WORLD CUP WORTH \$6 MILLION IN 2000

The G1 Dubai World Cup will once again be the world's richest race after Emirates Racing Association announced that the fourth renewal of the race will be worth \$6 million. The winner's share of the Mar. 25 event will be \$3.6 million and total prize money for the day will be nearly doubled to \$12 million. The Dubai Duty Free S., previously run on dirt over a mile and a quarter for a \$500,000 purse, becomes a nine-furlong race on turf worth \$2 million while The Dubai Sheema Classic, formerly the Dubai Turf Classic, has also been boosted to \$2 million from \$500,000. Les Benton, chief executive of the Emirates Racing Association and chairman of the Dubai World Cup Committee, said, "The mission given to us by His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum and his brothers is one of excellence. Our intention is not only to create one of the most significant days of racing anywhere in the world but to make this highly competitive range of championship races appealing to racing enthusiasts and viewers around the world."

Keos To Hermitage Farm:

The winner of the G2 Goldene Peitsche at Baden-Baden, **Keos** (Riverman) will retire to stud at Hermitage Farm in Goshen, Kentucky, upon completion of his European racing career. The property of the Niarchos Family, the five-year-old will race for his owners through the end of 1999. A full brother to Korveya, the producer of champions Hector Protector and Bosra Sham, Keos has registered six victories from 17 lifetime starts to date. No stud fee has been set as yet.

BAFFERT'S CAMP UPSETS DEL MAR FINALE

Forest Camp passed his five-furlong debut test with flying colors Aug. 7, recovering nicely from a stumbling start and then patiently awaiting running room on the turn before accelerating away from his rivals to win by two lengths as the 3-2 chalk. Trainer Bob Baffert thought enough of that effort to give the dark bay the chance to prove himself against the best juveniles on the grounds, and a pair of bullet workouts, including a best-of-37 five eighths Sept. 4 in :58 4/5 had him on his toes. Cameron Pass (Mr. Greeley), one of three in the race for Baffert, was sent for the lead from the rail with favored and undefeated Dixie Union glued just to his outside and Forest Camp tugging his way along in third on the outside. Leaving the three-eighths pole, jockey David Flores gave his mount the green light to run, established a clear advantage into the lane and was given only a mild hand ride to the wire. Flores, who sparkled throughout the meet, said, "He improved a whole bunch today. We wanted to get him to relax and he did. He could be any kind. He is amazing." Baffert, saddling his fourth consecutive Futurity winner, called Forest Camp "the most impressive winner" he has had in the Futurity", but did not commit to a next start for his charge.

A strong-finishing second in her only start to date, a conditions race at Deauville Aug. 14, the choicely bred Moon Driver was not at the forefront of punters' minds when potential winners were forecast. She belied her relatively long odds by winning in good style despite not getting the clearest of runs. Mall Queen and Harbour Island disputed the early running as Moon Driver tracked the leaders, covered up, and the favored Cap Coz (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) was restrained in the rear. Harbour Island held a definite advantage at halfway and looked in control with 1 1/2 furlongs to run as Mall Queen was shuffled back a couple of places. Moon Driver was short of room at that point, but got a beautiful split between horses at the furlong marker and quickened impressively into the lead. She was kept up to her work and ran out an easy winner. Harbour Island kept on to take second and Mall Queen, hampered slightly at the furlong marker, came on again in the final furlong to take third. Cap Coz, the disappointment of the race, was never in a position to make a serious challenge. Alan Cooper, racing manager to the Niarchos Family, said, "Moon Driver will go next for the G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket Sept. 28. We have always held this filly in high regard...she comes from a family that is very dear to us all. She has a yearling full sister who will soon go into training; her three-year-old brother, Mojave Moon, won recently in California; and the dam is in foal to Storm Cat."

Having only broken her maiden at Ripon Aug. 30 in her eighth attempt, Mistle Song confirmed the boost in confidence that win gave her by toying with her rivals before pouncing late to score in good style. She had previously shown form of the highest order, finishing sixth in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks at York Aug. 18, second in the G3 Lancashire Oaks at Haydock July 3 and fourth in the G2 Ribblesdale S. at Royal Ascot June 17. She settled well in midfield and travelled sweetly throughout as Clandestine (GB) (Saddlers' Hall {Ire}) set a generous pace. Both Valentine Girl and Credit-A-Plenty made stealthy headway to challenge for the lead at the three-furlong marker as Mistle Song eased into third, marking the moves of the front two. Credit-A-Plenty took over approaching the final furlong, but Mistle Song was on the scene immediately and overhauled the leader to grab the advantage in the last 50 yards and win with a bit in hand. Winning trainer Clive Brittain said, "She is just a big frame of a horse at the moment and we have something to look forward to next season. I would very much like to think that she could be a 'Cup' horse next year. She was a bit unlucky not to have broken her duck before she won at Ripon last week. I thought she could have won the Ribblesdale at Ascot, but for encountering bad luck in running."

When Reference Point had to be destroyed after breaking a leg in his paddock at Dalham Hall Stud on December 26, 1991, his death caused widespread sadness. Reference Point, after all, had endeared himself to just about everyone with his tremendous will to win, which had helped him record seven victories from 10 starts. He had led throughout to win the G1 William Hill Futurity in great style at two, in the process earning the title of Europe's champion juvenile. And he put up further magnificent displays of front running the following season to take the G2 Mecca-Dante, the G1 Derby, the G1 King George, the G2 Great Voltigeur and the G1 St Leger.

I'm sorry to say that the sadness concerning Reference Point's death was almost to turn to relief over the next few years, after the vast majority of his stock had performed well below original expectations. The writing had been on the wall when he came up with only two winners from eight first-crop runners in 1991. Although one of those winners, Ivyanna, went on to take the G1 Oaks d'Italia, Reference Point failed to come up with another Group scorer from his four crops, his best efforts being the Listed winners Sir Mark Sykes, Mutual Consent and Sand Reef. His cumulative average earnings figure stood at only 0.51 by the end of 1997.

Some would claim that Reference Point's disastrous stud career was predictable. His sire, Mill Reef, was a generally disappointing sire of sires, with the very notable exception of Shirley Heights, and the same could be said of Reference Point's maternal grandsire, Habitat. However, Mill Reef and Habitat became very successful sires of broodmares, so the faint possibility exists that Reference Point will make much more impact in this role than he did as a sire. His chances in this area ought to be helped by the fact that many of his daughters come from excellent female lines, a good example being Hill of Snow, the mare who provided him with easily his best result so far when her daughter Preseli won the G1 Moyglare Stud S. last Sunday.

Although Hill of Snow was rated only 76 by Turform after winning a 1 1/4-mile maiden at Navan, she realized 160,000gns at Tattersalls' 1995 December Sales. She owed her popularity to being a daughter of White Star Line, a winner of the Gl Alabama S. and Gl Kentucky Oaks who had cost Sheikh Mohammed a cool \$3 million at the Newstead Farm dispersal in 1985. White Star Line had also been in the news in 1995, thanks to the fine efforts of her grand-daughter Valley of Gold, a Shirley Heights filly who won the G1 Oaks d'Italia and was second in the G1 Prix Vermeille. White Star Line has also produced Whitehaven (G2 Prix de Pomone), Native Wizard (Acomb S.) and the group-placed winners White Star and Titanic, playing her part in establishing her dam, Fast Line, as a very influential broodmare. Fast Line's exceptional granddaughter Northern Trick (a three-parts sister to White Star Line) is the second dam of Shiva, winner of this year's G1 Tattersalls' Gold Cup, so this family is having a very good year in Ireland.

The unbeaten Preseli is a member of the penultimate crop by the much-missed Caerleon. It is significant that she is out of a mare by a Derby-winning son of Mill Reef because Caerleon enjoyed great success with mares by Shirley Heights, Mill Reef's other Derby winner. Among the winners produced by the Caerleon-Shirley Heights cross are Lady Carla (G1 Oaks), Atoll (G1 Oaks d'Italia), Amfortas (G2 King Edward VII S.), Coretta (three GII races in the U.S.) and Innuendo (a group-placed Listed winner).

CHEROKEE RUN COLT TOPS CANADIAN SALE

Brian Sweeney, acting as agent for the Hong Kong Jockey Club, was forced to a sale's topping C\$270,000 to bring home a colt by Cherokee Run-Devaluation (Conquistador Cielo) at the Canadian Breeders Sales Selected Yearling Sale at Woodbine Tuesday. The bay was consigned by Susan Foreman, agent for Kings Brook Farms, Inc. A total of 149 yearlings sold Tuesday for a total of \$5,146,500. There were 34 horses reported not sold. The average of \$34,540 marked a 12.9-percent increase over the 1998 figure of \$30,602. At last year's sale, 152 horses sold for \$4,651,500. In 1998, 42 horses did not sell.

MT. LIVERMORE FILLY TOPS WTBA SALE

A filly by Mt. Livermore--Spectacular Bev (Spectacular Bid) brought a final bid of \$125,000 to top Tuesday's Washington Thoroughbred Breeders Association Summer Yearling Sale. Sold by Northwest Farms, the yearling was purchased by Tim McMurry, agent for Darby Dan Farm. A total of 153 horses sold Tuesday at the Morris J. Alhadeff Sales Pavilion at Emerald Downs, for a total of \$2,794,600 and an average of \$18,265. The average increased 8.5 percent from last year's sale when 140 yearlings sold for \$2,357,800 and an average of \$16,841. The median increased 9.3 percent, from \$13,500 in 1998 to 14,750 in 1999. "We were very happy with the results," said WTBA president Jerry Woods. "Buyers seem secure that racing in western Washington at a high level is here to stay."

BUCK'S BOY TO RETURN TOMORROW

The 1998 Breeders' Cup Turf champion Buck's Boy (Bucksplasher) will make his much-anticipated return to the races in a 1 1/8 mile money allowance event on the turf tomorrow at Woodbine. The Noel Hickey trainee will face four other rivals in his first start since a wire-to-wire victory in the Breeders' Cup Turf last November. The bay has won over the unique Woodbine turf course before, capturing the Hong Kong Jockey Club Trophy last year. Hickey has indicated that the six-year-old will return to Chicago after the race and that despite being nominated to the Oct. 17 Gl Canadian International at Woodbine, no definitive plans have been finalized for the rest of 1999.

HANCOCK RESIGNS KEENELAND POST Reaffirming his opposition to casino gambling at race tracks, Arthur Hancock III resigned his position as director of the Keeneland Association, according to Harness Tracks of America newsletter. He has held the seat for 25 years. Keeneland, in conjunction with gaming conglomerate Harrah's Entertainment, purchased Turfway Park earlier this year.

Tactical Advantage Stays in Florida:

Marablue Farm and Taylor Made Farms announced that Tactical Advantage (Forty Niner--Twitchet, by Roberto) will stay at Doug Henderson's Marablue Farm for the 2000 breeding season, instead of moving to Kentucky. "The exodus of stallions like Saint Ballado, End Sweep and Out of Place has created a certain void in the stallion market," said Ben Taylor. "Our long-term plan is to relocate the horse to Kentucky." Tactical Advantage ranked third among freshman sires of 1998.

COMMON GROUNDS COLT TOPS DONCASTER

WEDNESDAY A Common Grounds (GB) colt offered from Camas Park Stud last night became the most expensive yearling sold at Doncaster's St Leger Sales since 1983 when realising 82,000gns. Agent Andy Smith, who trades as Havana Horse, bought the colt on behalf of Californian Gary Seidler, who was at the sale. It has not been decided who will train the yearling, who is out of Midnight Oasis (USA) (Java Gold), a winning daughter of Canadian Oaks winner Northernette (CAN) (Northern Dancer {CAN}), herself a full sister to Storm Bird (CAN). Timmy Hyde, proprietor of the sales-topping vendor Camas Park Stud, bought the second most expensive lot--a 46,000gns colt from the first crop of Charnwood Forest (Ire) out of Limerick Princess (Ire) (Polish Patriot) offered by Thomas Doherty of Co Limerick. She will be returning to Ireland, but Hyde does not know who will train her. Furnace Mill Stud's First Trump (GB) colt out of Bellyphax (GB) (Bellypha)--a half-sister to 1985 GI Met Mile winner Forzando (GB) (Formidable) --will be going into training with Dermot Weld after bloodstock agent Peter Doyle paid 40,000gns for her. This year's sale is heading towards a record set of final figures, with last night's numbers comfortably better than the previous mark, set in 1997.
