HASKELL MOUNTS TAKING SHAPE In the latest episode of musical jockeys, Pat Day has settled on James Stone and Arthur Hancock's Menifee (Harlan) over Overbrook Farm's Cat Thief (Storm Cat) as his mount for the GI Haskell Invitational Aug. 8 at Monmouth Park. "I've had a good deal of success with this horse." Day said. "Every time he has run against Cat Thief, he has beaten him. I also felt a good deal of loyalty to Menifee and I think that was the deciding factor." As for Menifee's performance in the Belmont, Day commented, "You can throw that race right out. I don't know if he was a tired horse or what, but he has trained well ever since and looks great right now." Menifee drilled six furlongs on Monday at Saratoga in 1:12 for trainer Elliott Walden. Mike Smith, who piloted Cat Thief to a second-place finish in the GI Blue Grass S. and a third-place finish in the Kentucky Derby, picks up the mount for trainer D. Wayne Lukas. Smith won last year's Haskell aboard Coronado's Quest.

FLORIDA DROPS PAIR OF LABS Debbie Miller, director of the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering, has dropped Industrial Laboratories in Denver and Truesdail Laboratories in California from the state's list of acceptable labs for purposes of testing urine samples for the presence of illegal substances in race horses. Industrial Lab had been involved in testing split samples of trainers Mark Hennig and Todd Pletcher earlier this vear. Both showed trace levels of cocaine containing less than 60 nanograms of the class 1 drug. The new labs added to the list are Maryland Racing Commission Laboratory in College Park and Cornell University in Ithaca, NY. Ohio State Lab also fell into disfavor with the State of Florida last year when Dr. Rick Sams failed to confirm a Bute overage on a Florida horseman because it didn't meet the lab's minimum criteria. This past June, Sams proposed a Drug Classification System to the Ohio State Racing Commission that required a minimum concentration of a drug in a horses system before a positive could be called. In the case of cocaine, Sams suggested 150 nanograms as the bottom level to call a positive.

Having suffered a slight injury while being prepared for the GI Kentucky Derby, Aljabr was a fine second to Sendawar in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Roval Ascot June 15 in his belated first start this season. Leading from the outset, Aljabr set a forcing pace from a group including Docksider, while Almushtarak brought up the rear. As the field came down the hill and into the straight, Aljabr was challenged by Docksider as the pair began to draw clear of the remainder. Aljabr tried to quicken away from Docksider at the quarter-mile marker but couldn't shake off his rival and the pair kept on resolutely to the line with Aljabr holding sway over his persistent challenger. Almushtarak, second to Among Men in this race last year, ran on best of the rest to take third close to home. Winning trainer Saeed bin Suroor said that despite his setback in America this spring, he would be back in the fall. "We prepared him for the Kentucky Derby but he was a bit stiff for two days before the race, so we decided to bring him back to Britain. Since we brought him back to Britain he has been working better and better, and he is now better than at any time. He will improve and will go for the (G1) Prix du Moulin (at Longchamp Sept. 5) and after that the (G1) Breeders' Cup Mile. We are likely to take him to America in good time in order to acclimatize." Winning rider Frankie Dettori added, "Aljabr is very courageous and we always thought he was going to be good. From now on we are going to have to take on the older boys. He was very tough and today had it all to prove against these good horses."

Magicalmystercat came into this race as the most accomplished filly in the field, unbeaten in three starts and coming off back-to-back stakes victories, including an impressive victory in the July 5 GII Landaluce S. at Hollywood Park. However, the opening day crowd of 26,720, unimpressed by the the chestnut's speed figures, made her third choice behind the darling of New York, impressive debutante Circle of Light who easily broke her maiden against overmatched Empire breds by 8 3/4 lengths at Belmont July 8, and Finder's Fee (Storm Cat), heroine of the Astoria S. at Belmont July 2. With the addition of blinkers, Magicalmystercat showed good speed away from the gate, pressing Regally Appealing through a quarter in :21 3/5 before gaining the lead after a half in :45 1/5. The Storm Cat filly dug in resolutely to prevail over the fast-closing Circle of Light. "When we ran her the two times at Hollywood, she would get the lead, but she was ducking and diving and she really wasn't focused," said winning trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "We called the stewards and said 'We know she is three for three, but if you let us put blinkers on, she'll run straight." Straight to the winner's circle, that is. Trainer Todd Pletcher said of his runner-up, "I am very proud of my filly. This was a big step up and she ran a huge race against a filly that had two more starts coming in to the race." Lukas was undecided about whether to send the winner to Monmouth Park for the Aug. 14 GIII Sorority S. or to remain at Saratoga for the Sept. 3 GI Spinaway S.

A winner of only a lowly Class E maiden at Chepstow July 3, Bachir belied his inexperience and, with the aid once again of a Monty Roberts blanket to enter the stalls, quickened superbly inside the final furlong to land his first group race in impressive style. Our Ambition (Ire) (Great Commotion) went straight into the lead from Ginola's Magic, Bally Pride (Ire) (Pips Pride {GB}) and Far Mount (GB) (Bluebird). Bachir soon raced in fifth, after a tardy start, followed by Hunting Lion and Bee Eight (GB) (Mujtahid). At halfway, Ginola's Magic and Bally Pride overtook the weakening Our Ambition as Bachir, tracked by Hunting Lion, moved menacingly onto the heels of the leaders. Bachir picked off the leaders approaching the final furlong with a fine burst of acceleration at the distance, and quickly put the issue beyond doubt. Hunting Lion ran on well to take second but could not cope with the winner's decisive kick. Ginola's Magic kept on well to safely hold third. The rug, developed by Roberts as something of a security blanket to quiet horses who are nervous in the gate, is placed over their hindquarters before they enter the starting gate, and comes off when the gate springs open. Winning trainer John Gosden said, "He is very, very nervous in his hind end, hence the use of the rug which is the most wonderful thing for horses like that. I was delighted with the way he travelled throughout and Frankie, who had never ridden him before, said the ground was better than Tuesday. The overnight watering enabled him to get his toe in enough."


