FREE HOUSE WILL STAND IN CALIFORNIA

The recently-retired Free House (Smokester) will stand at Vessels Stallion Farm in Bonsail, California, the *Daily Racing Form* reports today. Farm owner Frank Vessel told the DRF that his farm has purchased an interest in the likable gray and that Free House would not be syndicated. No stud fee has been announced as yet. The five-year-old was scheduled to be shipped to the farm next Wednesday and should not require any further treatment for the pulled muscle which he sustained while winning the GI Pimlico Special this past May and ultimately led to his retirement. "We're very excited to have him, especially seeing as how everyone in California loves him so much," Vessels commented.

HASKELL HAPPENINGS Queen's Plate winner Woodcarver (Woodman) will make his first start outside his native Canada in Sunday's \$1 million Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park. The gray had his final Haskell workout yesterday morning at Woodbine, going five furlongs in 1:00 3/5 and galloping out six furlongs in 1:14 3/5 with regular rider Mickey Walls in the saddle. The Canadian invader will head south of the border tonight, arriving at Monmouth tomorrow morning. Cat Thief (Storm Cat) breezed five furlongs in 1:03 3/5 over the Oklahoma training track at Saratoga Tuesday morning. Mike Maker, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas, said the GI Swaps winner will van down Friday morning. GI Dwyer S. winner Forestry (Storm Cat) worked six furlongs in 1:13 and galloped out seven furlongs in 1:25 Tuesday morning at Churchill Downs. Trainer Bill Mott's Haskell hopeful, Unbridled Jet (Unbridled), worked a half mile in a sharp :46.40 over the Belmont main track yesterday morning. The runner-up in the Long Branch Breeders' Cup S. at Monmouth, he ships to Jersey Sunday morning.

Bourbon Belle was sent off as the Spa crowd's second choice and set blistering fractions en route to her second graded stakes triumph. The chestnut filly scored in the Gill Thoroughbred Club of America S. at Keeneland last October and had won or placed in five of six 1999 starts. Bourbon Belle showcased her brilliant speed with a 6 1/4-length romp in Monmouth's July 4 Regret S. before faltering when third in her most recent start, the July 25 Endine S. at Delaware. Breaking sharply from the nine hole, Bourbon Belle went straight to the front and made the running under pressure from favored Prospector's Song, clicking off fractions of :21 4/5 and :44 4/5 before putting that rival away and sailing home for a daylight victory. Trainer Peter Salmen Jr was elated in winning his first Saratoga start and was eager for more. "This is the fastest horse I've ever trained," he said. "I'm going to stay here and go in the Ballerina (GI, Aug. 22). She's been primarily going six furlongs, but if she's fit enough to get six, I don't see it being a problem for her to get seven." Prospector's Song stopped badly after a half, prompting concern from trainer Randy Morse, "Truthfully, this is the worst race she's ever run. I wouldn't be surprised if we retire her after this." Defending champ Furlough (Easy Goer) finished well to be fourth.

The slight favorite rated in fifth early, swung wide for the drive and finished determinedly for his second straight win.

Churchill Downs Second Quarter Results:

Churchill Downs Incorporated Tuesday reported second-quarter and half-year results for the period which ended June 30. Net revenues for the second quarter were a record \$84.1 million, up 25 percent over the \$67.4 million reported for the same period in 1998. Net earnings for the quarter were \$13.7 million, up one percent from 1998. Diluted earnings per share were \$1.79 for the second quarter of both 1999 and 1998. Net revenues for the first half of the year were a record \$101.8 million, a 23-percent increase from 1998. Net earnings were \$10.7 million, an 11-percent decrease from last year. Diluted earnings per share were \$1.39, compared with \$1.61 diluted in 1998.

Scramble Expected For Illinois Racing Dates:

Each of the three Chicago-area Thoroughbred racing facilities filed preliminary requests for racing dates for next year with the Illinois Racing Board on Tuesday. Arlington International Racecourse, shuttered since 1997, has asked for racing dates beginning May 1 and ending Oct. 31, while Sportsman's Park has requested its usual winter dates from March 1 through May 13, but has also filed for fall dates Nov. 2 through Dec. 31. Hawthorne Race Course has applied for dates from Sept. 9 through Dec. 23. The Illinois Racing Board will announce the schedule for 2000 in a meeting Sept. 21.

Former Trainer Collins Dies:

"Gin" L. Collins, who trained Swift Ruler to victories in both the 1965 Arkansas Derby and 1966 Oaklawn H., passed away Monday in Hot Springs. He was 77 years old. A regular at Oaklawn, Mr. Collins also maintained a public stable at Arlington Park. Funeral services were held yesterday in Hot Springs.

Stallions Set to Shuttle:

With the closing of the Northern Hemisphere breeding season last month and the Australasian season about to get into full swing, preparations are nearly complete for those stallions shuttling to the Southern Hemisphere. A record number of departees, 86 in all, will begin their duties in the coming weeks. A total of 25 will make the journey for the first time and notable newcomers include **Air Express (GB)** (Salse), **Anziyan (Danzig)**, **Bahhare (Woodman)**, **Bijou D'Inde (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), **End Sweep (Forty Niner)**, **Generous (Ire)** (Caerleon), **Gilded Time (Timeless Moment)**, **Loup Sauvage (Riverman)**, **Peintre Celebre (Nureyev)**, **Sandpit (Brz)** (Baynoun {Ire}) and **Tale Of The Cat (Storm Cat)**. **Daggers Drawn (Diesis {GB})**, who is due to stand at Ballyhane Stud in Ireland next year, will be presented with his first book of mares at Curraghmore Stud in Waikato, Australia. There are also some notable absentees not making the journey south this year including **Barathea (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), **Hector Protector (Woodman)** and **Supremo (Gone West)**. The most expensive Southern Hemisphere nomination belongs to **Danehill (Danzig)** at a hefty A\$120,000 (US\$78,947). Next on the list: **Peintre Celebre** will stand for A\$60,000 (\$39,474) and **Red Ransom (Roberto)** (live foal) and **Woodman (Mr. Prospector)** at A\$50,000 (\$32,895) each.
