DAYLAMI TO BREEDERS' CUP

Godolphin announced yesterday that Daylami (Ire) (Doyoun {GB}), who won three straight Group 1 events before running ninth in the Oct. 3 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, will run in the Breeders' Cup Turf at Gulfstream Park on Nov. 6. Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford said, "Daylami leaves in the early hours of Monday morning to travel to Florida. That will be followed by a three week build-up to the Breeders' Cup Turf, which gives us the opportunity to see how he acclimatises and adapts to the very different set of conditions down there. We've been very pleased with the way he's come out of the Arc. He's in very good order and Sheikh Maktoum is keen for him to go out early so that he can assess his progress towards the race. He is, however, very much on course to run and we're greatly looking forward to the challenge ahead." Daylami was installed as the 2-1 favourite for the race by Coral, with Val's Prince (Eternal Prince) at 3-1; Yagli (Jade Hunter), 4-1; and Buck's Boy (Bucksplasher), 6-1.

FASLIYEV INJURED

Undefeated two-year-old Fasliyev (Nureyev), winner of the Aug. 8 G1 Heinz 57 Phoenix S. at Leopardstown and the Aug. 22 G1 Prix Morny at Deauville, has been injured and may not race again. "Fasliyev sustained a pastern fracture at Ballydoyle this morning," trainer Aidan O'Brien said. "He has been attended to by veterinary surgeon Dr. John Halley, who has moved him to Troytown Hospital in Kildare for evaluation and surgery. At present, Dr. Wayne McIlwraith of Colorado State University is en route to assist and consult with the surgery. We will issue a further statement when we have more news." A perfect five-for-five, Fasliyev has earned \$374,487 to date. While the colt's future is up in the air, the injury is not believed to be life threatening. He is expected to stand stud at Coolmore at the conclusion of his racing career.

TATTERSALLS OCTOBER GOING STRONG

It was another very strong day at the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale in Newmarket yesterday, with a record average and median for any day in the history of the sale. The average was up 9 percent to 38,313 guineas and the median rose 11 percent to 30,000 guineas. The sale, which has a day and a half to go, has already nearly seen the number of six-figure horses achieved as last year. The top price realised yesterday was 190,000 guineas for Lot 604, a Darshaan (GB) colt from the family of Alleging which sold during the morning session. Agent Charlie Gordon-Watson, believed to be acting for owner Saeed Suhail, faced a strong challenge from Sheikh Mohammed's former racing manager Anthony Stroud. The yearling will be trained by Sir Michael Stoute. During the evening session, Lot 638, a Barathea (Ire) filly, was knocked down for 160,000 guineas to agent John Ferguson, buying for Sheikh Mohammed. The first foal from the Kris (GB) mare El Jazirah (GB), she is a full sister to French Oaks winner Rafha (GB). John Gosden will train the filly, who was consigned by her breeder Michael Page of Gaskyns Stud. Seamus Burns of Ireland's Lodge Park Stud was the underbidder. Highclere Thoroughbred Racing, the successful ownership grouping, splashed out on its most expensive purchase when agent John Warren went to 155,000 guineas for a Bering (GB) colt from the family of Montieu (Ire) who was consigned by France's Haras des Capucines. The underbidder was Amanda Skiffington, Highclere's head Harry Herbert said, "I have learned over the years that when John gets that excited about a horse to pull out all the stops. If ever Highclere has a horse to win a Derby, I hope this could be it." There are two sessions today, with the first starting at 9:30 a.m. and the second at 5 p.m. Tattersalls Toppers and Stats, p2

The bay colt was beaten just a head in the GI Belmont S. and could punch his ticket to the GI Breeder's Cup Classic with a good showing here. Sir Bear defeated a strong field when winning the GI Met Mile at Belmont, but had some trouble sustaining that form. Third in the GII Forego at Saratoga Sept. 6, the Florida bred will attempt to improve on last year's third-place finish in this race.

Happyanunoit's form has improved dramatically with blinkers, winning the GIII Palomar over Tuzla (Fr) and finishing a head second to that filly in the GI Ramona S. Sept. 4 at Del Mar, with subsequent GI Yellow Ribbon S. winner Spanish Fern back in third. The Kiwi bred will use this as her final prep for the Breeders' Cup. Defending Eclipse champion Fiji looked short in her first 1999 start when sixth in the Yellow Ribbon, but has trained well since and also has her sights set on Gulfstream. Pleasant Temper has been very consistent this season, with three straight wins including the Kentucky Cup Ladies Turf over a mile at Kentucky Downs Sept. 26. The distance may not be to her advantage as she has yet to win beyond 8.5 furlongs.

Sky Heights Tops Caulfield Cup:

Sky Heights (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) is the favorite for Saturday's G1 Caulfield Cup. Bookmakers are predicting the four-year-old, who drew post 11 in the 18-horse field, will firm from 3-1 to 7-2 if Melbourne's wet weather continues. He shares topweight of 56.5 kilograms for the 1 1/2-mile test with imported stayer Maridpour (Ire) (Shernazar {Ire}), trained by Michael Moroney, who is rated at 40-1. Maridpour hasn't raced since finishing a distant last eight weeks ago in the G3 Lonsdale S. at York. "It's a bit of a mystery--a foreign horse who hasn't raced for eight weeks going over a mile and a half--but I am very happy with him. He's no oil painting, but he seems a nice horse," said Moroney. The race is proving controversial once again as Lady Elsie (Aus) (Rainbows For Life), who was to be ridden by Shane Dye, and the Bart Cummings-trained Zazabelle (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) were found to have been ineligible all along despite be included among the official entries. The Victoria Racing Club has ordered a full investigation and there is the threat of legal action. Bookmakers estimated that both mares, rated equal ninth in the order of entry, had been backed for "tens of thousands" of dollars in Cups doubles, but under published conditions of entry, horses have to have won at 1600 meters or over and neither mare has done that. "It's a real kick in the guts, to be given the total flick is hard to cop," said Lady Elsie's owner Eric Butler, who will seek legal advice over this issue. "Punters have done their money cold." Racing Victoria General Manager Greg Nichols took responsibility for the situation, saying, "This isn't one of our greatest moments, but the buck stops with me. This was a kindergarten, schoolboy error." The Caulfield Cup committee also used its discretionary powers to include Cranbourne Cup winner Figurehead (NZ) (His Royal Highness {NZ}) at the expense of Inshallah (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}). "She's a Group 2 winner--of course she deserves to be in the race. But I can't change anything and there have been worse days," Inshallah's trainer Gai Waterhouse said.

THE 'NOT RISE' IN STUD FEES By Bill Oppenheim

From Newmarket...Midway through Tattersalls' October Sale--the third week of the three-week sales marathon that defines the European yearling market (the median is still up, as with the other two)--perhaps the biggest news of the day was the publication of the 2000 stud fees for Ashford Farm, Coolmore's Kentucky arm. Of their 10 stallions at stud in Kentucky both years (but not including El Gran Senor and Lure), the prices for six declined, only one advanced (Southern Halo, and that by less than expected) and three remained the same.

Even though several other Kentucky farms which had announced fees had generally held at 1999 levels, the Ashford announcement came as a surprise, especially following roughly 40-percent rises in yearling prices at the Keeneland September sale. Given past performance, and our contention that stallion managers are principally motivated by the desire to make money for shareholders in their stallions, generally a 40-percent rise in yearling prices would be followed by more of an across-the-board rise in stud fees.

A few of the cynics among us, who doubt that Coolmore is in business for altruistic reasons, were overheard saying they thought this move meant that Ashford's assessment is that these prices are what the market will bear, especially keeping in mind they consider a book of 100 mares barely adequate. The hundred-plus book was one of two Coolmore innovations which put them back in the stallion-buying game against the weight of Japanese money five years ago. But the old saying that imitation is the sincerest form of flattery now means even Ashford finds itself in competition with a raft of other farms who'd like their stallions to cover 100-plus mares. No doubt Ashford's awareness of the competition for mares must have been a contributing factor in their decision.

There are two other elements we ought to take into account when thinking about why there hasn't been a wholesale rise in Kentucky stud fees for next year. One factor is that there has already been about a two-thirds rise in the stud fees of many popular stallions in the last four years, since 1996.

I took an unrepresentative sample of 25 stallions who stood at 12 major Kentucky farms from 1996 through 1999, ranging from \$10,000-\$150,000 (in1996), and who then ranged from \$15,000-\$200,000 in 1999. Of the 25 sires, I believe only four will be higher next year than they were this year. Of the remaining 21, only one (Rahy) stood for less in 1999 than he did in 1996; 20 out of 21 stood for more. And the average price rise for those 20 was 68 percent.

Of course, the entire business has been growing since it bottomed out in 1992-93, and there's no doubt yearling prices in 1999 are a lot higher than they were four years ago, just as stud fees are. Growth in a market sector is rarely even: if stud fees have risen 68 percent in the last four years, it doesn't necessarily figure that they're going to increase by 17 percent this year.

The Kentucky stallion managers seem to have the perception, at any rate, that their seasons sales may not be as brisk if they are too indiscriminate about fees rising.

One reason for this is doubtless the prevalence of young, unproven stallions in the Kentucky stallion population. I have a list of 240 major Kentucky stallions I work from, and by my count 111 of them--46 percent --went to stud in 1996 or later, meaning their oldest foals are 2-year-olds, yearlings, weanlings or in utero. As the business has recovered--and Japan became less aggressive in their stallion purchases--more and more hoses have retired in Kentucky; roughly 28 a year. If they each had 50 foals, and half their foals were in yearling sales, those stallions alone would produce 2,775 sales yearlings a year--it would be a kind of 'baby boom.' In any event, 111 young stallions looks like a lot for the market to absorb.

Especially given the spike in North American yearling sales prices the last couple of years, a lot of us who follow the market have been asking each other, what's different from the Eighties? This is different. Whether that difference is significant or not, we don't yet know. One way of reading it is that the general 'failure to advance' of Year 2000 stud fees (special cases and the usual success stories excepted) constitutes the recognition of an impending decline, only this time it will be somewhat orderly, instead of in free-fall. But that would be ascribing the market breeding sector the capability of taking a longer-term view. That really would be news; I thought long-term thinking went out with the owner-breeders. And most likely it has, which would leave us back with the short-term explanation: what the market will bear.

ROBERTO MARE TOPS OBS FINALE The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's 1999 Fall Mixed Sale ended yesterday with the second of two open sessions. Ann's Roberto (Roberto), a 16-year-old broodmare in foal to Tactical Advantage, topped the final session, bringing a bid of \$50,000. A full sister to Kris S., she was consigned by Red Oak Farm and purchased by Live Oak Stud. Her foals include stakes winner and graded-stakes placed Abduct (World Appeal). Two lots tied for highest-priced weanlings at the session, selling for \$30,000 apiece. Hip number 1219, a filly by Harlan out of Mary Mac (Kipper Kelly) was consigned by Scott Carlsen Development Corp. and purchased by Equest Thoroughbreds Inc. Hip number 1229, a colt from the second crop by Mecke out of Mimi's Golden Bird (Gold Meridian) was consigned by Eddie Woods, Agent X, and purchased by Chad Johnson, agent. The average for the four sessions of the sale (not including the Mockingbird Dispersal) was up 26 percent from 1998, while the median rose 33 percent. "I believe the Mockingbird Dispersal showed how well we can sell topquality breeding stock here in Ocala," OBS General Manager Tom Ventura said. "The rest of the market was strong throughout the week at all levels and demand was particularly strong for weanlings that looked the part. We couldn't be more pleased, and now it's time to turn our attention to the nominees for the select two-year-old sales."

BAY MEADOWS CLOSES TURF COURSE According to the published reports, Bay Meadows has closed its turf course and postponed the GIII Ascot H., which was scheduled to be run Saturday. Track officials decided after Monday's card to cancel turf racing indefinitely, reacting to a pair of spills on the course Oct. 2 and Oct. 11. According to the Daily Racing Form, three turf specialists inspected the course Tuesday and Wednesday and pinpointed an area of hardened peat moss which appeared to be causing horses to bobble severely. The problem can be corrected, and the Form reports that the turf could be opened again by the end of the month.

MILITARY TO GLENCREST Military (Danzig--Wavering Girl, by Wavering Monarch), winner of last year's GI Oak Tree Turf Championship S., injured a suspensory during a morning workout at Belmont Park Tuesday and has been retired. Owned by Glencrest Farm, The Thoroughbred Corp. and Green Lantern Stables, LLC, he will enter stud at Glencrest near Midway, Kentucky in 2000. "Military has a pedigree with remarkable similarities to sire sensation Danehill," Glencrest spokesman David Greathouse said. "Both stallions are by Danzig and have His Majesty and Buckpasser up close. Military also has linebreeding to Northern Dancer and Ribot, which allows a lot of opportunity for mares with Mr. Prospector, Bold Ruler and Raise a Native." The fiveyear-old was 12th in the 1998 Breeders' Cup Mile, but rebounded to take the Nov. 28 GII Citation H. to end the campaign. He had started just once since, finishing seventh after the 10-month layoff in the GII Belmont Breeders' Cup H. Sept. 25. He goes to the breeding shed with a record of five wins, a second and two thirds from 12 starts and earnings of \$462,716. His stud fee has not been finalized.
