TATTERSALLS SALE A RECORD-SETTER

The 1999 Tattersalls October Yearling Sale, Europe's largest yearling auction, came to a close yesterday with records broken for median, average and aggregate. Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony said "This year's October Yearling catalogue was significantly larger than last year's, with intense demand for places in both this week's sale and the Houghton. Our yearling inspection team looked at nearly 3,000 horses this spring, which made it hard to keep both sales at manageable levels, and it has been encouraging to see last year's level of trading matched. This year's sale included 19 lots who realized 100,000 guineas or more, compared to 17 last year. Another feature, in addition to the traditionally strong presence from Central Europe, has been the major impact that buyers from Eastern Europe have made upon the sale, after promotional visits to the Czech Republic and Poland this year." The top price of the week came Friday night, when a client of Peter Doyle Bloodstock paid 400,000 guineas for a Sadler's Wells filly offered from Raffin Stud, the property of Thrup Bloodstock. Yesterday's final session was topped by Lot 984, the first foal of Marina Park (GB), an eight-time winner in Britain and the United States. Her colt by Gulch, his only lot in the sale, was offered for Greenland Park Ltd from Collin Stud and fetched 72,000 guineas from trainer Peter Harris. Agent Peter Doyle paid 60,000 guineas for Lot 960, a daughter of Roar, offered by American consignor Highclere Stud. Lot 961, a Shirley Heights (GB) colt out of the Fairy King mare Fajjoura (Ire), offered from Fieldspring Stud, was bought by agent Charlie Gordon-Watson for 62,000 guineas.

A CHAMPION IS CONFIRMED

After his initial outing in a maiden at Doncaster July 28, where he had subsequent G3 Solario S. Aug. 20. winner Best of the Bests (Ire) behind, Distant Music (Distant View) was a name on many people's lips. He imposed himself again on the same course in the G2 Champagne S. Sept.10, rushing clear of Rossini. As he entered the parade ring today, he held the position of 4-1 favorite for next year's G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas S. May 6, such had been his impression on all involved. Zentsov Street (Nureyev) set a mild pace as both Brahms (Danzig) and Distant Music sat in behind. When Michael Hills asked the winner to quicken two furlongs out, the response was immediate and he forged to the front, pursued only by the runner-up. Although Brahms closed the gap in the final hundred yards, Distant Music was not threatened. Hills was emphatic after the race when he said, "I think he's exceptional. He's the best I've ridden." Trainer Barry Hills, recording his 100th winner of the season, added, "He really needs a fast pace, which he didn't get here, but he can't do more than win. He has done it very well and he would have been even better on faster ground. Every time he does a piece of work at home, the riders all say that the leading horse is no good, that they don't go fast enough for him. When you set him alight he just goes." Distant Music is now as short as 9-4 for the first Classic of 2000.

Trainer Bobby Frankel's hot streak continued as Keeper Hill put in a strong run to upset Banshee Breeze in the 44th renewal of the Spinster. The bay recorded her first victory of the year, adding a third Grade I to her Kentucky Oaks and Las Virgenes wins. Last spring, Keeper Hill and Banshee Breeze took turns beating one another, with the latter outfinishing Keeper Hill in the Breeders' Cup Distaff for the Eclipse Award. Keeper Hill finished fourth in her first two starts this year, both on the Hollywood main, before rallying for third in the GI Beverly Hills on the turf. Shipped east, she continued to run well, finishing second in the GIII Delaware H. July 25, third in the GI Personal Ensign at Saratoga to Beautiful Pleasure and Banshee Breeze, and third in the GI Ruffian. Settling on the inside just four lengths off frontrunning Lines of Beauty (Line In The Sand), Keeper Hill advanced along the rail, burst through in deep stretch and drove home an impressive winner. "I was kind of looking for her [Banshee Breeze]," said winning jockey Kent Desormeaux. "But when the doors opened up, my filly was so full of run, I didn't think anybody could catch her. She was awesome." Trainer Bobby Frankel, winning his third Keeneland stakes this meeting, said, "I don't know if I have been giving the jockeys bad instructions or putting her in the wrong spots or what, but she really ran a huge race today." Banshee Breeze raced five wide much of the way, but rallied well for second.

Since winning this race 12 months ago, Alborada has encounted numerous setbacks and has had only one race, a creditable fourth to Zahrat Dubai (GB) in the G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood July 31. Trainer Sir Mark Prescott has enjoyed a trouble-free month as he prepared Alborada, who is the first to win this race twice in a row since Triptych did so in 1987. Salford Express (Be My Guest) led in the early stages, but was soon running fourth as Kabool took over as the field turned into the long straight in advance of Alborada and High-Rise (High Estate {Ire}). The favorite Shiva was restrained by Richard Quinn in midfield. The race began in earnest with three furlongs to run, where the principals all came under pressure, still headed by Kabool. George Duffield became urgent aboard Alborada; she was on terms entering the final quarter and hit the front with 1½ furlongs to run. Shiva had made good progress from the three-furlong marker, was third at the furlong pole and ran on well to be closest at the finish. Prescott said, "This is one of the most enjoyable days I have had. Last year was so straightforward when she won, but it has been a real struggle this time due to all the niggles. She has come back at the right time and all credit to [owner] Miss Rausing who has been so patient. Good horses are normally easy to train so this is a great relief."

Only off the board once in his nine-race career prior to this start, Pleasant Breeze broke his maiden at third asking for the Behrens connections, going 10 furlongs at Saratoga in August of 1998, and hasn't missed a beat since. The gelding came into his first stakes test with a five-length triumph at the Spa Aug. 30 and a front-running, seven-length victory at Belmont Sept. 26, both at the Med Cup distance of nine furlongs. Pleasant Breeze broke alertly from the two hole and was joined immediately from the outside by Jazz Club and the pair raced together down the backstretch, while favored Vision and Verse galloped along in midpack and in the clear on the outside. Turning for home, Pat Day, aboard Jazz Club, turned up the pressure on the front runner and forged a narrow lead from Pleasant Breeze in midstretch, but the latter was unyielding along the inside and fought back gamely for the victory. Travers runnerup Vision and Verse rallied wide into the stretch and finished with good energy without menacing the top pair.

In a race billed as a match between General Challenge and Old Trieste for West Coast leadership, the venerable Budroyale emerged victorious and now heads to the Breeders' Cup as the winner of the last major California prep. The bay gelding, always consistent, came into the Goodwood with an excellent record on the season, with only one unplaced effort in nine starts. After romping in the GII Mervyn LeRoy by eight lengths, he chased home Old Trieste in the GII Californian S. May 29. Budrovale then finished second to Real Quiet in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup, but could only manage a fourth to Mazel Trick and River Keen in the GIII San Diego H. at Del Mar Aug. 7. Shipped up to Washington, he fought his way home in the GIII Longacres Mile at Emerald Downs Aug. 22. Lightly regarded at 9-1 here, Budroyale settled in third early, about six lengths off the front-running Hollycombe and Old Trieste. The six-year-old made his move between horses, took a short lead in midstretch and outgamed General Challenge to the wire for a Calbred exacta. "I've never ridden a guttier horse than this one," said winning jockey Garrett Gomez. Budroyale may have punched his ticket to Gulfstream with this victory. "If he comes out of the race good and doesn't give us any reason not to, then I'd say we're running in the Breeders' Cup Classic," said winning trainer Ted West. "He beat two of the best horses in the world today in General Challenge and Old Trieste, and the others were no slouches either. The fact that he can look those horses in the eye and gun them down means we'll have to consider [the Classic]. He's completely eligible."

What a long strange trip it's been for this one-time Triple Crown hopeful. The flashy bay raised eyebrows when he left Kelly Kip, among others, in his wake during his track-record setting performance in the seven-furlong GI Carter H. in April, and then endured the wrath of a crazed fan who ran into his path in the Maryland Breeders' Cup H. in his next start on Preakness day. A smattering of runner-up finishes ensued, but he scored his first victory since the Carter when scoring by 31/2 lengths in the GI Vosburgh in his last start. A notoriously slow starter, Artax would have to overcome the inside post in this heat. With a bullet drill Oct. 9, the four-year-old was on his toes and broke alertly to lead in the early stages from the returning Bet Me Best (Barberstown), who trailed by only a head after a quarter of :22 1/5 and a half in :44 3/5. Entering the stretch, Artax was full of run, put away Bet Me Best to lead by 41/2 lengths past the eighth pole and broke Groovy's 1987 track record by one fifth of a second. "He's phenomenal," commented trainer Louis Albertrani. "He's an amazing animal. He will not miss an oat tonight. He loves what he does." After toying with the idea of running Artax in the Breeders' Cup Mile, the plan is now clear. "We're going to the Sprint," said owner Ernie Paragallo.

When Susu came back from Dubai earlier this year to race in the colors of Sheikh Mohammed's son, Sheikh Rashid al Maktoum, she carried with her a tall reputation. However, it wasn't until the Listed Kyoto Sceptre S. at Doncaster Sept. 9, that she showed her real ability by quickening impressively to win with plenty in hand. After an even break, it was Presumed (Dynaformer) who took them along at a fast pace, tracked by Sugarfoot (Thatching {Ire}). As they quickened past halfway, none seemed to be going better than Lend A Hand, with Olivier Peslier biding his time. When the favorite was asked, he readily put distance between himself and the chasing group and looked set for a facile success until Susu was brought to challenge by Kieren Fallon on the outside and she wore down Lend A Hand to take the race. "That is the way to ride her, she likes to come from off the pace as she has a very good turn of foot," said trainer Sir Michael Stoute. "It was all down to the owner that she ran. He was very confident when he looked at the field." Of the runner-up and the thirdplaced horse, John Ferguson, bloodstock agent for Godolphin, said, "We will wait and see how Lend A Hand is and talk to Sheikh Maktoum about the Breeders' Cup. I think going round two bends at Gulfstream Park will suit him fine, seven furlongs looks his trip here in England, but a mile in Florida might be all right for him. You are never pleased to be beaten, but he has run well. We thought he would win today and he hasn't, so that is why there is going to be a question mark about the Breeders' Cup. Josr Algarhoud ran very well and he will be a nice horse next year."

The winner of the GII Dixie H. at Pimlico in May, Middlesex Drive took the GII Bernard Baruch H. at Saratoga Aug. 12 before disappointing as the favorite when fifth in the GIII Fourstardave H. at Saratoga Aug. 28. Showing good speed from the outset, Middlesex Drive chased pacesetter Bomfim through good early splits, took over after a half-mile, opened up a fivelength lead coming into the stretch and held off Divide and Conquer late. "I felt like he was as good as he could be going into today," said trainer Phil Hauswald. "Hopefully, he'll go next in the Breeders' Cup Mile." Jockey Shane Sellers said, "Down the backstretch he was real comfortable and he was pricking his ears. Once he inherited the lead, he just drew off and I was real impressed with his race."



Trainer Colin Alderson savored a particularly sweet victory as Zabeel's offspring recorded a clean sweep of the Caulfield Cup. Alderson prepared Our Unicorn for a Caulfield Cup tilt last year only to be denied a berth in the 18-horse race when the VATC controversially decided to allow Taufan's Melody to run. This year, Alderson, not a man given to brash statements, predicted Sky Heights and stablemate Inaflury would quinella the race--and he was nearly right, with only Laebeel separating the pair. "It got very aggressive from the start, but the last 300 meters was harder than I expected," said Sky Heights' jockey Damien Oliver after the 5-2 favorite wore down Laebeel, whose rider Steven Baster thought he had the race won with only a short half head between them. "He's a bulldog of a horse and he will be hard to beat in the Melbourne Cup," added Oliver. Inaflury's jockey Larry Cassidy said his mare was trapped too far back and peaked on her run with 150 meters to go. Sky Heights has been penalized 1.5kg for the Melbourne Cup, so he'll carry the same weight he did today, 56.5kg (124 lbs), in the two-mile race Nov. 2. He's third favorite at 5-1, behind Kayf Tara (7-2) and Tie The Knot (9-2) with Laebeel firming from 25-1 to 8-1.

Zabeel Overtakes Danehill Atop Aussie Sire List:

The best of Danehill's five Caulfield Cup representatives today was fifth-placed Rose O'War while Zabeel swept the top three positions, putting the New Zealand sire on top of the sires' table.

Police Looking Into Possible Drugging Incident:

Victoria's chief steward Des Gleeson has called the Police Racing Squad to assist investigations into whether two horses who were favorites for minor feature races at Caulfield Friday were drugged. Trainer Tony Vasil became suspicious about the health of his runners Pareto (Aus) and Marstic (Aus) after both appeared listless Friday. The Melbourne Herald-Sun reported it was believed the two had been injected in the neck and that police were interviewing a man in his 20s who is the son of a well-known racing identity. Both horses were scratched from their races Friday night and Gleeson beefed up security and testing on all runners. Gleeson said the horses, two of 40 stabled at Vasil's were "obviously not well" when stewards were alerted. but their condition was no longer life threatening. Three-year-old Pareto was the 5-2 early favorite for the Permastall Plate and Marstic was 7-4 co-choice for the G2 Schillaci S.

Jockey and Girlfriend Get Prison for Race Fixing:

The South China Morning Post reported yesterday that jockey Stanley Chin Kin-ming, 25, has been jailed for 3½ years while his girlfriend, Denise Yeung Ka-yee, 28, was jailed for two years and nine months after being found guilty of fixing two races at Sha Tin in 1996. The pair approached 11 apprentice jockeys not to finish in the top three in a race March 30, and also paid jockeys to lose in a race Jan. 27. The gamblers who provided the bribe money reportedly lost HK\$700,000 when their horses didn't finish in the right order.

Hurricane Irene Aftermath:

Hurricane Irene swept through South Florida late Friday afternoon (Oct. 15) dumping 12-16 inches of rain on the area. The three Thoroughbred tracks, Calder, Gulfstream and Hialeah all sustained cosmetic damage. Calder president C. Kenneth Dunn said, "There was some water seepage, trees down and we lost electricity on the backside. Thankfully there were no injuries to humans or horses." Calder canceled racing the day the hurricane hit. The Festival of the Sun, which included five stakes races, will be held on Saturday, Oct. 23. Gulfstream, host to the Breeders' Cup Nov. 6. had part of its backside under six inches of water and its entire clubhouse parking lot was submerged. Some trees were down and two corporate tents recently erected were ripped to shreds. The tent used to house the auxiliary press box was damaged. There are about 100 horses on Gulfstream's backside and no injuries were reported. Hialeah general manager Rick Sacco said, "We're assessing the damage right now, but there only seems to be water damage and downed trees."
