

TITLE ON THE LINE AT LEOPARDSTOWN

The defection of Montieu (Ire), who will participate in tomorrow's G2 Prix Niel Majestic Barriere at Longchamp, has taken a little of the shine off what promised to be the race of the European season to date. But today's G1 ESAT Digifone Champion S. at Leopardstown is still a mouthwatering clash which will go some way in determining who is crowned the top middle-distance performer in Europe this year. This season's G1 Coronation Cup and G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. winner Daylami (Ire) (Doyoun {Ire}) is set to take on G1 Juddmonte International S. winner Royal Anthem (Theatrical {Ire}). Daylami already holds one call over Roval Anthem this season, having beaten him into third in the Coronation Cup at Epsom June 4. That race was run at a pace which did not suit Royal Anthem and The Thoroughbred Corporation's giant is capable of turning the tables on the representative of the boys in blue on the basis of his most recent run. He put up the middle-distance performance of the season when surging to a hugely impressive record-breaking eight-length win in the Juddmonte International at York Aug. 17, beating a high-quality field. To say that Dream Well (Fr) (Sadler's Wlls), winner of last year's French and Irish Derbies, will lead the battle for third suggests how highly Royal Anthem and Daylami are regarded. He is a top-class individual in his own right and, with the benefit of a confidence-boosting win in the G3 Prix Gontaut-Biron at Deauville Aug. 15, can expose any failings of the top two. The track condition will also be in his favor.

"SILVER" STREAKS INTO GAZELLE

Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) has racked up 10 straight victories against fillies, starting the streak in the GII Alcibiades S. in October of her two-year-old season and extending it with her nine-length victory in the GI Alabama Aug. 21. She looks to make it 11 in a row in today's GI Gazelle H. at Belmont Park. "I picked out the Gazelle because ... 'Silver' runs like a gazelle, so I thought it fit," trainer Bob Baffert quipped. The queen of her division, Silverbulletday will give from nine to 12 pounds to her five rivals while carrying a career-high 124 pounds. But she shouldered 123 pounds and ran away to a seven-length victory in the GI Ashland S. back in April while handing the runner-up eight pounds. Her lone loss this year came against colts in the GI Belmont S., but, according to Baffert, she will not face the boys again. "We're not going to run against colts," he said. "(Owner Mike Pegram) and I talked about this and the basic decision is to just run her and enjoy her. That's one reason we decided on the Gazelle. Having a race like this is certainly better than just breezing her all the time. And, when you have a horse like this, all you want to do is keep her happy. She loves to race."

Honor Glide, fifth in this race last year, has had a very successful, if abbreviated, 1999 campaign. The five-year-old came back after a seven-month layoff to be second in a Belmont allowance test June 5, then picked up back-to-back wins in the July 10 Gll Bowling Green H. and Aug. 14 GI Sword Dancer Invitational H. "The first time, he definitely needed the race," jockey Jose Santos said. "The second time, he ran a good race...but the third race, he was really ready. He's going to be the horse to beat in the Man o'War." Single Empire is undefeated in two starts this year. Imported from Europe at the end of his 1998 campaign, he was second in the GIII C.F. Burke H. last October, took five months off, then returned to win the Mar. 21 GII San Luis Rey S. and Apr. 18 GI San Juan Capistrano H. in two starts this year. "He's had some little setbacks here and there," trainer Neil Drysdale said. "He's had a cough and a sore foot, nothing major. But he has been training well and he's got to start soon, because we're aiming him for the Breeders' Cup Turf."

QUEEN'S PLATE WINNER DEAD Woodcarver (Woodman), five-length winner of the 1999 Queen's Plate at the end of June, suffered a severe fracture of his left front leg during a workout at Woodbine yesterday morning and had to be euthanized. "He suffered a complete rupture of one branch of the suspensory ligament, a condylar fracture and dislocation of the left fore fetlock," Dr. Robert McMartin, the attending veterinarian, said. "The diagnosis was the damage was irreparable and that he had to be humanely put down." The three-year-old won three of his nine career starts, earning \$455,126.

Trainer Barry Hills' love affair with Doncaster continued with this sparkling performance, which has established the unbeaten homebred Distant Music as one of the joint-favorites, with the Ballydoyle pair of Fasliyev and Bernstein, for next year's English 2000 Guineas. A four-length maiden winner here July 28 on his only previous start, he settled at the back of the field as Ekraar (Red Ransom) led from Tioga (Unfuwain) and the unbeaten Ballydoyle colt Rossini. Rossini grabbed the lead a guarter mile out, but Distant Music guickened brilliantly on the outside and simply flew past the Irishtrained colt to settle the race in a few strides, coming home clear. "He has a lot of class," said winning rider Michael Hills, son of the trainer. "He quickens so well and he is the best I have ridden so far for my father." Added Barry Hills, "The 2000 Guineas is something to dream about and there is every chance he will get a mile and a guarter next year in top company." As for the immediate future, Hills said, "The obvious route would be to go to the [G1] Dewhurst S. at Newmarket [Oct. 16], but I will talk to Prince Khalid and his racing manager Teddy Beckett first. If he doesn't go to the Dewhurst, he won't run again this season."

The world's oldest Classic is overshadowed somewhat these days, with the three Arc trials held at Longchamp and the Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown attracting greater attention. But the race will be pushed to the forefront should the gallant Ramruma add this to her three Oaks wins (English, Irish and Yorkshire) this season, becoming the first British-trained horse since Nashwan, in 1989, to win four consecutive Group 1 races. She has had a long hard season, but will start as the odds-on favorite to give trainer Henry Cecil his fifth winner. She faces some gritty opposition, headed by Mutafaweq, who represents last year's winning connections. He was impressive when beating Iscan in the G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot June 18, but disappointed slightly when fifth in the G1 Irish Derby at the Curragh June 27, where Tchaikovsky was third. He then went on to finish a respectable fourth in the G2 Great Voltigeur S. at York Aug. 17, and gives the impression he would be better suited by a test of stamina. Iscan's participation is no longer in doubt, having successfully passed his stalls test. He ran a good race and was unlucky in defeat when second in the Listed March S. at Goodwood Aug. 28, and is sure to progress for that run. All The Way has the stamp of a stayer and makes his return to the track after a superb fifth-place finish in the G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom June 5. He is more than just a lively outsider and will endeavour to give trainer Terry Mills his first taste of Classic success.

Fez was a most unlucky loser at Goodwood, having been badly hampered in the early stages and losing a good deal more than the length she was eventually beaten. Aussie Jock Suspended:

Controversial jockey Shane Dye's spring carnival aspirations are in tatters after he was suspended vesterday for two months, beginning Sept. 19, over his ride on Melbourne Cup hopeful Tie The Knot (Aus) (Nassipour) in the Warwick S. Aug. 21. "I'll take this as far as I have to," said Dye after the 3 1/2-hour hearing. He immediately lodged an appeal. Dye was charged with not taking all reasonable and permissible measures to give Tie The Knot the best opportunity when the seven-time Group1 winner was fast-finishing runner-up to Sunline (NZ) in the weight-for-age test over seven furlongs. "It is clear to us on video and evidence that a run virtually stares you in the face for 200 meters and by the time you take it, the bird has flown," said Thoroughbred Racing Board Chief Steward Ray Murrihy. Murrihy clashed heatedly with high-profile Sydney lawyer Chris Murphy throughout the hearing, and it is understood TRB officials are considering whether Murphy can be charged under Australian Racing Rule 175(j) which deals with "improper or insulting behavior."

The speedy sixvear-old led every step, setting honest fractions and opening up on the field with only mild encouragement from jockey Robert Landry. He went out an extra eighth after the finish line. "I'd have to say this was the easiest win I've ever had," Landry said. "I still had a lot of gears left. I asked him from the eighth pole home because (trainer Noel Hickey) wanted him to get something out of it, and I let him gallop out really well. He's a tremendous horse and I'm just honoured to be able to have the opportunity to ride him." Hickey said the gelding will likely stay at Woodbine to prepare for the GIII Sky Classic S. Sept. 25 and the GI Canadian International Oct. 17. "I'll decide that (this morning)," he said.

PAULSONS TO SELL 60 MARES IN NOVEMBER

According to the Daily Racing Form, Allen and Madeleine Paulson's Brookside Farms will sell 60 of its broodmares at this year's Keeneland November sale. Among the mares slated to be sold are champion Eliza (Mt. Livermore), in foal to Deputy Minister; Winglet (Alydar), dam of champion Ajina (Theatrical {Ire}) and in foal to Storm Cat; and Nijinsky's Best (Nijinsky II), dam of Yagli (Jade Hunter) and in foal to Deputy Minister. "You want to keep the family, but when you try to run the farm as a business you have to decide what to keep and what is most marketable," Madeleine Paulson told the Form. "We have Ajina, and a daughter of Eliza, so this makes sense." Paulson added that she and her husband have no plans to sell their farm in Kentucky. The sale will still leave the Paulsons with approximately 90 broodmares and roughly 400 horses in training.

VICAR TO STAND AT DARBY DAN MGISW Vicar (Wild Again--Escrow Agent, by El Gran Senor) will be retired to stud duty at Darby Dan Farm in Lexington, Kentucky upon the conclusion of his racing career, owner James Tafel and Darby Dan Farm's John W. Phillips announced yesterday. Darby Dan has purchased a "significant interest" in the three-year-old, according to the announcement, and will syndicate the colt, who will continue to race in Tafel's colors. The winner of the GI Fountain Of Youth S. and the GI Florida Derby at Gulfstream Park this past winter, Vicar was most recently fourth in the seven-furlong GI King's Bishop S. at Saratoga Aug. 28. A stud fee has not been determined.

JOCKEY KILLED AT FAIRPLEX The Daily Racing Form reports that jockey J.C. Gonzalez was killed in a spill during the fifth race at Fairplex Park Thursday. Gonzalez was in the lead as the field raced past the quarter pole when his mount, Wolfhunt, broke both front legs. The 23-year-old rider suffered severe head injuries and was pronounced dead by Dr. Neal Archer at the Fairplex first-aid station. Jockey Danny Sorenson, aboard Accomodator, was directly behind Wolfhunt when he fell and the pair went down as well, but neither was seriously injured. Wolfhunt had to be euthanized. Gonzalez, born in Jalisco, Mexico, was the leading rider during the 1998 Los Angeles County Fair Meet at Fairplex. The remainder of Thursday's program at Fairplex was canceled.

ST LEGER SALES A SMASHING SUCCESS

Doncaster's St Leger Yearling Sales closed Friday night with a record average of 12,098 guineas, a joint best-ever median of 9,000 guineas, a turnover (5,274,900 guineas) that fell just a fraction short of the 1997 best and an individual top price (82,000 guineas) that had not been matched for 16 years. Henry Beeby, Doncaster's managing director, reflected on the week. "'Our best catalogue ever for the most successful sale for two-year-old winners' was our cry as we headed towards the 1999 St Leger Yearling Sales," he said. "Trade throughout the entire week has thoroughly endorsed that claim and we are thrilled to have posted a record average, a 95 percent clearance rate and turnover up by over 140,000 guineas [on 1998] despite a reduced [by design] catalogue." This week's sale played very much to a domestic market and Beeby looked on the bright side of the scarcity of overseas buyers. "One particular point of note is the fact that this sale was almost entirely dominated by British buyers, including a huge number of trainers from every corner of the country which will ensure DBS yearlings will dominate so many British two-year-old races next year," he said. Michael Ings, a client of Richard and Sally Aston's Goldford Stud, better known as National Hunt vendors, sold the top two lots last night. Epsom trainer Terry Mills paid 45,000 guineas for the first of them, a Grand Lodge (USA) filly out of Crystal Ring (Ire) (Kris {GB}), a half-sister to MGSW Catella (Ger) (Generous {Ire}). Glamorgan-based handler Bryn Palling bought the next lot, a Common Grounds (GB) filly out of Cafe Glace (GB) (Beldale Flutter {USA}, for 48,000 guineas. She will race for owner Albert Yemm. Both fillies had been bought "in utero" by the BBA's David Minton at the 1997 Tattersalls December Sales--Crystal Ring for 34,000 guineas and Cafe Glace for 23,000 guineas.


