Following the Cox Plate, the Series moves to Gulfstream Park in Florida Nov. 6, where both the Breeders' Cup Turf and Breeders' Cup Classic are Series races. Then it's off to the Far East for the Nov. 28 \$3 million Japan Cup at Tokyo Racecourse and the \$1.3 million Hong Kong International Cup Dec. 12. The winner of the Series receives a \$1 million bonus.

Make No Mistake Likely to Miss Plate:

Irish challenger Make No Mistake (Ire) (Darshaan (GB)) pulled up sore after a track gallop yesterday and is unlikely to represent trainer Dermot Weld in Saturday's A\$1.7 million Cox Plate at Moonee Valley. The four-year-old suffered a hoof bruise earlier in the week, but connections were hopeful he would improve by post time. "Before he went out to gallop today we were very confident, but the concussion of hitting his feet on the ground seems to have aggravated the injury," said Weld. "The worst thing you can do if a horse is not right is run him." Make No Mistake would have been the first international entrant in the race regarded as Australasia's weight-for-age championship, but Weld, who snatched the Melbourne Cup with Vintage Crop in 1993, hasn't given up hope and VRC veterinary steward John McCaffery will inspect the horse Friday.

McCaffery said Northern Drake (Aus) (Varick), who appeared sore after a work Monday, had galloped freely and would take his place in the field.

Redoute's Choice (Aus) (Danehill) remains the early favorite for the Cox Plate, although only four three-year-olds in almost 30 years have won the race; Octagonal (1995), Red Anchor (1984), Surround (1976) and Taj Rossi (1973). "Every three-year-old who has won this race in recent years has been voted Horse of the Year, so Redoute's Choice has very big shoes to fill," said jockey Chris Munce, adding he had a "gut feeling" the colt would make the grade.

Sunline (NZ), the forgotten Cox Plate contender, is primed for her mission according to trainer Trevor McKee. Her pristine gallop Tuesday dispelled rumors that all was not right as she went over 1600 meters in 1:50.5, reeling off her last 400 meters in :25.25.

AMERICAN HORSES BANNED IN HONG KONG

Reacting to the recent outbreak of the West Nile-like fever on the East Coast, Hong Kong has temporarily banned the import of horses from North America, according to the a report from Reuters. "This is a precautionary measure to prevent the possibility of the virus responsible for the fatal neurological disease from getting into the local mosquito population and infecting people, birds and animals in Hong Kong," the Hong Kong Jockey Club said, adding that they will begin testing horses for exposure to the virus. "This will enable importation of horses into Hong Kong from the United States to resume as soon as it is considered safe to do so." Hong Kong's three international races, the Cup, the Bowl and the Vase, are set to be run Dec. 12. American-bred horses destined for the annual International Sales the same week, are also in jeopardy of being banned.

No Lack of Entries for Hong Kong Races:

A total of 442 entries have been received for this year's four international races in Hong Kong Dec. 12 at Sha Tin. The featured G1 Hong Kong International Cup, run over 1 1/4 miles and the final event of the Emirates World Racing Series Championship, has attracted Alborada (GB) (Alzao {USA}), Fruits of Love (USA) (Hansel {USA}), Running Stag (USA) (Cozzene {USA}) and Daylami (Ire) (Doyoun {GB}). The selection of overseas horses and reserves will be announced Wednesday, Nov. 10.



The sale concludes today with what is traditionally the stronger session.

SUSPENSION OF BARATHEA GUEST UPHELD

France Galop yesterday backed the decision to disqualify Barathea Guest (GB) (Barathea {Ire}) from first place in the G1 Grand Criterium at Longchamp Oct. 10. The George Margarson-trained colt beat the Aidan O'Brien-trained Ciro (USA) (Woodman {USA}) by a neck, but the placings were reversed after the Longchamp stewards decided that Barathea Guest had caused interference. The appeal was heard in Paris Wednesday evening, but judgement was not issued until yesterday. Tim Corby, racing manager to owner John Guest, said, "We received a fair and professional hearing. Although disappointed that the appeal was not upheld, Barathea Guest was the moral winner of the Grand Criterium at Longchamp. The colt will not run again until next year." France Galop spokesman Olivier de Malherbe said, "The appeal panel, after taking everything into account, have decided that the decision to demote Barathea Guest was the correct one. Obviously, the fact that it was a two-year-old race, run on very soft ground, was taken into account when reaching a verdict. However, what is undeniable is that Barathea Guest did encroach and that Ciro's rider, Michael Kinane, was forced to react."

CUMANI FINED FOR DRUG POSITIVE

Trainer Luca Cumani was fined a total of £1,500 by the Jockey Club Disciplinary Committee yesterday after prohibited substances were found in the post-race sample from the Aga Khan-owned Zalal (Ire) following a win in the EBF Triumvirate Classified '95' S. at Goodwood in June. The horse was disqualified for the presence of phenyibutazone and oxyphenbutazone. Zalal was the second Aga Khan-owned Cumani runner in the last year to fail a post-race drug test. Cumani said yesterday, "I am sorry about the incident and sorry for the connections. I have no comment to make about anything else, it is up to His Highness the Aga Khan to say what he feels. Horses require treatment from time to time. It is naive to expect a stable today to run without medication. The excretion times are not very helpful, but let's not make a criminal issue out of what is a painkiller. It is not a performance-enhancing drug, no one was cheating or trying to gain an advantage. And the only intention was to try and keep the horse in training to do what it was bred to do." The £1,000 fine was for the positives and £500 in regard to the rule requiring the keeping of proper medication records.

FALLON WINS 200TH FOR THIRD STRAIGHT YEAR

Kieren Fallon vesterday rode his 200th winner of the season, becoming the first jockey since Sir Gordon Richards in 1952 to complete a third consecutive double-century when Alva Glen (USA) won the Oath Maiden S. at Nottingham. The 34-year-old said, "I'm just glad it's all over. When I went down south to ride for Henry Cecil, I didn't find that nerve-wracking and even when going out on Oath (Ire) in the Derby I wasn't too worried. But this week was the first time I was starting to get worried. I'd had some good rides earlier in the week, but when you get to the fourth day you wonder whether you are going to do it. It was disappointing to leave Henry [Cecil]. He had a lot of good horses and we had a lot of Classic winners together. I did not expect it to happen and I was the last person to find out. It was a great day winning the Derby and it's just a shame that Oath got injured in his next race because the sky was the limit with that horse." Fallon is hoping to pass his best yearly total of 204 before he leaves for Hong Kong Tuesday.
