DANEHILL FILLY STRUTS HER STUFF

The fourth highest price ever for a filly at the October Yearling Sale was achieved twice yesterday at the second day of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale. Irish trainer Charles O'Brien gave 155,000 guineas for Lot 311, a Danehill filly out of Strutting (Ire) (Ela-Mana-Mou {Ire}), and John Gosden paid the same price for Lot 443, a Mujtahid filly out of Gaijin (Ire) (Caerleon). O'Brien had to outlast agent Charlie Gordon-Watson for the Danehill filly who was consigned from Watership Down Stud on behalf of Carolyn Waters. Gosden will train the Mujtahid filly from his new base at Hawksley Hill, to whom the yearling is a half-sister. Gosden said, "They are very old friends of mine and I trained for them in California 20 years ago. This filly is likely to be bred from at the end of her racing days as she comes from a good family." Agent Peter Doyle went to 140,000 guineas for a Distant View colt out of Annual Dance (Nostalgia), with former trainer Gordon Smyth the underbidder. Distant View's first crop includes Saturday's Dewhurst S. favourite Distant Music. Doyle said, "He was the pick of the sale so far." Annual Dance, winner of nine races in the U.S., was offered by agent John Troy for a client who had paid \$68,000 for the colt at Keeneland in November. The third day tomorrow of the five-day sale has two sessions, the first starting at 9:30 a.m. and the second at 5 p.m. after racing at Newmarket.

New Zealand filly Shizu denied Danglissa a fourth straight win, besting the 13-4 favorite by a short head on the line. Shizu was a notable escapee at her last appearance when she ducked away at the barrier and headed home riderless, trotting all the way back to the stables at Flemington, where trainer Mike Moroney has an Australian base. The Gai Waterhouse-trained Danglissa, having her first start in Melbourne's anti-clockwise direction, tried to lead throughout, but Shizu finished fast to catch the crowd's choice despite drifting in down the stretch. Danglissa's jockey Chris Munce was among several to scrutinize video showing Shizu had shifted in during the drive, but decided not to protest. The Bart Cummings-trained longshot Beat The Fade (50-1) was a fast-finishing third. Shizu will now attempt to become the 15th filly to complete the Thousand Guineas-Oaks double by contesting the A\$500,000 Crown Oaks at Flemington on Nov. 4.

STUD FEE REDUCTIONS AT ASHFORD Ashford Stud in Versailles, Kentucky, has announced its roster of year 2000 stud fees, which features a number of reductions from its 1999 scale. Two established sires feature substantial decreases: Woodman's stud fee has been reduced from \$75,000 in 1999 to \$60,000 for 2000, and Royal Academy's has dropped from \$45,000 to \$35,000. The fees of several younger sires have been reduced as well: Honour and Glory dipped from \$20,000 to \$17,500; Louis Quatorze was halved from \$20,000 to \$10,000; King of Kings dropped from \$35,000 to \$30,000; and Victory Speech from \$12,500 to \$10,000. Southern Halo, who stood for \$15,000 in 1999, is the only increase listed on the roster; his fee will double to \$30,000. "There is no one single reason why we have taken this decision," said Aisling Cross, Ashford's Director of Sales, of the stud fee reductions, "but a number of factors have contributed to it. These factors include the current competitiveness of the market, our wish to sustain the current growth in the market, and our long-held policy of always offering our clients the best service and value for the money that we possibly can. Although the yearling market is strong," she continued, "we don't believe this alone justifies a big increase in a sire's fee. History has shown us that big increases in sires fees on the strength of their most recent yearling sales are not necessarily the best thing for the sires or the breeders who support them. At the end of the day, our clients are our partners and as breeders and sellers ourselves, we understand that the stud fee is crucial to our clients' success."



BREEDERS' CUP NOTES

Buck's Boy (Bucksplasher), the defending Eclipse turf champion, drilled six furlongs yesterday at Hawthorne in 1:12.43 and galloped out seven furlongs in 1:27 2/5 and pulled up the mile in 1:43. After the move, Hawthorne track clocker Bobby Belpedio commented, "He's really sharp right now." Buck's Boy will be looking for back-to-back wins in the Breeders' Cup Turf Nov. 6 at Gulfstream Park.

Breeders' Cup Sprint probable and GI King's Bishop winner Forestry (Storm Cat) continued his preparation for the big day drilling six furlongs in 1:10 3/5 at Santa Anita. Big Jag (Kleven), also a Sprint candidate, worked a half mile for trainer Tim Pinfield.

THREE CHIMNEYS SPINSTER S.-GI, \$500,000, 3yo/up, f/m, 1 1/8m

Let (A.P. Indy) worked five furlongs over a dull Churchill Downs track yesterday in 1:04. "So far, she's been a little bit behind these horses--maybe just a step behind," commented trainer Rusty Arnold. "But you never know when she might step it up a notch and we're going to give her that chance." The four-year-old filly, second in last year's GI Ashland S. over this track, is coming off a runner-up finish in the Sept. 25 Gill Turfway Park Breeders' Cup.

Keeper Hill (Deputy Minister) breezed five furlongs over Keeneland's turf course yesterday in 1:02 3/5. "The reason we've been on the turf the last couple of days is that she busted out a little quarter (crack) and we've been taking it real easy with her," explained trainer Bobby Frankel. "She missed a couple of days of training. But she was moving really good out there today and that's what we were looking for." Keeper Hill won last year's GI Kentucky Oaks, but is winless in six starts this year.

John Franks' **Silent Eskimo** (Eskimo), last seen when a disappointing fourth in Monmouth's Gill Molly Pitcher Breeders' Cup H. July 5, worked five furlongs Tuesday morning in "about 1:01" at Churchill Downs according to trainer Bobby Barnett, who said that the official track clockers had missed the work. The four year old was beaten just 1/2 length by Banshee Breeze in the June 5 Gill Fleur de Lis at Churchill Downs.

Aussie Jockeys Injured:

Two jockeys were taken by ambulance to the Prince of Wales Hospital following a four-horse spill at Randwick in Sydney Wednesday. Len Beasley, riding Onyx Own (Aus) in the Fairlight H., clipped the heels of Ignatio (Aus), ridden by Terry Jones. Beasley was catapulted from the saddle before the horses ridden by by Kevin Moses and Craig Carmody also fell. Beasley and Moses were taken to the hospital. "All of a sudden I saw crowding in front and before I knew it everything was down," said Carmody, who escaped with only a sore wrist. "There was nowhere to go bar over the top." Beasley had the reins wrapped around his neck, but managed to get himself free as his horse stood up. The extent of his injuries was not immediately known. Moses was unconscious.

British racegoers will find it hard to believe that River Keen, a horse they saw win races on the all-weather tracks at Lingfield, Wolverhampton and Southwell, is now firmly established as one of the best older horses in the States. As River Keen's Grade I victories over Almutawakel in the Woodward S. and over Behrens in the Jockey Club Gold Cup demonstrate so well, Bob Baffert has transformed this seven-year-old from the horse who twice received annual Timeform ratings of 102. What makes River Keen's emergence as a championship contender even more surprising is the fact that his sire, Keen, commanded a fee of only £1,500 in Yorkshire this year, having spend the 1997 season based in the Czech Republic.

To suspend this feeling of disbelief, one needs to cast one's mind back to the early 1980s when Keen was a young horse. In an interview with Timeform back in 1983, Henry Cecil said, "What can I say about Keen? He's a brother to Kris and Diesis, he's the best looking of the three and he has a lovely temperament. He made his debut in the Granville S. at Ascot in July and did everything asked of him in very pleasing fashion, making all the running and coming home a couple of lengths clear....Keen obviously has a great deal to live up to - Kris was only beaten twice in 16 races and Diesis was one of last year's outstanding two-year-olds - but I hope Keen will make a top-class colt too."

Keen improved his record to two wins from as many starts on his three-year-old debut, winning impressively over a mile from the very talented Raami. Consequently he shared the position of second favourite with Lear Fan behind El Gran Senor in the 2,000 Guineas. In a particularly hotly-contested classic which also featured Rainbow Quest and Chief Singer, Keen could finish only fifth, but his defeat was partly attributed by Cecil to his not being mature enough for such a major test. However, both of Keen's subsequent efforts confirmed his limitations. Although distinctly smart, he wasn't top class, but maybe the best wasn't seen of this big, imposing colt who had the build to do well at four or five.

Keen started his stallion career in Australia, where he followed the example of Kris and Diesis by siring an Oaks winner in his first crop, namely the South Australian Oaks winner Gamine. But whereas his older brothers both have the magnificent total of over 30 group winners to their credit, Keen has enjoyed only sporadic success at the top level.

All horses in the International TDN were bred in North America unless otherwise indicated.

In his defense, Keen generally hasn't enjoyed the same quality of mares as his brothers and he cannot have been helped by being moved from Australia to Ireland and then to England, before moving on to the Czech Republic. However, he has been faithfully supported by Taiki Farm, whom he rewarded with the smart Japanese horse Hikoki Gumo.

River Keen's dam, the 1 ¼-mile winner Immediate Impact, was also a well-bred individual. With Caerleon as her sire and a mare by Never Bend as her dam, she is bred along similar lines to several of Caerleon's best winners, as Never Bend's name also appears in the pedigrees of Atoll, Cape Verdi, Coretta, Lady Carla, Psychobabble, Tenby and Preseli. River Keen's second dam Match Bend was a three-parts-sister to the smart American horse Distinctive.

Caerleon also appears as the broodmare sire of Sonda, a Dolphin Street filly who narrowly won the G3 Premio Dormello last Sunday. Coincidentally, the cheaply-bought Sonda comes from the outstanding female line which produced Keen, Kris and Diesis, her third dam Sancta being a half-sister to Doubly Sure, the dam of this exceptional trio.

PERSONAL FLAG FILLY TOPS FIRST OPEN SESSION Diletto, a three-year-old filly by Personal Flag, brought a final bid of \$30,000 to top the first open session of the OBS Fall Mixed Sale at Ocala, Florida yesterday. Consigned to the sale by Summerfield (Agent) and believed to be in foal to 1996 Preakness winner Louis Quatorze, she was purchased by Jeff Feins. Buyers had to wait until the next-to-last lot of the afternoon for the top yearling, a March 13 foal by sprint sire Kipper Kelly out of Jolene Jolene (Sunny Clime). Hip number 1169 was consigned by Beth Bayer, agent and was taken for \$30,000 by Thorobeam Farm. Gross receipts compared to the corresponding session from a year ago were up by 27 percent and the average also increased by nearly 24 percent. The sale's final day begins this morning at 10:30 a.m. with a total of 248 broodmares and weanlings catalogued for sale.

Dreamy Maiden put forth a game effort for her first black-type score and gave jockey Pat Day a nice present for his 46th birthday. The chestnut filly won at first asking at Gulfstream last winter and resurfaced with a third in a Keeneland allowance in April. She easily captured a pair of Churchill allowances before backing up to sixth in a Saratoga allowance Aug. 16. Breaking alertly from the rail here, the Florida bred set the early fractions while being pressed by Golden Illusion, was passed by that rival entering the stretch and fought back along the inside for a narrow victory.

His fortunes went south after that, going winless in nine 1998 starts. Claimed for \$100,000 out of a Santa Anita claimer Jan. 29, El Angelo had yet to win in 12 starts in this year, but rallied for third in the Kentucky Cup Mile Sept. 26 at Kentucky Downs. Sent off as the second choice here, he was unhurried early at the back of the pack, rallied five wide off the turn, caught front-running Nite Dreamer in the final sixteenth and edged away late for the score.
