ANOTHER MILLION GUINEAS **COLT AS HOUGHTON SALE ENDS**

The Tattersalls Houghton Sale ended last night with a new record median of 120,000 guineas, up 20 percent on last year's level, demonstrating that Europe's top yearling sale attracted plenty of buyers at all layers of the market, as 100 yearlings made 100,000 guineas. While the top end was not as spectacular as last year, the second million-plus purchase of the sale was made yesterday, with Dick Mulhall of The Thoroughbred Corporation going to 1.2 million guineas for Lot 229, a bay Sadler's Wells colt out of Marseillaise (GB) (Artaius). The underbidder was Demi O'Byrne, standing next to Coolmore boss John Magnier. The yearling will go into training with Henry Cecil. Consigned by Timmy Hyde's Camas Park Stud, he cost 315,000 guineas as a foal at the Tattersalls December Sale. Mulhall, who had been on the phone to Prince Ahmed Salman throughout, said, "He was the best one I saw in the sale and I thought the price would be about this level." Two other Sadler's Wells colts were the next most expensive during the third and final session. A Sadler's Wells colt out of G3 winner Kithanga (Ire) (Darshaan {GB), whose first foal Single Currency(GB) (Barathea {Ire}) was third on his recent Haydock debut, made 650,000 guineas, with Magnier seeing off the British Bloodstock Agency's Joss Collins and Sheikh Mohammed. Another Sadler's Wells colt, Lot 259, had Magnier again involved, but it was Rudiger Alles of German International who had the last word at 575,000 guineas. Godolphin acquired a Silver Hawk colt out of Madame L'Enjoleur (L'Enjoleur) for 420,000 guineas, with Mulhall the underbidder this time. The sale aggregate was 34,665,000 guineas, down two percent off last year's 35,471,000, while the average dropped six percent to 161,232 guineas. Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony said, "The average at last year's Houghton Sale shot up by over 60 percent and the median by 25 percent. That level of trading has been all but maintained this year." The leading purchaser was Demi O'Byrne, acting for the Magnier/Michael Tabor partnership, securing nine lots for 4,290,000 guineas, an average of 476,666 guineas. Agent John Ferguson was next with 18 lots for 3,207,000 guineas (average 178,166) and many of these were for Godolphin, who in its own right took eight for 2,240,000 guineas (average 280,000).

Primo Valentino, comfortable hero of the G2 Mill Reef S. at Newbury Sept. 18, showed the utmost determination to stretch his winning streak to five with a gritty front-running display which provided trainer Peter Harris with his first Group 1 success. Jockey Pat Eddery sent Primo Valentino straight into the lead, with Fath and Brahms following. The winner came under pressure approaching the final furlong as Fath challenged while going extremely well on his outside, and the pair began to make the race their own. The duo entered the final furlong in unison, but if Fath ever got in front it was only briefly as Primo Valentino responded gamely to Eddery's strong driving. Brahms was not disgraced and kept on well for third, but the remainder were never a factor. Harris proudly boasted, "He is home bred--I also bred the dam as well, and this is her first foal. I didn't think he was going to be beaten when Fath challenged. That is the first time he has really raced. I think that will be it for him this season as his coat is on the turn." Turning to thoughts of next year, Harris added: "If you win this race you deserve to go for the [G1 2000] Guineas. I feel confident he will get a mile because his dam was out of Connaught Bridge, who was a mileand-a-half Group 1 filly. There is a lot of stamina on the dam's side and I think it could be conceivable that he could get a little bit further than a mile."

When Primo Dominie started favourite to extend his
unbeaten run to six in the 1984 Middle Park S., he
finished only a disappointing third. However, the Cheveley

finished only a disappointing third. However, the Cheveley Park Stud stallion has made ample amends for that lapse by siring two winners of the G1 Middle Park--First Trump in 1993 and now Primo Valentino, who proved too strong for Danzig's sons Fath and Brahms Thursday.

This was the third consecutive stakes win for Primo Valentino and his second at group level, so he represents a very good start to the broodmare career of his dam Dorothea Brooke, a front-running winner of an 8 1/2-furlong maiden race at Epsom in 1995. Although Dorothea Brooke's form was nothing out of the ordinary, her pedigree was first-rate, and both her parents, Dancing Brave and Connaught Bridge, were Group 1 winners over 1 1/2 miles. Dorothea Brooke was dropped back to around a mile after three starts over 1 1/4 miles, perhaps because she tended to take a strong hold in her races.

The way that Primo Valentino has led throughout to take the G2 Mill Reef S. and the Middle Park shows that he too is ideally suited to racing in the front rank, and it is going to be interesting to see whether he will prove equally effective over a mile at three. There is encouragement to be drawn from the record of Premier Bay, his brother-in-blood out of Dorothea Brooke's sister Lydia Maria. This colt progressed from showing useful six-furlong form at two to win over 1 1/4 miles at three, but some of the other omens are less favourable. Primo Dominie raced mainly over five furlongs at three after trying seven furlongs, and First Trump was returned to six furlongs after two defeats over a mile.

Dorothea Brooke is by no means the first unexceptional racemare by the brilliant Dancing Brave to excel as a broodmare. Dancing Brave was the broodmare sire of six 1998 group winners, including the Group 1 winners Zomaradeh (Oaks d'Italia), Robertico (Deutsches Derby) and Mus-If (National S.), and, significantly, five of the six were produced by daughters which retired without a win.

SEEKING THE PEARL TO MAKE NEW YORK BOW

Seeking the Pearl (Seeking the Gold) makes her New York debut tomorrow in Belmont's GIII Noble Damsel H. at one mile on the turf. She has won more than \$4 million, most of it in Japan, but she ventured to France twice last year, winning the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest over another successful world traveler, Jim And Tonic (Fr) (Double Bed {Fr}). Her effort in beating colts by a length in the 61/2-furlong affair was enough for her to be recognized as France's top older female sprinter. She last ran June 13 in Tokyo, finishing third in the G1 (Jpn) Yasuda Kinen. This will be her second race in the States, as she made her 1999 debut in the GI Santa Monica H. at Santa Anita Park, running fourth in the only dirt start of her 19-race career. Bred in Virginia by Lazy Lane Stables Inc., the five-year-old was recently bought by the Jayeff B Stables and is now trained by Alan Goldberg, If all goes well, the Breeders' Cup Mile is a possibility.

WRITERS UP

AT THE SALES ... with Bill Oppenheim

Tale Of The Tape ... the Houghton gross dropped by less than a million guineas --two percent; the average was down 10,000 guineas (six percent), following a 61 percent rise last year; very significantly, though, the median was up 20 percent, from last year's then-record 100,000 guineas to this year's new record 120,000 guineas. That means the Houghton sale has really finally a genuine middle market. Believe me, there were plenty of "bottom-fishers" around; they didn't get that much. And, as Tattersalls' ultra switched-on Marketing Manager Jimmy George pointed out, if this year's two high yearlings (2.9 million total) had brought as much as last year's (5.2 million), the gross would have been marginally up on last year's, and the average would have been dead even. The House was not complaining last night.

The final session pretty much continued the trend of the first two days. Godolphin and Ferguson added six more to take their sale total to 24. (Ferguson said 27 afterwards, plus he bought two for Moller Racing. He should know, but both the sales company's and my totals came up with 24.) Anyway, let's say "at least" 24; those cost 5,197,000 guineas and averaged 216,452 guineas (\$372,730), with the sale high just 420,000 guineas (\$723,240). Shadwell finished with 10 for a total of 2,085,000 guineas, an average of 208,500 guineas (\$359,037) and a high of 480,000 guineas (\$826,560). Gainsbrough added two, so the Maktoum brothers, in their own names, bought 36 yearlings and spent 7,572,000 guineas (22 percent of the gross). Charlie Gordon-Watson reported that about half of his 16 were bought for Maktoum associates, which means all told the family and friends bought at least 44 yearlings--20 percent of those sold.

Remarkably, though, none of the eight yearlings which made 500,000 + guineas (the same number as last year, incidentally) were bought by the Maktoums. Three went to Demi O'Byrne, three to Rudiger Alles of German International Bloodstock and two to The Thoroughbred Corporation. Both of those, incidentally, were Sadler's Wells colts sold by Timmy Hyde.

Those two colts helped Sadler's Wells edge back into the leading sire (on average) position, among sires who had four plus sold. Sadler's Wells had 21 listed sales, averaging 327,143 guineas (\$563,340); but his median of 210,000 guineas (\$361,620) means that 10 of his yearlings made 200,000 guineas (\$344,400) or less. Green Desert, with four sold, including the top filly at 750,000 guineas (\$1,291,500), just edged out Fairy King for second; Green Desert averaged 313,750 guineas (\$540,278) for four sold, while Fairy King ended up with eight selling, for an average of 309,000 guineas (\$532,098). But Fairy King's median was considerably lower, at 127,500 guineas (\$219,555). Including only those sires with three-year-olds and up in 1999, my version of the three hot new commercial sires--Darshaan, Danehill, and Machiavellian--came fourth, fifth, and sixth in average with some very respectable sires, such as Rainbow Quest (eighth), Nashwan (ninth), and Caerleon (11th) plainly struggling.

All horses in the International TDN were bred in North America unless otherwise indicated.

Among first-year sires, the undoubted star of the show was Coolmore's repatriated Dr Devious. He only had three sell, but they averaged 193,333 guineas (\$332,919) and were bought by Wafic Said, Charlie Gordon-Watson and Sheikh Hamdan; perhaps that good performance will heighten interest in the 13 Dr Devious yearlings catalogued next week at Goffs. Three Maktoum stallions, Pennekamp, Halling, and Mark of Esteem came next, followed by Ashkalani, with Spectrum, on this occasion last of six among first-year European stallions who had three or more sell.

BARATHEA FILLY TOPS INGLIS BREEZE-UP

Former jockey Ron Dufficy and his Hong Kong-based brother Rod gave participants at yesterday's fourth annual Inglis Breeze Up sale a copybook lesson when a Barathea (Ire) filly which originally cost them A\$50,000 returned a sales-topping A\$190,000. "Ron bought specifically for this sale, and that is half the battle," said Arthur Mitchell of Yarraman Stud, which prepared a large consignment, including several on behalf of Dufficy. The filly, from the stakes-winning mare Chador (Aus) (Marscay {Aus}), was among 10 to break 11 seconds in her gallop Tuesday. She will be prepared by Bart Cummings on behalf of Asian clients. John Moore's Olympian Bloodstock Hong Kong gave A\$110,000 for a Rory's Jester (Aus) colt offered by Widden Stud who recorded the fastest breeze-up time of 10.47, and Kieran Moore gave A\$140,000 for Widden's Snippets (Aus) colt, who clocked a speedy 10.67. The sale average was A\$33,563 for 90 sold, down from last year's A\$38,584. Thirty-five were passed on, including the Danehill half-brother to Australian Horse of the Year Mahogany (Aus) (Last Tycoon {Ire}), who failed to reach his reserve of A\$170,000.

Bien Bien to Stand In England:

Bien Bien (USA) (Manila) is to stand at Kirtlington Stud in England next season. He is moving from Mill Ridge Stud, Kentucky, in a deal brokered by Kern/Lillingston. No fee has been set yet. His best known son in Europe is Bienamado, who won last year's G3 Prix de Conde at Longchamp on his second start and was just caught by Montjeu (Ire) in the G2 Prix Niel at Longchamp Sept. 12.

Aussie Jock Wins Appeal:

High-profile Sydney jockey Shane Dye won his appeal against a two-month suspension he incurred over his ride on Tie The Knot (Aus) (Nassipour) in the Aug. 21 Warwick S. The appeal, chaired by Tom Hughes QC, lasted seven hours, but the five-member panel deliberated for only five minutes before overturning the stewards' decision to out Dye for not giving Tie The Knot every opportunity in the home straight of the 1400-meter race. "I make decisions in a split second. I'm the jockey and that's why I'm a good jockey," Dye said.

Aussie Trainer' Appeal Denied:

Trainer Anthony Cummings' appeal against his 19month disqualification for his role in the trenbolone steroid implant scandal was dismissed yesterday by the Thoroughbred Racing Board. Cummings has one week to find a new home for his large string of horses at Randwick.

The premature death of Storm Cat's son Harlan looks as if it might be a serious loss for the breeding community. Despite standing at just \$5,000, Harlan sired from his first crop not only grade one winner Menifee, but also Wandering (c, 3, Harlan--Gypsy Sweetheart, by D'Accord), who took the GII British Columbia Derby last Saturday. Wandering has a very clever pedigree since his sire is by Storm Cat (by a son of Northern Dancer out of a Secretariat mare) and his dam is by D'Accord (by Secretariat out of a Northern Dancer mare). Remarkably, Yaletown (g, 3, Chief Honcho--Golden Madam, by Shelter Half), who finished just a neck behind Wandering in second, has a virtually identical pedigree, since he is by a son of Chief's Crown (by a son of Northern Dancer out of a Secretariat mare) and his second dam is by D'Accord's full brother, Medaille d'Or.

Watch out too for Postponed (c, 2, Summer Squall-Bridal Tea, by Gulch), an impressive debutant at Belmont on Saturday from the connections of Lemon Drop Kid. His granddam, Chapel of Dreams, is a three-quarters sister to Storm Cat (Northern Dancer/Secretariat cross again) and his sire, Summer Squall, is by a son of Northern Dancer out of a Secretariat mare.

Ghazi is quietly showing himself to be a very useful sire, and he added another stakes winner to his record when Lock in the Money (c, 2, Ghazi--Our Locket, by Mr. Leader) took the Autobot S. at Hawthorne. Yet another stakes winner with linebreeding to genetic relatives from the La Troienne family, Lock in the Money has the full sisters Businesslike and Belle of Troy 5x5.

GULFSTREAM UNVEILS RECORD STAKES

SCHEDULE Anchored by five Grade I events, Gulfstream's 2000 stakes schedule will be worth a Florida record \$5.25 million. The 63-day meet (Jan. 3-Mar. 16) features 35 stakes--32 of which are graded. The track's signature event is the \$750,000 GI Florida Derby at 1 1/8 miles for three-year-olds, to be run Mar. 11. Early bird nominations to the Florida Derby and to the Jan. 5 GIII Spectacular Bid S., Jan. 15 Holy Bull S., Jan. 29 GII Hutcheson S. and Feb. 19 GI Fountain of Youth S. are \$595 per horse and are due by Oct 13. The other Grade I races on the calendar are the \$500,000 Donn H. on Feb. 5, the \$200,000 Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H. on Feb. 12 and the \$350,000 Gulfstream Park H. on Feb. 26. "The Gulfstream stakes schedule offers ample opportunities in every division," said Gulfstream President Douglas Donn. "We have had great interest from the horsemen regarding our forthcoming meeting. Our racing department will carefully screen all stall applications to ensure the highest caliber of competition."

LA GRIFFE DEAD La Griffe (Prince John) passed away Wednesday night at Knockgriffin Farm in Paris, Ky., due to the infirmities of old age. She was 25. The chestnut mare is perhaps best known as the dam of Champion Older Horse Blushing John, winner of the Hollywood Gold Cup and Pimlico Special in the U.S. and the 2000 Guineas in France. Other stakes winners out of La Griffe included Night Fire, Shamaritan and Supreme Stand. Her last foal is an unraced three-year-old colt by Seattle Slew. La Griffe will be buried at Knockgriffin Farm.
