BIANCONE SUSPENDED 10 MONTHS

High-profile Hong Kong based Frenchman Patrick Bianone has been suspended until June 30, 2000 as a result of two of his horses testing positive to prohibited substances. The Biancone-trained Whytellyou tested positive for mephenesin, a prohibited muscle relaxant, after winning the L'Or de Martell Cup at Happy Valley April 10. A month later, Rickfield (Ire) tested positive to boldenone. While Biancone was not accused of of any wrongdoing *per se*, as trainer of the horses in question, he is ultimately responsible.

EUROPEANS LEAD THE LIST FOR AUSTRALIA'S BIGGEST RACES

Kavf Tara (GB) (Sadler's Wells) remains topweight for the \$A1.77 million Caulfield Cup Oct. 16 and the \$A3 million Melbourne Cup Nov. 2, following second declarations that pruned 240 entries back to 131. Secondstage omissions included Grand Archway (Aus) (Archway {Ire}), retired due to a back problem this week, and 1998 Melbourne Cup winner Jezabeel (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}), who has a date with Danehill instead. Godolphin's Kayf Tara will be among the Sept. 28 arrivals, providing he holds his form when defending his G1 Irish St. Leger title Sept. 15. Australian hero Tie The Knot (Aus) (Nassipour) is the only local among the topweights, which include Europeans Enzeli (Ire) (Kahyasi {Ire}), Silver Patriarch (Ire) (Saddlers' Hall {Ire}), Central Park (Ire) (In The Wings {GB}), Sea Wave (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), Arctic Owl (GB) (Most Welcome {GB}) and Ungaro (Ger) (Goofalik). San Juan Capistrano winner Amerique (St. Jovite) is the sole North American entry. The Queen's Blueprint (GB) was among the withdrawals.

All horses in the International *TDN* were bred in North America unless otherwise indicated.

Well in the rear until halfway, she made swift progress on the outside a quarter-mile out and swept into a clear lead over a furlong out, running on for a comfortable score from Everlasting Love. Winning trainer Clive Brittain said, "I hold her in similar regard to my previous Classic-winning fillies Pebbles (GB) and Sayyedati (GB). She will now go for the [G1] Fillies' Mile [at Ascot Sept. 25] or the [G1 Prix] Marcel Boussac [at Longchamp Oct. 3]." Winning jockey Frankie Dettori said, "I like this filly a lot, she has that bit of class. She is still a bit weak, but has lots of scope for next season. She won this really well and only confirmed the good impression she gave me when winning at Newbury last time."

DEL MAR CAPS SUCCESSFUL MEET With the completion of its 60th summer of racing Wednesday, the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club enjoyed increases in both attendance and handle figures. Average daily on-track attendance rose to 14,793, up three percent from 1998. The average daily on-track handle climbed 4.2 percent to \$2,419,616. Estimated distribution to horsemen, including purses and breeders' distribution, soared 15 percent to \$524,316. With the introduction of full-card simulcasting this year, Del Mar presented daily racing programs from Saratoga and Monmouth Park while continuing to simulcast selected stakes races from other tracks throughout the U.S. Bob Baffert captured his third consecutive training title with 27 wins, while David Flores won his first Del Mar riding title with 38 victories. Golden Eagle Farm was the leading owner of the 42-day meet with six wins. The trio combined to score in Del Mar's premier race, the \$1 million GI Pacific Classic, won by Golden Eagle's homebred General Challenge (General Meeting).

Live Foal Reports Nearly Complete for 1999

The Jockey Club reported Thursday that as of Sept. 1, 1999, 4,793 stallions covered 60,785 mares in North America during 1998, which resulted in 34,596 foals submitted to The Jockey Club in Live Foal Reports received before Aug. 31. Vice president of registration services Roger Shook cautioned that the foal count is not complete, with an estimated 10 percent not yet reported. "The increases in mares bred and live foals so far reported support our 1999 registered foal crop forecast of 36,500," said Shook. The number of stallions decreased 3.7 percent from the 4,979 reported in 1997 at this time last year, while the number of mares increased 1.2 percent from the 60,054 mares reported in 1997. The statistics include 112 progeny sired by stallions standing in North America, but foaled abroad.

Bullard was accompanied by the colt's new connections, owner Billy Maguire and trainer Michael Bell. Balding had earlier paid 36,000 guineas for a Tagula colt out of Mountain Harvest (Fr) (Shirley Heights {GB}), offered by a client of Catridge Farm Stud. That purchase, like the one bought for the same amount Wednesday, will race for Channel Islands-based owner Robert Hitchins, in whose colors Tagula ran and who still has a share in the stallion. "We got them not only because we want to support Tagula, but also because they are bloody nice yearlings," said Balding. Newmarket agent Linda Tate, acting for trainer Karl Burke, paid 47,000 guineas, the second-highest price of the night, for a Piccolo (GB)--Kingdom Princess (GB) (Forzando {GB}) colt offered from Gay O'Callaghan's Yeomanstown Stud, who had cost 17,500 guineas as a foal at the Tattersalls December Sales.
