robert Hess, Jr. Hennessy averaged more than 18 times his \$30,000 1997 stud fee, and no matter how many sell in however many more sales the rest of the year (starting with five more at Fasig-Tipton Wednesday and Thursday), this is some impressive performance. Wayne Lukas will get four of the nine as Padua bought three and Overbrook one.

Through the first two sessions, Padua was one of four leading buyers who'd spent 46 percent of the gross among them: all these figures will have changed again after last night's session (and reviewed in tomorrow's edition), but, after two-thirds of the sale, Demi O'Byrne, The Thoroughbred Corporation, Padua, and John Ferguson, plus partners on various buys, had bought 24 yearlings (28 percnet of the number sold) for \$21 million (46 percent of the gross). Those 24 averaged \$875,000 (about \$1.3 million average for Demi and The Thoroughbred Corp., \$700,000 each for Padua and John Ferguson); the other 61 listed sales in the first two sessions averaged \$403,000.

John Ferguson was buying for one of three famous names who reappeared at Keeneland July for the first time in some years, this being, of course, Sheikh Mohammed. He hasn't been gone for nearly as long as the other two, namely Brownell Combs and Nelson Bunker Hunt. Bunker Hunt received a round of applause when recognized by auctioneer Tom Caldwell after signing the ticket for a Kris S. colt for \$110,000 Tuesday afternoon.

The other story of the sale so far, without any question: the clearance rate. With the smallest catalogue in 20 years still only 68 percent of those through the ring were sold, and 13 percent of the catalogue were outs. We saw last year that the Repository is having a profound effect on buying patterns and price distribution, and that trend--"Vet No's"--is continuing unabated. It's time for owners to trust their trainers, agents, and vets, absolve them all from threats of lawsuits, and decide when "Vet No" means you've still got a reasonable chance of getting a racehorse. I would never advocate buying problems, but if there's a middle ground somewhere--and logically there must be--those who find it and farm it quickest will have made the bargain buys of 1999.
