BADOUIZM BAGS LAKE PLACID

Following the scratch of the Patrick Byrne-trained entry of Nani Rose (Peteski) and Illiquidity (Sky Classic), former Byrne assistant Brian Ange recorded his first stakes when Badouizm (Shiekh Albadou {GB}) swept to victory in yesterday's Gil Lake Placid H. at Saratoga. The bay filly took a Churchill allowance June 9 and returned with a game second against her elders going 11 furlongs at Saratoga Aug. 6. Dropping back in distance here, Badouizm sat patiently off Confessional (Holy Bull)'s blistering early fractions and rallied three wide on the turn. Confessional held a narrow lead after a mile in 1:33 4/5, but Badouizm kept coming and gamely prevailed at the wire. Said winning trainer Brian Ange, "Thank God this came here at Saratoga. It's a great place to do it. She doesn't have a quick move, but once you get her going, she just fights." Winning jockey Robbie Davis was thrilled with his filly's win: "The pace was just phenomenal. She was really running her eyeballs out, and in the last eighth of a mile she just picked it up even more." Confessional held well after her fiery fractions and certainly took to the grass in her turf debut. Nani Rose was scratched with a slight fever.

After the fifth of six days, the L'Agence Francaise Deauville Yearling Sale in France continued to post gains over last year's auction. The gross, FF167,630,000, is up 11 percent from the 1998 figure and the average of FF509,514 is up nine percent. The buy-back percentage was six percent. Trainer Nicolas Clement signed the slip for the top price at yesterday's session, paying FF320,000 for a colt by Midyan--Riviera Moriniere (Fr) (River Mist). The yearling was consigned to the auction by Haras du Mezery. The sale concludes today.

MAZEL TRICK UPDATE Mazel Trick (Phone Trick), who broke down during a work at Del Mar Tuesday, is scheduled to undergo surgery Thursday or Friday at the Helen Woodward Clinic, according to trainer Bobby Frankel. "So far, everything looks good," said Frankel. "The ligaments are supporting the leg, so he should be OK." Dr. Larry Bramlage will fly in from Lexington to perform the operation. The chestnut colt compiled a record of 10-6-2-1 in the U.S. and France for earnings of \$435,633.

TURFWAY & GALLERY FURNITURE SPLIT Turfway Park and Gallery Furniture have split the partnership which saw the Kentucky track's premier Triple Crown prep run this year as the GII Gallery Furniture.com S. "We have decided to downsize the expansion of the Gallery Furniture.com brand for now," explained the company's owner Jim McIngvale. "For the time being, we're going to concentrate on the Houston area and the state of Texas to work out the growing pains we are experiencing." Turfway President Bob Elliston said, "As for next year, we are aggressively pursuing possible partners and don't foresee major difficulties in attracting significant corporate involvement for this great day of racing." Next year's race is scheduled for Mar. 25.

Touch 'N' Fly (Ire) (Catrail {USA}) will not run in Saturday's G2 Celebration Mile at Goodwood because of a bruised foot. The unbeaten colt will instead be aimed at the G3 GNER Park S over a mile at Doncaster Sept. 10 and then the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot 15 days later. Trainer Henry Cecil said yesterday, "Touch 'N' Fly was shod yesterday and had bruising in his foot. He wasn't quite sound last night and although he was much better this morning, we couldn't work him. He will swim for two days but I don't want to go half-cocked into the Goodwood race after he has missed a couple of days' work."



CORAL OPENS BETTING ON BREEDERS' CUP

Coral became the first of the British bookmakers to offer odds about various European-trained horses at the Breeders' Cup at Gulfstream Park Nov. 6, giving **Stravinsky (USA)** (Nureyev {USA}) the best chance. The winner of the G1 Nunthorpe S on his latest outing is 6-1 for the Breeders' Cup Sprint. Coral bet 4-7 that there will be no European winner, i.e. a repeat of what happened in 1992 and 1989 at the venue. It is 15-8 one winner, 7-1 two winners, 16-1 three winners and 33-1 four winners. Coral offers **Daylami (Ire)** (Doyoun {Ire}) and **Royal Anthem (USA)** (Theatrical {Ire}) at 12-1 and 16-1 respectively for the Breeders' Cup Turf, while **Aljabr (USA)** (Storm Cat {USA}) and **Sendawar (Ire)** (Priolo {USA}) are at 8-1 for the Mile. Simon Clare of Coral said, "People sometimes refer to Gulfstream Park as Graveyard Park when talking about Europe's chances but if you look at the last time we raced there, in 1992, we may not have won any races but European horses were placed. There was no Godolphin around in 1992 and during the last few years the operation has proved itself a force to be feared around the globe. That is not to say the Europeans do not face a very difficult task but we do not think it is impossible." At odds of 12-1, Coral has given Dubai World Cup winner **Almutawakel (GB)** (Machiavellian {USA}) the best European chance to win the Breeders' Cup Classic.

HUGGINS TO HIGHLIGHT BHB SEMINAR

Ron Huggins, owner of record-breaking stayer Double Trigger, Dido Harding, owner of 1998 Tote Cheltenham Gold Cup winner Cool Dawn, and Harry Herbert, of Highclere Thoroughbred Racing, will be among the speakers at the latest British Horseracing Board owners seminar at Newmarket Sept. 27 and 28. It aims to provide delegates with all the information they need before coming racehorse owners. The seminar includes visits to trainers' yards, the National Stud, Tattersalls and Newmarket races and costs £225 plus VAT.

LOOSE HORSE CAUSES DELAY AT WORCESTER

The start of the last race at Worcester yesterday the Worcester Goody Bags Are Best Intermediate National Hunt Flat Race, due off at 5 p.m., was delayed by 64 minutes after Red Radish unseated his rider Henry Oliver and bolted, evading capture for over an hour.
