AVERAGE SOARS AT FASIG-TIPTON The Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July Yearling Sale concluded yesterday in Lexington, posting dramatic increases across. During the two-day auction, the average sales price of \$75,037 increased 35.3 percent from last year's oneday sale figure of \$55,480. The high price yesterday was the \$350,000 bid Cam Allard needed to take home hip number 309, a colt by Honor Grades--Bo K (Raise a Native). The chestnut yearling was consigned by Whisper Hill Farm. "Fasig-Tipton, as a company, is extremely pleased with the sale," Terence Collier, director of marketing for Fasig-Tipton said yesterday. "We are gratified both by the horses offered by our consignors and from the response of our buyers. Of the sale, Collier added, "There was an extremely deep buyer base and a discriminating market. The sale had a flavor of the early '80s--with great demand. The market was strong for both colts and fillies and for young and proven sires."

BILL INTRODUCED TO CUT CAPITAL GAIN HOLDING PERIODS A bill which would reduce the capital gain holding period for horses from 24 to 12 months has been introduced into Congress by U.S. Senators Mitch McConnell and Jim Bunning. Currently, all capital assets--with the exception of horses and cattle--qualify for the lowest capital gains tax rate if held for 12 months. The two-year holding period for horses was established in 1969 as a mean to reduce tax loopholes. "The horse industry is extremely important to the country and for the thousands of Kentuckians who participate in horse-related activities," said McConnell. "There is no reason to treat horses differently than other capital assets and this legislation will remove unfair tax laws that favor other businesses."

WRITERS UP

AT THE SALES ... WITH BILL OPPENHEIM

The final totals at Keeneland amplified, if anything, the trends that emerged in the first two sessions. In what was certainly the smallest total number of horses sold in the 20 years I've been at Keeneland--about the equivalent number to an afternoon's business in September--48 percent of the gross was money spent by four buying groups: Demi O'Byrne, The Thoroughbred Corp., John Ferguson, and Padua Stable. This highest level of buyers is even somewhat insulated from the Vet No factor, because they're after the very highest quality, not quantity, anyway.

This Vet No factor is getting huge, when you consider that, between withdrawals (extraordinarily high for a July sale in a bull market) and not-solds, only 61 percent of the 216 yearlings catalogued were listed as sold. As I hope I made clear Wednesday, that's not a circumstance vets should be blamed for, nor am I in any way anti-repository. It is a great advance; the Vet No factor is an unanticipated side effect.

The fact is, there is, all of a sudden, a great chasm in value between horses who vet and those who don't. But common sense surely tells us that advances in technology enable the vets to find things they couldn't see before, but which didn't stop horses from winning big races. Sure, it's always been tough to find good horses, but it's hard to believe 40 percent of the yearlings which are July catalogue standard are such bad percentage chances, when the figure has been more like 20 percent in past years.

None of this, as we noted Wednesday, had the slightest impact on Hennessy. All nine yearlings catalogued by him sold, and they averaged a whopping \$559,000 and change. He had \$250,000 and \$300,000 yearlings at Fasig, and just generally has made a huge, overwhelming impression; as one 'judge' put it, they are just really good-looking horses. Wayne Lukas is clearly a fan; there are at least five going to him, from Padua, Overbrook, and The Thoroughbred Corp. There is a chance that Storm Cat is going to make the next important sire of sires; at least, the market very much continued in that direction at Fasig. Hennessy wasn't the only son of Storm Cat to ring the bell this week: Brookdale's Forest Cat also rang up a couple of big numbers 'across town,' including one for \$520,000.

I was a little surprised the Storm Cat half brother to A.P. Indy topped Keeneland for as 'little' as \$3 million, but minor glitches like that aside, you couldn't have missed the clamor for nice yearlings that vet if you tried. Who knows what circumstances can suddenly reverse economic trends--I certainly don't--but it's a stone-cold certainty to predict that, as long as the Dow-Jones is cruising in the five-figure range, nice yearlings are going to cost plenty this year. Round One to the sellers whose yearlings vetted.
