"MILLENIUM" HEADS OF MILE

Due to the adverse weather conditions affecting the state of the ground, today's G1 Queen Elizabeth S., Europe's last Group 1 mile race of the season, has seen the field reduced to four. Dubai Millennium (GB) (Seeking the Gold), who met with his only defeat in the G1 Vodafone Derby, will be a strong favorite to give Godolphin their 16th Group 1 winner of the year. The three-year-old decimated a quality field in the G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois at Deauville Aug. 15 and today's track condition is similar to that occasion. The colt clearly appreciates a testing surface. The consistent Almushtarak (Ire) (Fairy King) also favors softer going and has finished to good effect in most of his races. He closed for third in the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood July 28, finishing ahead of both Gold Academy (Ire) (Royal Academy) and Balisada (GB) (Kris {GB}), then finished fourth in the G1 Juddmonte International at York and third in the G2 Celebration Mile at Goodwood Aug. 28. Balisada, winner of the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot June 16, needs to have a strong pace to be seen at her best. She won on heavy going as a juvenile and will be held up to make as late a challenge as possible.

FAST "FRIEND" FAVORED IN VOSBURGH

Crafty Friend (Crafty Prospector) was 4-1 when he captured the July 4 GII Tom Fool H. and 9-2 when he took the Sept. 6 GII Forego H. He is the even-money morning-line favorite to make it three in a row in today's GI Vosburgh S., but trainer John Kimmel is uneasy about running the six-year-old back on short rest. "Anytime you run back in less than three weeks, it's a little bit of a concern, especially coming off the kind of effort he gave in the Forego," Kimmel said. The chestnut battled on the front end through fractions of :44 1/5 and 1:08 1/5 in his most recent appearance and still had enough in the tank to best the talented Affirmed Success by a neck. He is now three-for-four at the Vosburgh distance of seven furlongs. Looking forward to the Nov. 6 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, Kimmel said, "Six furlongs is a little short for him. It would be a tough assignment. He would have to draw favorably, probably an outside post position. We'll see how we do here...if we don't like the way things are going, we could point to a race like the Cigar Mile (at Aqueduct, Nov. 27)." Stormin Fever (Storm Cat) makes his second start after a nine-month layoff. The five-year-old, who fractured a hind cannon bone as a three-year-old, did it again last season, but came back to take a Saratoga allowance Sept. 5. Second in this race a year ago, he narrowly missed beating Horse of the Year Skip Away in the 1998 GII Iselin H. and won the GIII Sport Page H. in his penultimate performance of the campaign. "He had screws in him last year when he lost by a nose to Skip Away," trainer Mark Hennig said. "He's been to a good surgeon and we've done a good job taking care of him. He's...training better than he ever has. He was a June foal and he got sick as a baby, so maybe he is reaching his peak now."

Teggiano has the credentials to add to her decisive win in the G3 May Hill S. at Doncaster Sept. 9, where she beat Aunty Rose into third. In winning that race, she reversed the form of a July 25 Newmarket maiden when she finished fourth to Aunty Rose. Both fillies look particularly useful sorts, but preference is given to Clive Brittain's progressive juvenile, who has won two of her three starts to date. High Walden was fourth in the Listed Chesham S. at Royal Ascot June 17 on her debut and followed up with a workmanlike win in a mile maiden at Leicester Sept. 7. She bids to give Henry Cecil his seventh win in this race and merits the utmost respect.

Blazing Sword has overcome a series of setbacks to make it to the starting gate for today's race. "I've never had a horse that's had more tough luck and suffered through so much," trainer Kathleen O'Connell said. The five-year-old showed a lot of promise early in his career, winning stakes at two before taking the GIII Calder Derby and finishing second in the GII Fountain Of Youth S. to start his three-year-old season in 1997. But he came down with a lung infection, then was plagued by recurring colic. "At one point, he looked like a bag of bones," O'Connell said. He came back to finish second in the GIII Royal Palm H. and third behind Yagli in both the GIII Hialeah Turf H. and GII Dixie H. last year. But after running second in the Nov. 26 Thanksgiving Day H. at Calder, he slipped and fell and cracked his pelvis. The gelding was out for nearly nine months before running second over a sloppy Calder strip in an Aug. 14 allowance, then finished fifth in his latest, the Sept. 6 Spend A Buck H. "He has overcome so much," O'Connell said. "We thought he might be through last year, but he's come around and we're running him in the Kentucky Cup to see just how much. A horse that's had as much adversity as this fellow--but has an even bigger heart--deserves a chance to go as far as he can." Classic Cat, a perfect three-for-three at this distance, was first in the Apr. 11 GII San Bernardino H. two back. He adds blinkers after finishing eighth in his return off the layoff in the Aug. 22 GIII Longacres Mile H.

Isitever finished off the board in three California starts to kick off his career, but has been nearly perfect since shipping to Kentucky. The bay colt won back-toback outings in June and July, finished second by a head when trying the turf at Ellis Park Aug. 14, then came back to take a Turfway allowance test by eight lengths Sept. 15. Making his stakes debut, he can sit off what are sure to be serious fractions. Five Star Day dueled through a half in :43 2/5 and six furlongs in 1:07 3/5 before finishing second to Forestry in his stakes bow, the Aug. 28 GI King's Bishop. West Coast shipper Freespool can also fly. The bay flashed through a half in :43 2/5 before tiring to be fifth in the July 4 Harry Henson S. at Hollywood, added a front-running score in an optional claimer at Del Mar July 31 and was most recently fourth after contesting a :44 2/5 split in the Sept. 4 Pirate's Bounty H. at 6 1/2 furlongs.

On their best form they would dominate the event, but the latter, winner of the G1 Aga Khans Studs National S. as a juvenile, has failed to win in three starts this season and has not appeared since finishing fifth in the G2 Budwiser International S. at The Curragh June 27. Muhtathir, who shipped to Tokyo in June to finish fifth in a Group 1 event, has had just the one run in Europe this year, finishing fourth in the G3 G.N.E.R.Park S. at Doncaster Sept. 9.

The 1998 G1 Oaks d'Italia winner Zomaradah won the G2 Royal Whip S. in Ireland in mid-August, but was then beaten by German-trained Noel (Ger) in the G3 Premio Federico Tesio at Milan Sept. 5. Nightdance, winner of a Listed race at Krefeld in July, was third on her last start, the G3 Deutscher Stutenpreis Sept. 12. Best of the home-based runners are Bardonnechia and Juhina. The latter beat the former by a head in the Listed Premio Buontalenta in Rome in June, but has been unplaced on her last two starts. Bardonnecchia won the G3 Prix de Psyche at Deauville last year, but was only fourth in the G2 Prix d'Astarte Aug. 1. She bounced back to win the Listed Premio Archidamia here Sept. 12.

WRITERS UP

HOUGHTON SALES THOUGHTS By Tony Morris

There are two strains of the highly infectious sales fever.

One, whose conspicuous symptoms are a long face, an agitated demeanour and a propensity for Prozac-popping, has been largely absent from these islands since 1992.

The other, characterised by high adrenalin levels, childlike optimism and much rubbing of hands, is prevalent again in Newmarket, borne on the tornado of rising prices that has already affected the environs of Lexington, upstate New York and continental Europe's luxury seaside resort of Deauville.

The three-day Houghton Yearling Sale, the premier auction of its type this side of the Atlantic, opens Tuesday. Take it from a local resident that the town already throbs in anticipation of another carefree spending spree in the Park Paddocks pavilion, Tattersalls' temple to mammon where last year's top-priced lot even outsold anything that Keeneland had to offer.

It can be confidently predicted--this is not the year for a dramatic market downturn at Tatts. We wonder every December, when the pinhookers speculate in seemingly ever-more irrational sums, whether their comeuppance lies only nine months away; in an industry unused to steady growth, a year or two of bust invariably follows years of boom. For now doomsday is on hold; first, more boom.

It would be too much to expect that the rash of new money poured into 1999's U.S. markets might be replicated here. But if just the usual suspects show--and there is every indication that they will--they will suffice to send prices soaring to new highs. In this crazy world where the sums rarely add up, some of the players actually need to be seen spending more, if only to maintain the credibility of the credulous.

The Houghton is Tattersalls' flagship sale. Sharing its spot in the calendar with an important race meeting a mile up the road, it is much more a focus of public attention than the huge December clearance, which may seem massively significant to the cosmopolitan professional gathering it attracts, but as a wintry, out-of-season affair quite divorced from racing tends to pass almost unnoticed by the great majority.

The Houghton is timely theatre, illusion under lights, and a natural headline-grabber. And since his elevation to chairman of Tatts board, Edmond Mahony has maximised the potential of the occasion with unerring accuracy.

When he stripped nearly 20 percent from the catalogue in 1995, he remarkably obtained a rise in the gross as well as predictable increases in average and median. A further contraction a year later brought 50 percent-plus growth in all departments.

In '97 he consciously forfeited average by increasing numbers, but along with his growth in revenue he got a slight but significant improvement in the median. Last year, by reducing the catalogue drastically again, he created ferocious demand, leading to outlandish records in average (171,357gns) and median (100,000gns).

The 1999 book is larger again, but up only from 246 to 260. In a year when the acquisitiveness of the perennial major players has been amply demonstrated elsewhere, the likelihood is that Mahony has judged things right once more. The final test is whether the physical specimens match their pedigrees (which are certainly on a par with last year), and if that proves to be the case, we can look for increases all round.

So, the showpiece occasion, in the spotlight's glare, seems set to glitter more than ever. Heavens be praised, all's well with the world!

Well, not quite. Rising revenues and falling records, set in the dramatic context of the auction arena, will be attention-grabbing, and a howling Houghton success will surely cause a few champagne corks to pop.

But in all the celebratory brouhaha, some essential facts will, as ever, be obscured or ignored. Rise upon rise would be more convincing if the comparisons were like with like; the continual alterations to the composition of the catalogue mean that is not the case.

We will also surely discover that this year's Houghton will be largely about the buying of half a dozen major players--some of them "whim" bidders utterly careless of the value of money, others with an ultra-businesslike approach, keen to keep prices high because of their vested interest in the other end of the market, namely stallions.

The Houghton is an elite occasion. It involves few sellers and far fewer buyers. It does not touch the lives of many who seek to thrive as breeders of racehorses. At least, it should not.

Unfortunately, its results--to a degree manufactured, contrived and unrepresentative of reality--will be a major factor in an inflationary stud fee spiral to affect one and all. That postponed "bust" year is getting closer.

Both will be trained by Chris Wall in Newmarket for Italian-born, but U.K.-based owner Ettore Landi. Amanda Skiffington took down a colt by Night Shift (GB)--Dabbiana (USA), by Fappiano (USA), who will go to Luca Cumani, for L125,000,000. Among the home team. Scuderia Nuova Sbarra was the most active, being responsible for the top two fillies, a St. Jovite (USA) -- Lovealoch (Ire), by Lomond (USA) for L150,000,000, and a Barathea (Ire)--Via Col Vento (USA), by Arctic Tern (USA) for L110,000,000. The average was up to L55,000,000 from last year's L52,344,595.

DETTORI THREATENS TO SUE BBC

Leading rider Frankie Dettori is threatening to sue the BBC's Newsnight program over its press release advertising an item broadcast on Thursday night's show about the use of diuretics by jockeys. The press release had the headline: "Dettori Tells Newsnight: I Took Drugs," and carried a selective quotation from Dettori, who admitted to using diuretics very early in his career. The release, since changed, implied that he might still be using them. Dettori stated that he had not used the drugs for 10 years. The Jockey Club banned diuretics in June and has not seen a positive sample since. Peter Burrell, Dettori's business manager, said yesterday, "We will be taking vigorous action. We are not litigious people, but there are things you get away with in life and things you get pulled up on, and they will get pulled up on this one. What we are concerned about is the nature of the BBC's press release, which basically has resulted in every newspaper in the country printing the story." The BBC said no attempt had been made to imply Dettori had used "illegal drugs to enhance his sporting performance or otherwise."
