NIGHT SHIFT FILLY TOPS DEAUVILLE DAY 3

Figures at the Deauville Yearling Sale continue to climb. After three days, the gross is up 15 percent from last year, with the average up 10 percent. And all this without the benefit of the Fares dispersal, which was held during the third session last year. Irish bloodstock agent Sally Carey signed the slip for the top seller during yesterday's session, Hip 175, a Night Shift filly out of stakes-placed Kate Marie (Bering {GB}). Consigned by the Haras des Capucines, the Irish-bred brought FF2.2 million. Trainer Freddy Head, who will handle the filly's career, also bought the second highest-priced yearling, Hip 286, a Baratheia (Ire) colt out of Banque Privee (Private Account); the dam is a half-sister to multiple Grade I winner River Memories and Group 3 winner Raise A Memory. Consigned by Haras des Capucines as well, the colt, named Blue Stellar (Ire), was purchased for FF1.6 million. The sale continues today after racing.

Toting topweight of 130 pounds after a 3½-month layoff, he broke a bit slowly and was settled in mid-pack, making his move into the final turn. As they straightened out, Seiun Sky took command and easily held off the late challenge of Phalaenopsis. "I didn't want to ask him strongly because of his weight," said winning jockey Norihiro Yokoyama. "I just let him run at the beginning."

Lazy Lode (Arg) (Lode), the latest addition to the Pacific Classic field, zipped five furlongs in :57 4/5 over the Del Mar main track yesterday morning. The five-year-old has been on the board in seven out of 12 starts since shipping up from South America, but has tried the dirt only once in the U.S., running fourth in last year's Pacific Classic. He did win a Group 1 and finished second in the Argentine Derby on the dirt in his native country.

Speculation about what might have been is generally a waste of time, but we wouldn't be human if we didn't occasionally allow ourselves to wonder how much the breeding world has lost through the misfortunes of some exceptional racehorses.

What might Cigar and Swale have achieved had they not respectively suffered from infertility and a fatal collapse? Would Shergar have succeeded in passing on his undoubted brilliance but for being snatched by the IRA after only one season? And would Troy, a seven-length winner of the English Derby, have left a lasting legacy had he not died at age seven?

Any such list of "what ifs" must sadly also include the great Easy Goer, a magnificent performer who retired to Claiborne Farm with a 14-5-1 record from 20 starts. His figures would have been even more impressive had he not been born in the same year as Sunday Silence, his conqueror in the GI Kentucky Derby, GI Preakness and GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

Of course Easy Goer gained revenge for his narrow defeat in the Preakness by handing Sunday Silence an eight-length beating in the GI Belmont S., with this mile-and-a-half victory coming just two months after he had lowered Aqueduct's mile record in the GI Gotham S. So Easy Goer possessed that hard-to-achieve blend of stamina and speed, in addition to film-star good looks and a flawless pedigree.

By Alydar (a horse whose record featured a number of parallels to his son's), Easy Goer was a brother to Cadillacing (GI Ballerina H.) and their dam, Relaxing, was a champion from the Big Hurry branch of the La Troienne family.

It seemed that Easy Goer could hardly fail to develop into a major sire, so much so that Claiborne gave him the stall previously occupied by Secretariat. But no one expected Easy Goer to suffer a premature death in May of his fourth stud season, at the age of only eight. His death meant that he left only 133 foals--about as many as some top stallions sire in a single season nowadays.

One hundred and thirty-three foals are barely enough to give an exact picture of Easy Goer's prowess as a sire, especially as breeders were denied the chance of adjusting the type of mare they sent him in light of his stock's displays on the track.

That said, there are some disappointing aspects to Easy Goer's record as a sire, including a percentage of stakes winners which hardly reflects the high quality of the mares he covered. However, his eight stakes winners feature six at the Grade I or Grade II level, namely the redoubtable My Flag (four Grade I wins, including the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and CCA Oaks), Wills Way (GI Travers S. and GI Whitney H.), Composer, Relaxing Rhythm, Jetto and Furlough, who finished strongly to take the GI Ballerina H. Sunday.

The credit for Furlough's talent has to be shared between Easy Goer and her dam Blitey. This daughter of Riva Ridge and the champion filly Lady Pitt produced a trio of notable offspring to Nijinsky II, starting with Dancing All Night (a Grade II winner over 1 1/2 miles) and following up with Dancing Spree (a Grade I winner over six, seven and 10 furlongs) and Oh What A Dance (the dam of Heavenly Prize and Oh What A Windfall).

Blitey has also excelled with some of her matings with Raise A Native line stallions, producing the Grade I winner Fantastic Find to Mr. Prospector in addition to Furlough to Easy Goer. Fantastic Find numbers the Danzig colt Treasure Island (second in the GI Peter Pan S.) and the Storm Cat filly Finder's Fee (Astoria S.) among her representatives this year. No doubt Furlough will also add further lustre to her family's glittering reputation once her racing days are over.

MIGLIORE OUT FOR THE YEAR Jockey Richard Migliore, who broke his right arm in a July 17 spill at Belmont, has pushed back his expected comeback date to Jan. 1. Migliore had hoped to be back in action by Oct. 1, but a bone graft performed on the arm has not aided the healing process as his doctors had hoped. He may need a second operation on the arm, but that will not delay his comeback any further. "Basically, I'm done for the year," Migliore said. "The doctor has seen enough growth not to have to operate right away, but it was a devastating injury and it needs more time to heal." Migliore said he will likely resume riding at Gulfstream Park, but has not ruled out the winter meet at Aqueduct. "If I think I'll need a kick start after the injury, I might ride the winter in New York," he said.

Off for five months after that start, the chestnut had been fourth in his three starts since, most recently missing by 1 1/4 lengths in a Saratoga allowance against open company Aug. 4. The third choice taking on state-bred stakes foes, he settled off honest early fractions, angled to the outside for the drive and outfinished Draw Shot to take the photo. "The race set up perfect for him," jockey Jose Santos said.
