SADLER'S WELLS COLT TOPS TATTERSALLS OPENER

It was The Thoroughbred Corporation, in the shape of racing manager Richard Mulhall, who captured the top lot of the opening session of the 1999 Tattersalls Houghton Yearling Sale yesterday evening in Newmarket, England. Mulhall, speaking on a mobile phone all the while, continued bidding up to 775,000 quineas while others wilted under the pressure. In the end, he fought off Demi O'Byrne, acting for Coolmore interests, to secure lot 47, a Sadler's Wells colt out of Shilka (GB) (Soviet Star). The yearling had cost Camas Park Stud's Timmy Hyde 430,000 guineas as a foal at Tattersalls December Sales. The colt will go to trainer Henry Cecil. O'Byrne got his way when, acting for Coolmore's John Magnier, he bought Lot 17, a Gone West filly out of G1 Irish Oaks winner Pure Grain (GB) (Polish Precedent), for 625,000 guineas. The underbidder was Hamdan Al Maktoum's Shadwell Estate Company. The other yearling to top the 500,000-guineas mark was Lot 16 who went for 600,000 guineas after another prolonged bidding battle, this time between Rudiger Alles of German International Bloodstock and Sheikh Mohammed, with the former taking the spoils. Compared to last year's opening session, the average price was down 4.5 percent. The median increased 20 percent from a year ago. At the end of bidding yesterday, Tattersalls Marketing Manager Jimmy George said, "After the phenomenal sale of the last year, the median rising by 20 percent has to be seen as a very encouraging start to the 1999 Houghton Sale." The sale resumes at 2:30 p.m. today and the third and final session begins at 5:15 p.m. Thursday.

A win in one of two contested maidens at Brighton Apr. 29 and a second-place finish in the Listed Sirenia S. at Kempton Sept. 8, proved to be the ideal springboard for Seazun to record the biggest win of her career to date as she just got the better of the more experienced Torgau after a protracted duel throughout the final furlong. There was a minor sensation before the race as the fancied Warrior Queen (Quiet American) was withdrawn at the start based on the advice of the track veterinarian. As the race got under way, the field split into two groups, the far side headed by Bethesda (GB) (Distant Relative {Ire}) and the hard-pulling Vita Spericolata (Ire) (Prince Sabo {GB}) and the near side towed along by Torgau. As the field passed halfway, Torgau held the overall advantage and, with a quarterof-a-mile to go, it became evident that the finish would be between Torgau, Seazun and Crimplene. Torgau was joined by Seazun at the distance and it was only in the last half furlong that Seazun inched ahead. Moon Driver, a huge pre-race gamble, was in rear throughout and was only put into the race when it was too late. A relieved Mick Channon enthused, "Everything has been planned around coming here, win or lose, and we have been fortunate enough to go and win it. The first two are good and the form is solid. The best thing about Seazun is her temperament, she is bomb proof. Races like the (G1 1000) Guineas will be on the agenda next season."

SAHM RETIRED Sahm (Mr. Prospector--Salsabil {Ire}, by Sadler's Wells), a five-year-old graded stakes winner, has been retired from racing and will begin stud duties next year at Shadwell Farm in Lexington, Kentucky. Of his former charge, trainer Kiaran McLaughlin commented, "He is a great-looking colt. He had some suspensory problems last year and they continued to aggravate him all summer." Sahm won five of 11 starts, including the GII Knickerbocker H. in his final start last October, and earned \$197,932.

Gold Away Shipped to Florida:

Gold Away (Ire) (Goldneyev) was shipped Monday evening from Criquette Head's Chantilly stables to Florida where he will be based in the run up to his attempt at the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Gulfstream Park Nov. 6. Runner-up to Sendawar (Ire) in the G1 Emirates Prix du Moulin de Longchamp in his latest start Sept. 5, Gold Away will seek to improve on the poor record of European-trained challengers at Gulfstream Park, Head's decision to send her charge so far in advance of the meet is so the horse has ample time to acclimatize to the humid weather conditions. After going through the necessary period of quarantine, Gold Away will be stabled at Payson Park until the morning of the race. Assistant trainer Rupert Pritchard-Gordon will supervise the preparation of the Wertheimer-owned homebred.

Dark Moondancer Ruled Out:

Flamingo Road (Ger)

After a less-than-impressive gallop at Maison-Laffitte yesterday, trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre declared Dark Moondancer (GB) (Anshan {GB}), winner of this year's G2 Prix d'Harcourt and G1 Prix Ganay, from Sunday's Arc, despite the horse being one of 25 acceptors at yesterday's forfeit stage. Intended jockey Pat Eddery, joint record holder with four wins in the race, is at present left without a ride.

Darvaba Superb in Final Workout:

Owner His Highness the Aga Khan and trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre supervised their star filly Daryaba (Ire) (Night Shift) in her last serious piece of work before the big race, at Chantilly's Les Aigles grass course yesterday morning. Gerald Mosse was in the irons. Winner of the June 13 G1 Prix de Diane Hermes at Chantilly and the Sept. 12 G1 Prix Vermeille at Longchamp, she covered nine furlongs with three lead horses and delighted connections with a superb display. She finished upsides one of her stablemates, as the pair drew clear and she had plenty in hand at the end of the exercise. An impressed Mosse said: "I was in second gear all the way. I will keep fourth and fifth gears for Sunday as that is when it really matters. She looks to be in tremendous form."

Collet Hopeful for Cerulean Sky:

The three-year-old filly Cerulean Sky (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}), winner of this season's G1 Prix Saint-Alary at Longchamp May 23 and third to Daryaba in the G1 Prix Vermeille last time out, also worked yesterday morning over Chantilly's Les Aigles grass course. With Sylvain Guillot in the plate, she covered approximately 10 furlongs with three stable companions and satisfied both trainer and jockey by finishing a comfortable four lengths clear of her workmates.

Nowhere to Exit Still on Target:

Nowhere To Exit (GB) (Exit To Nowhere), trained by John Dunlop for Chelsea Football Club director Gary Pinchen, is still possible for the race as the ground conditions remain in his favor. With the going currently described as good to soft and further rainfall forecast until the end of the week, Nowhere To Exit will find the track condition very much to his liking. The winner of the G3 Prix la Force at Longchamp May 20, was an excellent second to current race favorite Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club at Chantilly June 6, but was slightly disappointing when fifth in the Listed March S. at Goodwood Aug. 28, in his latest start. He has a legitimate excuse for his that effort as it was run on unsuitably fast ground.

WRITERS UP

AT THE SALES ... with Bill Oppenheim

In 1994, Tattersalls' flagship Houghton Sale saw 280 yearlings gross just over 17 million guineas (\$29 million, at current exchange rates), and average 60,893 guineas (\$104,857), with a median of 36,000 guineas (\$61,992). As we all know, the market has surged big-time since then, but even so, the Houghton has followed the international select pattern of fewer being sold (207 last year, though it should be higher this time). In 1996, 213 listed sales averaged 122,427 guineas (\$210,819 at today's rates)--more than double the '94 average. After a blip in 1997, when the number sold went back up to 302 and the average dipped, the average surged to 171,357 (\$295,076) guineas last year, while the median continued its relentless climb and hit the 100,000 level (\$172,200). So the average and median nearly tripled in five years and the gross had doubled.

In that context, trade at last night's opening session had to be considered satisfactory. Short sessions can often produce inconclusive results, and we'll surely have a clearer picture today, but, compared to last year's opening session, the number sold and gross were up around 10 percent. The average was off four percent, but the median jumped another 20 percent, to 120,000 guineas (\$206,640), which certainly heartened the House. Three yearlings-successive fillies by Diesis (GB) and Gone West and the session-topping colt by Sadler's Wells, made over a million dollars.

Sheikh Mohammed and John Ferguson combined to buy six yearlings, all between 180,000-250,000 guineas (\$309,960-\$430,500), and they averaged 216,667 guineas (\$373,100). Shadwell added three, which averaged 230,000 guineas (\$396,060). As in Keeneland Book 1, the brothers accounted for around 20 percent of the night's gross--but in Kentucky, their Book 1 average was more like \$600,000. The feeling is that there isn't the strength in depth here that there is in that vast American market, and so, last night anyway, there wasn't really the sustained opposition to the Maktoums which would doubtless have driven prices higher. The other big players just bought one (Thoroughbred Corp.) or two (Demi, Wafic Said), while agents like Rudiger Alles of German International (including the 600,000-guineas Diesis filly), Peter Doyle, Brian Grassick, the Kern/Lillingston partnership of Lincoln Collins and Luke Lillingston, and trainers like Gerard Butler were able to each buy two or more six-figure yearlings.

Short first-year sire update: the 1992 Epsom Derby winner Dr Devious (Ire), now repatriated from Japan, had one for 220,000 guineas (\$378,840); the ubiquitous Hennessy, two more averaged 165,000 guineas (\$284,130); two nice individuals by Diesis' son, five-time Group 1 winner Halling, averaged 100,000 guineas (\$172,200); one by the crack miler Ashkalani (Ire), whose stock sold well at Deauville, brought 60,000 guineas (\$103,320); and two by the 1995 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Spectrum (Ire), averaged a disappointing 31,000 guineas (\$53,382). More chances for everybody today...

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

VOSBURGH S.-GI, \$250,000, BEL, 9-25, 3yo/up, 7f, 1:21 3/5, ft.

A classics contender last year after victories in the GII San Felipe S. and GII Santa Catalina S., Artax has benefited from changes of location and distance this year. Moved to New York and the care of Louis Albertrani after his previous trainer Randy Bradshaw took over D. Wayne Lukas' California division, Artax has also benefited from being campaigned as a sprinter. His pacesetting victory in the GI Vosburgh S. was his second outstanding performance over seven furlongs this year, following a win in the GI Carter H. in which his time of 1:20 eclipsed Dr. Fager's 21-year-old Aqueduct track record.

Artax is a member of the first crop of the Conquistador Cielo stallion Marquetry. Marquetry did equal a course record for about 6 1/2 furlongs on turf at Santa Anita, but he was at his best at middle distances, as demonstrated by wins in the 10 furlong GI Hollywood Gold Cup, and at nine furlongs in the GI Meadowlands Cup and GI Eddie Read H.

Perhaps some of the credit for Artax's speed comes from his female line. His granddam Fager's Charisma is a daughter of Dr. Fager, one of the fastest horses ever to race in North America. His dam Raging Apalachee is by Apalachee, who stayed a mile well enough to score a hugely impressive victory in what was then England's principal juvenile staying contest, the G1 Observer Gold Cup, but often sired speed. particularly in daughters such as Apalachee Honey, Pine Tree Lane (herself winner of the Carter H.), Lazer Show, Clocks Secret and Miss Indy Anna. Apalachee is beginning to make a mark as a broodmare sire, and in addition to Artax, his daughters have produced four other stakes winners by Mr. Prospector-line stallions, graded scorers Zealous Connection and Amarillo among them.

We don't know if this pedigree would have conveyed speed to Raging Apalachee. A \$2,300 purchase at the California Thoroughbred Sales Company's April mixed sale, she never reached the racecourse. Since then, Raging Apalachee's own value and the standing of the family have increased considerably. In fact, the female line has produced another 1999 Grade I winner in the shape of the GI

Del Mar Oaks victress Tout Charmant, whose dam Charm A Gendarme (a Grade III winner) is out of a half sister to Raging Apalachee. As for Raging Apalachee herself, she was sold for \$290,000 in foal to Siphon at the 1998 Keeneland November Sales. Earlier in the year her Mi Cielo filly, a three-quarters sister to Artax, was knocked down for \$190,000 at the Keeneland September Sales.

From a pedigree pattern viewpoint, the most noticeable factor is that Marquetry's sire Conquistador Cielo is bred on a Native Dancer (Polynesian)/Bold Ruler cross, while Power Ruler, sire of the third dam of Artax, is by Bold Ruler out of a Polynesian mare. This makes considerable sense when one recalls that Tout Charmant goes back in tail-male line to Boldnesian, who is also by Bold Ruler out of a Polynesian mare, and therefore has the three-parts related Boldnesian and Power Ruler 4x5. Power Ruler is another speed source-he scored his only stakes victory in the five-furlong Hyde Park S., and it is no surprise that the combination of Bold Ruler and Polynesian should produce pace. Both were champion sprinters, and both have pedigree similarities as Bold Ruler combines Pharos and Pompey, and Polynesian's pedigree contains Sickle (a close relative to Pharos) and Pompey. This concentrates a considerable amount of the brilliant English sprinter Sundridge with Sainfoin, a full brother to the dam of Sundridge, and this is a formula which often generates speed.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

Having already shown brilliance as sire, and great promise as a sire of sires, Storm Cat is demonstrating potential as a broodmare sire. His daughters have already produced European Champion two-year-old Mujahid and Japanese classic winner Phalaenopsis, and over the weekend the pair were joined by Black Tuxedo (c, 3, Sunday Silence-- O. P. Cat, by Storm Cat), winner of the G2 R. F. Radio Nippon Sho St. Lite Kinen in Japan. Black Tuxedo is yet another Sunday Silence out of a Northern Dancer-line mare and therefore linebred to Almahmoud.

Teggiano (f, 2, Mujtahid--Tegwen, by Nijinsky II) placed herself at the forefront of the English juvenile fillies with a courageous victory in the G1 Meon Valley Stud Fillies' Mile at Ascot. Teggiano's sire Mujtahid is a son of Woodman, who has crossed very well with mares by Nijinsky, the cross producing seven stakes winners including the group one scorer Way of Light. One would suspect that this is because Woodman is out of a mare by Buckpasser (by Tom Fool) and Nijinsky Il is out of Tom Fool's genetic relative, Flaming Page. Teggiano actually has a double of Buckpasser, and in fact both her grandsire Woodman and her granddam Beautiful Alv are bred on Raise a Native/Buckpasser crosses. Of particular interest is that the Raise a Native strains come through Mr. Prospector and the similarly bred Alydar, and we suspect that the this pair are going to be seen together with increasing frequency in the pedigrees of stakes winners.

THIS WEEK IN HISTORY...

September 29, 1973...Secretariat, off as the 3-10 favorite, was defeated by Prove Out in the mile-and-a-half Woodward S. at Belmont Park. Trained by Allen Jerkens, who also sent out Onion to beat Secretariat in the GI Whitney H., Prove Out won by 4 1/2 lengths, with the favorite second.

September 30, 1981...Jockey Laffit Pincay Jr. recorded his 5,000th career victory aboard Wander in the seventh race at Santa Anita...Bill Shoemaker picked up his first graded stakes win as a trainer, saddling Baldomero (Ire) to take the GIII Golden Harvest H. at Louisiana Downs.

October 2, 1943...Belmont Park hosted "Back the Attack" Day in support of the war effort. Admission was by purchase of \$25 or \$100 war bonds. The track raised approximately \$25 million.

October 2, 1981...At age 17, Behavin Jerry set the record for most career starts by a Thoroughbred, making his 307th appearance. Making his first start as a two-year-old in 1966, he raced every year through 1978, took a two-year break, then returned to race at age 17.

October 3, 1942...With his victory in the Jockey Club Gold Cup, Whirlaway, became the first Thoroughbred to earn more than \$500,000.

Oct. 4, 1970...Nijinsky II's 11-race winning streak came to an end when he finished second to Sassafras (Fr) in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp.

Oct. 4, 1989...Secretariat was euthanized at Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky due to complications from laminitis. He was 19.
