MAZEL TRICK OUT OF PACIFIC CLASSIC

GII Triple Bend H. winner Mazel Trick (Phone Trick) broke down during a five-furlong workout yesterday morning at Del Mar while preparing for Sunday's GI Pacific Classic. The four-year-old fractured both sesamoids in his right front leg and, while the injuries do not appear to be life threatening, his racing career is likely over. Mazel Trick was nearing the far turn, when he was pulled up by jockey Chris McCarron. He was taken by ambulance back to the barn of Bobby Frankel where x-rays confirmed the injury. In recent weeks, the Classic has lost Victory Gallop and Real Quiet to injury.

DEAUVILLE DAY FOUR

With top price of FF800,000 for a colt by Sillery--Debbie's Law (Ire) (Law Society), the fourth day of the Deauville August Yearling Sale has again confirmed the vitality of the French market. Irish bloodstock agent Peter Doyle, very active for the last four days, signed the slip for the bay, consigned by Haras du Buff (Neustrian Associates) and sold as hip 391, the last number of the day. The second highest priced yearling of the day was hip 380, a daughter of 1999 first crop sire Green Tune out of the Top Ville mare Battani. Consigned by Haras d'Etreham, the filly was purchased for FF450,000 by the Wertheimer brothers. Through four days, 282 horses grossed FF161,830,000, up 12.3 percent from 1998. The average after four sessions is FF573,865, up 9.9 percent from last year.

One remarkable feature of Seattle Slew's stud career has been the ability of his less spectacularly performed sons to outsire themselves. Sons of Seattle Slew who were not high-class performers themselves who have still sired Group or Grade I winners include Slewacide (placed in one start), Gold Meridian (listed winner in Ireland), Air de France (one win in two starts), Synastry (stakes placed), Gleam Machine (one win) and Warring Nations (non-winner). Other graded stakes sires by Seattle Slew who were not themselves stakes winners include the very promising Gold Legend (unraced) as well as Seattle Battle and Breeders Bonus (both also unraced), Avenue of Flags, Kentucky Slew, Turkey Shoot and Slew's Royalty.

To the list of Grade I sires we can now add the name Slewvescent, sire of this weekend's GI Del Mar Oaks heroine Tout Charmant. Slewvescent, a son of champion Our Mims (herself a half sister to Alydar), cost \$475,000 as a yearling and earned just \$15,600 of that back on the track with one win from seven starts. Slewvescent, who now stands at Creston Farms in California, has been represented by five crops of race age, with 57 starters and 26 winners, including stakes winners Lazy Slusan and Kraal.

In the case of Tout Charmant, it has to be admitted that Slewvescent had some help from the dam, Charm A Gendarme. A sister to \$500,000 earner Charmonnier, Charm A Gendarme was herself a three-time stakes winner, her most notable triumph coming in the GIII Senorita Breeders' Cup S. The family, which traces to Magic Night--a Star Kingdom mare imported from Australia--has not been a top-class one in recent times, but Tout Charmant is its second Grade I winner of this year as the GI Carter H. victor Artax is out of a half sister to Fagers Charm, the dam of Charm a Gendarme. From a pedigree pattern viewpoint, the most interesting thing about Tout Charmant's pedigree is that the fourth dam is by Power Ruler. This stakes winning two-year-old was by Bold Ruler out of a Polynesian mare, and therefore bred on an identical cross to Boldnesian, the grandsire of Seattle Slew. Thus, Tout Charmant has the three parts genetic relatives 4x5 in her pedigree. The strain of Bold Ruler's sire Nasrullah also gets a lot of support in this pedigree since Seattle Slew has two other strains of Nasrullah, one through a daughter. Then Batonnier (Tout Charmant's broodmare sire) is out of champion two-year-old Mira Femme, who has in her pedigree Furrokh Siyar and Oil Capitol, two genetic relatives to Nasrullah.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

We note a very clever pattern in the pedigree of **Point Guard (f, 4, Regal Intention--Quiet Magic, by No Louder)**, winner of the Cover Girl S. at Hastings Park on Sunday. Her sire Regal Intention is out of a daughter of the mare Loudrangle, who also appears as dam of Point Guard's broodmare sire No Louder, giving Loudrangle 3x3. In addition, Regal Intention is by Vice Regent, who has a very similar Northern Dancer/Windfields combination to Barachois, the sire of Point Guard's second dam.

Winner of the listed Ballycullen S. at Leopardstown on Sunday was **Royal Rebel (c, 3, Robellino--Greenvera, by Riverman)**. He has Monarchy and her full brother Round Table 4x4, each time combined with Bold Ruler.

Oyster Catcher (f, 3, Bluebird--Brigid, by Irish River), who captured her first stakes victory with a win in the Belgrave S. at Fairyhouse, is inbred 5x5 to the mare Sunday Evening, who appears as fourth dam of both her sire and dam. Sunday Evening duplications are also found in Bluebird's sprint champion Dolphin Street (a close relative to Oyster Catcher) and the 1999 Group 2 winner Ronda.

My Baby (c, 2, Anjiz--Susita Duke, by Nostrum), winner of the Iowa Cradle S., has a rather unusual inbreeding. Her sire is a grandson of Northern Dancer, and her broodmare sire is by Northern Dancer's half brother, Nostrum, giving her Natalma 4x3.
