RED HOT: \$3.9 MILLION COLT ADDS TO KEENELAND THUNDER

Forget Floyd. The real storm is at Keeneland where the September Yearling Sale continues to streak into the record book. In the 55 years that Keeneland has been selling yearlings in September, only 12 colts and five fillies have sold for seven figures, but buyers at this year's auction are intent on blazing a new trail. With just two of 11 sessions in the history books, 15 colts and five fillies have already topped seven figures. Leading the million-dollar hit parade Tuesday was hip number 503, a son of Kris S.--Mr. P's Princess (Mr. Prospector). After a protracted bidding war, the colt went to Sheikh Mohammed al Maktoum for a sale's record \$3.9 million. The figure obliterated the previous Keeneland September best set when Satish Sanan purchased a son of Mr. Prospector for \$2.3 million in 1997 and is the highest price paid for a yearling in the world so far this year. Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne was the underbidder. The sale's topper was consigned by Dixiana Farm, agent for Harold Harrison, and is a half brother to the top European two-year-old Fasliyev (Nureyev). "He is phenomenal," said John Ferguson who signed the sale's ticket for Sheikh Mohammed. "He is a grand-looking athlete. There's a very, very good two-year-old in Ireland (Fasliyev), Menifee is in the pedigree--the family is on fire and we are absolutely delighted to have him."

Coolmore Buys Record Filly...

The day wasn't a complete shut-out for the Coolmore contingent of John Magnier and Michael Tabor. They were the last bidders left standing when hip number 536, a daughter of Storm Cat--Piquetnol (Private Account) sauntered through the ring. With a final bid of \$2 million, the yearling became the highest-priced filly in the sale's history, eclipsing the mark of \$1.65 million set earlier in the day by hip number 344. "She's a lovely filly," said O'Byrne. "She's got a grand pedigree and she looks the part. The sale is very strong. If you want one of the top horses, you have to pay."

Charismatic's Half Brother Sells for \$1.2M

Another highlight of yesterday's session, was the sale of hip number 331, a half brother by Cryptoclearance to Kentucky Derby winner Charismatic (Summer Squall). Dave and Jill Heerensperger spent \$1.2 million to bring home the dark bay yearling. "This is the first time we've played this high in the market," Jill Heerensperger said after outbidding Charismatic's trainer D. Wayne Lukas, among others. "We've been thinking about getting in and going after a big horse. We really liked this horse. He looks like he has a chance to be a real runner and, if he can, he has a great chance to be a stud. My husband is retired now and we've got to find him something else to do. This ought to keep him busy." The colt will be trained by David Hofmans. Although missing out on the half brother to his sophomore star, Lukas did purchase nine yearlings Tuesday for Charismatic's owners Bob and Beverly Lewis. "From where I'm sitting, the sale is as strong, if not stronger than it's ever been," Lukas commented. "It seems like everybody in the room is on the hips that we've selected. That makes it very, very difficult to buy. We're getting some good horses."

By the Numbers...

The 14 yearlings who sold for over \$1 million last night represented 10 different sires. Three stallions, Mr. Prospector, Storm Cat and Gone West, were represented by two or more millionaires. Figures for the sale continue to reach the stratosphere. Last night's average was up a whopping 60.6 percent over the 1998 sale and the median rose 47.5 percent. Over the first two days of the sale, the average is up 49.1 percent and the median is up 42 percent. "We are extremely happy," said W. B. Rogers Beasley, Keeneland's director of sales. "We thought (Monday)'s session was very good and that today would be about the same. We never dreamed that it would be up 60 percent." The sale's third session begins today at 10 a.m.

AMERICAN ANTHEM Royal Anthem (Theatrical {Ire}), the impressive eight-length winner of the Aug. 17 G1 Juddmonte International S. prior to his fifth-place finish to Daylami (Ire) in the G1 Irish Champion S. this past Saturday, is being sent to the U.S., according to published reports. He will be trained by Bill Mott. Discussing long-term goals for the four-year-old, Dick Mulhall, racing manager for Prince Ahmed Salman's The Thoroughbred Corp, said, "We may think about the Breeders' Cup Classic, as well as the Dubai World Cup and the Japan Cup." Trained in England by Henry Cecil, Royal Anthem won five races from nine starts and over \$1.3 million, including last year's GI Canadian International at Woodbine before finishing seventh as the favorite in the Breeders' Cup Turf. "He is a very, very good horse who ranks amongst the best I've been lucky enough to train," Cecil told the *Racing Post*. "It's sad he's going, but we wish him all the very best in America," he added.

WRITERS UP

AT THE SALES ... with Bill Oppenheim

Not the Big Room at The Top at this sale for Sheikh Mohammed...he was out in the trenches with the rest of us, and he seemed to be enjoying himself, too. He breaks records all the time--14 Group 1 wins in Europe this year for Godolphin, and counting--so he probably won't notice too much that he broke the world record for a Kris S. yesterday afternoon, when he bought hip number 503, Fasliyev's half brother, for \$3.9-million, highest price for a yearling in the world so far this year. Demi O'Byrne was the underbidder, so he would have broken another record himself if Sheikh Mohammed hadn't. Demi won the sale's high filly a half hour later, \$2 million for hip 536, the Storm Cat filly out of Chimes of Freedom's Classic-placed sister, Piquetno. In a sale where 10 buyers or buying groups had bought 16 seven-figure (\$1 million-plus) yearlings by mid-afternoon Tuesday, the two biggest buys featured the Thoroughbred world's two biggest players--Sheikh Mohammed and the Maktoums, and Coolmore. Business as usual. Brisk business.

Book 1 featured the revival of Unbridled's Song among first-year sires. Each of the last three years has featured a popularity contest between Ashford's top prospect and the top prospect from The Rest of The World (so to speak). At the 1997 sales (oldest now three-year-olds), it was Dehere for Coolmore, and Holy Bull. Jury still out on both, by the way, but both are still close to being all right. Last year it was Thunder Gulch--now with eight winners and trying to act like a hot young sire--and Tabasco Cat. He only has one winner so far but doesn't feel like a horse in trouble--at least that was the impression I got when I sat and watched one go through the ring for \$900,000. This year, of course, it's Hennessy and Unbridled's Song, who finished two-one in the 1995 Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Hennessy got the headlines and the money through the summer (21 sold, averaging \$392,000), while Unbridled's Song had just five sell, well enough, averaging \$308,000. Through the first 500 in Book 1, Unbridled's Song had 10 offered, seven sold, averaging over \$466,000, including a colt and a filly to Bob and Beverly Lewis (in absentia) for \$1,150,000 and \$600,000 respectively, and an \$800,000 filly to B. Wayne Hughes. That brought his average up to just a tick over \$400,000 for his first 12 sold, and probably edges him ahead of Hennessy, who had 31 catalogued in Book 1.

There were just six stallions with five or more catalogued in Book 1, and the reviews were generally good for the other four, too--Afternoon Deelites, Grindstone, Honour and Glory, and Smart Strike. One or two of the Judges were quite complimentary about the Smart Strikes especially.

Still quite a hefty buy-back rate; almost 30 percent Monday, though looked better Tuesday. A demain ...

The weekend was a very good one for Valid Appeal mares. This up-and-coming broodmare sire was represented by Grade I winners on successive days at Belmont Park with Val's Prince (Eternal Prince--Key Buy, by Valid Appeal) taking the Man o' War S. and Perfect Sting capturing the Garden City Breeders' Cup H.

Perfect Sting is another example of a very successful combination, that of In Reality and Roberto. It is not surprising that this should be particularly successful for a Valid Appeal mare, since Valid Appeal's full sister Desert Vixen produced Real Shadai (by Roberto), who won the G2 Grand Prix de Deauville and finished second in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club before going on to earn honors as champion sire in Japan.

The combination of Roberto and Valid Appeal doesn't give any close inbreeding, but it is worth noting that Roberto's sire Hail to Reason is out of Nothirdchance, a mare inbred 3x4 to Man o' War. Valid Appeal's sire In Reality is inbred 3x3 to War Relic, a son of Man o' War who was inbred 3x3 to Rock Sand.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

Four on the Floor (g, 2, Academy Award--Pleasant Deception, by Darby Creek Road), who stamped himself as one of Canada's top juvenile colts with a win in Saturday's GII Summer S., is the product of a very clever pedigree. Academy Award is by Secretariat (Bold Ruler--Somethingroyal, by Princequillo). Popular Demand, the third dam of Four on the Floor, is by Successor (Bold Ruler--Misty Morn, by Princequillo), who is closely related to Secretariat. We have noticed Secretariat working with other Bold Ruler/Princequillo crosses, and we think that he generally works well with any reinforcement of his Nasrullah/Princequillo background. To return to Four on the Floor, we also note that he has duplications of Nashua (broodmare sire of Academy Award's own broodmare sire, Mr. Prospector) and of Better Self, the sire of Academy Award's second dam.

The Floral Park H. produced an unusual example of the pattern of inbreeding to the broodmare sire of the sire, in the shape of **Positive Gal (f, 3, Affirmed--Degenerate Gal, by Degenerate Jon).** She is inbred 3x5 to Crafty Admiral, the broodmare sire of Affirmed. In addition, Positive Gal also has Native Dancer 4x4, and of course the combination of Crafty Admiral and Native Dancer has long been recognized as a positive one.

Promising young sire American Chance had two stakes winners on Saturday. We have previously reviewed Lasting Chance (f, 3, American Chance--Baildance, by Bailjumper), who took the GIII British Columbia Breeders' Cup Oaks, but **Rebound (c, 2, American Chance--Chugger, by Drone),** who took the Floyd Duncan Memorial S., also has a pedigree pattern worth noting. American Chance is a grandson of Stop the Music, who was by a son of Turn-To out of a Tom Fool mare. Rebound's broodmare sire Drone is also by a son of Turn-To out of a Tom Fool mare. In addition, American Chance carries Speedwell, a half sister to Somethingroyal (dam of Secretariat and Sir Gaylord) and Drone is by a son of Sir Gaylord, giving Rebound a duplication of Imperatrice.
