TATTERSALLS OCTOBER OPENS TODAY

Europe's largest and most comprehensive yearling auction begins today at 10 a.m. The Tattersalls October Sales, with 993 lots catalogued, invariably provides the best indicator of the state of the yearling market. The catalogue includes two by champion sire Sadler's Wells (USA). The first is lot 741, a half sister to the globetrotting Running Stag (USA) (Cozzene {USA}), out of River Dove (USA) (Riverman {USA}). The May-foaled filly was bred by Martyn Burke and is offered from Barton Stud. The other, lot 888, is a daughter of Lyndonville (Ire) (Top Ville {Ire}), whose other progeny include the Japanese Group 1-placed Tsukba Symphony (GB) (Danehill {USA}). Distant View (USA) (Mr. Prospector {USA}), whose first crop includes Saturday's G1 Dewhurst S. contender Distant Music (USA), is represented by four yearlings, including lot 363, the second foal of nine-time winner Annual Dance (USA) (Nostalgia {USA}). The colt was bought for \$68,000 at Keeneland last November by Wyndham Ridge and is offered by John Troy as agent. Those by Caerleon (USA) include lot 745 from Raffin Stud, the first foal of Sabaah Elfull (GB) (Kris {GB}), who hails from a Bloomsbury Stud family rich in black type. As at Goffs last week, yearlings by a broad spectrum of U.S.-based stallions are on offer, divided roughly 50/50 between those offered by pinhookers or breeders and those for sale having been bought in utero in America. Falling into the former category is lot 901, offered from Ballyhimikin Stud, a colt by Forest Wildcat (USA) (Storm Cat {USA}). Out of an unraced half sister to Polish Precedent (USA) (Danzig (USA)), he was a \$140,000 Keeneland foal purchase. Also from that category is lot 557 from Landscape Stud in Ireland, a \$125,000 Mt. Livermore (USA) colt out of Seattle Special (USA) (Nureyev {USA}), a Group 2placed granddaughter of Maximova (Fr). Through his Bishop's Down Farm, former Tattersalls Director and auctioneer Bruce Deane sells lot 548, a Brief Truce (USA) half sister to the G1 Lockinge S. winner Fly To The Stars (GB) (Bluebird {USA}). First-crop sires are well-represented, in particular British champion Charnwood Forest (Ire) (Warning {GB}), who has 29 lots catalogued--more than any other sire. Selling begins at 9:30 a.m. Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday. There are post-racing sessions starting at 5 p.m. on Thursday and Friday as well.

UNHAPPY ENDING FOR EXCITING STORY

Exciting Story (Diablo), three-for-four with a 5 1/2length win in the Sept. 26 GIII Swynford S., was 3-5 in yesterday's GI Grey Breeders' Cup S. at Woodbine. The crowd's choice proved much the best, coasting to an 8 1/2-length victory, but he had the win taken away by the stewards. Caught in traffic on the first turn, the chestnut colt caused Twilight Dreams (Naevus) to steady; he got out to press the pace while wide down the backstretch, took over on the far turn and galloped clear as Four on the Floor (Academy Award) closed to get second, but was disqualified and placed fifth for the early interference. Four on the Floor, tossed in against \$50,000 maiden claimers in his first start going six furlongs on the dirt at Woodbine Aug. 19, came home a winner. His connections next tested him in gradedstakes company and he did not let them down, taking the Sept. 11 GII Summer S. at a mile on the turf at better than 21-1. He was lucky to make it three-forthree with a return to the main track in the Grey. His jockey, Jim McAleney, said his mount was also bothered by the incident on the first turn. "We were at the tail end of a pretty good domino effect," he said. "It forced my horse out and cost us a significant amount of ground going into that turn. But he recovered quickly and got himself right back into the race."

BREEDERS' CUP PREVIEW FOLLOW UP

On to the Classic for Gold Cup Quartet:

River Keen (Ire) (Keen {GB}), Behrens (Pleasant Colony) and Almutawakel (GB) (Machiavellian), the first three finishers in Sunday's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont Park, all came out of the race in good order and are going on to the Breeders' Cup Classic at Gulfstream Park Nov. 6. Trainer H. James Bond was please with the way beaten favorite Behrens ran. "He was just spinning his wheels in the slop," said Bond, "but he still put in a big run to get second. That race just shows you how much courage this horse has." Bond also reported GI Turf Classic winner Val's Prince (Eternal Prince) came out of his race in good order, and both his Breeders' Cup contenders will ship to Payson Park in Florida Tuesday. "Let's just say I feel pretty good about our chances in the Breeders' Cup," Bond said. Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo), who finished fifth in the Gold Cup, is headed to Florida Oct. 18 for a run in the Classic as well. "The only thing that we're going to change for the Breeders' Cup is the track. That's it," said trainer Scotty Schulhofer, whose charge has never run well in sloppy going.

Fillies Fly South:

John Ward, trainer of GI Beldame winner Beautiful Pleasure (Maudlin) and GI Frizette runner-up Darling My Darling (Deputy Minister), will take his fillies back to Kentucky before heading to Florida within the next two weeks. Ward reported that Darling My Darling, who missed by just a head in the Frizette, bled slightly and will be treated with Lasix in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. GI Frizette winner Surfside (Seattle Slew) shipped back to Kentucky yesterday and will head to Florida a week before the Breeders' Cup. "Wayne still thinks she'll be better around two turns and on a fast track," said Mike Marlow, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "She's an exciting filly."

An allowance winner over the turf at Saratoga two starts back, Eze was 39-1 in the GI Garden City Breeders' Cup H. over this course Sept. 12 and finished sixth, but beaten only 3 3/4 lengths by subsequent GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup heroine Perfect Sting. The 5-2 third choice off the effort, the dark bay was last in the closely bunched field through six furlongs in 1:15.16 over the soft turf, came with her bid as she swung four wide into the stretch and prevailed in the three-horse finish. "We weren't sure how the course was going to be," trainer Billy Turner said. "I had thought it was going to really deep, but they rolled it after the first race and it turned out to be better than I expected." Added jockey Robbie Davis, "I thought Eze ran a super race. It was a small field, with not too much pace. I got her to settle and she made a nice run. She's an improving filly." The 2-1 favorite Schenck (Zafonic), winner of the G2 Italian 1000 Guineas this April and fourth in the G1 French 1000 Guineas in his final European start in May, made her second U.S. start against Belmont allowance company Sept. 25 and finished third. She was rated while outside in her first American stakes try, but had no rally and finished fifth. According to jockey Jerry Bailey, "Just one word says it all: overmatched."

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races. Ridden with patience, Kadance Ville settled in sixth as Milford Track (Ire) (Fairy King) set the tempo and Coach brought up the rear. Turning into the straight, the field fanned out with plenty in with chances. Kadance Ville and Coach made their efforts on the wide outside, but the former stayed on strongly, took the lead with over 100 yards to run and, moving on best of all, went on to a comfortable win. Coach finished with a strong run, but just failed to snatch the runner-up berth as Milord

Wiliam T. Young's Overbrook Farm already has reason enough to be grateful to the prolific Storm Bird-Secretariat cross, which supplied Overbrook's magnificently successful stallion Storm Cat. But last Sunday's GI Frizette S. provided further cause for gratitude, with the victory of Overbrook's highly promising Seattle Slew filly Surfside, whose second dam Starlet Storm is another of the many horses that Storm Bird sired from daughters of Secretariat.

The explosion in the number of Secretariat mares sent to Storm Bird was sparked back in 1985 when W.T. Young Storage was credited with breeding two very good juveniles from Storm Bird's first crop. Storm Cat very nearly added the Breeders' Cup Juvenile to his Grade I success in the Young America S., and the English-trained Storm Star won the G3 Cherry Hinton S. in such great style that she started odds-on to beat the colts in the G2 Gimcrack S.

Inevitably, more daughters of Secretariat were quickly beating a path to Storm Bird's door and one of his matings with them in 1986 resulted in the excellent Summer Squall, who won the GI Hopeful S. and GI Preakness S. before embarking on a stallion career that has produced Charismatic and Storm Song. Predictably, Storm Star's dam Cinegita was another of the Secretariat mares covered by Storm Bird in 1986, the outcome this time being Starlet Storm, a winner of both her starts, both over sprint distances as a three-year-old.

Although Storm Star made a bright start to her broodmare career, producing the stakes winners Captain Starbuck and Dodge (GIII Best Turn S.) as her first two foals, her sister Starlet Storm has made a bigger impact by producing Surfside's outstanding dam, Flanders, to Seeking The Gold.

Flanders, you will remember, ran away with the 1994 Eclipse Award for two-year-old female, gathering every single vote from each of the three voting organizations. She owed this great tribute largely to her wonderful display of talent and determination in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, in which she managed to edge ahead of Serena's Song even though she had suffered fractures in her right foreleg.

Flanders' earlier Grade I victories had included the Spinaway S and Frizette S., and now her Seattle Slew filly is following the same route, winning the Frizette after finishing second to Circle of Life in the Spinaway. Surfside's rematch with Darling My Darling on Breeders' Cup day should be fascinating to watch, especially if Chilukki is also in the line-up.

As Seeking The Gold's eldest daughters are only eight years old, it is still early days for the Claiborne stallion as a sire of broodmares, but the signs are very promising (as they should be for a horse who has a champion broodmare sire, Mr. Prospector, as his sire and another, Buckpasser, as his maternal grandsire). Interestingly, the first graded-stakes winner out of a Seeking The Gold mare is Lu Ravi, a filly by Seattle Slew's son A.P. Indy. Significantly, Seeking The Gold has sired two of his other Grade I winners--Cape Town and Seeking The Pearl--from daughters of Seattle Slew, so the two combine well.

Surfside is the latest in a long line of Grade I-winning fillies by Seattle Slew, but she is one of the few fillies by him to have won at the highest level at two. Two other exceptions were Landaluce, the exciting but short-lived champion of 1982, and Seattle Meteor. This raises hopes that Surfside will continue to improve in much the same way that Seattle Slew did. Although he was good enough to take the title of champion two-year-old in 1976, he was even more effective at three, as his Triple Crown opponents discovered.

With the average up 8 percent and the median rising 10 percent, OBS General Manager Tom Ventura said, "I thought it was a very solid session. It was gratifying to see so many of the buyers who came for the Mockingbird dispersal stay and buy today. The demand for broodmares with nice pedigrees in foal to to attractive stallions was strong throughout the session." The four-day Fall Mixed Sale continues at 10:30 this morning.



The winner of the GII Jerome H. at Belmont going this trip in his last start Sept. 18, Doneraile Court became eligible for this race when the rains came and this race was taken off the turf yesterday. Usually speedy from the gate, the dark bay was unhurried and raced fifth early, moved up along the inside on the turn, took a short lead at the top of the stretch and drew clear for a decisive score.

MARGARSON TO APPEAL GRAND CRITERIUM

RESULT Trainer George Margarson confirmed yesterday that he will appeal the decision of the Longchamp stewards who disqualified Barathea Guest (GB) (Barathea {Ire}) from a first-place finish in Sunday's G1 Grand Criterium. The victory would have been Margarson's first Group 1 score. In addition to the disqualification, rider Philip Robinson received a four-day ban after the stewards ruled Barathea Guest hampered Ciro (USA) (Woodman {USA}) in the run to the wire. Ciro, second under the wire, was awarded the race. Margarson said yesterday, "We are going to appeal. I wasn't really upset, just annoyed. There are no gripes with anyone and no malice against the stewards -- they were just doing their job. But our horse moved only six inches at the most--not even half a stride--the other horse wandered all over the course. They made a great deal of the fact that he was only beaten a neck at the line but at one stage, ours was six lengths clear then he idled in front. It is possible the appeal will be held this week. Philip and I will have to go, but it is Newmarket sales this week and I have got to buy next year's Group 1 winner."

Havdock Race Canceled:

The Tote Jackpot S., scheduled to be run over six furlongs at Haydock Park Wednesday has been abandoned because part of the course is not safe. Haydock's clerk of the course Philip Arkwright said yesterday, "Following an inspection today by the inspector of courses, the six-furlong chute was deemed unfit for racing on Wednesday. As a result, the six-furlong race has been abandoned and the meeting will go ahead as a six-race card. The going is currently heavy but the rest of the course is perfectly raceable."

Levy Contribution Deemed Unacceptable By BHB:

A newspaper report that the Bookmakers' Committee offered an extra £3,975,000 contribution to the Levy in the latest round of negotiations was predictably condemned yesterday by Peter Savill, the British Horseracing Board chairman. Savill said: "The offer, if accurately reported, is derisory and totally unacceptable. It is an insult to all those who work in racing and whose livelihoods depend on the size of the levy. This offer would only increase the percentage of betting turnover paid by the bookmakers to racing from 1.1 percent to 1.17 percent when all other major racing nations receive between 4.4 percent and 15 percent. Since the last levy negotiations in 1994, betting industry profits have increased by £250 million. That they are apparently willing to offer only £3.9 million of this sum for the product on which their businesses are founded is further evidence of the abuse of their position as monopoly distributors of horse race betting."

Easycall Retired:

Easycall (GB) (Forzando {GB}--Up and Going {Fr}, by Never So Bold {Ire}), a three-time group winner as a two-year-old, has been retired to stand at Fares Stables in Hertfordshire, at a fee of £2,500, October 1st terms. His juvenile successes in 1996 included the G2 Richmond S. at Goodwood, G2 Flying Childers S. at Doncaster and the G3 Cornwallis S. at Ascot. He remains in the ownership of the Easycall Partnership. whose spokesman Gavin Lewis said yesterday: "Hopefully he will be popular as he was the only triple-group winning two-year-old of his year, when he was unbeaten over five furlongs. He is a three-parts brother to Up And At 'Em."
