Germany's main hopes will rest with Tertullian (Miswaki), who won the G3 Grosser Preis von Berlin at Hoppegarten July 24 in his last start. The much-improved No Warning (GB) (Warning {GB}) is able backup for the home defense. An interesting outsider with possible place claims is Su Tirolesu (Ire) (Tirol {Ire}) who has been a consistent performer in Italy.

WHITE HEART WIN SPARKS CONTROVERSY

In a controversial decision, White Heart (GB) (Green Desert) was allowed to remain the winner of yesterday's G3 Darley-Oettingen Rennen at Baden Baden despite nearly causing one of his rivals to fall. The Swedish-trained Intruder (Ire) (Polish Precedent) broke fast and set out to make all at a strong pace. She was closely followed by White Heart and favored Haami (Nashwan) with Miss Tobacco (Forty Niner) in midfield and Gonlargo (Ger) (Big Shuffle) bringing up the rear. Turning for home, Miss Tobacco made her move on the inside but was knocked into the rails by the challenging White Heart and was nearly brought down almost unseating her jockey. White Heart guickly joined Intruder, who still led, and both battled it right out to the line with White Heart asserting control close to home. Haami challenged on the outside and, despite edging right, just held on for third from the fast-finishing Gonlargo. The subsequent stewards inquiry allowed the result to stand because the hampered Miss Tobacco finished out of the prize money, a ruling which angered many of the assembled racegoers.

September 1, 1881...Sheepshead Bay...The Dwyer Brothers' Hindoo won his 19th consecutive race, a purse event at Sheepshead Bay. His streak was snapped, however, six days later in the September H. over the same track.

September 1, 1947...With a victory by Armed in the Washington Park H., **Calumet Farm** became the first stable to surpass \$1 million in annual earnings. Calumet led all owners for 1947 with earnings of \$1,402,436.

September 2, 1901...Seven-year-old Ogden won two races in a single day at Coney Island.

September 3, 1956...Washington Park...Swaps ended his racing career with a victory in the Washington Park H.; he was subsequently named Horse of the Year.

September 4, 1920...Belmont Park...Man o'War won the Lawrence Realization by 100 lengths, the largest winning margin in modern racing history. His time for the 1 5/8-mile race, 2:40 4/5, shattered the world record by 6 4/5 seconds and was his fifth record-setting performance of the year.

It's the Year of The Cat. Although Storm Cat has carried off the Champion Sire of Two-Year-Olds title four times, an overall Champion Sire title has eluded him. That key omission from his resume looks as if it will be corrected in 1999. Going into the weekend, Storm Cat had a lead of almost \$1,000,000 on the sires' standings, and events at Saratoga on Saturday lengthened that lead, with Forestry capturing the GI King's Bishop S. and Vision and Verse (Storm Cat--Bunting, by Private Account) running a game second in the GI Travers S. In Ireland, another Storm Cat son, Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat--Mariah's Storm, by Rahy), is headed for Group 1 competition after taking this weekend's G3 King of Kings EBF Futurity S.

The one-and-a-half-length victory in the King's Bishop--his first in a Grade I event--was also a vital one for Forestry. Out of a Grade I winning mare from the immediate family of Mr. Prospector, Forestry has a mouth-watering stallion pedigree. With a Grade I sprint victory under his belt, and with the recent demand for Storm Cat sons, he is guaranteed to be one of the hottest prospects in his crop when the time comes to retire him to stud.

Forestry, and another 1999 graded stakes winner, the filly Pleasant Temper, are both by Storm Cat out of mares by Pleasant Colony. Pleasant Colony is a grandson of Ribot, and in the early years of Storm Cat's career, deliberate efforts were made to cross him with Ribot line mares (particularly those descending from His Majesty, the sire of Pleasant Colony, or from His Majesty's brother Graustark). The philosophy behind this was a belief by the then Overbrook Farm pedigree advisor, Ken McLean, that the Tracery strain in Ribot (which is duplicated in His Majesty and Graustark) would work well with similar linebreeding in the pedigree of Storm Cat's dam, Terlingua.



The formula enjoyed considerable success in Storm Cat's first three seasons at stud, resulting in Grade I winners Tabasco Cat (dam by a grandson of Graustark), Mistle Cat (by Maribeau {Ribot}) and Sardula (dam by Hoist the Flag), as well as millionaire Mountain Cat (dam by a son of Graustark) and stakes winner Tempest Dancer (dam by Hoist the Flag). Oddly enough, there was then a hiatus, and it wasn't until Storm Cat's sixth crop, when breeders had the opportunity to review the early successful matings, that the next Storm Cat/Ribot unrestricted stakes winner arrived. The nick has cerainly come back with a bang, however, as there are now three Storm Cat/Ribot 1999 graded stakes winners, Forestry being joined by the previously mentioned Pleasant Temper, and by Corona Lake (dam by Alleged). With regard to Forestry and Pleasant Temper, the similarities extend further, as both are inbred 4 x 4 to Bold Ruler, and in both cases that horse appears as sire of the third dam.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

We have frequently remarked how often the first stakes winner for a sire has a special pedigree. This has happened once again in the case of Unaccounted For, who was represented by a two-year-old stakes winner from his first crop when **No Curfew (c, 2, Unaccounted For--Promiscuous Angel, by Deputy Minister)** won the WTBA Lads S. at Emerald Downs Sunday. Unaccounted For is out of a mare by The Minstrel (by Northern Dancer out of a mare by Victoria Park). No Curfew's broodmare sire, Deputy Minister, is by Vice Regent (by Northern Dancer out of a half sister to Victoria Park), a close relative to The Minstrel. For good measure, No Curfew also has Buckpasser 4 x 3 and Buckpasser's dam, Busanda, and her three-parts sister, Striking, 5 x 6 x 4.

The increasingly successful Danzig/Sharpen Up cross struck again when Invincible Spirit (Ire) (c, 2, Green Desert--Rafha {GB}, by Kris {GB}) took Monday's Ripon Champion Two-Years-Old Trophy. The key is that Danzig's third dam, the English Oaks winner Steady Aim, is a very close relative to another Oaks winner, Rockfel, the dam of Sharpen Up's broodmare sire, Rockefella.


The combination of Flower Bowl, dam of Graustark and His Majesty, with relatives such as her three-parts brother and sister Your Host and Your Hostess, or the similarly bred Swaps, has been a hugely successful one. Latest score for the pattern was the victory of Dysham (f, 2, Dynaformer--Sham Street, by Sham) in Sunday's Junior Champion S. at Monmouth Park. Dynaformer is out of a His Majesty mare, and Dysham's second dam is by Majestic Prince (granddam, Your Hostess), so Dysham has Flower Bowl and Your Hostess 4 x 5. The second weekend stakes score for Flower Bowl with a genetic relative came when Dawson's Legacy (g, 4, Roanoke--Creme Caromel, by Whitesburg) captured Saturday's GIII Play the King H. at Woodbine. Dawson's Legacy is by a grandson of His Majesty, and his second dam is by a son of Swaps, so Flower Bowl/Swaps appear 4 x 4.

Last year's Champion Canadian Two-Year-Old Filly Fantasy Lake (f, 3, Salt Lake--Springtime Fantasy, by Affirmed) was a result of the mating of a son of Deputy Minister to an Affirmed mare. Another Canadian stakes winner, Celestialbutterfly (f, 3, Affirmed--Butterflies, by Deputy Minister), who took the Ontario Colleen H. Sunday at Woodbine, is the result of the reverse cross. The key: Affirmed is by Exclusive Native (Raise a Native--Exclusive), is closely related to Deputy Minister's third dam, Grass Shack, who is by Exclusive Native's great grandsire, Polynesian, out of Exclusive Native's granddam, Good Example.

Successful young Florida sire Line in the Sand was credited with a first graded stakes winner when Lines of Beauty (f, 4, Line in the Sand--Duper, by Garthorn), a member of his first crop, captured Saturday's GIII Gardenia at Ellis Park. Lines of Beauty has a noteworthy pedigree as she has Australian 1,000 Guineas heroine, Reveille II, 4×5 in her pedigree. This imported daughter of Star Kingdom is third dam of Line in the Sand, and granddam of Believe It, who in turn is sire of Lines of Beauty's broodmare sire, Garthorn.

DERBY RUNNER UP TO BECOME HUNT STALLION

City Honours (USA) (Darshaan {GB}), beaten in a photo by High-Rise in the 1998 Epsom Derby, has been acquired by a partnership to stand as a National Hunt stallion at Bert House Stud near Athy, Co Kildare, in Ireland, alongside Crystal Hearted's sire Broken Hearted. A son of Pretty Polly S. and Vanity H. winner Miss Toshiba (Sadler's Wells {USA}), City Honours is from the same family as, and bred along very similar lines to, Bold Reasoning, sire of Seattle Slew. Winner of a mile maiden and Group 2-placed in three starts at two, he was second in all three of his starts the following season, hunting up Group 1 winner Saratoga Springs in the G2 Dante S. before finishing second in both the Epsom and Irish Derbies. Southern Bloodstock's Larry Stratton, who arranged the purchase of the horse from Godolphin Racing, said, "We looked at a lot of horses over the past three or so years, but our patience has been rewarded, as this is as fine a National Hunt sire prospect as has retired to stud for years. He has a stallion's pedigree, and it is hard to imagine at the moment a better combination than Darshaan and Sadler's Wells for this job. He is an extremely good individual with size and scope, and very athletic, and he was consistent at the very top level, including getting beaten only a head in the Derby".
