NUMBERS STILL STRONG AS SALE WINDS

DOWN With gross sales up a whopping 51 percent versus 1998 and the average up 27 percent, the penultimate day of this year's Keeneland September Sale continued the record-setting trend established in previous days. The session's top seller, the next-tolast horse to go through the sales ring, was a colt by Storm Boot out of the unraced Assagai mare Assagai's Ex. Purchased by Academy Development for \$80,000, the chestnut was consigned to the sale by the McMillin Brothers. The top-selling filly of the afternoon was hip 3738, a dark bay or brown filly from the first crop of yearlings from the Seeking the Gold stallion Mutakddim. Out of Valid Pache (Valid Appeal), a full sister to GSWs Valid Expectations (GIII Derby Trial, GIII Sport Page H.) and Little Sister (GIII Azalea Breeders' Cup), she brought a final bid of \$52,000 from Willow Ridge Farms and was consigned by Angus Glen Farm, Inc. Also sold for \$52,000 was He Can Really Dance, a colt by Is It True--Can Thou Dance (Seattle Dancer). Consigned by Dromoland Farm, the chestnut was purchased by M. R. Stables. The 11th and final session of the sale begins this morning at 10 a.m.

KING OF THE MANOR

A previous winner of two conditions events this season, Chelsea Manor (GB) (Grand Lodge) was tackling group company for the second time. He finished fourth in his previous start, the G3 Prix Daphnis at Chantilly July 27. He made the necessary progression from that first experience to beat some more hardened opponents in good style, seizing the initiative in the final furlong for a competent win. Alliteration (GB) (Polish Precedent) dictated the early pace ahead of Perfect Vintage (GB) (Shirley Heights {GB}), Barbola (Diesis {GB}) and Agol Lack (Gulch) as Chelsea Manor was reserved in sixth. Chelsea Manor made his move passing the two-furlong pole and led approaching the final furlong. He made a decisive kick at the distance and poached a race winning lead, keeping up a strong gallop all the way to the line. His opponents were caught napping and it was only in the last 100 yards that Barbola and Agol Lack began to reduce the deficit. Agol Lack ran on slightly the better of the pair and nicked second from Barbola in the dying strides.

EL CONDOR PASA SPARKLES IN ARC WORK El Condor Pasa (Kingmambo), an early favorite for the Oct. 3 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, worked an impressive five furlongs on the Coye La Foret grass straight course at Lamorlaye. According to French trainer Tony Clout, who hosts the Japanese champion, "El Condor Pasa seems to be in top form presently. Also the ground was quite soft this morning and he seems to handle it perfectly well, which is a good sign as the conditions might be similar on Arc day." Manager Nobutaka Tada, who supervises the training of the colt, watched his charge's work before boarding a plane to Miami. He is scheduled to scope out Gulfstream Park in anticipation of El Condor Pasa's possible start in the Nov. 6 Breeders' Cup

GERMAN GUINEAS WINNER TO U.S. Rose of Zollern (Ire) (Seattle Dancer), winner of the G2 Henkel-Rennen (German 1,000 Guineas) has been sold to Gary Tanaka for an undisclosed sum. The three-year-old filly won four of eight German starts and was on the board in both the G2 Prix der Diana (German Oaks) and G1 Großer Preis Bayerisches Zuchtrennen Dallmayr. She will stopover in France before traveling on to begin her United States racing campaign.

BEVO FINISHED FOR THE YEAR Bevo (Prospector's Gamble), conqueror of the previously undefeated More Than Ready in last Sunday's GI Futurity at Belmont Park, is done for the year after a bone chip was discovered in his left knee. Surgery to repair the injury took place Tuesday at the New Jersey Equine Clinic. "I talked to Dr. Palmer (Wednesday) morning and he said Bevo came out of the surgery just fine," said trainer Billy Badgett. The chestnut is expected to miss up to four months. While the Kentucky Derby is still on the agenda for Bevo, Badgett told the *Daily Racing Form* that everything would have to go "picture perfect" in order to make the Derby.

Our Mims Gets New Home:

Twenty years ago, everyone in the racing world knew about Our Mims, but recently it seemed that she had been forgotten. But now, the 25-year-old, who was voted three-year-old champion of 1977, has a new home. Jeanne Mirabito, a writer for the *Bourbon County Times* (Kentucky), became concerned about the welfare of Our Mims and contacted ReRun, a Kentucky-based home for retired Thoroughbreds, for their intervention. ReRun agreed to participate and contacted T.U.R.F. (Thoroughbred United Retirement Fund). "We jumped at the chance to support a horse like Our Mims," said Carol Sinclair, founder of T.U.R.F.

Stellar Brush Likely To Miss Super Derby:

The GIII Ohio Derby winner Stellar Brush (Broad Brush), recipient of a tough trip in the Sept. 5 GIII Remington Park Derby in his last start, came out of that third-place finish with cuts on his legs and is likely out of the GI Super Derby at Louisiana Downs Oct. 2.

Greely Charge Sharp in Kentucky Cup Drill:

Lightly raced Five Star Day (Carson City), an outstanding second to Forestry in the GI King's Bishop S. at Saratoga in his first stakes engagement Aug. 28, prepped for Saturday's GII Kentucky Cup Sprint with a bullet three-furlong drill in :34 2/5 yesterday morning at Turfway Park. Five Star Day is expected to go favored in the race which produced last year's Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Reraise.

Seven New Inductees To Fair Grounds Hall of Fame:

Five human and two equine inductees will comprise the Class of 2000 for entry into the Fair Grounds Hall of Fame. The 1996 Louisiana and Kentucky Derby winner Grindstone and Eclipse Award-winning filly Furl Sail are to be joined by trainers Bobby Barnett and Homer Pardue, racing official Frank "Buddy" Abadie, and racing "pioneers" Gen. Thomas Jefferson Wells and Richard Ten Broeck. Induction ceremonies are scheduled for Sat., March 11, 2000.

Sam Houston Stakes Schedule Announced:

Sam Houston Race Park, which will begin its 90-day meet on Oct. 28, will offer \$100,000 in purses each day and will feature 37 stakes races with over \$1.7 million in purses. The northwest Houston racetrack's seventh Thoroughbred meeting concludes Apr. 9. The Texas Champions Day has been set for Dec. 10 and will offer nine stakes races with over \$700,000 in purses. Highlighting the card is the \$200,000 Gallery Furniture.com Texan Juvenile S. for two-year-olds of Texas owners. Also on tap for the season is the Jan. 22 \$100,000 MAXXAM Gold Cup and the Feb. 26 \$150,000 Connally Breeders' Cup Turf.

\$5 Million "Ultra" Pick Six On Tap for BC Day:

Officials at Breeders' Cup Ltd. have announced a guaranteed \$5 million Pick Six on Breeders' Cup Day at Gulfstream Park Nov. 6. The exotic wager will cover each of the championship races, except the Distaff and Juvenile Fillies. It is expected for the first time that the Ultra Pick Six will be available in a number of international jurisdictions, as discussions are under way with officials in England, Ireland and France. Guaranteed \$1 million Pick Six wagers will be offered on the other two days of the meeting Friday, Nov. 5 and Sunday, Nov. 7.

Pair of Lawsuits Against Gulfstream Park:

Donna Morello-Ciardullo, a former Gulfstream Park employee who worked in the marketing department, has filed a \$250,000 civil law suit against track management charging sexual harassment and discrimination. In her suit she claims she was repeatedly told by management level personnel of Gulfstream to talk to clients sexy on the phone (it will help you get meetings with them), wear short skirts for business meetings with clients, and sit up close to clients so they could see your knees. Morello-Ciardullo claims she was the only female marketing assistant and the only person to whom this type of comment was directed. Another former employee has filed charges of sexual and wages discrimination with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission against Gulfstream. Vicki Samuels-Rodriguez, former director of simulcasting, claims both her male predecessor and male successor were paid higher salaries than her. She also claimed "...she was tremendously humiliated to be screamed at and essentially called a liar for having to go to court so many times for my ongoing divorce proceedings." Her case is under review by the EEOC. Doug Donn, president of Gulfstream Park said, "When the facts come out they will not support their case. Discrimination in any form under my administration will not be tolerated."

The sale's topper was the first horse to walk through the ring at Wednesday's second session of the two-day sale. Swedish trainer Michael Khan went to 84,000gns to secure lot 271, a colt by Danehill (USA) out of the German champion mare Palacegate Episode (Ire) (Drumalis {Ire}). It was the fourth highest price ever paid for a yearling at Fairyhouse. The sale's average was up eight percent over last year's sale and the aggregate represented an increase of 12 percent. The median climbed five percent. "The rise in aggregate and average to new record figures has been a satisfactory outcome to the last two day's trading," said Tattersalls (Ireland) Chairman Edmond Mahony. "It was very encouraging to see so many purchasers from the UK as well as Irish trainers and so many vistors from overseas."
