FAIRY KING OF HOUGHTON SALE

Two of the most powerful men in the bloodstock world, John Magnier of Coolmore Stud and Godolphin's Sheikh Mohammed, engaged in a bidding battle for a colt by Fairy King out of Groom Order (GB) (Groom Dancer) near the end of yesterday's second session of the Tattersalls Houghton Yearling Sale in Newmarket, England and when the dust had settled, Magnier walked away with the 1.7-million guineas yearling. The bidding frenzy produced applause from around the ring, while the seven-figure tag is the fourth highest price paid for a yearling in the world so far this year and the fifth highest ever witnessed in Europe. The sale's topper to this point is a full brother to the Aidan O'Brien-trained two-year-old King Street (Ire), a winner in his debut at The Curragh earlier this month, and is also related to Group 1 winners Entrepreneur (GB) and Exclusive (GB). He was consigned by Roy and Belinda Strudwick's Ballygallon Stud in County Kilkenny, Ireland who bought the mare, carrying King Street, for 82,000 guineas at the 1996 Tattersalls December Sales. After the sale Belinda Strudwick said, "I'd always thought he was a fantastic colt, but never in your wildest dreams do you imagine that this sort of thing will happen." Groom Order has a Baratheia (Ire) filly foal and went to Desert King this year. Rudiger Alles of German International, acting for a thrilled Baron Georg von Ullmann, went to 750,000 guineas for a Green Desert filly out of Colorsnap (GB) (Shirley Heights {GB}). Alles joined the fray at 550,000 guineas and had Sheikh Mohammed as the underbidder for the filly who was consigned by Egon Weinfield's Meon Valley Stud. Von Ullman said, "She will be a family horse and be trained in Germany. We will breed from her eventually--she has wonderful bloodlines. I am very happy to have her." The average sale price at yesterday's session was up three percent while the median increased 20 percent compared to last year's corresponding session. Through two days, the average is up 0.42 percent. The sale's final session begins today at 5:15 p.m.

Claimed by her current connections out of a winning effort against \$25,000 maidens in November 1997, Hula Queen made only one other main track appearance before switching to the infield for her last nine starts. The switch seemed to do the trick as the bay has been off the board only twice in those nine efforts, with three victories and a narrow defeat against Desert Lady in the GIII Las Cienegas H. Apr. 18, beaten a head. She followed that effort with a Hollywood allowance victory, but went to the shelf after a seventh-place finish in the Great Lady M. H. July 5. As the gates opened, Ecudienne showed first and set a strong pace in the early going, while Hula Queen, off slowly and bumped at the start, lingered towards the back of the pack. As the field crossed the main track, Ecudienne still led as Desert Lady and Hula Queen were charging down the center of the track, but it was the latter who reeled in the pacesetter and drew off to win going away. Winning jockey Alex Solis said, "I was not planning to be there (behind), but it just happened and I had to just go from there and improvise. It really worked out good for us because she relaxed great and then came very strongly with a big kick." The winner marks the first American stakes success for 53-year-old trainer Luis Seglin. The native Argentinian has trained in California for four years. "This is a nice way to start," he said.

The field for Newmarket's second Group 1 juvenile event of the week dwindled to just six starters with the late withdrawal of likely favorite **Bernstein** (Storm Cat) due to an abnormal blood count. Bernstein's defection leaves stablemate **Brahms** the sole representative of the well-oiled Ballydoyle machine. He was second to the G1 Prix de la Salamandre winner Giant's Causeway in the G3 King Of Kings EBF Futurity S. at The Curragh Aug. 29 in his last run, but he faces strong opposition from the home team. **Fath**, a half brother to G1 1000 Guineas winner Shadayid, was a hugely impressive winner of the Moorestyle Convivial Maiden S. at York Aug. 19 in his only career start. **Invincible Spirit** represents the in-form John Dunlop stable and was an eye-catching winner of the Listed Champion Two-Year-Old Trophy at Ripon Aug. 30 in his latest start. He is reported to have worked in good style since that last run and is another with a strong chance of winning. **Primo Valentino** has progressed with each race this year and has won his last five. He defeated Seazun, winner of Tuesday's G1 Cheveley Park S., when successful in the Listed Sirenia S. at Kempton Sept. 8, and was most recently victorious in the G2 Mill Reef S. at Newbury Sept. 18.

WRITERS UP

AT THE SALES ... with Bill Oppenheim

Fillies by Zieten run 1-2 in the Cheveley Park one day, and the next day John Magnier outbids John Ferguson and pays 1.7-million guineas (\$2,927,400, so you do get change for your \$3-million) for a colt whose sire never won a race and has two blank dams ... There's No Rules ... it's a popular cry these days. Of course, the sire in question is Fairy King, sire of Helissio, Oath, Second Empire, Revoque, and Victory Note in the last few years ... there are Rules, by the way, but just a few, like saletoppers have to be by a top international sire, they have to look the part, they have to pass the vet ... It was a Clash of the Titans, reminding us once again that all of us who swim around in six-figure land (or even five-figure land) have to stand back in awe when the Big Horse comes in, and John Magnier and Sheikh Mohammed square off. Sheikh Mohammed's been outbid a few times this sale--in fact, everytime he's gone above 400,000 guineas (\$688,800), he's lost. But Godolphin and John Ferguson between them have still signed for 18 horses (12 colts--including three by Machiavellian--and 6 fillies), and the highest price they've paid is 380,000 guineas (\$654,360). Sheikh Hamdan has bought seven now, including three colts by Darshaan, who is very definitely emerging now as a top-flight sales sire. Between them, the two brothers have bought 25 yearlings so far, accounting for 21.5 percent of the sale's gross, and averaging a relatively low-key 218,480 guineas (\$376,223). Plus Sheikh Maktoum's Gainsborough Stud has bought one, and agent Charlie Gordon-Watson, who usually buys for Maktoum associates, has added eleven. If we include all of Charlie's, that makes 37 so far, one less than 25 percent of the catalogue. Demi has bought six (two of them Danehill colts, so put him on your list alongside Machiavellian and Darshaan as emerging commercial stars), including the saletopper, Wafic Said's Addison Racing has bought six, and The Thoroughbred Corp. has just bought the one, Tuesday evening's session topper. But the real new shooter at the top level is German International's Rudiger Alles, who has bought seven so far, averaging 328,571 guineas (\$565,800), including two of the five which have brought 600,000 guineas or more.

There's a suggestion, in looking at the stallion averages, that a few of the Old Guard are losing favour, and a new group is poised on the threshold of commercial stardom. Fairy King inevitably leads the sire rankings thus far, but even though his average (five sold) is 406,400 guineas (\$699,820), his median is only 105,000 guineas (\$180,810)--the Big Horse has accounted for over 80 percent of his gross. Sadler's Wells comes next, of course, his 13 averaging 258,384 guineas (\$444,937), nothing to sneeze at, but maybe not quite so charismatic as in the past. Darshaan is the only other major sire averaging over 200,000. The seven sold by him have averaged 241,429 guineas (\$415,740). Consider him catapulted into the big time. The big commercial disappointment this year is Rainbow Quest, whose nine yearlings combined brought just over half of what Shakespeare alone sold for last year, and averaged 142,444 guineas (\$245,288). Among first-year sires, the top-class 1995 English 2000 Guineas winner Pennekamp got into action yesterday, and three yearlings by him averaged 132,333 guineas (\$227,877) to lead the pack among European sires (Hennessy has had three average 183,333 guineas, which is \$315,699). Another Maktoum stallion, the reformed hadicapper Halling, continued to look good, and to this point has had four average 97,500 (\$167,895). Impressive performances for both. Ashkalani has had four in this sale, and they have averaged 80,000 (\$137,760). Bringing up the rear among first-year stallions with three or more in the sale) is Spectrum, whose three sold have now averaged a more respectable 54,000 (\$92,988)

Pasa Passes Final Exam:

Japanese champion colt El Condor Pasa (Kingmambo) came through his final piece of serious work to the delight of connections. He covered seven furlongs of Les Reservoirs straight grass course at Chantilly yesterday morning with jockey Masayoshi Ebina aboard. With just over two furlongs remaining El Condor Pasa powered past his workmates and finished several lengths clear at the end of the gallop while stretching out in superb style. Trainer Yoshitaka Ninomiya said, "The soft ground doesn't seem to be a problem at all, he had his usual action and he quickened well. It was pretty soft when he won the (G1) Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud (July 4), so I am not too concerned."

Montjeu Sets Sights on High Stakes:

Soon after El Condor Pasa had lit the surroundings at Chantilly, it was Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells)'s turn to have his final preparation for the big day. Trainer John Hammond utilized the same stretch of Les Reservoirs straight grass course for his dual Derby winner and Montjeu covered six furlongs, only being extended in the last 1 1/2 furlongs. Soft ground is ideal for Montjeu and conditions look tailor made for Sunday's race.

German Duo Likely to Make Arc Lineup:

After a workout at Cologne Racecourse yesterday, Baron Georg von Ullmann's four-year-old colt Tiger Hill (Ire) (Danehill) was declared an "almost certain" starter by trainer Peter Schiergen. Tiger Hill was third to Sagamix (Fr) in last year's Arc. Baron Helmut von Finck's three-year-old filly Flamingo Road (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}) is reported by her trainer Andreas Schutz to have been working well and is also expected to take her chance on Sunday, but a definite decision will be made today. The filly won the G2 Preis der Diana (German Oaks) in May and was runner-up to Tiger Hill in the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden.

Dark Moondancer Still Doubtful:


Although it was reported yesterday that Dark Moondancer (GB) (Anshan {GB}) had been ruled out of the race, trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre allowed him to remain in the field at Wednesday's second forfeit stage. Dark Moondancer still remains a doubtful starter.

INGLIS BREEZE-UP SALE STARTS TODAY

A Danehill colt out of Alshandegha (Alydar) offered by Roselands Stud is expected to be the sale-topper at the fourth annual Inglis Australian breeze-up sale which kicks off today. This half brother to multiple Group 1 winner Mahogany (Last Tycoon) was clocked in 11.42 seconds for his 200-meter breeze during Tuesday's timed trials. Widden Stud in Hunter Valley is among those taking the breeze-up sale seriously with seven of its nine-strong draft clocking less than 11 seconds. "Overseas and here in Australia there is a correlation between the horses that run the fastest times and the horses that sell well, because they obviously have some race ability," said Widden Stud's general manager Derek Field. Trainer Gai Waterhouse, among several trainers scrutinizing the breeze-ups, said, "This sale is a brilliant concept because you get to see their action, their turn of foot, and you can watch them trot back after their gallop then see them again in the Inglis yard."

There weren't too many tears shed when Derrinstown Stud's Mujtahid was sold to Turkey in the autumn of 1997. Although the son of Woodman had created a favourable impression in 1995, when Mubhij (G3 Cornwallis S.) and Sweet Robin (runner-up in two G3 events) helped him into second place among the first-crop sires, that impression had gradually faded. There were no Group winners by him in 1996, his only Listed winners being Boojum (Radley S.) and Crown Treasure (a classic winner in India) and it was a similar story in 1997, though his son Gaily Eagle landed a valuable race classified as G3 in Japan.

Mujtahid's 1998 results also gave no reason for anyone to regret his departure, but there was always a chance that he would enjoy a revival this year, when he would be represented by the two-year-olds conceived immediately after his first-crop success in 1995, at an increased fee of Ir6,000gns. Sure enough, Mujtahid's current crop of juveniles has enjoyed plenty of success, with its total of winners reaching double figures. The winners include a healthy number of stakes performers, too, such as Fez, Tabheej and Bear King. Comfortably, the best of Mujtahid's two-year-olds, though, is his daughter Teggiano, who followed up her easy win in the G3 May Hill S. with a G1 success in the Meon Valley Stud Fillies' Mile.

It's to be hoped that Teggiano proves more durable than her sire, whose career was brought to a premature halt by a stress fracture to a cannon bone suffered in the December of his juvenile year. He had raced only four times, matching the record of his sire Woodman by winning his first three starts before suffering a defeat in the Dewhurst S. Despite that unexpected defeat, Mujtahid had been so impressive in winning the July S. by seven lengths and the Gimcrack S. by 4 that he was officially rated England's best juvenile, and he ranked second only to Hector Protector, another son of Woodman, on the International Classification.

The fact that Teggiano is out of a Nijinsky mare, Tegwen, is significant in view of the success that Woodman has occasionally enjoyed with daughters of the 1970 Triple Crown winner. Woodman's important winners out of Nijinsky mares include Bahhare, Way of Light and Dr Johnson and he also sired the Group-winning Wootton Rivers from a granddaughter of Nijinsky. Tegwen proved a disappointment as a racehorse, managing to win only an 11 ½-furlong maiden race at Yarmouth in Sheikh Mohammed's colours after being bought for \$625,000 as a yearling. She was also disqualified from a win over 1 ¼ miles, so can take credit for the stamina that Teggiano showed in the testing conditions at Ascot.

Both Tegwen and her dam, the Alydar mare Beautiful Aly, were closely related to GI winners. A mating between Alydar and Tegwen's third dam, Beautiful Spirit, produced Beautiful Melody, winner of the nine-furlong Beverly Hills H. in 1990, and a mating between Nijinsky and Tegwen's second dam, Beautiful Glass, resulted in the high-class Jeanne Jones, who lost the 1987 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies by only a nose. Beautiful Glass, a GIII winner over 8 ½ furlongs, also bred Avenue of Flags, a popular Californian stallion, so Teggiano has some impressive bloodlines. She is also inbred 4 x 5 x 4 to Raise A Native, through Mr. Prospector, Majestic Prince and Alydar.

From her three foals to race, the 18-year-old was most notably the dam of multiple champion and Canadian Horse of the Year Dance Smartly, who counts the 1991 Breeders' Cup Distaff among her accomplishments. Classy N' Smart is also the dam of GISW and current sire Smart Strike. Additionally, her unraced daughter Seattle Classic is the dam of this past weekend's GI Mazarine Breeders' Cup winner Hello Seattle. The mare was laid to rest yesterday at Sam-Son.

Hurricane Bertie Appeal Denied:

The New York State Racing and Wagering Board has denied the appeal lodged by the owners of Hurricane Bertie after she was disqualified from first place in the June 20 Vagrancy H. at Belmont. In the race, Hurricane Bertie came in on Gold Princess near the finish, causing John Velazquez, the rider of Gold Princess, to steady his mount. Hurricane Bertie was disqualified and placed second because of the infraction. Owners Bertram, Richard and Elaine Klein argued that the stewards were guilty of inconsistency and did not follow the same guidelines they used when allowing the result of the Acorn S. to stand after Three Ring allegedly interfered with with Better Than Honour. They also maintained that Hurricane Bertie was comfortably in front at the point of the foul and would have won the race anyway. Hearing Officer Bennett Liebman ruled against the Kleins, noting that the NYSWRB is only allowed to overrule the stewards in cases where a mistake of law was made, not in cases where the stewards' judgment comes into question.

A duo of Bob Baffert trainees were out for work in advance of stakes engagements next weekend. **Silverbulletday** (Silver Deputy), expected for the GI Beldame Oct. 10, worked five furlongs in 1:00 2/5 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:12 2/5. "The filly worked incredibly," said exercise rider Peter Hutton. "She was pulling from the start to the finish. She had her ears pricked and was on the muscle." GI Woodward winner **River Keen (Ire)** (Keen {GB}) followed with his five panels in 1:01 1/5 and out three quarters in 1:13 1/5. "The track had changed a little bit," Hutton commented on the two works. "With all the horses going over it, I had him off the fence a little bit more." River Keen goes next in the GI \$1 million Jockey Club Gold Cup Oct. 10.

GI Belmont and Travers winner **Lemon Drop Kid** (Kingmambo) continued his preparation for the Jockey Club Gold Cup with a five-furlong breeze Tuesday in 1:00 3/5. "He went very well. He looks super," commented trainer Scotty Schulhofer.

James Scaturchio's **More Than Ready** (Southern Halo) got back on the beam with a five-furlong drill Tuesday morning in 1:00 3/5. "He worked very well," said conditioner Todd Pletcher. "He came out of the work in good shape and I am very pleased with the way he is training." Pletcher has yet to commit to the next start for More Than Ready. The two options are the GI Champagne at Belmont Park Oct. 9 or the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity around two turns at Keeneland Oct. 10. That race has produced the last three winners of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile (Boston Harbor, Favorite Trick and Answer Lively).

Horses Safe From Encephalitis Outbreak:

An outbreak of encephalitis in the New York metropolitan area is not of concern to the 700 horses stabled at The Meadowlands thanks to ongoing local mosquito abatement efforts. "The Bergen County Mosquito Control Commission has been spraying since April and sprayed as recently as two days ago," said Meadowlands Vice President and General Manager Chris McErlean. Officials in Suffolk County, New York, are currently investigating the death of several horses to determine whether there is a connection to the outbreak.

Huff To Host Charity Breakfast:

Thoroughbred owner and former football star Sam Huff will host the Breakfast of Champions Charity Fundraiser at Charles Town Races Oct. 9. The president of the West Virginia Breeders' Classic, Huff has enlisted the services of seven ex-footballers, including Sonny Jurgensen. The breakfast will benefit the Charles Town Chaplaincy, an organization which provides counseling and spiritual guidance to jockeys and backstretch workers.

The Richard Mandella trained **Malek (Chi)** (Mocito Guapo {Arg}) heads the list of nominees for the Oct. 9 GIII Hawthorne Gold Cup, a race used last year by Awesome Again as a prelude to his subsequent victory in the Breeders' Cup Classic. Last year's Breeders' Cup Turf and local hero Buck's Boy captured the 1997 Gold Cup. Other prominent nominees include GIII Cornhusker Breeders' Cup H. winner **Nite Dreamer** (El Prado {Ire}) and GI Whitney third-place finisher **Catienus** (Storm Cat). The GIII Hawthorne Derby to be run Oct. 10 has attracted a 35-strong list of nominees headed by GIII Kent Breeders' Cup winner **North East Bound** (D'Accord).
