JUVENILES FACE OFF IN DEL MAR FINALE

Five two-year-olds will head to the post today for the 52nd renewal of the GII Del Mar Futurity. The likely favorite is Dixie Union (Dixieland Band). Unbeaten in three career starts, the Richard Mandella trainee has already won the July 18 GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship and the Aug. 18 GIII Best Pal S. Trainer Bob Baffert, who became the first trainer to sweep all five of Del Mar's Grade I races this summer, will saddle three of the five runners: Forest Camp (Deputy Minister), Cameron Pass (Mr. Greeley) and Captain Steve (Fly So Free). Forest Camp won his only previous start, an Aug. 7 five-furlong Del Mar maiden race, by two lengths, despite stumbling at the start. Cameron Pass has won both his starts, most recently taking a 5 1/2-furlong Del Mar allowance Aug. 20, while stablemate Captain Steve, third in the Best Pal, will wear blinkers for the first time in this effort. The D. Wayne Lukas-trained Commendable (Gone West) rounds out the field. The chestnut colt was an impressive four-length winner of his Aug. 14 debut. The Futurity is the closing-day feature at Del Mar.

NORTHERN EXPOSURE AT LONGCHAMP

He had only one previous win to his credit, but Northerntown (Manila) picked a fine time to double that total yesterday at Longchamp, winning the G3 Prix de Lutece by one length. A winner of a conditions race at Saint-Cloud May 19, Northerntown employed forcing tactics here to win a shade cleverly and provide Freddie Head with his first group race win as a trainer. Fractious beforehand, the Kentucky-bred colt had his mind in the right place once the race got underway. He initially raced in fifth but strode to the head of affairs after a half mile. He and First Ballot (Ire) (Perugino) raced five lengths in advance of the remainder, who were headed by Rhagaas (GB) (Sadler's Wells) as Amilynx (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) was settled in last place. Rhagaas closed the gap at the entrance to the straight and threw down a challenge approaching the final quarter, but that effort was short lived as Northerntown extended his advantage to three lengths entering the final furlong. He kept on well and was eased down close home to win a bit in hand. The winning trainer said, "He is a tough little horse who runs his heart out everytime. It is not easy to make all at a strong pace, but he would have no chance in a slowly run race. All being well, he will return in the G2 Prix Hubert de Chaudenay at Longchamp (Oct. 2), a race restricted to three-year-olds."

The winner of her racetrack debut July 24, Gaily Funky kept her perfect record intact with a narrow victory. The bay broke alertly under jockey Teruo Eda who settled the filly in midpack in the early stages. She advanced to make the lead rounding the far turn and dueled down the stretch with Berg Ticket, but dug in gamely for her first stakes success. Said Eda, "We didn't go to the front by force because we were in the outside gate. She still had enough energy around the turn so I thought we would have a chance to win. She ran very well."

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

It must be some considerable time since a stallion starting out at a stud fee of \$5,000 has succeeded in siring a Grade 1 winner in each of his first three crops. That, however, is the feat achieved by Belong To Me. A son of Danzig trained by Allen Jerkens, Belong To Me flashed tremendous speed as a three-year-old when he won six of 13 starts including the GIII Boojum H. and GIII Best Turn S. Retired to stand in New York, Belong to Me sired the multiple Grade I winning filly Jersey Girl in his first crop, the GI Hopeful S. victor Lucky Roberto in his second and completed the treble with Circle of Life's victory in the GI Spinaway S. last Friday. Belong To Me moved to Lane's End Farm in Versailles, Kentucky for the 1998 breeding season and stood his first two years there at a fee of \$20,000.

As a grandson of Northern Dancer out of a mare by a son of Raise a Native, Belong to Me is a cross of two of the strains which are most predominant in the North American population and Circle of Life is inbred to both horses. She is actually the third Belong to Me stakes winner out of a Northern Dancer-line mare--following Chasin' Wimmin (Deputy Minister) and Belongs To Mony (Gate Dancer)--and the second with a Raise a Native duplication, the first being Terreavigne (out of Im A Star Prospect, by Mr. Prospector).

Circle of Life's Northern Dancer inbreeding comes through Danzig and Nijinsky II. There have been at least 24 Danzig-line stakes winners with inbreeding to Northern Dancer through Nijinsky, including Group 1 winners Redoute's Choice (Aus) (Danehill--Shantha's Choice {Aus}, by Canny Lad {Aus}) and Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}--Songline {NZ}, by Western Symphony), as well as British champion sprinter Iktamal (Danzig Connection--Crystal Cup, by Nijinsky). Twenty of these stakes winners (12 group/graded, five Group/Grade 1) are out of mares which descend from Nijinsky in direct male line.

We have observed that, in general, breeding a mare back to a sire from her immediate male line tends towards disappointing results. There are, however, some exceptions to this observation and Circle of Life's pedigree features two of them. The first of these is that inbreeding to sons of a stallion seems to work well when sons of a somewhat different physique or aptitude are involved. This includes duplicating Northern Dancer through Nijinsky II and many of the other sons of Northern Dancer; Raise a Native through Mr. Prospector and Majestic Prince and Bold Ruler through Secretariat and other sons.

Another exception which seems to work quite well is when a stallion in the male line of the sire and in the dam (or the sire and dam themselves) are bred on a similar cross. This kind of parallel pattern is found in Circle of Life. As we have said, Belong to Me is by a son of Northern Dancer out of a mare by a son of Raise a Native, and if we look at the pedigree of her dam Concentric we find that she is by Shadeed (grandson of Northern Dancer) out of a mare by Alydar (son of Raise a Native). That this type of pattern should work well is not particularly surprising. Horses which are recruited as sires tend to be high-class performers, and so duplicating the "nick" which produced the sire frequently reinforces a proven affinity.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

English 2000 Guineas winner Mister Baileys (GB) was represented by a stakes winner from his freshman two-year-old crop when Cool Ashlee (f, 2, Mister Baileys--Ideal Index, by Copelan) flew home eight lengths clear in the Critical Miss S. at Philadelphia Park. Cool Ashlee is bred on a cross--Roberto line-sires over Tri Jet-line mares--which has a very good strike rate with nine other stakes winners, including Grade I winner Diplomatic Jet. We can also note that her dam has three crosses of the very fast Olympia, and Olympia's sire Heliopolis is bred on a very similar cross to Tudor Minstrel, a brilliant champion two-year-old and miler who is in the pedigree of Mister Baileys.

There was another success for the pattern of inbreeding to the broodmare sire of the sire when Deputy Warlock (c, 2, Silver Deputy--Date Stone, by Forty Niner) captured the Miller Genuine Draft Cradle S. Silver Deputy is out of a mare by Mr. Prospector, and Deputy Warlock's dam is by a son of Mr. Prospector, so Mr. Prospector appears 3x3 in the center of the pedigree.

KEENELAND PRESIDENT TO RETIRE William Greely, whose 28 years as a Keeneland executive includes 14 years as president of the organization, announced plans to retire in February. He will remain on Keeneland's board of directors. Greely, 61, became Keeneland's fifth president in 1986, succeeding James Bassett III. "With Keeneland's sales enjoying unprecedented success and racing purses at record levels, I felt it was an ideal time in my career to retire," Greely explained. "We have walked a fine line over the years, trying to grow and change enough to keep things fresh, but always mindful that we must protect and enhance Keeneland's great traditions for future generations."

SARATOGA CLOSES WITH NUMBERS UP

Saratoga concluded its 36-day 1999 meeting Monday with figures up across the board. The average daily ontrack handle was \$3,110,265--up 5.4 percent over last year. The daily average for total handle was \$15,486,599. The average daily attendance was 25,562, an increase of 3.7 percent over the 1998 figure of 24,660. Jerry Bailey was the meet's leading rider with 47 winners while Bill Mott was the top trainer with 16 victories. Racing resumes at Belmont Park on Friday.

Quaker Ridge (Forty Niner--Twilight Ridge {Cox's Ridge}) has been retired to stud at Hartley/De Renzo Thoroughbreds in Ocala, Florida for the 2000 breeding season. Injured while preparing for the GII Dwyer earlier this year, the three-year-old won three of seven starts and earned \$95,610. He will stand for \$3,000 Live Foal Stands and Nurses.

Cloud Cover (Storm Cat--Wortheroatsingold {Naskra}) will begin stud duty next year at Double Diamond Farm in Ocala, Florida. Records in average and aggregate that marginally surpassed those set two years ago began the 1999 St Leger Yearling Sales at Doncaster in the best possible fashion yesterday. The turnover of 1,325,800gns compared favorably to an opening day 1,271,400gns in 1997 and the average that year was 8,256gns, just below the 8.338ans figure recorded vesterday. Geoff Lewis was one of the busiest buyers, but the difference this year was that the Epsom trainer, who saddles his last runner on Friday, was acting for others. Lewis bought the day's joint top-priced offering, a 30,000gns colt by Lugana Beach (GB), who is a full-brother to the speedy handicappers Pure Coincidence (GB) and Pure Elegancia (GB), both one-time inmates of his Epsom yard. Mike Baker, formerly an owner with Lewis, will race this colt with Michael Jarvis in Newmarket. The 30,000gns price tag was also reached when Newmarket trainer Chris Wall got the better of agent Sam Bullard for a daughter of Shareef Dancer (USA) offered from the Swinburn family's Genesis Green Stud. Although much of yesterday's trading was done by British buyers, one lot that will be heading abroad is a Desert Style colt who was bought for 23,000gns by Florida-based trainer Frank Maurier on behalf of his client Cameron Express Inc to sell at an American breeze-up sale next year. Gestut Hof Ittlingen's G1 Japan Cup winning champion Lando (Ger) is now well off the mark as well. From a total of only five runners in Germany and Italy he has sired three individual winners. The Gestut Karlshof based G1 Irish Derby hero Winged Love (Ire) (In The Wings {GB}) can boast two winners. This past weekend also saw Hubert Hasler's middle distance champion Komtur (USA) sire his first when Pamri won a maiden race in Austria.
