BUCK'S BOY "READY"

Trainer Noel Hickey reports that his defending Breeders' Cup Turf champion Buck's Boy (Bucksplasher) is "doing just fine" and will arrive at Irish Acres Farm in Ocala, Florida this morning. "He's ready," said Hickey. "All I have to do is keep him in tune." Hickey still isn't sure when the six-year-old gelding will head down to Gulfstream Park. "I've raced off the farm with him before," he explained. "We set a track record."

SAYARSHAN OUT OF BREEDERS' CUP

The *Daily Racing Form* reports that Sayarshan (Fr) (Darshaan {GB}) will miss the Breeders' Cup Turf after suffering a bowed tendon. "I don't know when it happened," trainer Nick Canani told the *Form*. "The day it happens is not always the day it shows. It could have happened two weeks ago or two days ago." The four-year-old has won two of four starts since coming to the U.S., taking the June 19 GIII Golden Gate H. and the Aug. 28 GII Del Mar H. He was most recently fourth in the Oct. 3 GIII Oak Tree Turf Championship. It has not yet been decided if the French colt will be retired.

O'BRIEN TO ENTER SEPTET

Aidan O'Brien plans to enter seven in the Breeders' Cup, but will probably run three or four. Although he has won nearly 60 juvenile races this year, the star of O'Brien's stable is three-year-old Stravinsky (Nureyev), who will be entered in the Sprint and the Mile, with the Sprint the likely spot for the winner of the G1 July Cup and G1 Nunthorpe S. For the Juvenile, O'Brien will enter Brahms (Danzig), who was third in the G1 Middle Park S. in his latest start; Mull of Kintyre (Danzig), winner of the G2 Gimcrack S. by three lengths in his last; and a pair of two-for-two colts with Listed wins, Bach (Ire) (Caerleon) (Chesham S.) and Thady Quill (Nureyev) (Superlative S.). O'Brien has two for the Juvenile Fillies, maiden winner Amethyst (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Warrior Queen (Quiet American), winner of the Go and Go Round Tower S. in her last. "We stayed very healthy this year," O'Brien said of his incredible season. "We were lucky." About running his first starters in Florida, O'Brien said, "Everybody keeps telling us it will be difficult, but we will just do our best."

O'BRIEN OVERPOWERS RACING POST TROPHY

Britain's final Group 1 race of the season, the Racing Post Trophy, once again sees trainer Aidan O'Brien well represented in his attempt to plunder another top juvenile prize, saddling three of the nine runners. O'Brien has enjoyed a landmark season with his juveniles and, judged on the choice of stable jockey Michael Kinane, Zentsov Street (Nureyev) appears to be the Ballydoyle number one pick. He has top-class form and followed up his maiden win at Newmarket Sept. 30 with a solid third to Distant Music in the G1 Dewhurst S. at the same track Oct. 16. Ekraar (Red Ransom) is another classy individual who has experienced defeat at the hands of Distant Music. He chased that rival home when fourth in the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster Sept. 10, but had previously broken the track record when winning the G3 Vintage S. at Goodwood July 29. Scarteen Fox (Ire) (Foxhound) is one of the good juveniles from the David Elsworth stable and was a good style winner of the Listed Somerville Tattersall S. at Newmarket Oct. 1. Lermontov (Alleged), another O'Brien entry, was a brave winner of the G3 Beresford S. at The Curragh Oct. 16 and is an able backup for Zentsov Street. Cornelius (GB) (Barathea {Ire}) is an interesting runner in an event that is traditionally a keenly contested affair. He has not been seen since finishing a running-on third in the G3 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot June 15.

Umistim was fifth to Sir Ninja last time out in a conditions event at Ascot Oct. 9, but reversed the form of that race in no uncertain manner to record his first group win. He raced prominently in second as Zyz made the running with the slow-starting Sun Charm (Gone West) soon close up in third. As the field swung wide into the straight in search of better ground, Zyz still held sway, but the challengers were beginning to line up behind him. Umistim was fourth on the rail, with Zoning (GB) (Warning {GB}) and favorite Cape Town making their bids on the outside at the quarter-mile marker. Cape Town was slightly hampered going for a split between Zyz and Zoning approaching the final furlong, but Umistim began to find his second wind, grabbing the lead inside the last 100 yards. Cape Town eventually got a clear run and stayed on to take second close to home. The stewards enquired into the events that occurred near the furlong marker, but allowed the result to stand. Winning trainer Richard Hannon joked, "I get 10 percent no matter what the stewards do. The second horse was very unlucky as Zoning just crowded him and he got no sort of a run a furlong out. Umistim is a good horse, as he proved today, but he does need this ground to be at his best. Cape Town will be boxed away now and could be a Guineas horse next season."

Who will run and who will not? According to trainer Dermot Weld, **Make No Mistake** is now 80-percent probable after bruising a foot Monday. **Northern Drake** is doubtful as he also has a hoof injury, while favorite **Redoute's Choice** won't run if there is heavy rain before the race. Nonetheless, **Redoute's Choice** has won four of his last six starts, with three Group 1 wins. He gets in with a feathery 107 pounds and will attempt to become the fifth three-year-old in 30 years to win the Plate. **Tie The Knot** has won seven Group 1 races in a 35-race career, including three this year, but totes 128 pounds. **Sky Heights** was a game winner of the G1 Caulfield Cup Oct. 16, with **Inaflury** third.

JAPAN CUP NOMINEES ANNOUNCED A contingent of 22 North American horses heads the preliminary nomination list for this year's Japan Cup, to be run Nov. 28 at Tokyo Racecourse. A total of 53 overseas horses have been entered, including 13 from France, seven each from Britain and Australia, and one each from Germany, Hong Kong, Italy and New Zealand. The list includes American champion **Buck's Boy** (Bucksplasher); 1999 Grade I winners **Honor Glide** (Honor Grades), **Val's Prince** (Eternal Prince) and **Yagli** (Jade Hunter); European champions **Daylami (Ire)** (Doyoun {Ire}), **Dream Well (Fr)** (Sadler's Wells), **High-Rise (Ire)** (High Estate {Ire}) and **Tiger Hill (Ire)** (Danehill); G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, G1 French Derby and G1 Irish Derby hero **Montjeu (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells); G1 Caulfield Cup victor **Sky Heights (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}); and New Zealand champion **Sunline (NZ)** (Desert Sun {GB}). The selection committee will meet Oct. 27 and selected horses will be announced Oct. 28.

STUD FEES SET FOR COOLMORE STALLIONS

Coolmore has announced its 2000 stallion fees, with **Fasliyev** (Nureyev--Mr. P.'s Princess, by Mr. Prospector) being offered at Ir25,000 guineas. The two-year-old, undefeated in five starts with two Group 1 wins to his credit, was retired after fracturing a pastern in the paddock. Also new to the Coolmore stallion roster is **Second Empire (Ire)** (Fairy King--Welsh Love {Ire}, by Ela-Mana-Mou {Ire}), who will stand for Ir8,000 guineas. The four-year-old, a champion in Ireland at two and three, won four of 11 starts for earnings of \$356,323.

Galvin Drops Suit:

Dr. Michael Galvin has reached a settlement with the New York Racing Association and will drop his lawsuit against the organization. The veterinarian had sued NYRA for barring him from practicing at their tracks for four months during 1998. NYRA has in turn agreed to discontinue its disciplinary proceedings against Galvin, which stem from an incident in which Galvin allegedly administered an illegal medication to a horse on race day Mar. 27, 1998. Terms of the settlement were not revealed.

The sale-topper, at 16,500 guineas was a Bin Ajwaad (Ire)--Dilawara (Ire) half-sister to the useful juvenile Scottish Spice (GB) (Selkirk {USA}), bought by local trainer Brian Rothwell with Oxfordshire-based handler Alan Jarvis the under-bidder. "This could be a very good family in a year's time," said Rothwell. Jack Berry paid 14,000 guineas for Trickledown Stud's Zieten (USA)--Hawksbill Special (Ire) half-sister to G3 Railway S. third Appalachia (Ire) (Imperial Frontier {USA}). She will be trained by the purchaser's son Alan, while Richard Hannon will take charge of the Turtle Island (Ire)--Persian Light (Ire) colt bought by his assistant Sylvester Kirk for 13,000 guineas. Doncaster managing director Henry Beeby emphasized that this level of yearling trade is not buoyant. "Whilst there have been plenty of potential buyers viewing the yearlings this week, it would be true to say that it has been hard work," he said. "There is little doubt that the mass of yearlings on the market this year has allowed buyers to become increasingly selective as the sales season progressed."

This is racing's Ryder Cup and betting interest has already exceeded the levels of previous years. Realistically, however, Europe will do well to avoid a repeat of last year's whitewash at Churchill Downs."
