WHAT'S DOING DOWN UNDER

ROSELANDS ISN'T A ROOKIE

It's difficult to imagine any other stud operation having the same impact on Australia's thriving bloodstock industry as Coolmore. But following the purchase by Roselands Stud of Vinery Kentucky and Vinery Australia--located on a 2,300 acres of highly desirable Hunter Valley horse country about 50 kilometers from Coolmore--the balance of power may shift considerably.

Roselands, backed by a group of five Swiss and German lawyers, purchased Vinery's 245 acres in Kentucky and 2,300 acres in the New South Wales, as well as interests in dual hemisphere sires Red Ransom, Gilded Time, Langfuhr and Sandpit (Brz).

Roselands and Vinery will continue to operate under separate banners, with few immediate changes in the wake of a purchase estimated to be in excess of US\$25 million. It is understood Australia's largest stud Arrowfield was a keen competitor to snare its immediate neighbor, Vinery Australia.

Coolmore has dominated here in the stallion barn (this year's three highest-priced sires, Danehill, Peintre Celebre and Woodman, are at Coolmore) and in the sale ring, but clearly Vinery and Roselands together--with a stallion lineup spearheaded by heavyweight contender Red Ransom--wield clout considerable enough to at least create a more level playing field.

Roselands has rocketed to prominence in just three years by systematically assembling a formidable broodmare band, giving A\$500,000 for Golden Slipper winner Bint Marscay (Aus) (Marscay {Aus}), A\$700,000 for Group 1 winner Euphoria (Aus) (Marauding {NZ}) and A\$300,000 for stakes winner Beachside (NZ) (Crested Wave).

Astute Roselands is the stud that purchased Miss Bold Appeal (Valid Appeal) for A\$300,000 at a broodmare sale here and ultimately sold her to Richard Santulli for about A\$2.6 million. Miss Bold Appeal's Nureyev colt sold for A\$700,000 at Easter in a deal that English buyers Alydar International regarded as a coup. Roselands has Miss Bold Appeal's Danehill colt (Santulli has a half-share) in its paddocks along with Octagonal (NZ)'s full brother Colombia (NZ), an A\$1.2 million purchase. Summer Squall's brother, the French multiple stakes-winner Saithor (Storm Bird), is among the stallions standing at Roselands.

Arrowfield sold three outstanding mares--Mahaya (NZ) (*Sir Tristram), Lady Jakeo (Aus) (Last Tycoon {Ire}) and Tracy's Element (Aus) (Last Tycoon {Ire})--to Roselands for A\$1.9 million. The deal represents the fourth change in two years for the historic property, with its convict-built sandstone buildings, that was founded as Segenhoe Stud in 1816. Last April Michael Sissian sold the sought-after property, half its breeding stock and its entire 1997 foal crop to George Hofmeister, and Stone Lodge came into being. Then Hofmeister bought into Vinery and the stud became Vinery Australia.

Roselands Managing Director Lynden Burns was keen to emphasize it was "business as usual." He added that Ben Walden would act as consultant to Vinery.

"Vinery has 28 stallions in the U.S. and we will do what is in the best interests for shareholders of those stallions," Burns told *Thoroughbred Daily News*. "We've been seriously preparing this offer for six weeks.

"This heralds a new era for Roselands. It allows us to expand our Australian breeding interests into the Hunter Valley with the international support of one of America's most respected studs."

Asked whether he believed Roselands' purchase would affect Coolmore's dominance, Vinery Australia Manager Kiwa Fisher said, "We will focus on doing our own thing. We have our own goals and agendas and we are a service-driven stud. But we'll be very, very strong in Australia. Roselands is a very dynamic, aggressive, progressive stud.

"This is an extremely positive development for the farm both here and in the U.S. and personally I'm delighted to be part of the new team."

Not so long ago, Roselands was the newcomer--the rookie. Not any more.

ARCHERS BAY RETIRES The 1998 Queen's Plate winner Archers Bay (Silver Deputy--Adorned {Val de l'Orne {Fr}}) has been retired from racing and will return to his birthplace to begin stud duties next season at Windfields Farm in Ontario, Canada. After taking two-thirds of the Canadian Triple Crown, Archers Bay earned the Sovereign Award as the country's best three-year-old colt. As a four-year-old, he ran second to Behrens in the GI Gulfstream Park H. In his final start, Archers Bay was runner-up in the Apr. 25 Gill Excelsior Breeders' Cup H. He retires with four wins in 13 starts and earnings of \$666,200. "In June we discovered a slight tear in the tendon of his right front," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "He was never out of training, but it did not respond as we had hoped. We had hoped to have another try at Behrens and the top of the division in the Breeders' Cup Classic at Gulfstream." Windfields General Manager Bernard McCormack added, "We absolutely loved this horse as a foal and yearling, and he went on to become a tremendous racehorse. And he has a very special pedigree, with five generations of Windfields sires, all the way back to Nearctic and seven generations of Windfields breeding in his female line." Archers Bay will stand for C\$7,500, live foal.

HIT THE BOARD (f, 3, A.P. Indy--Dans Argent, by Danzig)'s lone previous win came over the Belmont turf May 22 and last time out she was third over the main track Sept. 22. Second choice at 5-2, the filly was quickly in contention despite an awkward start, rallied three wide nearing the stretch and inched clear late for a 1 1/2-length victory. Lifetime Record: 7-2-0-2, \$62,985.

The \$560,000 KEEJUL yearling and \$950,000 BESMAR juvenile was wide when second in his Aug. 28 debut at Saratoga and followed that up with a third to Traditionally (Mr. Prospector) at Belmont Sept. 18. Shedding blinkers, the even-money choice showed good early speed, took command turning for home and held off Broadway Barney (Thirty Six Red) by a half length. He is slated to be sold as part of the Waxman Dispersal at Fasig-Tipton Nov. 7. Lifetime Record: 3-1-1-1, \$37,820.

The underbidder was Peter Doyle, agent. Over the three days of the Irish National Yearling Sale, 587 yearlings brought IR£28,882,000, up 8 percent from 1998. The average of IR£49,203 was up 7 percent, while the median, IR£28,000, rose 16 percent.

TEENOSO DEAD

The *Racing Post* reports that 1983 Epsom Derby winner Teenoso (USA) (Youth {USA}) was euthanized Monday night after being diagnosed with thrombosis. The 19-year-old was standing at Pitts Farm Stud in Dorset as a National Hunt stallion. Teenoso carried jockey Lester Piggott to what would be his ninth and final Derby victory, and the next season went on to win the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S., where he beat Sadler's Wells and Tolomeo. First or second in 11 of his 13 career starts, he was named the champion older horse in England and France in 1984 and retired with earnings of £452,001. Trainer Geoff Wragg told the *Racing Post*, "It's very sad. He was a lovely horse to train, a great mover who would do anything for you. People said he was just a soft-ground horse, but when he won the King George (on fast ground), he beat a high-class field. It was a great shame that he went wrong just before the Arc."

Jockey Frankie Dettori does not look like he will appeal a ban which will mean him missing Champions' Day at Newmarket on Oct. 16. He was given a four-day whip ban at York on Wednesday. His business manager, Peter Burrell, said yesterday: "I don't think Frankie will be appealing." Olivier Peslier is a possible replacement for Dettori on High-Rise (Ire) in the G1 Champion S.

Trainer John Hills told the *Racing Post*, "He's been running over a mile this summer and Sunday's race was 10 furlongs. He got a bit switched on, so he really didn't give himself a chance to get the trip. I think he was a bit fresh after such a long layoff. We don't know yet if he'll qualify for the Mile...but he's in very good shape and we feel he warrants a crack at a big one."
