GUEST GRABS TATTERSALLS TOPPER

John Guest, owner of the horse who was disqualified from Sunday's G1 Grand Criterium at Longchamp in France, yesterday spent 85,000 guineas on a grey colt by Definite Article (GB) out of Nicea (Ire) (Dominion) to top the opening session of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sales in Newmarket, England. This came as next Wednesday was set as the day for the appeal against the disqualification of Barathea Guest, a 70,000 guineas buy at this sale last year. Catalogued as lot 239, the yearling is a half brother to Prose (Ire) (Priolo), who won races on both sides of the Atlantic. He was consigned by Ranway Stud as agent for a partnership and Tim Corby of Equine Services signed the slip for Guest. The colt had been bought for 37,000 guineas by Corby as a foal at Tattersalls December Sales. Corby, who also acts as racing manager to Guest, said, "I told him this horse was really nice and he told me to buy it for him. The yearling has a tough act to follow." The British Bloodstock Agency in its various guises was particularly active and Richard Frisby of the UK operation paid 60,000 guineas for the first offspring of G1 Moyglare Stud S. runner-up Tamnia (GB) (Green Desert) by Highest Honor (Fr) (Kenmare (Fr) and she will go into training in Newmarket. He also gave 48,000 guineas for a Muitahid (Woodman) filly out of Dalu (Ire) (Dancing Brave) offered by Oaks Farm Stables. She will go into training with James Toller. The largest yearling auction in Europe saw an increase in the number of unsolds and withdrawls, but the median rose slightly. Jimmy George, Tattersalls marketing manager, said, "We have had a very satisfactory start to the sale." The five-day sale resumes today at 9:30 a.m.

BREEDERS' CUP NOTES THREE CONTENDERS SIDELINED

It was a bad day for the Ms. Leading runners Menifee (Harlan), Malek (Chi) (Mocito Guapo {Arg}) and More than

Ready (Southern Halo) each encountered roadblocks on the way to possible Breeders' Cup berths. The GI Haskell winner Menifee will get the rest of the year off after running second to stablemate Ecton Park (Forty Niner) in the Oct. 2 GI Super Derby. Trainer Elliott Walden said, "He's tired. He's a little sore behind and not moving as well as he was. He's always been a good sound horse all year, but he was showing some signs of wear and tear."

Malek was scheduled to start in Friday night's GII Meadowlands Cup, but will be forced to miss that start with recurring back problems, according to *Daily Racing Form*. Instead, trainer Richard Mandella will give the six-year-old the rest of the year off and bring him back next year with a possible eye on the Dubai World Cup.

Leading juvenile runner More than Ready, who suffered the second defeat of his career in Saturday's Gl Champagne S., has been sent to Rood and Riddle Equine Clinic in Lexington, Kentucky. Trainer Todd Pletcher told the *Form*, "As abruptly as he stopped, we want to have him checked out. We're covering all bases to see if there's something inside that we can't see."

Banshee Breeze Dubai Bound in 2000?

With the Breeders' Cup fast approaching, champion Banshee Breeze (Unbridled) tests out new pilot Pat Day as she prepares to defend her title in Saturday's GI Three Chimneys Spinster S. The filly worked five furlongs at Churchill yesterday in 1:01 2/5. It was the second fastest of 29 works at the distance. "This is just our 'set her up for the race' work," explained trainer Carl Nafzger. Banshee Breeze won last year's Spinster's by a record 12 lengths before being edged out in the Breeders' Cup Distaff. In this year's Distaff, she could have an advantage over Beautiful Pleasure, Manistique and Silverbulletday as she is unbeaten in four starts at Gulfstream Park. Nafzger indicated that the filly could be pointed for the Feb. 5 GI Donn H. at Gulfstream and the G1 Dubai World Cup in March.

CANADIAN INTERNATIONAL-GI, C\$1,500,000, 3/up, 12fT Thornfield (Sky Classic), winner of the GII Niagara Breeders' Cup H., recorded his final major work for the International yesterday at Woodbine. The five-year-old drilled six furlongs in 1:15 4/5 and galloped out seven furlongs in 1:30 4/5 on the turf.

Beautiful Dancer (Brz) (Exile King) worked five furlongs in 1:01 with jockey Mike Luzzi aboard over Belmont Park's main track yesterday. The Rick Violettetrained runner was a Group 1 winner in Brazil last year.

Ungaro (Ger) (Goofalik) has suffered an injury and has been withdrawn from the race. Connections of the five-year-old German star are hopeful that the 1999 dual Group 1 winner will be ready to run in Hong Kong in December.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

A veritable giant in size, Meadowlake briefly flashed ability to match his physical stature, going undefeated in three starts at two and three, including the Gl Arlington-Washington Futurity. Now in the shape of Gl Champagne S. winner, Greenwood Lake, Meadowlake has a son who not only has a similar physique, but also appears to have the talent to match.

Greenwood Lake may next start in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, and if he were to emerge victorious, he would be following in the footsteps of his three-quarters brother Success Express (by Meadowlake's sire, Hold Your Peace), who captured the race in 1987. Greenwood Lake and Success Express are out of the Dancing Champ (by Nijinsky II) mare, Au Printemps, winner of the GIII British Columbia Oaks (G3) and also dam of Canadian champion Charlie Barley. Au Printemps is out of the High Hat mare, Lorgnette, and her third dam is Gallorette, one of the greatest North American racemares of the post-World War II era.

Meadowlake is a member of the Princequillo male line through Prince John (in fact he is its leading representative), which makes him something of an oddity in an era dominated by the Phalaris line through Northern Dancer, Raise a Native, Hail to Reason and Bold Ruler. Meadowlake's sire Hold Your Peace has a very interesting pedigree since he is by Prince John's son Speak John out of a mare by Eight Thirty. Prince John's third dam Herodiade is by Over There out of the mare Herodias, while Eight Thirty is by Herodiade's half brother Pilate, and his third dam Bathing Girl is a full sister to Over There. It is no surprise that Prince John and Eight Thirty often worked together.

Au Printemps reinforces the Prince John/Eight Thirty background as her granddam is by Lovely Night, a son of Pilate. In fact Lovely Night and Eight Thirty are bred on similar lines, since both are by Pilate out of Commando line mares.

An additional feature of Meadowlake's pedigree is that he has the Blue Larkspur/Sir Gallahad III combination through Blue Grail (granddam of his sire Hold Your Peace) and through his own granddam Nothirdchance. This strain is also reinforced by Au Printemps through Nijinsky II, who has a cross of Bull Dog (full brother to Sir Gallahad II) and Blue Larkspur through his broodmare sire Bull Page.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

In winning the GIII Pebbles S. Eze (f, 3, Williamstown-Ebony Dancer, by Green Dancer) became the first graded stakes winner from the first crop of her sire. Like many first timers for a sire, she has a special pedigree since she is inbred 3x3 to Turn to Talent, who is the second dam of Williamstown and of Eze's own dam, Ebony Dancer.

American Cash (f, 3, American Chance--Lady Allaire, by Deputy Minister) became the seventh stakes winner from the first crop of emerging young sire American Chance with a win in the Fall Fashion S. American Cash is linebred to the foundation mare Good Example through the closely related Exclusive Dancer (third dam of American Chance) and Grass Shack (third dam of Deputy Minister). Note that last year Out of Place, another with Exclusive Dancer as his third dam, sired the graded stakes winner Certain out of a mare carrying Exclusive Dancer's three-quarters brother Exclusive Native. Salt Lake (by Deputy Minster, and again carrying Grass Shack) sired last year's Canadian Champion Two-Year-Old Filly Fantasy Lake out of a mare by Exclusive Native's son Affirmed, so it looks as if mixing and matching the relatives from the Good Example family can pay dividends.

Seattle Slew mares have been working wonders for Seeking the Gold, providing the son of Mr. Prospector with Grade I winners Seeking the Pearl and Cape Town and listed scorer Mutakddim. The compliment was returned at the weekend when Surfside (f, 2, Seattle Slew--Flanders, by Seeking the Gold) produced a game performance to capture the GI Frizette S. It is no surprise that Seattle Slew and Seeking the Gold work so well together. Apart from the Mr. Prospector/Seattle Slew affinity, Seeking the Gold is out of a mare by Buckpasser, and Seattle Slew's dam has the full sisters Striking and Busher, who are three-quarters sisters to Buckpasser's dam Busanda.

Winner of the G1 Grand Criterium on a disqualification, Ciro (c, 2, Woodman--Gioconda, by Nijinsky II) certainly has the pedigree to be a star. His dam is half sister to Woodman stars Hector Protector and Bosra Sham, and he is also one of no less than eight stakes winners sired by Woodman out of Nijinsky II-line mares.

Minor Wisdom (c, 3, Major Impact--Alberta Johnson, by Upper Nile), who became the first graded stakes winner for his sire when taking the GIII Hawthorne Derby, is another example of the very successful Roberto/Nijinsky II cross. Oddly enough, there are three other Roberto-line stakes winners out of mares by Upper Nile, and another out of a daughter of Sportin' Life, who like Upper Nile is by Nijinsky II out of Round Table mare.



DEVITO RESIGNS NTRA POST Basil DeVito, Jr., the senior vice president-television and sponsorship for the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, has resigned his post, effective Oct. 25 and has accepted a position heading a new sports television venture. "We are sorry to lose Basil's unique talent and knowledge, but his work has given us a solid foundation upon which to build in both television and sponsorship as we move forward," said NTRA Commissioner Tim Smith. "Basil was instrumental in our acquisition of the racing assets of Winner Communications, the formation of NTRA Productions and our overall television strategy. We are grateful for what he has accomplished on behalf of the NTRA." Smith added that there are no immediate plans to replace DeVito.

STRONG MEET FOR KENTUCKY DOWNS Kentucky Downs's Fall Meet, which concluded Sept. 28, scored a 13.5 percent increase in total handle over last year. The 1999 total handle for the seven-day meeting was \$8,315,482. However, both on-track attendance and handle decreased. Attendance was down 20 percent to 4,975 and handle was down 21.6 percent to \$981,756. "We consider this seven-day meet to be an overall success," commented Robert Elliston, president of Turfway Park and Kentucky Downs. "The staff of Kentucky Downs did a tremendous job in readying the facility and especially the course. We went 62 straight days without rain this summer and miraculously, the jockeys and trainers racing with us said the turf was in the best shape it had ever been in."
