The three-year-old, whose racing career ended after he was injured while finishing third in the June 5 GI Belmont S., will stand at Lane's End next year for a fee of \$35,000 live foal.

RUNNING STAG TO SKIP BREEDERS' CUP

Running Stag (Cozzene), winner of the Gll Brooklyn H. and GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup H. in his last two U.S. starts, will not point for the Breeders' Cup Classic. His trainer, Philip Mitchell, explained, "Florida is a graveyard for European horses. Even though he has run a few times on dirt, he's still a European horse. European horses can't deal with the heat and humidity there." Running Stag will run next in the GI Woodward S. at Belmont Park Sept. 18 before returning to Britain to be prepared for the International meeting at Hong Kong in December.

Versatility is a quality which many modern European

trainers tend to downplay in their horses. Adopting the policy of "if it ain't broke, don't fix it," they try to establish each horse's optimum distance and then stick fairly rigidly to it.

One notable exception was the late Francois Mathet, who adopted a very adventurous policy with the likes of Zeddaan (GB), *Silver Shark and Blushing Groom (Fr). In the hands of the French maestro, Blushing Groom became only the second colt good enough, and versatile enough, to land France's four major juvenile events over distances ranging from 5 1/2 furlongs to a mile. Blushing Groom trained on to win the Poule d'Essai des Poulains, and Mathet next attempted to win the English Derby with this son of the fast Red God. Even though the experiment failed, Blushing Groom was far from disgraced in finishing third behind The Minstrel, and plenty of his progeny shone over 1 1/2 miles. For example, his son Runaway Groom won two legs of the Canadian Triple Crown, both over 1 1/2 miles, plus the Travers S. over 1 1/4 miles.

However, Blushing Groom's versatility reasserted itself in Runaway Groom's son Cherokee Run. This colt successfully progressed up the distance scale at three after equalling the track record for seven furlongs in the GIII Lafayette S. He took the GIII Derby Trial S. over a mile and then finished an excellent second, beaten half a length, in the GI Preakness S. over 9 1/2 furlongs. Although he later won the GII Dwyer S. over nine furlongs, Cherokee Run was transformed by Frank Alexander into a sprinter at four, when he never tackled more than a mile and became a Grade I winner in the Breeders' Cup Sprint.

Runaway Groom made his debut at stud in 1996, at a fee of \$7,500 at Jonabell Farm, and has made an eye-catching start, thanks to his remarkable daughter Chilukki. This filly's potential was already apparent when she drew a bid of \$875,000 from John Adger, agent for Stonerside Stable, at Fasig-Tipton's Calder Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale in March. "She is a very nice filly," Adger said at the time. "I like her pedigree. Hopefully, if she turns out to be a stakes winner, she would be a welcome addition to the broodmare band."

She will be all the more welcome now that she is unbeaten in five starts, including four graded stakes-especially as her pedigree is free of such as Northern Dancer, Raise A Native, Bold Ruler and Hail To Reason. The filly has every right to be precocious. Her sire won five of his seven juvenile starts and her dam, Song of Syria, is a half-sister to Doulab, a quick-maturing colt whose wins at two included the G2 Gimcrack S. and G3 Cornwallis S. Chilukki's second dam, Passerine, was a half-sister to Properantes (GI San Juan Capistrano H.) and her third dam, Pashamin, was a half-sister to *Seaneen (GI Californian S.).

*Tir An Oir, the fourth dam of Chilukki, was imported from Ireland and it is easy to see why. Her dam, Golden Penny (GB), was a sister to *High Stakes, a high-class gelding; parents Hyperion (GB) and Pennycomequick (GB) were both classic winners.

The question now is whether Chilukki will be able to stretch her speed to the 1 1/16 miles of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies later this year. There is no obvious reason why she shouldn't, as her first two dams are by the versatile Damascus, a winner at up to two miles, and Dr. Fager, a winner three times over 1 1/4 miles despite his champion sprinter status. Perhaps it's an omen that this race fell to Eliza, a filly by one of Blushing Groom's fastest sons, the last time it was contested at Gulfstream Park in 1992.

Steroid Scandal in Ohio:

According to the Harness Tracks of America newsletter, the Cleveland Plain Dealer reports that seven veterinarians in Ohio have been charged with administering anabolic steroids to "hundreds of Thoroughbreds and standardbreds" competing at tracks in the state. One case has been settled, with the remaining six awaiting hearings this fall. Ohio law prohibits the use of steroids for non-therapeutic purposes, but the state lab does not test for them. Cliff Nelson, executive director of the Ohio State Racing Commission, told the Plain Dealer that testing for steroids could drive Ohio horsemen from the state. Only Florida currently tests for steroids. "The only fair way to do this is to have a national standard," Nelson told the Plain Dealer. "There are concerns that Ohio's racing industry would suffer if we changed the way we do things." Dr. Richard Sams, the director of drug testing at Ohio State University, was quoted as saying, "The problem is, everybody does it."

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races. 
