#### REGALLY RALLIES TO TAKE ADIRONDACK

Regally Appealing (Valid Appeal) was no secret in her unveiling at Belmont Park July 1 and disappointed none of her backers at 3-2, dueling for the opening half mile, then drawing clear to a 3 3/4-length tally. The six-furlong July 28 GII Schuylerville marked the next and most recent start for the dark bay. Breaking alertly, Regally Appealing dueled with eventual winner Magicalmysterycat (Storm Cat) but could not match strides in the final yards, ultimately finishing third, beaten only three-partsof-a-length. Trainer John Kimmel cross entered his filly in last Saturday's GII Sorority at Monmouth Park, but the decision to hold her out for the Adirondack would be rewarded. Longshot Trump My Heart (Runaway Groom), Magicalmysterycat and the Bob Baffert trained Miss Wineshine (Wolf Power {Saf}) engaged in a protracted scramble for the lead, while Edgar Prado had Regally Appealing tucked neatly just behind those rivals. The trio of leaders was still at it into the stretch, with Miss Wineshine gaining a narrow lead at the eighth pole, but Regally Appealing had conserved just enough energy early to nip the favorite at the wire. Prado talked of the race strategy. "Last time it was a speed favoring track, so we decided to send. (Today) we decided to ease back and let her run at the end. When I asked her to run, she responded." The winner could go next in the GI Spinaway Sept. 3.

#### WORLD CUP VICTOR FACES 11 AT YORK

In his first race since winning the G1 Dubai World Cup in March, Godolphin colorbearer Almutawakel (GB) (Machiavellian) must tackle a quality field of 12 and translate his solid form over the Dubai sand to the turf. The four-year-old colt did capture the G1 Prix Jean Prat over the Chantilly turf in May 1998. Royal Anthem (Theatrical {Ire}), winner of last year's GI Canadian International, will bid for compensation after runner-up finishes in both the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom June 4 and the G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot June 18. Greek Dance (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), the subject of a strong ante-post gamble, was impressive when easily winning the G3 Rose Of Lancaster S. at Haydock Aug. 7, and is right back to form. Compton Admiral (GB) (Suave Dancer) caused something of a stir when winning the G1 Coral-Eclipse at Sandown July 3 while Golden Snake (Danzig), a determined winner of the G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly June 6, deserves consideration.

Melbourne-based Peter Hayes has nominated 118, ahead of Jack and Bob Ingham's Woodlands Stud syndicate with 80.

If the family descending from Lassie Dear and her daughter Weekend Surprise gets much hotter, there will be a danger of spontaneous combustion. Not content with providing the \$3 million sale topper at Keeneland and a \$1.35 million filly at Saratoga, this family has been busily reminding everyone that it is a fine source of stallions.

Of course Weekend Surprise's Storm Bird colt, Summer Squall, has Charismatic heading his team of 1999 stakes winners, while A.P. Indy, her son by Seattle Slew, has Symboli Indy (JPN-G1), Old Trieste and Stephen Got Even among his current team. Lassie Dear's Danzig colt Deerhound promises to be back in the news before long, judging by the recent comeback win by his champion daughter Countess Diana, and Deerhound's younger brother, Foxhound, has made a fast start in Europe with his first crop. Similarly, Lassie Dear's grandson Shuailaan has drawn attention to himself with three winners among his first four starters and now Honor Grades (by Danzig out of Weekend Surprise) has supplied the winner of the GI Sword Dancer Invitational H., in the shape of the back-to-form Honor Glide.

As a three-year-old, Honor Grades was probably better known for having celebrity owners, including Wayne Gretzky and Magic Johnson, than for anything he actually achieved on the track. After being rated 112 on the Experimental Free Handicap for 1990, when he raced for William S. Farish and W.S. Kilroy, Honor Grades finished second in the Derby Trial S. for his new

owners. Even so, he was one of the outsiders for the Preakness S.--a race won by Summer Squall the previous year--and finished last behind Hansel.

As a son of Danzig, Honor Grades was naturally tried on turf, winning an allowance at Belmont, but a stakes victory continued to elude him. He retired early in 1993 to Bonnie Heath Farm near Ocala as a winner of five of his 24 starts but his racing record paled into insignificance against the fact that he shared the same dam as Summer Squall and A.P. Indy. Honor Grades has never been short of support and he put himself on the map in 1997 when Honor Glide--a colt from his first crop--completed Arlington Park's Mid-America turf triple. By last year he had been transferred from Florida to Kentucky to stand at Darby Dan Farm, so the best may yet be to come from this very well-bred horse.

Honor Glide's dam, Becky Branch once sold for as little as \$6,700. It is one of those strange contradictions which abound in bloodstock breeding that this Run The Gantlet mare, who showed little ability on her only start, has produced a winner of nearly a million dollars, whereas her champion sister April Run, a winner of four major turf prizes over 1½ miles, is directly responsible for no winners of any importance. However, April Run is now the second dam of the graded winners Sir Cat and Weekend Madness.

Although there are one or two unfashionable names in Becky Branch's pedigree, she comes from a very good family. Honor Glide's third dam, April Slipper, was a sister to Panaview, a mare who made a major impact on the Irish classics by producing two winners of the Irish 1,000 Guineas (Front Row and Black Satin) a second in the Irish Derby (Ragapan) and a third in the Irish 2,000 Guineas (Kingsview). Honor Glide's second dam, April Fancy, contested the Irish 1,000 Guineas and also bred the Irish 2,000 Guineas fourth Northern View. So both of Honor Glide's parents come from families which have been highly consistent sources of quality winners, and the combination has produced a much better performer than could reasonably have been expected.

FOREST WILDCAT COLT TOPS SARATOGA
PREFERRED SALE A colt by Forest Wildcat--Cal at
Short (Ogygian) brought a sales-record bid of
\$350,000 to top Sunday's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga
Preferred Yearling sale. The bay was consigned by
Sugar Maple Farm, agent, and was purchased by
Buzz Chace, agent. The average price at the auction
was \$36,279 in 1999, compared with \$26,708 in
1998--an increase of 36 percent. Gross sales for the
77 yearlings was \$2,793,500. The 72 horses sold in
1998 grossed \$1,923,000. Thirty horses were reported as not sold.

FASIG-TIPTON CATALOGS 750 Fasig-Tipton will catalogue a record 750 yearlings for its 1999 Eastern Fall Yearling Sale at Timonium, Maryland. Due to the 25-percent increase over 1998, an extra day has been added to the schedule. The sale will begin Oct. 4 and will continue through Oct. 6. Catalogs will be available from all Fasig-Tipton offices on Sept. 10.

BUCK'S BOY LOGS FIRST BREEZE The 1998 Breeders' Cup Turf winner and champion turf male, Buck's Boy (Bucksplasher) recorded his first breeze of 1999 when drilling three furlongs Saturday morning at Hawthorne in :36, galloping out four furlongs in :49. Trainer Noel Hickey told the Daily Racing Form, "Please note he did this very much in hand. He was ready to work right now. But he's not nearing a race." Hickey confirmed that this year's Breeders' Cup is the ultimate goal for the six-year-old, but also indicated that he has no race or races in mind as yet for his charge.
