RECORD FILLY TOPS GOFFS OPENER

Overseas Holding Ltd., a new name in the upper echelons of the bloodstock market, paid a sale's filly record Ir1.2 million guineas to bring home the top price at vesterday's opening session of the Goffs Orby Sale in Kildare, Ireland. The show-stopping filly was hip number 150, a daughter of the legendary sire Mr. Prospector and Canadian Horse of the Year Alywow (Alysheba). She was consigned to the sale by Kilcarn Stud who also sold the previous Goffs record filly, a Barathea (Ire) yearling purchased for 950,000 guineas in 1997. Two well-bred yearlings went for 500,000 guineas to top the colt's list. Addison Racing Inc. got the first, Lot 49, a colt by Danehill--Sabaah, by Nureyev, a full brother to 1997 European champion three-year-old Desert King (Ire). Lot 132, a Kilcarn Stud colt by Spectrum (Ire)--Welsh Love (Ire), by Ela-Mana-Mou (Ire) who is a half brother to 1997 Irish champion two-year-old Second Empire (Ire) (Fairy King), went to Demi O'Byrne. The first session of the two-day sale was up on all fronts with the average increasing 22 percent to 69,459 guineas and the median up 41 percent to 45,000 guineas. The sale continues today at 11 a.m.

dor Pasa (Kingmambo--Saddlers Gal {Ire}, by Sadler's Wells) has made his final racetrack appearance, according to a report in England's Racing Post. The four-year-old was second in a game effort in Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, leading for almost all of the 11/2 miles. While the Breeders' Cup was mentioned as a possible next start, owner Takashi Watanabe's racing manager, Nobutaka Tada, said. "He has run for the last time and will become a sire at the Shadai Stallion Station next season." Last year's champion three-year-old in Japan, El Condor Pasa ran four times in France, finishing first or second in all, with wins in the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and G2 Prix Foy. Daryaba (Ire) (Night Shift--Darata {Ire}, by Vayrann {Ire}), winner of the G1 Prix de Diane Hermes (French Oaks) and G1 Prix Vermeille, and most recently 13th in the Arc, has also been retired. The three-year-old filly won three of five starts.

Likely European champion sprinter **Stravinsky** (Nureyev) could step up in distance and run in the Breeders' Cup Mile next month. The three-year-old had been expected to take part in the Breeders' Cup Sprint on dirt, but trainer Aidan O'Brien said yesterday, "We've not ruled out the Mile instead of the Sprint. Plans change and we'll keep our options open."

BREEDERS' CUP PREVIEW NOTES Ward Hopeful For Darling, Pleasure:

Two years ago, Kentucky-based trainer John Ward sent his then two-year-old filly **Beautiful Pleasure** (Maudlin) to Belmont for an impressive score in the GI Matron and while **Darling My Darling** (Deputy Minister) was unable to duplicate her more famous stablemate's exploits in that race, she acquitted herself quite well with a strong runner-up finish in only her second career start. Ward has high hopes for her in Sunday's GI Frizette. "I would think we'll get a five-length improvement off the Matron," he said. "She has a lot of talent and we'll just hope for the best."

Beautiful Pleasure, who defeated Banshee Breeze in the GI Personal Ensign at Saratoga Aug. 27, is back to take on **Silverbulletday** (Silver Deputy) in the GI Beldame. While Ward has the utmost respect for the champ, he said, "I think Silverbulletday has to step up. I feel that she is like a college player who is stepping up to the big leagues. She cannot make a mistake if she is going to win Sunday."

World Cup Winner Preps For Gold Cup:

Almutawakel (Machiavellian), winner of the G1 Dubai World Cup this past March and most recently a close-up second in the GI Woodward, worked five furlongs between double dogs yesterday morning in 1:01 4/5 with Jerry Bailey aboard. Normally a laidback sort, assistant trainer Rachel Dore noticed a change in the four-year-old after his work. "He was very full of himself today. He is into his own over here," she said.

GII GalleryFurniture.com winner **Stephen Got Even** (A.P. Indy) breezed five furlongs around the cones in 1:03 over the sloppy going. "I was real happy with the work," said trainer Nick Zito. Third in the Woodward in his second start since the Belmont, the sophomore will be piloted Sunday by John Velazquez.

Miner's a 49er:

Ogden Phipps' **Polish Miner** (Danzig), who broke his maiden Sept. 18 by 9 3/4 lengths, went four furlongs yesterday morning in :49 2/5, but is "on the fence" for the Champagne, according to trainer Shug McGaughey. Recent maiden winner **Traditionally** (Mr. Prospector), a son of champion Personal Ensign, could run instead.

When Impetuous Lady retired to stud in 1968, it
would have been hard to imagine her ever founding a

would have been hard to imagine her ever founding a dynasty. A Windfields Farm-owned daughter of Hasty Road, she was the first foal of Escocesa II, an unraced Argentinian mare, and, after finishing unplaced on her only start, was bred as a three-year-old. Escocesa II never did produce a runner of note, but Impetuous Lady more than made up for her mother. In the space of 18 years, Impetuous Lady produced 12 foals, 10 starters, 10 winners and four stakes winners. What's more, she is now the ancestress of at least 18 stakes winners, including Ecton Park winner of the GI Super Derby over the weekend.

Not surprisingly for a Windfields Farm mare, Impetuous Lady spent much of her career being covered by Northern Dancer line-sires. In fact, she produced four foals by Northern Dancer himself, the quartet including two-time graded stakes winner Northern Fling and Countess North, who took the GIII Comely S. and bred multiple graded stakes winner Westheimer. She also benefited from a mating to Northern Dancer's rather disappointing son Viceregal, that mating resulting in Regal Gal, a graded stakes winner and dam of graded stakes winners Malagra, Holy Mountain and Relaxing Rhythm.

The most successful branch of Impetuous Lady's family, however, does not come via a Northern Dancer line product. In 1974, Impetuous Lady was bred to Briartic (Nearctic--Sweet Lady Briar, by Round Table). The result of that mating, Impetuous Gal, won the GII Arlington Matron H. and three other stakes events. Impetuous Gal did even better at stud, producing three black-type winners headed by Banker's Lady, a threetime Grade I winning daughter of Nijinsky II. At stud Banker's Lady is already dam of the excellent Forty Niner colt Banker's Gold, hero of the GII Tom Fool H. and GIII Peter Pan S. Impetuous Gal's daughter Daring Danzig (by Danzig, and therefore a three-quarters sister to Banker's Lady), never ran, but has produced Banker's Gold's very close relative Ecton Park as her second foal. The brevity of Impetuous Lady's career at the racetrack makes it impossible to know if she owned any athletic ability. She did, however, own an extremely interesting pedigree: her fourth dam Rebelion II is a closely related half sister to Panasine, third dam of Free For All (sire of Rough 'n Tumble) and fifth dam of Marfa (Rebelion II and Panasine were out of the imported English mare Ladasine, herself inbred 2x3 to Paraffin, one of the great English tap-root mares of the 19th century).

Impetuous Lady had Teddy 4x5, with a daughter of Teddy's grandsire Flying Fox also present. In addition, her dam was inbred 4x3 to Copyright, a son of Tracery, while her sire brought in a daughter of Tracery. The Copyright/Tracery and Teddy strains have the effect of piling up St. Simon and his sister Angelica, and Ormonde, his full brother Arklow and his three-parts genetic relative Doremi (granddam of Teddy). Since St. Simon and Ormonde may well have been the greatest runners of the 19th century, it is not hard to see why Impetuous Lady had the potential to be a genetic powder keg.

Since Northern Dancer was linebred to Gainsborough, a very close relative to the dam of Teddy, and also carried Tracery, it is not surprising that Impetuous Lady should work so well with Northern Dancer and his sons (note too, Briartic, who sired Impetuous Gal out of Impetuous Lady, was by Northern Dancer's sire, Nearctic, and was linebred to Gainsborough and Tracery).

The matings between Northern Dancer sons Nijinsky II and Danzig and Impetuous Lady, which produced the dams of Banker's Gold and Ecton Park, give Nearctic 3x3 and build still further on the same background. When Forty Niner is thrown into the mix, it creates linebreeding to Native Dancer, Roman and Princequillo. This pairing brings in more Teddy, Tracery, and for good measure, a combination of St. Simon and a sister to Ormonde. So, Forty Niner's affinity with this pedigree may well be a result of reinforcing the background which made Impetuous Lady such a good producer.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

The Dixieland Band/Mr. Prospector cross struck again when Dixieland Diamond (c, 2, Dixieland Band--Sometimesadiamond, by Mr. Prospector) captured the Cup and Saucer S. at Woodbine. Dixieland Band has now sired at least 11 unrestricted stakes winners out of mares by Mr. Prospector and his sons. For owners of Dixieland Band mares, we can note that the cross is beginning to work well in reverse.

Alec Stewart has had a quiet summer with his juveniles, but is set to saddle some nice long-term prospects in the next fortnight, beginning Friday at Lingfield. Scheduled to face the starter for the first time in the seven-furlong EBF Lingfield Maiden S. is **Rasm (GB)** (c, Darshaan {GB}--Northshiel {GB}, by Northfields {USA}). A half-brother to one of 1997's top Italian juveniles, Special Nash (Ire) (Nashwan {USA}), Rasm is also related to former Stewart star Waajib (GB) (Try My Best {USA}), winner of the G2 Queen Anne S in 1988. Possessing plenty of scope, Rasm was knocked down to Shadwell Estates for 100,000 guineas at last year's Tattersalls Houghton Sale.

The same connections are also responsible for Hawaadej (Ire) (c, Barathea {Ire}--Lover's Rose {Ire}, by King Emperor {USA}). From a classy background, Hawaadej is a half-brother to Pass The Peace (Ire) (Alzao {USA}), the champion two-year-old in Ireland in 1988, who the G1 Cheveley Park S. and the G3 Fred Darling S.. Also catalogued in the Houghton Sales last September, Hawaadej made 100,000 guineas for his consignors, the Barton Stud.

Others waiting in the wings at Clarehaven Stables include Najeyba (GB) (f, Indian Ridge {GB}--Innocence {GB}, by Unfuwain {USA}), a 180,000 guineas purchase at the same auction. Closely related to Sir Robin McAlpine's prolific winner Jeune (GB) (Kalaglow {GB}), Australia's Horse of the Year in 19995, Najeyba is the first foal of a mare who was placed four times in eight starts.

Also a first produce is **Wathbat Mujtahid (GB)** (c, Mujtahid $\{USA\}$ --Wathbat Mtoto $\{GB\}$, by Mtoto $\{GB\}$), who made a pleasing introduction behind Zentsov Street (USA) in a seven-furlong maiden at Newmarket Sept. 30 and will do better in time.
