#### **EIGHT FACE OFF IN TRAVERS**

A field of eight three-year-olds were entered yesterday for Saturday's 130th running of the GI Travers S. at Saratoga. Trainer Elliott Walden, whose Victory Gallop ran second in this race last year, will be represented by two runners. Menifee (Harlan), the 9-5 morning-line favorite, will break from post position one while stablemate Ecton Park (Forty Niner), installed as the 7-2 third choice, drew the five post. The duo captured the two traditional Travers preps, with Menifee winning the GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park and Ecton Park victorious in the GII Jim Dandy at Saratoga. Since 1968, five of 11 Haskell winners have also won the Travers. Since 1960, only four horses have parlayed Jim Dandy wins into Travers victories. "This is the premier race of the summer," said Walden. "There are big races throughout the year, but winning this one means a lot. There is a lot of history in this race." Four of the six trainers represented in the Travers are members of the Hall of Fame, including Bill Mott who entered GI Belmont S. runner-up Vision and Verse (Storm Cat) and Unbridled Jet (Unbridled), a troubled fourth in the Haskell. "We waited on Unbridled Jet for the Haskell and Vision and Verse in the Belmont and we were almost right with both of them," Mott said. "But they have both convinced me that they can get the trip and I'm looking forward to the Travers and to the races this fall." Both Mott trainees are listed at 12-1 on the morning line. Belmont S. victor Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo), 9-2, turned in his final Travers work yesterday morning at Saratoga, breezing three furlongs in :35 3/5 for Hall of Famer Scotty Schulhofer.

### MALEK HEADS PACIFIC CLASSIC FIELD

With 8-5 morning-line favorite Malek (Chi) (Mocito Guapo (Arg)) leading the way, a field of eight was entered yesterday in Sunday's GI Pacific Classic at Del Mar. The \$1 million race is the final stop of the NTRA Champions on FOX series which began at Gulfstream Park in January. In addition to the Chilean-bred favorite, trainer Richard Mandella will saddle 8-1 shot Lazy Lode (Arg) (Lode) in an attempt to win his third Pacific Classic. "Malek is a hard campaigner who always seems to be right there in big races," Mandella said after the draw yesterday. "Lazy Lode had a good work coming into this race. Although he's run mostly on the grass, he has won on the dirt, too." Lazy Lode, fourth in last year's renewal of this race and the only repeat performer, will have the services of repatriated jockey Gary Stevens. The 2-1 second choice is the Bob Bafferttrained General Challenge (General Meeting). The California-bred three-year-old was second in the July 18 GI Swaps S. in his last start. STEWARDS INVESTIGATE NANI ROSE Speaking on behalf of trainer Pat Byrne, owner Bob McNair explained vesterday that Nani Rose (Peteski) was scratched from Saratoga's GII Lake Placid H. Wednesday because she had mistakenly been given a shot of a nutritional supplement prior to the race. In New York, horses cannot be treated with anything but Lasix once their name appears in the entries. At the time the filly was scratched, the Byrne stable said the horse had spiked a fever, but she was in fact scratched by the New York Racing Assocation stewards after the treatment was discovered. According to Byrne, veterinarian Greg Fox was treating other horses in the barn and mistakenly gave the medication to Nani Rose. Blood and urine tests have been taken on the filly, but the results have not yet been disclosed. According to McNair, Nani Rose was mistakenly given a shot of CRE-O-PAN. The active ingredient in CRE-O-PAN is creatinine, which is a substance present in all animals that stimulates muscle function. It is not a banned substance, but cannot be given within 48 hours of a race. It is not clear how or why NYRA investigators discovered the mistake or why as many as a dozen investigators swooped down on Byrne's barn Wednesday afternoon. "As far as rumors go, there was no tubing or no illegal medication given to the horse," Byrne said. Byrne put the blame on Fox. "We will no longer use his services," he said. "A mistake was made and it was unfortunate. But you can't have somebody come in and make a mistake like that, one that is that costly." The New York State Racing and Wagering Board confirmed yesterday that an investigation into the incident is on-going. Fox declined to comment.

#### LADBROKES THE LATEST TO GO OFFSHORE

Pressure on the British government to cut the betting tax mounts as Ladbrokes, Britain's biggest bookmaker, vesterday become the latest and most significant company to announce that it is establishing a major offshore betting center open to U.K. residents that will avoid Britain's usual nine percent deductions. The offshore companies will instead levy a service charge of three percent. Ladbrokes will be massively expanding its facility in Gibraltar, opened in 1992 and servicing overseas high-rollers to date with 20 staff, by putting in a call center and employing 200 staff by the year end. Victor Chandler International started the trend to undercut British deductions rates earlier this year when becoming the first company to offer U.K. residents similar deductions. Peter George, chief executive of Ladbrokes parent company, the Hilton Group, said, "An important part of betting and gaming's future lies in services distributed via telephone, Internet and interactive television. Over the next year, we will expand our existing facilities in the U.K. and Gibraltar to offer sports and gaming products to a worldwide market through both telephone and e-commerce channels." In response to the announcement, Peter Bell, the British Horseracing Board's communications director, said, "We are naturally concerned about the impact on the levy if a sizeable proportion of telephone betting goes offshore, and any drop in income will need to be taken into account in the forthcoming negotiations on a new levy agreement." The Gibraltar operation is opening accounts now, but will not start taking bets until October, and an Internet site offering worldwide betting will start in the first quarter of next year. While Victor Chandler moved his entire operation to Gibraltar, Ladbrokes is creating a parallel operation in harness with its British one.
