"BEAUTY" BEATS THE "BREEZE" AT SPA

Beautiful Pleasure (Maudlin), beaten a half length by Banshee Breeze (Unbridled) in the GI Go For Wand H. Aug. 7, turned the tables on the champ in yesterday's GI Personal Ensign H. Sent right to the lead by jockey Jorge Chavez, the four-year-old filly skipped over the sloppy Saratoga surface, taking a five-length advantage into the stretch and holding on to win as Banshee Breeze rallied, but in vain, to be second. "She had a nice, long stride and a light weight (113)," trainer John Ward Jr. said. "Nobody could chase her; they could only pray that she didn't have enough strength to finish it up." Jockey Jerry Bailey, aboard the runner-up, said, "I've got no excuse. I asked my filly for run for more than a half mile and she still couldn't catch Beautiful Pleasure. I thought she handled the track fine." The winner will have one more start before the Breeders' Cup, but Ward has not decided where that will be. Banshee Breeze goes next in the GI Three Chimneys Spinster S. at Keeneland Oct. 16. "That's a weight-forage race and I think that will be the difference," trainer Carl Nafzger said. Keeper Hill (Deputy Minister), third, heads for the Sept. 18 GI Ruffian S. at Belmont Parrk.

CAN "THIEF" TAKE TRAVERS?

Cat Thief (Storm Cat) has faced Menifee (Harlan) four times and every time, Menifee has had his measure. But Cat Thief is getting closer. The two were three lengths apart when one-two in a Saratoga allowance last year. They were 1 1/4 lengths apart when first and second in the GI Blue Grass Apr. 10 and three-quarters of a length apart when second and third in the May 1 Kentucky Derby. But only a half length separated the pair when they hit the wire in the GI Haskell Invitational last out Aug. 8. Will Cat Thief get his revenge in today's GI Travers S.? "His last two races have shown he is racing great and he has been training well for this race," trainer D. Wayne Lukas said. "He is as ready as he is going to be." The chestnut colt went off form after the Derby, running seventh in the GI Preakness and sixth in the GI Met Mile, but he bounced back to pick up his first win of the year in the GI Swaps S. at Hollywood Park July 18. He just missed in the Haskell, contesting a lively pace after bobbling at the break before succumbing to his arch-rival in the final strides. But Menifee, worse than second only once in nine tries, is ready to test him again. Eighth in the June 5 GI Belmont S. after running second in both the Derby and Preakness, he enjoyed a perfect trip to take the Haskell.

One loss was enough to attract 11 challengers to take on sprint division leader Yes It's True (Is It True). The three-year-old was third in the Aug. 11 GIII A Phenomenon S. at Saratoga, his only defeat under a mile since Feb. 6, when he made his 1999 debut. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas said that Yes It's True did not like the sealed Saratoga surface that day. Before the loss, the three-year-old won six graded sprints, capped off with a score over his elders in the GI DeFrancis Memorial Dash. GI Florida Derby winner Vicar (Wild Again) drops down in distance after battling the best three-year-olds all year. He has been beaten a total of 52 lengths in his last three, but they were the Kentucky Derby, where he had a rough trip; the Preakness S., when he chased a fast pace; and the Aug. 8 GII Jim Dandy, where he didn't take to the slop and finished fifth. His last start at this distance was his maiden win, back on Oct. 14. Bob Baffert is always dangerous. His Forestry (Storm Bird) had a five-race winning streak snapped last out when he ran third in the Aug. 8 GI Haskell Invitational.

Ladies Din (Sovereign Dancer) won four straight, including the GII Del Mar and GII Oak Tree Derbies last fall, but hasn't visited the winner's circle since. He has missed by a neck and a nose in his last two, the June 13 GII Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile and Aug. 1 GI Eddie Read H., respectively, and is stepping up from his usual distance of eight-to-nine furlongs. Sestino (Shirley Heights {GB}) is making his U.S. debut for Neil Drysdale. Handled in France by top trainer Criquette Head, He was third in the G1 French Derby last year and has been in the money in seven of his eight career starts. In his French finale, he finished third in the G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly at 1 1/2 miles; this distance should be right up his street. Sayarshan (Darshaan {GB}) won the G2 Prix Hocquart May 3 at Chantilly, beating Sestino, and won the GIII Golden Gate H. on his U.S. debut June 19. but then was a eighth of eight in his last, the GII Sunset H. July 18. If his Northern California form was the real Sayarshan, he will be a factor.

Almushtarak runs consistently well at the group level and was placed in both the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood July 28 and the G1 Juddmonte International at York Aug 17.

Another Aussie Trainer Banned:

Australian trainer Anthony Cummings, 43, was banned yesterday for 18 months after being found guilty on four charges relating to the trenbolone steroid implant scandal. Cummings pleaded not guilty to two charges of having caused a horse to be administered the prohibited substance as well as two charges of conduct prejudicial to racing. He broke down and told Thoroughbred Racing Board stewards, "My penalty started six or eight weeks ago. It was an honest mistake, I was not being devious." Cummings immediately lodged an appeal and was granted a stay of proceedings. Owner David Bentata, among three others suspended for periods of two months to two years, denied influencing Cummings in any way. Cummings told the inquiry he'd given a "full, honest, open disclosure" and maintained he believed the implants were amino acids.

FRISK ME NOW RETIRED The negotiations regarding his stud plans are ongoing, but Frisk Me Now (Mister Frisky--Slew Me Now {Tsunami Slew}), winner of the \$350,000 GII Iselin H. at Monmouth Park July 4, has been retired and will go to the breeding shed next season. "The deal's not done yet--I'm waiting for the phone call," trainer Bob Durso said. "But that's it as far as racing is concerned. He won't race again." Frisk Me Now started 36 times, collecting 12 wins, five seconds, six thirds and more than \$1.7 million. A graded-stakes winner at distances from seven furlongs to a mile and a quarter, he captured nine stakes races during his career, including the GII Ohio and GIII Pennsylvania Derbies at three, the GII Suburban H. at four and the GII Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup Sprint H. and the Iselin this year at five. The Florida-bred bay will maintain a light training schedule at Monmouth until it comes time to head to the farm. "He still goes to the track every day, so even I'm not believing he won't race again," Durso said. "It won't hit me until he gets on the van."

SAINT BALLADO FILLY TOPS OBS AUGUST

FINALE Oh So Sensational, a filly by Saint Ballado out of Silver Canoe (Silver Buck), topped the final Open session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's August Yearling Sale in Florida Thursday. Consigned by Eddie Woods, Agent XXI, the dark bay attracted a bid of \$155,000 from Bo Hunt, agent. "We're pleased with the way the sale went this week," said Tom Ventura, OBS director of sales. "There was considerable demand for horses who looked like athletes, whether they were bough to resell or race. I was glad to see so many new buyers this week, along with quite a few of our old customers who haven't been here for a few years."

AQUEDUCT ON THE BLOCK? According to New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association President Dennis Brida, New York Governor George Pataki confirmed his intention to explore the sale of Aqueduct Racetrack when meeting with the horsemen's group at Saratoga yesterday. It was reported earlier that Pataki wants to sell Aqueduct, conducting all downstate racing at Belmont Park. The sale of Aqueduct could provide a windfall profit for the state, but Belmont would have to undergo substantial renovations in order to conduct winter racing. Potential problems include winterizing the racing surface, heating parts of the grandstand and building additional barns to compensate for the loss of stall space at Aqueduct. "It would cost megabucks to do it -- so much so that I think it scares people," Brida said. "But (Pataki) said he is very committed to winter racing, which is what we wanted to hear. If all of the potential problems could be addressed, we think he has a plan that makes sense."
