RIVERMAN DEAD Leading sire Riverman (Never Bend) was euthanized Saturday due to complications of colic. The 30-year-old, sire of 127 stakes winners, was retired from stud duty in 1996. "Riverman's influence on the breed will extend well into the next century. He was one of our most popular stallions for visitors from around the world," said Michael Hernon of Gainesway. "Everyone here is saddened by his passing." Riverman captured the 1972 G1 French 2000 Guineas and the G1 Prix d'Ispahan before starting his stud career in France. He returned to the United States in 1980 and stood at Gainesway in Lexington, Kentucky until his retirement. Among his seven champions, Riverman sired Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winners Detroit (Fr) and Gold River (Fr), as well as Triptych, Loup Sauvage and Irish River (Fr). He ranks sixth among all stallions by stakes winners and his 513 lifetime winners ranks him third among all stallions.

NEW YORK PURSES GET A BOOST The New York Racing Association purse account will receive a \$7.5 million boost as part of a tax-cut package in the New York state budget that will be passed today. The purse increase was announced yesterday by Senate Majority Leader Joseph Bruno. Bruno had been lobbying for a \$20 million purse increase, but NYRA officials were pleased with the smaller subsidy. "We were very fortunate to get a bill passed in 1995 that allowed us to make the necessary improvements to the three facilities (Aqueduct, Belmont Park and Saratoga) and to put in an initial purse increase," NYRA President Terry Meyocks said. "This will allow us to increase purses further, to improve the racing product for the fans and the horsemen." The additional purse money will come from a cut in the state's take of the parimutuel handle. The state was taking 3.7 percent of all monies wagered on-track. That rate will fall to 2.6 percent Sept. 10 and then to 1.6 percent on Apr. 1, 2000. Once the full rate cut is in effect, NYRA purses will rise by about seven percent. News cont. p2

The announcement in July, 1995, that Forty Niner had been sold to Japan for a reported \$10 million came at a time when this admirable son of Mr. Prospector was experiencing a downturn in his fortunes. He was struggling in 45th place on the sires' tables, with only one 1995 stakes winner to his credit, and his yearlings had averaged only \$191,250 at the Keeneland July Sale, compared to the previous year's \$285,625. He had sired plenty of good horses, such as Nine Keys, Tactical Advantage, End Sweep, Dalhart, Twining and On Target, but not the star performer that every high-priced stallion needs to maintain support.

It looked, then, as though the Hancock family had made a thoroughly sensible decision in letting Forty Niner go. But, as so often seems to happen, the stallion's fortunes immediately took a turn for the better. By the end of 1995 Forty Niner had improved his position on the sires' table to 15th, thanks to a team of eight stakes winners.

Then 1996 saw the former Claiborne resident sire the winners of more money in North America--some \$4,815,825--than any other sire, with help from such as Editor's Note, Gold Fever, Roar, Ide, Move, Jules and Announce.

Coronado's Quest's efforts helped Forty Niner back into the top 20 sires in 1998, when his sons End Sweep, Tactical Advantage and Twining were such a feature of the leading first-crop sires' table. And now Forty Niner's final Kentucky crop of three-year-olds is again keeping his name well to the fore this year, with Golden Temper, Ecton Park, Marley Vale and the German filly Miss Tobacco among its leaders.

Marley Vale's victory in the GI Test S. last Saturday emphasized that speed is her main asset, even though Forty Niner stayed well enough to win the Travers S. and to finish a close second in both the Kentucky Derby and Woodward H.

The filly's speed isn't surprising, though, in view of the bottom half of her pedigree. Her dam Waggley, who was at her most successful late in her five-year career, picked up a couple of stakes victories over six and seven furlongs at Gulfstream Park early in 1989 as a six-year-old.

As Waggley's name suggests, she is a daughter of Hagley. The son of Olden Times showed plenty of precocious speed, setting a track record for five furlongs in the Rancocas S. at two before stretching his speed to a mile at three, when he took the Withers S.

As a stallion, Hagley is best known as the sire of Committed, a very fast filly who won several of Europe's leading five-furlong events including two runnings of the Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp. However, he also ranks as the broodmare sire of Pharma (GI Santa Ana H.) and as the sire of the second dam of Sagamix (Fr), winner of the 1998 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe.

Marley Vale is Waggley's second stakes winner, following the Rahy filly Beau Blush, a winner of two stakes at around six furlongs.

Waggley's half-brother Proudest Doon (by Matsadoon) was well above average at three, when he won the seven-furlong Valdez S. and finished second to Pancho Villa in the GII Silver Screen H. over a mile. Their dam, Jungle Rhythm, was by Nail, one of the best two-year-olds of 1955, and she was a half-sister to T.V. Mark, a very useful juvenile in 1981.
