A DAY IN THE SUN

Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}) delivered a stinging blow to many critics who claimed she would not cope with the pressure-cooker conditions by leading all the way to post a resounding victory in yesterday's G1 BMW Cox Plate at Moonee Valley in Australia. "She really let go when she was asked to go and this is the way we planned it," said co-trainer Steve McKee. The forgotten runner in a pre-race media frenzy, New Zealand's champion took the lead from Redoute's Choice (Aus) (Danehill) very early in the race and coasted to a two-length advantage 800 meters from home. Jockey Greg Childs calmly let her slip four lengths ahead of the 10-horse field at the turn and, although Tie The Knot (Aus) (Nassipour) put in his usual barnstorming finish, the tenacious mare held him off. "The track played into Sunline's hands," said runner-up jockey Shane Dye of a rain-affected surface that seemed to suit leaders. "I needed to grab Sunline's tail to catch her," said Damien Oliver, who rode third-placed Sky Heights (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}). "If you can get the others off the bit and chasing in this race then you have got it won, and that is exactly what she did." Added Childs, "She went and did it in fine style. I felt confident when I had a quick glance at the big screen. As we all know, it can be done--leading from start to finish--as Might And Power (NZ) did it last year. It was up to her to go and run it out strongly and she did." Sunline has now won 14 of 19 outings, including the G1 Doncaster and G1 Flight S., and more than A\$4.5 million in purses. Make No Mistake (Ire) (Darshaan {GB})'s jockey Pat Smullen said the Irish challenger was feeling his sore hoof. "At the 800 meters he was going as good as any of them, but when I asked him to quicken he wasn't willing to stretch out," he said. Redoute's Choice faded to fifth. "He wasn't quite up to the pressure today," said his jockey, Chris Munce. The Cox Plate was the fifth race in the Emirates World Series Racing Championship, which continues with the GI Breeders' Cup Turf and GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Gulfstream Park Nov. 6. O'BRIEN PHILOSOPHY AT WORK

Trainer Aidan O'Brien has been as famous for his multiple entries in Group races for juveniles recently as he is for producing the winners of those races. When it was announced in mid-week that he would be running three from Ballydoyle in yesterday's G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster, it was clear that he has considerable strength-in-depth at home this year. The winner, Aristotle (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), had only won a minor maiden at Galway previous to this, but he had done so by an impressive margin and he was highly regarded coming into this race. As Optimaite (GB) (Komaite) faded after cutting out a strong early pace, it was left to Lermontov (Alleged) to take them along. Then Ekraar (Red Ransom), who had been moving sweetly in behind, took to the front three furlongs out while cruising on the bridle and the race looked won, so easily was he going at that stage. But it was Aristotle who emerged from the chasing pack as the danger inside the last quarter of a mile, lengthening on the outside as Ekraar shortened his stride in the closing stages and forging past to win going away at the line. Lermontov, another of Aidan O'Brien's three runners, eventually got the better of Ekraar for a memorable one-two for his connections. The trainer said, "He's so lazy it's unbelievable. All he does is eat and sleep, but he's a very good horse. He has improved, as he's only had one run.' George Duffield, the winning jockey, was having his first ride for O'Brien, but was in fine form following his success on Alborada (Ire) last weekend in the G1 Champion S. How did he pick up the mount on the Ballydoyle horse? "They phoned me," he said. As for his strategy aboard Aristotle, he added, "Aidan said to be handy, but I was rowing four out. It was a good test of a horse in that ground and staying won the day. He has...guts and wants to win. He's a great walker and a good moving horse." The Racing Post Trophy, over a mile, is often seen as a stepping stone to the G1 Epsom Derby the following year. Aristotle was therefore priced up afterwards at 16-1 for that race. The consistent Princess Pietrina had been on the board in all nine starts this season, but had met defeat at the hooves of U Can Do It in her last two, missing by a nose when second in a Sept. 24 Calder allowance last time out after running third, beaten 1 3/4 lengths by that rival, in an allowance test Aug. 19. Signorina Cattiva hinted on her last two starts that on a soft surface she was a very solid middle-distance campaigner. The filly thrived last time in those conditions at Ascot in the G3 Princess Royal Willmott Dixon S. Oct.9, storming clear of a good field to win by seven lengths. Here, she looked to have a harder task against the top-weight Craigsteel (Suave Dancer), who had looked a likely candidate for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at one point of the season. However, it wasn't Craigsteel who gave her most to do, as he floundered in the loose ground, but Salford Express and the veteran performer Salmon Ladder. The three drew clear in the straight and Signorina Cattiva wore down Salford Express as Salmon Ladder buckled under pressure. The winner was not to be denied her hat-trick--she quickened again at the finish, running on strongly to score again by seven lengths. Trainer John Dunlop said, "She will definitely not stay in training, but we might run her once more in the Premio Roma. In these sort of conditions she is a good filly and she's beautifully bred."

Arctic Owl won the G3 Henry II S. at Sandown at the end of May and has since finished runner-up in three straight Group races, including the G3 Jockey Club Cup at Newmarket on his last start Oct. 2. Amilynx and Northerntown are both proven stayers, too, having finished first and second in the G2 Prix Hubert de Chaudenay here Oct. 2. The latter had previously beaten the former into third when winning the G3 Prix de Lutece over this course Sept. 7. The German filly Win For Us also proved she stays when winning the G2 Deutsches St. Leger at Dortmund Oct. 3.



We'll keep her going as long as she keeps bouncing back so well after each start." The filly could go next in the Nov. 7 Gaily Gaily S. at Gulfstream Park.
