FASIG-TIPTON SARATOGA STARTS

TODAY The 1997 edition of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Yearling Sales produced **Adonis** (Kris S.), winner of the 1999 GII Wood Memorial, and **Mutafaweq** (Silver Hawk), hero of the 1999 G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot; **Rossini** (Miswaki), who sold for \$500,000 in 1998, is undefeated in three starts this year, taking the G3 Anglesey S. in Ireland and the G2 Prix Robert Papin in France. This year's edition of the Saratoga Yearling Sales starts tonight at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion in Saratoga Springs, New York. The catalogue includes the offspring of such top stallions as A.P. Indy, Danzig, Deputy Minister, Gulch, Kingmambo, Mr. Prospector, Seattle Slew, Silver Deputy, Storm Cat and Woodman. The lone Storm Cat in the sale is Hip No. 32, a filly out of GSW Miss Union Avenue (Steinlen {GB}) consigned by Eaton Sales, agent. The late great Mr. Prospector has two in the auction: Hip No. 148 is a colt out of GSW Beal Street Blues (Dixieland Band) consigned by Eaton Sales, agent; and Hip No. 186 is a colt out of SP Eaves (Cox's Ridge), selling as the property of Angus Glen Farm (1996) Limited with Taylor Made Sales Agency as agent. Hip No. 50 is a colt by A.P. Indy out of the Argentine champion and MGISW Potridee (Arg) (Potrillazo) from the Lane's End consignment. Also on offer are such as Hip No. 54, a full brother to GI Champagne S. winner Ordway (Salt Lake) consigned by Lantern Hill Farm, LLC; Hip No. 65, a half-brother to GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Gal In A Ruckus (Bold Ruckus) by Capote from Vinery Kentucky, agent; and Hip No. 150, a half-brother to champion Housebuster (Mt. Livermore) by Capote from Eaton Sales, agent. The three-day auction runs through Thursday, with bidding beginning at 8 p.m. nightly.

MARQUETTE ON HALL OF FAME MARQUIS

Marquette (Spectacular Bid), second in the GIII Palm Beach at Gulfstream in February and fifth in Hialeah's GIII Everglades in March, rallied for a 1 1/4-length score in yesterday's GII National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame S. at Saratoga. Unraced since a five-length triumph in the Apr. 16 Forerunner S. at Keeneland, the 6-5 favorite was always within reach of the pacesetters, moved up around the second turn to take charge a furlong out and drew off late for the first graded-stakes win of his career. "I knew he was going to be good from the first day I got him," said winning trainer Rick Violette, Jr. "He was not an attractive mover on dirt; I knew turf would be his game. I tried him once on dirt just to prove myself right. I think he's Breeders' Cup material. We'll look at the (Sept. 1 GIII) Saranac as a strong possibility." Winning rider Jerry Bailey added, "He could have been first, second or third (early in the race), but I thought it would have been better for him to give him a breather, especially since he hasn't raced in almost four months. He was the best horse today."

What was a good weekend for Unbridled was nearly a great one for the Claiborne Farm resident. A day after Unbridled's Eclipse Award-winning daughter Banshee Breeze had stayed on route for another championship by taking the GI Go For Wand H., Unbridled was represented in the GI Haskell Invitational H. by the lightly weighted Unbridled Jet, who showed plenty of potential in finishing a close fourth after having to be snatched up at the furlong marker.

What is interesting about these two offspring of 1990's champion three-year-old is that they are both inbred: Banshee Breeze is inbred 4x3 to In Reality and Unbridled Jet 4x4 to Raise A Native. Of course we have seen several other good examples of inbreeding to Raise A Native this year, including Unbridled's stakes-winning daughter Boom Town Girl (4x2) and Real Quiet (4x3), who is by another of Fappiano's grandsons. Coincidentally, Real Quiet is out of a granddaughter of In Reality, as are Unbridled's daughter Fee Fi Foe, a creditable third in the GII Railbird S. in May, and Banshee Breeze. The three broodmare sires involved here are, respectively, Believe It, Relaunch and Known Fact.

For a breeder to want to inbreed to a stallion, he must have a lot to offer, and In Reality--who was himself inbred 3x3 to the closely-inbred War Relic--is no exception.

It's a measure of In Reality's achievements, which included siring over 80 stakes winners, that he commanded a fee of \$80,000 at the age of 24 at Gainesway Farm in 1988, after his owner-breeder Frances A. Genter transferred him to Kentucky from his long-time base at Tartan Farms in Florida.

In Reality was a small individual, standing little over 15.2 hands, but his lack of inches was more than compensated for by his toughness, consistency and determination. Despite being unlucky enough to have been born in the same year as the superstars Damascus and Dr. Fager, he finished out of the first two only three times in a 26-race career. The Florida Derby, Metropolitan H. and Carter H. were among his victories and he filled the runner-up spot behind Damascus in both the Preakness S. and the American Derby. Coincidentally his son Known Fact sired Banshee Breeze's dam, Banshee Winds, from the very same family which produced Damascus.

To be precise, Banshee Breeze's fourth dam, Aunt Tilt, was a half-sister to Damascus. Several of Aunt Tilt's daughters did well, including her Cloudy Dawn filly Lost Virtue. Although she never raced, Lost Virtue produced four stakes winners, headed by Riverman's top-class European daughter All At Sea, winner of the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp, and Super Concorde's smart son Over The Ocean, a dual Group 3 winner in France. Less talented was Lost Virtue's Quack filly Quack A Doodledoo, but this triple winner did well with Known Fact, producing Banshee Winds, who earned an Experimental Free Handicap rating of 107 after finishing second in the GII Arlington-Washington Lassie S.

Quack A Doodledoo's half-sister All At Sea looks likely to add to this family's achievements. Her first two runners, the Nureyev filly Imroz and Mr. Prospector's daughter Insinuate, have earned black type in England and she has youngsters by Mr. Prospector, Woodman and Storm Cat.

Banshee Breeze represents Known Fact's best result so far as a broodmare sire, but this top-class miler, who benefited from Nureyev's disqualification in the 1980 2000 Guineas, is also the sire of the dams of the Group winners Talloires, Leap For Joy, Baroon and Struggler.

LUKAS & BAZE EARN THEIR PLAQUES Trainer D. Wayne Lukas was officially inducted into Thoroughbred racing's Hall of Fame yesterday in Saratoga Springs, New York. He was presented his Hall of Fame plaque by six former assistants: his son Jeff Lukas, Randy Bradshaw, Todd Pletcher, Kiaran McLaughlin, Mark Hennig and Dallas Stewart. The 63-year-old conditioner said, "There's a lot of industry people sitting here today and those of you who are concerned about Thoroughbred racing can rest and sleep well tonight because of young guys like this. Thoroughbred racing is in great hands and as long as we have young people like this, we'll be okay." Of his sometimes controversial decisions, Lukas said, "I've been criticized by certain people in the industry, some of them media members who don't always agree with what we do, but it's my nature to push the envelope every time. If you want a coach who wants to walk the ball up the court, you better get another guy, because we're going to run and press all the time." Lukas has trained 19 Eclipse champions, 13 Breeders' Cup winners and 11 winners of Triple Crown races. Also being welcomed into the Hall of Fame yesterday was jockey Russell Baze. "I've been pretty darn lucky to go to work for 25 years to a job I loved so much," Baze said. "I owe so many people so much for being here today--my parents for raising us and instilling the work ethic that got me here, my wife and kids: they give me refuge from the world when things are not going right, my agent (Ron Harris) and all the horsemen." Baze earned the Isaac Murphy Award for the rider with the nation's highest win percentage for four consecutive years. Equine stars Exceller, Miesque and Gun Bow also joined the sport's pantheon yesterday.

VICTORY GALLOP GROUNDED AGAIN GI Whitney H. winner **Victory Gallop** (Cryptoclearance), who had his trip to California for the Aug. 29 GI Pacific Classic at Del Mar postponed last week because of a cough, will not take off today, either. The four-year-old had been rescheduled for a flight from New York today, but trainer Elliott Walden said, "He didn't cough (Monday), but I wanted to give him a few more days. I'd rather breeze him here and make sure he is doing good. We may wait (to ship) until the last minute. We intend to make the race, but we've got to make sure he is okay. If he doesn't make the Pacific Classic, he will run in the Woodward (GI, Sept. 18 at Belmont Park)."

TRAVERS OUTLOOK A day after two major preps for the Aug. 28 GI Travers S., connections were assessing their three-year-olds' chances in the Midsummer Derby. Trainer Bob Baffert said GI Santa Anita Derby winner **General Challenge** (General Meeting) will not be running at Saratoga. "We're going to stay in California and wait for the (Aug. 29 GI) Pacific Classic (at Del Mar)," he said. "He's trained beautifully on that racetrack and it's such a long ship there (Saratoga) and back." General Challenge worked seven furlongs in 1:23 2/5 over the Del Mar main track yesterday morning. If Baffert is represented in the Travers, it will be by **Forestry** (Storm Cat), third in Sunday's GI Haskell at Monmouth Park. Trainer Elliott Walden's dynamic duo of Jim Dandy winner **Ecton Park** (Forty Niner) and Haskell winner **Menifee** (Harlan) came out of their respective victories in fine shape, but only Menifee is definite for the Travers. "Menifee came out of the race and we're in the Travers," Walden said. "With Ecton Park, it's just a question of running him back again after running him back after two weeks." Ecton Park may start in the Sept. 6 GIII Pennsylvania Derby. **Cat Thief** (Storm Cat) had to overcome a broken bridle before his game runner-up finish in the Haskell. "His bridle broke in the paddock, so we didn't get to use his normal figure-eight noseband," explained trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "He ran awful well without it." Cat Thief will now aim for the Travers.

ROBERTS' DISPERSAL SET FOR KEENELAND NOVEMBER Bea and Robert Roberts, one of the leading owners in the country, will disperse their horses in training and their breeding stock at Keeneland in November. The stable is currently in the top 10 in both earnings and races won. The Roberts will sell 100 horses in training, 80 broodmares and six weanlings on Nov. 7, the first day of the Keeneland November Sale. Included in the offering is SW **Gold From the West** (West by West), who was third in the GI Ashland S. and second in the GIII Delaware Oaks last time out. The Roberts will keep their yearlings and remain in racing. Alex Rankin's Upson Downs Farm will represent the stable in the sale of broodmares and weanlings. Stanley Hough will be the agent for the horses in training.

WAGON LIMIT RETIRED Wagon Limit (Conquistador Cielo--Darlin Lindy {Cox's Ridge}), who defeated Horse of the Year Skip Away to win the 1998 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, has been retired from racing. "He really has a lot more speed than we let him use in his races because we trained him to go long," said the five-year-old's trainer Allen Jerkens. "There is no doubt about his class." Wagon Limit won six of 20 starts for earnings of \$992,660. No stud plans have been announced.

She split the field when sixth in the 1998 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1000 Guineas) and added the G3 Prix Chloe in a five-race sophomore campaign before coming to the States, where in a pair of starts she was second by a nose to Belmont allowance foes and fifth in the GII New York H. in her last start July 17. The bay rated kindly, came four wide into the stretch and drew clear under a hand ride.

MIKEY HEATON-ELLIS DIES AT AGE 41

Trainer Mikey Heaton-Ellis has died at the age of 41 after suffering from motor neuron disease. He rode as an amateur rider over jumps between 1977 and 1981, gathering 11 winners, but in 1982 he broke his back in a riding accident and had to use a wheelchair. Clive Cox, his assistant, said yesterday, "He was the most amazing man. He never mentioned his problems. Motor neuron disease was diagnosed 18 months ago and not once did it get him down. He was a great example to us all." Heaton-Ellis, who started out in 1991, did well with Speedy Classic (USA) (15 victories) and Lord High Admiral (Can) (11), and had 125 wins to his credit. John Dunlop, who had employed him as an assistant from 1985 to 1987, said, "It is very, very sad news. He had more than his fair share of problems, but he was a very resolute young man." The funeral will take place at 2 p.m. Friday at St Mary's Church, Marlborough.

2nd Dam: Park Appeal (Ire), by Ahonoora (GB)

3rd Dam: Balidaress (Ire), by Balidar (Ire)

When Warning retired to Banstead Manor Stud at the end of 1989, this champion two-year-old and miler brought with him much more than just an outstanding racing record. As a son of Known Fact and Roberto's classic-placed daughter Slightly Dangerous, Warning also had the considerable attraction of being a top-class outcross for Europe's proliferating number of Northern Dancer line mares. As a consequence, he received a sizeable number of mares by Northern Dancer or by one or other of his many sons and grandsons, and the ploy worked well. He sired the Group-winning Inzar from a daughter of Northern Dancer, and the very good Group winners Prophecy and Decorated Hero from Lyphard mares.

However, it has been Warning's partnership with Sadler's Wells mares that has been strikingly successful. Among his first few foals out of mares by the perennial champion sire were Bishop of Cashel, who gained the first of his three Group wins in the G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte in 1994, and Charnwood Forest, who developed into one of the best milers of 1996 after finishing second in the 1995 St James's Palace S. Now this partnership has come up with another very good performer in the shape of Diktat, who improved his record to six wins from eight starts when he landed the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest last Sunday.

The success of Bishop of Cashel and Charnwood Forest encouraged breeders to send numerous daughters of Sadler's Wells to Warning in his last two seasons in England, 1995 and 1996, the end result being a total of 29 foals bred on these lines. One of the 1995 matings produced Sumati, a Group-placed Listed winner in Italy, and I will be surprised if this nick doesn't also produce some good performers among Warning's 1999 juveniles.

One of the initial incentives for sending mares by Sadler's Wells to Warning was that they produced 4 x 5 inbreeding to Hail to Reason and 5 x 5 to Native Dancer. As both these famous stallions figure among the four great-grandires in Sadler's Wells' pedigree, this was an attractive way of attempting to reinforce their influence, especially if the mare had failed to live up to expectations while in training. It is worth pointing out that Charnwood Forest's dam never raced, that Bishop of Cashel's had a comparatively modest Timeform rating of 84 and that Diktat's dam, Arvola, was rated only 75 after winning a mile maiden at Nottingham.

Needless to say, Arvola came from a very good family. Her dam, Park Appeal, was the champion two-year-old filly of 1984, when her Group 1 wins included the Cheveley Park S. and Moyglare Stud S. Park Appeal in turn is a daughter of the exceptional broodmare Balidaress, which makes her a half-sister to Alydaress (Irish Oaks), Desirable (Cheveley Park S. and dam of the classic-winning Shadayid) and Nashamaa. For quite a while, Park Appeal looked destined to be a disappointment as a broodmare, but she has made full amends over the last two years, which have seen her son Cape Cross become a Group 1 winner and her daughters Pastorale and Arvola produce the Group winners Kareymah and Diktat, respectively.
