ROYAL ANTHEM TAKES INTERNATIONAL

Despite two defeats this season, Royal Anthem (Theatrical {Ire}) still held the trust of the punters and rewarded his supporters with a spectacular display to take yesterday's G1 Juddmonte International at York by the largest winning margin in the history of the race. His connections were undaunted by recent runner-up finishes in the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom June 4 and in the G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot June 18, and their faith held true as Royal Anthem easily put daylight between himself and a field of high-class rivals. On the run to the final bend, with five furlongs to go, Gary Stevens' patience finally ran out and he sent Royal Anthem into the lead. Greek Dance (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) challenged with three furlongs to run, but the victor simply bounded away from the field and won as he pleased in splendid isolation. Stevens enthused, "He buried a very good field and I can't ever remember winning a Group 1 that easily." Ahmed Salman of The Thoroughbred Corporation added, "This is the best horse, at a mile and a quarter, on planet Earth, I don't know about the other planets." The colt could start next in either the Sept. 11 G1 Irish Champion S. or in the Oct. 16 G1 Champion S. at Newmarket.

11 SET FOR OAKS REMATCH

A quality field of 11 fillies will line up today for the Yorkshire Oaks at York, in what looks like a rematch of the G1 Vodafone Oaks at Epsom. Ramruma (Diesis {GB}) was successful on that day in June while Noushkey (GB) (Polish Precedent) ran second, Zahrat Dubai (GB) (Unfuwain) third and Sunspangled (Ire) (Caerleon) sixth. Ramruma followed her English Oaks win with a powerful display in the G1 Irish Oaks at The Curragh July 11, and is a strong contender to record her fifth win from five starts this season. Noushkey proved her Epsom second was no fluke when winning by a wide margin from Mistle Song (GB) (Nashwan) in the G3 Lancashire Oaks. Zahrat Dubai was a game winner of the G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood July 31 and, while she failed to see out the Oaks trip, this flatter track will be of assistance in her attempt to stay the distance. Cerulean Sky (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}) is an interesting challenger from across the English Channel. An impressive winner of the G1 Prix Saint-Alary at Longchamp May 23, she could manage only sixth place in the G1 Prix de Diane Hermes (French Oaks) at Chantilly June 13.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES by Alan Porter

"Girl Power" ruled on Sunday at Woodbine when the Breeders' Stakes, third leg of the Canadian Triple Crown, fell to Free Vacation. Not only did the three-year-old filly defeat males in the one-and-a-half mile turf test, she was also ridden by Laurie Gulas, the first female jockey to win a Canadian Triple Crown event.

Free Vacation is the first stakes winner for her sire Fly So Free, champion juvenile of 1990. After taking the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and GI Champagne S. in his first season, Fly So Free stayed well to take the GI Florida Derby at three. Later that year he reverted to sprinting to win the GIII Riva Ridge S. over seven furlongs, and at five captured the GII Fall Highweight H. over six furlongs. That being so, it is rather surprising that Fly So Free should get a horse who stays as well as Free Vacation, even though her dam Miami Vacation-a stakes winner over a mile at two--is by Far North (Northern Dancer--Fleur, by Victoria Park), a full brother to English Derby winner The Minstrel.

Often when horses outstay their pedigrees we find that the key connections are somewhat distant in the pedigree, and this may be what has happened here. Free Vacation's closest duplications are of Native Dancer, who appears 4x5 and Hyperion, who is 5x6x6. Incidentally, this pair both won classics at a mile and a half, Native Dancer taking the Belmont S. and Hyperion capturing the English Derby.

The key to Free Vacation's pedigree, however, may lie with inbreeding possessed by each of her parents: Fly So Free has the high-class runner Sun Again (Sun Teddy--Hug Again, by Stimulus) 5x5 as his closest inbreeding, while Miami Vacation has the good runner and great stallion Bull Lea (Bull Dog--Rose Leaves, by Ballot) 5x5 in her pedigree. Both Sun Again and Bull Lea are by sons of the extremely influential stallion Teddy. Sun Again's third dam One I Love is a half sister to Thankful Blossom, the third dam of Bull Lea. Thus, Sun Again and Bull Lea are rather closely related. It appears that in the case of Free Vacation, Fly So Free has benefited from being bred to a mare who reinforces his own closest inbreeding--to Sun Again--with inbreeding to Sun Again's relative Bull Lea. This background may be further supported by the fact that Free Vacation's sire and dam both have multiple strains of Hyperion. Hyperion's sire Gainsborough is a close relative to Rondeau, whose son Teddy is grandsire of Sun Again and Bull Lea. As we said at the start, this pattern of linebreeding to numerous ancestors far back in the pedigree is very typical of a runner who outstays his or her pedigree.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

Falstaff's daughter Ivory Bowl (f, 2, Falstaff--Conquista, by Conquistador Cielo) took her record to two-for-two with a decisive victory in the Mid-Peninsula S. at Bay Meadows. She has an unusual pedigree as she is inbred 4x4 to full siblings My Sister Kate (third dam of Falstaff) and Raise a Native.

Reinforcing a famous family worked well for Sonoma H. victor Native Brass (f, 3, Dixieland Brass--Shawl Dance, by Our Native). She traces to the blue hen Hildene, dam of champions Hill Prince and First Landing, granddam of champion Cicada, and ancestress of Grade 1 winners Crusader Sword, Cherokee Colony, Silken Cat and Petite Ile. Native Brass is by Dixieland Brass, whose granddam is a daughter of Hill Prince, and so has Hildene 5x6.

There is no doubt that Saint Ballado is benefitting from mares with Prince John in their pedigree. Prince John is already found in the pedigree of Saint Ballado's Grade 1 winner Sister Act and his graded stakes winner Fantasy Angel, and a new name was added to the list when **Daises and Nites (f, 4, Saint Ballado--Slew's Ann, by Slewpy)** took the \$100,000 Shocker T. H. at Calder. Saint Ballado is a son of Halo, and Halo's broodmare sire Cosmic Bomb is a half brother to the dam of Prince John.

Shibuni's Falcon (c, 2, Polar Falcon--Shibuni, by Damister), winner of the Premio FIA Breeders Cup in Milan, is yet another good runner with inbreeding to the Thong family. He has the full siblings Special and Thatch 3x3.

NEW SCENE FOR WILD EVENT Arthur Appleton's Grade One winner **Wild Event** (Wild Again--North of Eden {Ire}, by Northfields) has been retired and will stand the 2000 breeding season at Bridlewood Farm in Ocala. Wild Event captured the GI Early Times Turf Classic at Churchill Downs on Derby Day and made his final start in the June 27. GIII Firecracker Breeders' Cup, finishing third to Joe Who (Brz) and Middlesex Drive. Overall, the bay compiled a 22-10-3-4 record, for earnings of \$937,274. He is half brother to champion Paradise Creek (Irish River {Fr}), earner of \$3,401,416, and his dam is a half sister to champion and leading sire Theatrical (Ire) (Nureyev). Wild Event is nominated to the Florida Stallion Stakes series and the Breeders' Cup.

WAGON'S STUD PLANS FINALIZED Wagon Limit

(Conquistador Cielo--Darlin Lindy, by Cox's Ridge) will stand at Arthur B. Hancock III's Stone Farm, according to an announcement made by the farm Tuesday. Best known for his win over Skip Away in last year's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, the bay horse won six of 20 starts, placing in six others, taking home \$992,660 for owner-breeder J. V. Shields Jr. Wagon Limit will stand for \$5,000 live foal, property of a partnership. He is expected to arrive at Stone Farm this week and breeders are invited to come see him.

BERTRANDO FILLY TOPS CTBA OPENER A filly by Bertrando--When (Skip Trial) brought a final bid of \$200,000 from trainer Bruce Headley to top Monday night's first session of the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association's Del Mar Yearling Sale. The filly, sold as hip number 38, was consigned to the sale by Debbie Sands, agent. The CTBA sold 42 yearlings Monday for \$1,744,000. The average sales price was \$41,524--up 40 percent from last year's sale--and the median was \$27,000. Twelve horses were reported as not sold. "We're very pleased with the results of the first night," said CTBA General Manager Doug Burge. "Bolstered by the state's lucrative incentive program and restricted purses, the demand for Cal-breds continues to run high." The sale concluded last night and complete results will be published in tomorrow's TDN.
