ORBY SALE FINISHES ON HIGH NOTE A chestnut colt cataloged as hip number 225 brought a final bid of Ir£700,000 to top the second and final day of the Goffs Orby Yearling Sale at County Kildare, Ireland. Consigned by Camas Park Stud, the son of A.P. Indy and the 1993 French two-year-old filly Champion Coup de Genie (Mr. Prospector) was purchased by Demi O'Byrne. A full sister to prominent sire Machiavellian, Coup de Genie was a multiple Group 1 stakes winner in France, including the 1993 Prix de Salamandre. The afternoon's second-highest lot was hip number 348, a bay colt by Caerleon--Misallah (Ire) (Shirley Heights {GB}). Consigned to the sale by Croom House Stud, he was knocked down for a final bid of Ir£480,000 from John Ferguson Bloodstock. Acting as agent for Gigginstown House, Lynn Lodge Stud consigned the session's top-selling filly, a daughter of Sadler's Wells--Ducking (GB) (Reprimand {GB}). Sold as hip number 258, the bay was purchased by Addison Racing Inc. for Ir£340,000. For the two days, gross receipts increased by seven percent and the average was also up by a moderate four percent compared to 1998. Most impressive was the strength of the middle market which saw the median up by 22 percent against 1998 at Ir£69,415.

Mind you, the feeling was still that the vast supermarket that is Keeneland September has strength in depth in spades, even more so than this new-found depth in Europe ... and it wasn't like everything that went through got the money. You got the money if you had the horse, but you didn't get the money if not; and American-bred and other pinhooks didn't do as well as they have done, in both sales. But the buzz was back at Goffs, the trade was brisk, and plenty of consignors, and sales company officials, were smiling. The news was good. You know how it's always interesting to look at the performance of first-crop sires. Coolmore's Spectrum, buoyed by an Ir£500,000 half-brother to Second Empire Tuesday night, edged out stablemate Dr Devious (first yearlings back from Japan) on average, Ir£ 69,583 (\$95,417) to Ir£ 66,667 (\$92,000), but Spectrum's median was only Ir£ 30,000 (\$41,400). Rathbarry's Charnwood Forest actually also edged out Dr Devious in the median department at Goffs, Ir£ 53,000 (\$73,140) to Ir£ 52,500 (\$72,450). Even though he was (a very narrow) second in both categories, Dr Devious still gets the highest marks: Spectrum's average was skewed by one big sale, and Charnwood Forest's median was helped by having only eight of his 15 catalogued at Goffs sell--and in fact, the last five Charnwood Forests offered were not sold. Taking the two sales combined and converting to dollars, nine first-year stallions had five or more sell. These, along with the number they have catalogued in next week's October sale back in Newmarket, were:

MIDDLE MARKET RISES

Dateline County Kildare ... Goffs' two-day Orby yearling sale, which ended last night, saw single-digit rises in gross (seven percent) and average (four percent) over corresponding 1998 figures (which in this case means last year's figures, in Irish guineas, were converted to Irish pounds before comparisons were made), whereas last week's Tattersalls Houghton sale at Newmarket saw single-digit declines. But the story of the two sales this year is the median: the Houghton median increased 20 percent, from 100,000 (British) guineas (\$172,200) to 120,000 (\$206,640); the median at Goffs, where 364 yearlings sold over the two days (2 1/3 times Houghton's 156), rose 22 percent, from 36,750 Irish pounds (\$50,715) to 45,000 (\$62,100). It has to mean there is growth in the 'middle market' at the two sales, and that has to be good news for a broad range of breeders, because it signals strength in depth -- something there hasn't been enough of in European markets the past few years.

MELBOURNE CUP UPDATE Godolphin's **Sea Wave (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), who hasn't won since taking the G2 Great Voltigeur S. in August, 1998, was a surprise second acceptor for the Nov. 2 A\$3 million Melbourne Cup and the David Elsworth-trained **Persian Punch (Ire)** (Persian Heights {GB}), third in last year's Cup, a notable omission on a list of 60 contenders. The other European acceptors are two-time G1 Irish St. Leger hero **Kayf Tara (GB)** (Sadler's Wells), Italian Group 1 winner **Central Park (Ire)** (In The Wings {GB}), Irish St. Leger runner-up **Yavana's Pace (Ire)** (Accordian {Ire}), G3 Curragh Cup winner **Maridpour (Ire)** (Shernazar {Ire}) and **Travelmate (GB)** (Persian Bold {Ire}). **Amerique** (St. Jovite), trained by Michael Dickinson, is the lone American on the list. Kayf Tara is the 4-1 co-favourite alongside eight-times Group 1 winner **Tie The Knot (Aus)** (Nassipour). Maridpour, transferred from Sir Michael Stoute to New Zealand-based Mike Moroney, arrived last Monday along with the Dermot Weld-trained **Make No Mistake (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}), who will contest the Oct. 23 A\$1.8 million Cox Plate at Moonee Valley.

BREEDERS' CUP PREVIEW NOTES

Glide Out Of Turf Classic:

Trainer Christophe Clement announced yesterday that his GI Sword Dancer H. winner **Honor Glide** (Honor Grades) will bypass Saturday's GI Turf Classic and will instead ship to Payson Park in Florida to prepare for the Breeders' Cup. "I believe he needs a bit more time," said the Frenchman. "His work on Sunday was OK, but I'm also concerned about the ground not being firm enough." The five-year-old was seventh and last as the favorite in the Sept. 11 GI Man O' War over a soft Belmont turf course.

Baffert Biggies Get Final Works:

GI Gazelle H. winner **Silverbulletday** (Silver Deputy) drilled five furlongs over the Belmont main track yesterday morning in 1:01 in advance of her first appearance against older in Sunday's GI Beldame. The work was originally slated for Monday, but was rescheduled due to the sloppy going and almost didn't happen again yesterday. "The track superintendent came through for me," said trainer Bob Baffert. "If we couldn't have gotten the work in, we might have shipped her to Keeneland for the (Oct. 16) Spinster." The GI Woodward winner **River Keen (Ire)** (Keen {GB}) also breezed five furlongs yesterday morning. He got the distance in 1:00 3/5 and out six furlongs in 1:12 2/5 in preparation for the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup. "He's ready to go," said the trainer. Baffert will not be in New York this weekend, but will stay in California to saddle juveniles **Chilukki** (Cherokee Run) in the GI Oak Leaf and Forest Camp (Deputy Minister) in the GII Norfolk.

John W. Galbreath enjoyed tremendous success with Roberto, the Darby Dan-bred colt which scored unforgettable victories in the Epsom Derby and the Benson & Hedges Gold Cup. Roberto's subsequent career at Darby Dan yielded a magnificent proportion of group or graded winners among his 500 foals--a world-class figure of over eight percent--but unfortunately the sons of Roberto which retired to Darby Dan failed to live up to expectations. No doubt Galbreath's heirs have often wondered whether they should have retained Brian's Time, the Florida Derby winner who has proved an outstanding success in Japan, in addition to his brother-in-blood, Sunshine Forever. Happily, Galbreath's heirs have continued to enjoy plenty of success with the Roberto line by using sons based at other farms. Silver Hawk provided Joan and John Phillips with Memories of Silver, who numbered the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup and the GI Beverly D. among her wins.

Now Kris S. has supplied the same partnership with Soaring Softly, another leading turf filly. Both these high-class fillies represent the prolific cross that Roberto enjoyed with descendants of Graustark, another former Darby Dan resident. Roberto himself sired Sunshine Forever, Brian's Time and Fool's Prayer from daughters of Graustark. Graustark appeared as the sire of the second dam in Memories of Silver's pedigree, but he owes his presence in Soaring Softly's pedigree to his top-class son Key To The Mint, who sired the filly's dam Wings of Grace.

It isn't often nowadays that we see a pedigree like Soaring Softly's, which features 3x4 inbreeding to Princequillo. This exceptional sire of broodmares was born as long ago as 1940 and died in 1964, leaving a 1965 crop which included Kris S.'s dam Sharp Queen. Princequillo also appears in the pedigree of the Flower Bowl H. winner as the sire of Key To The Mint's noted dam, Key Bridge. Inbreeding to Princequillo also features in the pedigrees of several other stakes winners by Kris S., including the Grade I winner Cheval Volant (3x5), the Group 1 winner Dr Fong (3x5), the Grade II winner Lyin To The Moon (3x4) and the 1999 Group 3 winner Peshtigo (3x4).

Soaring Softly's dam Wings of Grace was a very useful turf performer, winning the Gill Boiling Springs H. Easily the best of her four foals by Roberto was Plenty of Grace, a multiple graded-stakes winner whose best win came in the GI Yellow Ribbon Invitational S. over 1 1/4 miles in 1990. After Roberto's death, Wings of Grace had foals by Groovy, Majestic Light, Seattle Slew and Private Account, but she didn't produce anything approaching Plenty of Grace's calibre until she visited Kris S.

As a Grade I winner of eight of her 15 starts, Soaring Softly must now be a very valuable broodmare prospect, especially as her third dam is Soaring. This daughter of Swaps has found fame largely through her granddaughter Ballade, the dam of Devil's Bag, Saint Ballado and Glorious Song and second dam of Rahy and Sing-spiel (Ire).

A filly by Pleasant Tap out of the Copelan mare I'll Get There sold for \$315,000 to highlight the final session of the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern Fall Yearling Sale in Timonium, Maryland. Offered as hip number 718, the bay was purchased by the partnership of Jan, Mace and Samantha Siegel from the consignment of Morgan's Ford Farm. The Siegels were also responsible for taking home the day's second-highest offering, going to \$190,000 for a colt by West By West--Crown Jubilee (Chief's Crown). The bay was consigned to the sale by Dark Hollow, acting as agent for Mr. & Mrs David Hayden. The average for the three-day sale was \$19,163, an increase of two percent against 1998.

Sent into Grade I company, she chased the pace before tiring to sixth in the GI Matron Sept. 19 at Belmont. The heavy favorite broke awkwardly, but settled into third down the backstretch just two lengths off the lead. Ranging up to challenge on the turn, she drew away under her own steam and was ridden out to the wire for her first black-type win.

Country Hideaway returned to the winner's circle in her first start since the GI Gazelle H. Sept. 11, which saw her unbeaten streak snapped. The bay filly captured her debut by 4 3/4 lengths at Belmont June 17, then went on to capture her next two, both allowance events at Saratoga. Sent into the Gazelle off a 5 1/4-length romp Aug. 18, the Phipps homebred dueled through a sharp early pace, but tired after three-quarters in 1:09 3/5 and held well for fifth against Silverbulletday. Favored here, she recovered after being bumped at the start, moved four wide on the turn and was kept busy down the lane for the win.

MONTJEU EARNS TOP RATING Montjeu (Fr) (Sadler's Wells {USA})'s outstanding season, culminating in his G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe triumph, has earned him a provisional rating of 135 pounds from the official handicapper. His half-length defeat of the Japanese-trained **El Condor Pasa (USA)** (Kingmambo {USA}) in the Arc has given him a rating that compares with some of the best in recent years. Nigel Gray, the senior British Horseracing Board handicapper, said: "I had a fax from the Japanese handicapper this morning and at this stage the Japanese, Irish and British handicappers have Montjeu on 135, with El Condor Pasa 134. The French handicapper has them both one pound higher and we are waiting input from the Italian, German and North American handicappers. A definitive rating will be decided at the International Classifications conference in Rome in December. But that sort of rating reflects a tremendous performance by the first and second to pull six lengths clear of the rest. Going back to 1986 the only horses rated higher than 135 have been Dancing Brave (USA) on 141, Generous (Ire) and Peintre Celebre (USA) on 137 and Suave Dancer (USA), 136."
