SUCCESS SURGERY FOR FASLIYEV

Fasliyev (Nureyev--Mr. P.'s Princess, by Mr. Prospector), who fractured his pastern Thursday morning, has made an excellent recovery from surgery, but the twoyear-old will be retired and heads to Coolmore to stand at stud next season. "We are expecting him to leave the Troytown Equine Hospital early next week and he will go straight to Coolmore," said trainer Aidan O'Brien, "The vets are very pleased with his recovery and expect him to be fully recovered well before the covering season starts in four months time." Fasliyev was undefeated in five starts, recording Group 1 victories in the Prix Morny at Deauville and the Heinz 57 Phoenix S. at Leopardstown for earnings of \$374,487. "It takes a real star to achieve what he has done this year," O'Brien said. "It's just tragic that he hurt himself in the way he did, when he was out in the paddock, because he was a very sound horse. I would never have asked him to tackle two Group 1 races in the space of 15 days if he wasn't. He should take to his new role at Coolmore as he has always been such a mature individual." Faslivev's stud fee has not been finalized.

STRAVINSKY TO ASHFORD AFTER SPRINT

Stravinsky (Nureyev--Fire The Groom, by Blushing Groom {Fr}), Europe's top sprinter, will make his final career start in the Breeders' Cup Sprint, then will ship from Gulfstream Park to Ashford Stud in Kentucky and start his new career as a stallion next season. Trainer Aidan O'Brien had been pointing the colt for the Mile, but said, "I am confident that he will adapt to dirt and he has so much brilliant speed that he should take all the beating. My only worry is whether the European horses will cope with the switch to a hot and humid climate." The three-year-old, hero of the G1 Persimmon Homes Nunthorpe S. at York and the G1 Darley July Cup at Newmarket in his last two starts, has won three of his seven starts, bankrolling \$360,071. His stud fee has not yet been announced.

On a day when Cherokee Run consolidated his lead on North America's freshman sires' table through Silentlea's success in the GII Astarita S., another Kentucky-based stallion, Distant View, shot to the top of the British and Irish list thanks to the victory of his son Distant Music in the G1 Dewhurst S.

Distant Music was expected to win--and win well-following his dazzling display in the G2 Champagne S., but the ground conditions did not help his cause. Jim McGrath expressed fears in *The Daily Telegraph* that "the fragile state of the ground on the July Course could bring him back to the pack" and his fears were substantiated to an extent. Although the Juddmonte homebred was still able to produce his instant acceleration, the conditions and the slow early pace conspired to prevent him from drawing well clear of Brahms.

Time may show, though, that Brahms is also a very good colt. After all, this million-dollar colt is by Danzig out of Queena, a Mr. Prospector mare who became a champion at the age of five.

Distant Music's ability to quicken could be described as hereditary. His sire looked to have little hope of success when he was boxed in on the rails in the G1 Sussex S., but he quickened so well on seeing daylight that he managed to catch Barathea (Ire) close home, in the process lowering Goodwood's mile record. Unfortunately Distant View failed to reproduce that form in two subsequent starts in 1994 and never made it to the track when kept in training as a four-year-old.

This type of scenario often represents quite a blow to a young stallion's prospects, but Distant View was fortunate that his breeder, Khalid Abdullah, has always supported him very strongly.

Distant View has already repaid his owner with colts of the calibre of Distant Music, Decarchy and Observatory, and the eight-year-old stallion has also rewarded outside breeders with several winners, including Kelso Magic, an English filly who recently finished a good fourth in the G3 Cornwallis S.

Distant Music is a grandson of Populi, a mare bought for \$2,000,000 at Keeneland in 1983, and he represents the second substantial dividend produced by Populi's daughters this year. Her Northern Dancer filly Kamkova is the dam of Kirkwall (GB), a Selkirk horse who recently scored his third 1999 graded win in the GII Keeneland Turf Mile. Distant View's dam, Musicanti, is by Nijinsky II out of Populi and is therefore a 3/4 sister to Kamkova. Although Kamkova and Musicanti are closely related, they are very different physical specimens. Musicanti is much the bigger at over 16.2 hands, and this plain, lengthy mare has blended very well with Distant View, a neater, more muscular and strong-quartered individual.

When a colt possesses Distant Music's powers of acceleration, the chances are that he will struggle to get 1 1/2 miles. He could get 1 1/4 miles, though, because Musicanti gained her only win from 12 starts over 1 3/4 miles in France and she is a half sister to Vanlandingham, a top American horse who gained Grade I wins over 1 1/2 miles in the Washington D.C. International and Jockey Club Gold Cup.

Populi was herself a half sister to Temperence Hill, a champion three-year-old who stayed 1 1/2 miles well enough to win the GI Belmont S. and GI Jockey Club Gold Cup. Populi's sire, Star Envoy, also stayed pretty well, once winning the 1 3/8-mile Manhattan H. Could it be, though, that Distant View's female line will exert a stronger influence? His dam Seven Springs was a very talented two-year-old sprinter and winner of the G1 Prix Morny--a race also won by her half-sister Regal State.

GOOD AND TOUGH TO VINERY IN 2000 The fourvear-old multiple graded-stakes winner Good and Tough (Carson City--Amy Be Good, by Northern Raja) will stand the 2000 breeding season at Vinery Kentucky. Vinery Kentucky and partners purchased a majority interest in the David P. Reynolds homebred, who is scheduled to make the final start of his career in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. Runner-up in this year's GI Frank J. DeFrancis Memorial Dash S., Good and Tough won the GII Commonwealth Breeders' Cup S. and GIII Finger Lakes Breeders' Cup S. He was most recently second behind Artax in the GII Forest Hill H.; his record currently stands at nine wins in 22 starts for earnings of \$809,341. "Like commercially popular Lord Carson, Good and Tough is an attractive, well-made son of Carson City and a product of David Reynolds' successful breeding program. He's a natural fit here at Vinery," said Director of Operations Bates Newton.

Former Jockey Sam Renick Dead:

Sam Renick, who rode his first race in 1928 at the age of 16 and later became one of the founders of the Jockeys' Guild, died Saturday morning at his home in Manhattan after a long illness. He was 87. Renick, who rode under contract for owners such as Alfred Vanderbilt and Harry Warner, teamed up with Johnny Longden and Eddie Arcaro to form the Jockeys' Guild in the early '40s. He retired from the saddle later that decade, but went on to host one of the first television programs on horse racing. Plans for a memorial service at Belmont Park have not yet been finalized.

California law enforcement officials, investigating whether Youbet.com was operating outside of state and federal legislation against gambling on the Internet, raided the company's headquarters yesterday. Youbet.com, which argues that it does not accept bets, but only transmits wagering information to licensed betting facilities, is cooperating with officials. The company's stock price dropped sharply on the news, falling 1 9/32 points, or 28 percent, from 4 1/2 to 3 23/32 at the close of the market yesterday. Volume on the stock, which has averaged about 151,000 shares daily over the last 30 days, was up dramatically, with 1,781,300 shares traded yesterday.

Another horse was being treated for feet problems at that time. Royal Line was mistakenly contaminated with the substance and Godolphin accepts full responsibility." The two other horses to have tested positive are El Curioso (USA) (El Gran Senor {USA}), for phenylbutazone and oxyphenbutazone, after winning at Salisbury July 10, and French County (Ire) (Executive Perk {GB}), for flunixin, after scoring over hurdles at Bangor June 30.


