### VICTORY GALLOP RETIRED

Prestonwood Farm's Victory Gallop (Cryptoclearance --Victorious Lil, by Vice Regent) tore a suspensory ligament in his left front leg, possibly during his game score over Behrens in the Aug. 1 GI Whitney H. at Saratoga, and has been retired from racing. "(Thursday) morning he had a little filling behind his pastern," trainer Elliott Walden said. "He had an ultrasound and it revealed a tear in his suspensory. He's too valuable a horse to try to rehabilitate, and it would have been a six-month process. We decided to retire him fairly quickly. After doing the homework, it was the right thing to do." Walden insisted that the cough which had kept Victory Gallop from shipping to California for the GI Pacific Classic was not a smoke screen to cover the injury. "People might think the cough was a mirage, but it wasn't," he said. "He did cough (after the Whitney). We got the cough cleared up and he had only galloped two days since the Whitney. (The injury) didn't really show up until he had a couple of days of galloping. That's what happens with a soft tissue injury. It might separate and tear during the race, but when they do something on the track (after the race), that's when the actual hemorrhage comes." Victory Gallop, who thwarted Real Quiet's Triple Crown bid with his nose triumph in the 1998 GI Belmont S. after finishing second in both the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness, retires with a record of nine wins, five seconds and a third in this year's G1 Dubai World Cup from his 17 starts. He earned \$3,505,895. The four-year-old will stand stud at Prestonwood Farm in Versailles, Kentucky. His stud fee has not yet been determined. "The fact is, he's done enough in his career to make a great stallion prospect," co-owner Art Preston said.

### YAGLI CONTINUES MARCH ON ECLIPSE

Yagli (Jade Hunter), runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf and GI Hollywood Turf Cup last year, has stamped himself as the top U.S. turf horse this season, but today's GI Sword Dancer Invitational at Saratoga should be his toughest test to date. Trainer Bill Mott had been giving Yagli plenty of time between races, but his star will be running on only two weeks rest after a 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>length win as the 1-10 choice in the July 31 GI United Nations H. at Monmouth. The six-year-old has taken three straight Grade I races and has been out of the money only once in 19 career turf starts. Honor Glide (Honor Grades) may be returning to his three-year-old form, where he won Arlington's Mid-America Triple. His last run was a win in the GII Bowling Green H. at Belmont July 10, which followed an allowance second at Belmont and a trainer change to Christophe Clement. Finishing third (disgualified to fourth) to Honor Glide in the Bowling Green was favorite Federal Trial (Skip Trial). He had been first or second in his previous nine starts, and chased Yagli home in the GI Manhattan H. June 5 at Belmont. Supreme Sound (Superlative {GB}) made his U.S. debut in the United Nations, leading from the start, but Yagli ran him down fairly easily and he had to settle for second.

Having run 10th in the G2 Keio Hai Spring Cup in Japan May 15, Lend A Hand, last season's G1 2000 Guineas runner-up, made spectacular amends here to give Frankie Dettori his 200th career Group race win. Auction House (Exbourne) broke well to lead, but only set a steady gallop as Lend A Hand stalked in second. The pacesetter was still in front with three furlongs to go, but Dettori was sitting with a double handful. He gave his mount his head at the guartermile marker and the colt readily accelerated clear of his rivals. Teapot Row and Exeat ran on well from the rear and dueled for the minor honors, with Teapot Row proving just the better. Referring to his landmark, Dettori said, "It is a good total to reach in the 12 or so years I have been riding and let's hope the next 10 years are as good. I have been very lucky to ride for someone like Sheikh Mohammed." Referring to Lend A Hand, Dettori added, "This horse has lots of class and he did finish second in a verv good 2000 Guineas last season. He possesses plenty of speed and plenty of gears and won in the style he was entitled to. His rivals were good horses, but only Group 2 and 3 class. Lend A Hand is a genuine Group 1 colt and I came here with plenty of confidence."

Idle Rich nabbed her first graded-stakes win in the process of collecting her second straight Spa victory. The chestnut won the Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial S, in Ireland and placed in the G2 Pretty Polly S. at The Curragh before her purchase by Stonerside last autumn. She cruised through her conditions this spring in New York, beginning with an allowance win at Aqueduct Apr. 28, before a narrow defeat (beaten a nose and a head) when third in a June 25 Belmont allowance. Favored off an impressive allowance win July 30 over the same distance, the public choice pressed Bundling's early pace, accelerated past that rival turning for home and drew clear through the straight in a time just four ticks over the course record. "I was optimistic that this filly would run well today," said winning trainer Bill Mott. "I wouldn't be ready to say that she is in the top echelon right now, but she is certainly on her way in that direction." Idle Rich was the third winner on the card for jockey Jerry Bailey. "There's no doubt about it: Mr. Mott always has them ready," said Bailey. "Basically, I just wanted to keep her out of trouble and not mess up the pace."

**ARLINGTON RACES TO BE GRADED IN 2000** The

Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association's American Graded Stakes Committee announced yesterday that the stakes at Arlington International will be graded for the track's reopening next year. "Arlington International has assured the Committee that all 18 of its races that were eligible for 1999 grades will be conducted in 2000 under the same conditions and with at least the same purse value as they had when they were last run in 1997," Committee Chairman Russell B. Jones, Jr. said. "We have a history for these races, and we are assured of their continuity, so we're going to evaluate Arlington's races at this year's grading session in the same manner as we review all other eligible races. At that time, if the Committee considers that their most recent renewals through 1997 (were) on a par with those of other graded races in their divisions, then Arlington's races will receive grade designations for the year 2000." While the Committee's published quidelines state that if a race has not been run for two or more years it is ineligible for grading, Jones explained, "Our guidelines also emphatically state that the American grading system must always incorporate judgement and flexibility...our members gave this matter considerable thought and, finally, were unanimous in their decision that to include Arlington International races in our ongoing grading process is the most appropriate response to the changes that have taken place in that region."

### LADBROKES DROPS MINIMUM STAKE ON PHONE BETS

It comes at a time when Britishbased telephone bookmakers are losing customers to off-course operators who charge lower deductions but have higher minimums. John O'Reilly, commercial director at Ladbrokes, said, "By reducing our minimum stake, we want to widen the appeal of betting by telephone to even more potential customers." Both the Tote and Bet Direct already offer a minimum stake per call of £5.


### NEW SALES COMPLEX AT BADEN-BADEN COMPLETED
