CLASH OF THE TITANS AT LONGCHAMP

It just seems like it has been raining in Paris for 40 days and nights, so punters should not confuse today's Longchamp feature for an "arc" of a different variety. Despite the sticky conditions, Europe's two dominant middle-distance horses are set lock horns this afternoon in Paris. Montjeu only just got up to win the G2 Prix Niel at Longchamp Sept. 12, albeit after a mid-season break, and had previously displayed his star quality when scoring in both the French and Irish Derbies at Chantilly June 6 and The Curragh June 27 respectively. If all goes according to plan, he will be hard to beat. Daylami, proven at this standard, bids to seize the the champion middle distance crown from Montjeu's grasp and will do so if complementing his Group 1 wins in the Coronation Cup at Epsom June 4, the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot July 24 and the G1 ESAT Digifone Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown Sept. 11. If he can overcome the prevalent conditions, which will be at the outer limits of his capabilities, he will confirm himself as one of the best middle-distance horses of recent times. El Condor Pasa has made a smooth transition from the Japanese circuit to Europe and has impressed with wins in the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud July 4 and the G2 Prix Foy at Longchamp in his last start Sept. 12. He has not finished out of the first two in 10 career starts and has a strong chance, but the very soft going is a slight cause for concern. Daryaba, another for whom the going is a worry, is the leading light among the three-year-old fillies and has improved with each run this year, including the G1 Prix Vermeille at Longchamp Sept. 12. Croco Rouge, fourth last year when afforded an injudicious ride, beat El Condor Pasa in the G1 Prix d'Ispahan at Longchamp May 23, but then disappointed when seventh of eight in the G1 Coral-Eclipse at Sandown July 3. Third to El Condor Pasa in the Prix Foy, he would need to get back to his best form to be considered a likely winner. Tiger Hill, third last year, represents the best German form and ran with credit when second to El Condor Pasa in the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. He has since recorded impressive wins in the G1 Grosser Dallmayr Preis at Munich Aug. 1 and the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden at Baden Baden Sept. 9. Cerulean Sky can be considered a lively outsider. It is imperative that she gets a strong pace to be seen at her best and that is almost guranteed here. She will start at long odds, but is no forlorn hope. (Arc notes p???) 10 (Jes, I corrected !) "

Walden sent Ecton Park to Thistledown, where he narrowly missed taking home laurels in the Ohio Derby, and then decided to run him back in the GII Jim Dandy instead of the GI Haskell on the same day. While Menifee cruised through the stretch to take home Haskell honors, Ecton Park was making a mockery of the Dandy, splashing home to win by 5 1/4 lengths. The Travers was next for the stablemates, with Menifee up for third after being blocked and Ecton Park, an excuse-less fourth, beaten 4 1/4 lengths. Juvenile champion Answer Lively set a strong early pace, as Ecton Park settled in nicely in third and Menifee in sixth through six furlongs in 1:10. Turning for home, Alex Solis cut Ecton Park loose with a three-wide move to storm past the leaders. The chestnut was 2 1/2 lengths clear at the eighth pole and was able to hold Menifee easily at bay for the win. "It went very much like I hoped it would," said Solis. "Coming to the three-sixteenths, I let him roll. He was striding out very strongly down the stretch and at that point I though he would win it." Jockey Pat Day aboard Menifee took his hat off to the winner. "The winner ran a powerful race, you can't take anything away from him. I really can't fault my horse." Said Walden about future plans for the duo, "If I could be guaranteed they'd run like they did today in the Breeders' Cup Classic, I'd go."

Spanish Fern was switched to the U.S. at the tail end of last year and made a victorious debut taking a Nov. 25 Hollywood allowance by 1 1/2 lengths. Given time off by Bobby Frankel, the dark bay resurfaced with a third-place finish at Inglewood June 5, before a twomonth hiatus. Off a 1/2-length victory to clear her "three other than condition" at Del Mar Aug. 2, the Juddmonte homebred was given a stiff test for class in the GI Ramona Sept. 4, rallying late and fighting off trouble at the eighth pole to report home third, beaten only half a length by Tuzla. As expected, Tranquility Lake set out for the early lead, but she was joined immediately by Brazilian-bred Candy Lonly and together they led the field at a good clip for the distance. Spanish Fern bided her time patiently while saving all the around under Chris McCarron until the field reached the top of the lane. The veteran sent his filly four wide around horses, collared long-time leader Tranquility Lake inside the final eighth and inched clear for the victory. Caffe Latte and Shabby Chic, the latter making her U.S. bow, rallied stoutly for the minor placings. Said McCarron, "I was a little farther back than I wanted to be. I didn't let her break at all and she relaxed more than I thought she would. So I am going around the first turn and I'm thinking, 'Boy, I hope she's this good because I'm giving her a lot to do.' But she was that good." Frankel said that the Breeders' Cup is a possibility for the winner. Fiji (Rainbow Quest), last year's female turf champion, made an unsuccessful return to the races. "She just got tired. I think she needs another race," said trainer Neil Drysdale. The Oct. 15 Vinery First Lady at Keeneland could proceed a start in the Breeders' Cup for the Eclipse winner.

Second to Kayf Tara in the G2 Prix Vicomtesse Vigier at Longchamp May 23, Tajoun followed that run with a disappointing 17th in the G1 Ascot Gold Cup at Royal Ascot June 17. He returned to form in good style to win the G3 Prix Gladiateur at Longchamp Sept. 5 and proved his Ascot run was only a blip by keeping on in game fashion to hold the persistent challenge of the Irish-trained San Sebastian. Divination led at a ridiculously slow pace from Arctic (Arctic Tern), Largesse (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), San Sebastian and Tajoun, as Invermark (Machiavellian) pulled hard at the rear of the field. Largesse took over from Divination a mile from the finish and immediately increased the tempo, but the latter regained the lead turning into the straight for the final time. Tajoun went into the lead at the furlong marker and seemed set for a comfortable win, but San Sebastian rallied gamely and fought back in brave style. Tajoun perhaps idled a little in front, but the margin of advantage was being eroded as the line arrived. A controversial finish to an exciting race with jockeys Thierry Jarnet and Andrasch Starke each receiving 20day bans for failing to ride out the finish when mistaking the winning post. Jarnet seemed set for victory aboard Daring Miss, but stood up in his irons having passed the first winning post, which allowed Fairy Queen to seize the initiative close to home for a lucky win. "I think it is a shame to have such a good bunch of horses that are going to be running in such bad ground." Ground which was not raced on vesterday will be made available today by moving running rails.
