GOFFS ORBY SALE STARTS TODAY

A catalogue of 422 yearlings, 16 up on last year's offering, awaits buyers at Goffs Orby Sale when the two-day auction kicks off in County Kildare, Ireland at 12 noon today. The usual top European sires are all there, with a round dozen by Sadler's Wells, half a dozen by Darshaan (GB), the same number from the penultimate crop of Fairy King, nine of Caerleon's final crop and 14 by Irish National Stud flagbearer Indian Ridge (Ire). Fifteen sires with first-crop yearlings are in, the largest group provided by triple Group 1 mile winner Ashkalani (Ire). Other high-class milers represented include Charnwood Forest (Ire) with 15 and Spectrum (Ire) with 14. Perhaps the most salient feature of this year's book, though, is the massive number of U.S. stallions featured, most of them Kentucky-based and many of them with just one offering. Besides the usual suspects such as Danzig, Diesis (GB), El Gran Senor, Irish River (Fr), Miswaki, Red Ransom and Woodman, which one is accustomed to seeing frequently in European sales these days, less common entries include A. P. Indy, Holy Bull, Mr. Greeley, Numerous and Sea Hero. Sadler's Wells' sought-after lots are bound to include a daughter of a half-sister to Breeders' Cup Turf and Japan Cup winner Pilsudski (Ire) (Polish Precedent) and Ballylinch Stud's full-brother to the talented Coliseum (Ire) out of GI Santa Ana H. winner Gravieres (Fr) (Saint Estephe {Fr}). Lot 49, the full-brother to Irish 2000 Guineas and Budweiser Irish Derby winner Desert King (Ire) (Danehill), and Camas Park's Danzig three-quarter brother to dual Guineas winner Rodrigo de Triano (El Gran Senor) will command interest. But the lots most likely to earn the headlines at sale's end are Kilcarn Stud's Mr. Prospector filly, the second foal of Canadian Horse of the Year Alywow (Alysheba); and Camas Park's A. P. Indy colt out of Coup de Genie (Mr. Prospector), the dual Group 1 winning full sister to leading sire Machiavellian.

BREEDERS' CUP PREVIEW NOTES

Belmont Park will present a preview of the 1999 Breeders' Cup this weekend, offering six graded stakes, five of them Grade I, worth \$3 million. Saturday's card features the \$1 million GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at 1 1/4 miles, \$600,000 GI Turf Classic at 1 1/2 miles and \$400,000 GI Champagne S. at 1 1/16 miles, while Sunday's program will be highlighted by the \$500,000 GI Beldame S. at 1 1/8 miles, \$400,000 GI Frizette S. at 1 1/16 miles and the \$100,000 GIII Gallant Bloom H. for fillies and mares at 6 1/2 furlongs.

Bond Pleased with Behrens' Gold Cup Breeze:

The likely favorite for the Jockey Club Gold Cup, **Behrens** (Pleasant Colony) worked six furlongs in 1:13 4/5 over Saratoga's Oklahoma training track yesterday morning. He galloped out a mile in 1:42. The five-year-old, first or second in all seven starts this year with wins in the GI Oaklawn H., GI Gulfstream Park H., GII Suburban H. and GII Massachusetts H., is getting ready for his first start since a nose loss in the Aug. 1 GI Whitney H. "He worked awesome," trainer Jim Bond said. Behrens will ship to Payson Park on Tuesday, Oct. 12 to prep for the Breeders' Cup Classic.

Kids Ready to Take on Elders:

GI Belmont S. and GI Travers hero **Lemon Drop Kid** (Kingmambo) worked five furlongs in 1:00 4/5 over the Belmont main track Sunday. The three-year-old faces older horses for the first time in the Gold Cup. "The work was beautiful and he came out of it great," trainer Scotty Schulhofer said, adding, "I may blow him out three furlongs on Thursday just to get him on his toes."

Vision and Verse (Storm Cat), the runner-up in both the Belmont and the Travers, also worked Sunday, going five furlongs in 1:01 4/5. "He has come a long way," trainer Bill Mott said. "Ever since we put blinkers on him, he has grown and matured." As for his chances in the Gold Cup, Mott said, "Aside from Behrens, there doesn't appear to be a standout older horse. I think the three-year-olds will play a big part in this race and the Breeders' Cup."

Repeat Possible for Val's Prince?:**

Val's Prince (Eternal Prince), who battled back from injury to win the Sept. 11 GI Man o'War S. in his third start after an 11-month layoff, captured the Turf Classic in 1997 and will try to duplicate that effort this Saturday. The seven-year-old worked six furlongs in 1:17 over the Oklahoma training track yesterday morning. The millionaire moved to Jim Bond's barn just before the Man o'War. "We're fortunate to have him," Bond said, adding, "(Trainer Jimmy Picou) did a great job with him and deserves most of the credit. We're just trying to keep the horse happy."

More Than Ready Looking for Redemption:

More Than Ready (Southern Halo) heads to the Champagne looking to rebound from his first loss. The colt finished third as the 2-5 chalk in the GI Futurity Sept. 19. He breezed five furlongs in 1:00 2/5 over the Belmont main track yesterday, galloping out six furlongs in 1:13. The two-year-old won five in a row before the Futurity, capping the streak with a 9 3/4-length romp in the GII Sanford S. at Saratoga. Trainer Todd Pletcher decided to keep his charge in New York, rather than sending him to Keeneland for the two-turn GII Breeders' Futurity. Explaining the decision, he said, "We have the horse here (at Belmont), he likes the track...I thought there was more to lose by going to Keeneland than there was to gain from two-turn experience. Both winners of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Gulfstream, Gilded Time and Rhythm, didn't have a two-turn race before they went there. I've never seen any reason why (More Than Ready) wouldn't handle two turns. I don't think two turns will bother him at all."

Champagne Refill for Zito?:

Trainer Nick Zito, who took last year's Champagne with The Groom Is Red, has GI Futurity runner-up Greenwood Lake (Meadowlake) ready for this year's edition. The colt, who missed by only a neck in his stakes debut Sept. 19, worked five furlongs in 1:00 2/5 yesterday. "I think I've got a big shot," Zito said. "Greenwood Lake looks super and he's improving with each start." Zito also saddles Stephen Got Even (A.P. Indy) in the Jockey Club Gold Cup.

Finder's Fee Flies in Frizette Prep:

GI Matron S. winner Finder's Fee (Storm Cat) put in her final prep for the Frizette yesterday, going a half mile in :46 3/5. "She works pretty fast, so I wasn't concerned," trainer Shug McGaughey said.

The previously unbeaten Cover Look was the only three-year-old filly to take on her elders in this, the first Group 1 race of the season for distaffers. Starting as the 2-1 favorite, it was probably only Cover Look's inexperience that saw her defeated by her year-older stablemate Lady Brompton and Circle of Life. These three, who topped the betting boards, fought out the finish by themselves, with a gap of 8 1/2 lengths between third and fourth places. It was a good day for Lady Brompton's sire, the Roberto horse AI Mufti, whose son Elegenat AI won the G2 Premier's H. earlier in the afternoon.

If the Arc confirmed the preeminence at middle distances of the mighty Sadler's Wells, who sired the horses who finished first, fourth and sixth as well as the dam of the runner-up, the Prix de l'Abbaye again confirmed that Danzig, another of Northern Dancer's sons, is one of the world's premier sources of speed.

When Danzig's son Agnes World just got the better of Imperial Ballet (Ire) (a grand-daughter of Sadler's Wells), the Japanese hero followed Polonia and Dayjur as his sire's third winner of this renowned five-furlong event. Danzig has also exerted a powerful influence on Europe's other Group 1 sprints. The Claiborne veteran has supplied no fewer than five winners of the July Cup and three of the Sprint Cup at Haydock, completing his Group 1 sprint set with Dayjur in the Nunthorpe S. and Anabaa in the Prix Maurice de Gheest.

However, Danzig cannot claim all the credit for Agnes World's considerable speed. The colt's first public appearance came at Keeneland's 1996 July Sale, just months after Hishi Akebono, his half-brother by Woodman, had received the JRA's award for the Best Sprinter and Miler of 1995.

Hishi Akebono had secured this title in the last few months of 1995. After a very close third to Dojima Muteki (Jpn) over a mile, he ran out a four-length winner of the seven-furlong G2-Jpn Swan S. and then won the G1-Jpn Sprinters S. over six, beating the Nunthorpe S. winner So Factual into third. These efforts were good enough to earn Hishi Akebono a very creditable third place behind Mayano Top Gun (Jpn) and Genuine on the JRA Classification of three-year-olds.

No wonder, then, that Takao Watanabe was prepared to pay a big price for Hishi Akebono's half brother at Keeneland. At a sale where only four lots made more than \$1 million, Agnes World realised \$1,050,000.

Agnes World and his fellow Prix de l'Abbaye contender Black Rock Desert are the best representatives so far of the Danzig-Seattle Slew cross. The Japanese colt's dam, Mysteries, showed distinct talent when she filled third place behind the future Oaks winner Snow Bride in the G3 Musidora S. over 10 1/2 furlongs.

Mysteries' dam, Phydilla, was a very good racemare at her best. After winning three of her four starts at two, she developed into a leading miler, good enough to finish fourth in the G1 Prix du Moulin. Phydilla was just one of several very good winners that Robert Sangster bred from Godzilla, a mare he acquired after she had done very well as a two-year-old in Italy.

As Godzilla was the outcome of a mating between Gyr, a top-class mile-and-a-half horse, and Gently (GB), a speedy daughter of Grey Sovereign (GB), it isn't so surprising that her winners covered a wide range. Observation Post (Ire), Godzilla's colt by Shirley Heights (GB), was second in two Group 1 races over 1 1/2 miles, including the Irish Derby, but another of her sons, Ernani (Ire), showed unusual speed for a son of Sadler's Wells, twice finishing fourth in Group 1 events over seven furlongs. Godzilla's 14th foal, the Royal Academy colt Royal Suzuka (Ire), also became a leading performer in Japan, notably winning the Swan S.

This is a tremendously talented family and it is worth pointing out that Agnes World's fourth dam, Gently, was bred to the same pattern as Matatina (GB), Britain's champion five-furlong performer of 1963: both were by Grey Sovereign and both had the famous mare Democratie (Ire) as their third dam.

W. S. KILROY DEAD William S. Kilroy, a Thoroughbred owner and breeder for over 30 years, died Saturday. He was 73. A native of Ohio, Kilroy founded and chaired Kilroy Company of Texas, Inc., an independent oil and gas exploration company, in 1951. Four years later, he established Kilroy Drilling Company. Among his first successful runners was graded-stakes winner Lassie Dear, who went on to produce 1992 Broodmare of the Year Weekend Surprise. Lassie Dear marked the beginning of a long-time partnership between Kilroy and Lane's End owner Will Farish. The pair have bred 26 stakes winners, including classic winners A.P. Indy, Summer Squall and Lemon Drop Kid. Kilroy and Farish, in conjunction with the late Warner L. Jones, Jr., produced the world-record \$13.1 million yearling Seattle Dancer. On his own, Kilroy bred five stakes winners. He is survived by his wife of 33 years, Lora Jean (Jeanie), his son William, Jr. and two brothers. A memorial service will be held today at 1:30 p.m. in the St. John the Divine Episcopal Church in Houston, Texas. In lieu of flowers, donations can be made to the William S. NBC TO TELEVISION TRIPLE CROWN NBC Sports and Triple Crown Productions have agreed to a five-year contract, reportedly worth \$51.5 million, which will give NBC the exclusive American broadcast rights to the Visa Triple Crown. The contract goes into effect in 2001 and continues through 2005. NBC outbid CBS and ABC, which had televised every Kentucky Derby since 1975 and the entire Triple Crown series since 1987. Dick Ebersol, NBC chairman of sports and Olympics, said the network will likely use the same talent currently seen on the Breeders' Cup telecasts, with Tom Hammond serving as host and Tom Durkin calling the races. The ratings for the Triple Crown events have been slipping in recent years, but Ebersol predicted a reversal of that trend. He noted that in the past, the Triple Crown races went head-to-head against NBC's coverage of the NBA playoffs. With NBC televising the Triple Crown, not only will the NBA games be repositioned to avoid conflict with the Kentucky Derby and Preakness, but they will be used as promotional tools for the horse-racing series. "As a television big event, the Triple Crown was unique in that it went head-to-head with other big events," Ebersol said. "Take the events and pair them together and you'll immediately see substantial growth in the broadcasts. I think you'll see 10, 15, 20-percent growth in Kentucky Derby and Preakness ratings right off the bat." Ratings for the Belmont, however, are somewhat dependent on a horse winning the first two legs of the series. Ebersol said NBC would control coverage of many of the Triple Crown preps currently on ABC, but would not be able to televise them over the network due to other obligations. Instead, he said they may be shown over cable affiliates MSNBC or CNBC.
