UNBRIDLED BIDDING AT KEENELAND

Hip number 153, a colt by Unbridled out of multiple Grade I stakes winner Missy's Mirage (Stop the Music), lured Sheikh Mohammed and his agent, John Ferguson, into the Keeneland sales pavilion for the first time in vears, but the pair ended up underbidders as David Shimmon went to \$2 million for the yearling. The bid topped the first session of the 11-day Keeneland September Yearling Sale, which began with skyrocketing figures yesterday in Lexington. The median for the opening session soared 39.1 percent, while the average jumped 35.5 percent. Bob Hess and his son, Bob Hess Jr., acted as agents for the day's top vearling. "I thought he was worth \$2.2 million," Hess Jr. said. "So, if you look at that, he was a bargain. We loved the horse. This one is a work of art. Price was not an issue. (David Shimmon) really is looking for quality and not quantity. David has only three horses and they are all yearlings. He has a Hennessy and a Dixieland Band and now this one. We don't envision a big stable. We're looking for colts that we think are going to effective on the dirt. We may try a filly or a turf horse or two, but most of them will be for the dirt and for California." There were seven seven-figure yearlings on the night, five colts and two fillies. David Borislow, with Buzz Chace acting as agent, purchased the second-highest priced yearling yesterday, going to \$1.8 million for Hip number 101, a colt by Deputy Minister out of Isle Go West (Gone West), who is herself a half sister to Grade I winners Hennessy and Pearl City. The chestnut was consigned by Dromoland Farm Inc., Agent I. "(Borislow) comes up with the horses and he asks us to take a look at them," John Scanlon, who trains for Borislow, said. "If we like them, he buys them. It's as simple as that. We really think this is an outstanding individual." The sale continues today at 10 a.m.

STORM BIRD PENSIONED Storm Bird (Northern Dancer), who produced leading sire Storm Cat, has been retired from stud duties at the age of 21. He has sired 10 Group or Grade I winners. Among the bay stallion's top runners were Summer Squall, Bluebird, Indian Skimmer and Balanchine. Two grandsons and a great grandson--Charismatic (Summer Squall), Menifee (Harlan) and Cat Thief (Storm Cat)--battled for the top placings at this year's Kentucky Derby. Storm Bird won the 1980 G1 William Hill Dewhurst and G2 National S. while undefeated in five juvenile starts and was named champion two-year-old in England and Ireland. He started only once at three before beginning his stud career. He stood at Ashford Stud in Kentucky.

Last weekend's graded stakes provided a number of notable doubles on the breeding front. The Aga Khan enjoyed a Group 1 double as the breeder of Daylami (Ire) and Daryaba (Ire), and Valid Appeal matched him by appearing as the broodmare sire of the Grade I winners Val's Prince and Perfect Sting. Perfect Sting's sire Red Ransom was also in the news on two counts, the other being that his granddaughter Hoh Dear (Ire) took a division of the GIII Natalma S. on her North American debut. Hoh Dear is a first-crop daughter of Red Ransom's first-crop son Sri Pekan.

It was another double by Red Ransom, gained within a few days in June 1994, that first catapulted this Vinery stallion into the spotlight. His daughter Petrouchka set the ball rolling by winning the My Dear S. and Sri Pekan then increased the momentum by taking the G3 Coventry S.--a win he followed up with two Group 2 juvenile victories. With further stakes successes coming from Upper Noosh, Bail Out Becky, Lucky Lauren and Roujoleur, Red Ransom ended 1994 as leading first-crop sire, inviting more of the comparisons with Danzig that had been made from the moment he was forced into retirement.

Like Danzig, Red Ransom managed only three starts and he, too, was never tested in stakes company. He had made a spectacular debut at Saratoga in 1989, setting a record of :56 4/5 for five furlongs, and followed up later in August by winning over six furlongs at Belmont in 1:09 4/5.

Even though the big juvenile prizes went by without Red Ransom, his reputation was enough to make him winter favourite for the Kentucky Derby. After being sent to Florida by trainer Mack Miller, the Rokebyowned colt created further excitement when he worked on Feb. 21. Despite being reined in, Red Ransom was timed in :59 for five furlongs, which was very impressive for a colt bred to stay twice that distance.

Unfortunately, he didn't reproduce this form in a seven-furlong allowance at Gulfstream Park on Mar. 3, when he failed to catch Bright Again. Six days later Red Ransom worked four furlongs in :47 4/5 seconds, but tore a tendon sheath in his off-fore. Worse was to follow, as he fractured a sesamoid in July, bringing his career to an end.

Miller described Red Ransom as "the most talented individual I have ever trained," even though he had previously handled the champions Leallah, Assagai, Hawaii and Snow Knight.

I'm pleased to say that Red Ransom is justifying this praise--in the process adding to Roberto's reputation as a sire of sires. His fee soared from \$7,500 to \$30,000 after his first crop did so well and it rose again, this time from \$35,000 to \$50,000, after his son Intikhab was rated the best horse seen in Europe in 1998. The chances are that his best crops will be those born after 1995, and Perfect Sting heads a 1996 crop which has also produced Pico Teneriffe, Shabby Chic, Crystal Symphony, Lenny's Ransom and Strike A Blow.

The 1997 crop has got off to a very promising start, with Shining Hour and Ekraar becoming Group winners in England.

It is no surprise that Perfect Sting is a turf performer, because that has been the route taken by most of Red Ransom's best winners. Thanks to Bail Out Becky, Perfect Sting, Intikhab, Sri Pekan, Comic Strip, Pico Teneriffe, Upper Noosh, Stay Sound, Trail City, Wandering Star, Petrouchka, Ekraar and Shining Hour, as many as 13 of his first 14 Northern Hemisphere graded winners have gained at least one of their major victories on turf. No wonder some of the Maktoum brothers are now supporting him strongly.

NTRA DROPS SALES SURCHARGE The Harness Tracks of America newsletter reports that the National Thoroughbred Racing Association has dropped its proposed one-percent surcharge on horses purchased at auction. The NTRA abandoned the plan in response to the protests of Thoroughbred owners who buy at the sales. The organization had expected to collect \$4.6 million from the surcharge, and will cut its current budget by 10 percent, or \$3.2 million, to make up for the lost revenue.


