Team Godolphin Targets Cup

Godolphin will have four Breeders' Cup entrants, running **High-Rise (Ire)** (High Estate {Ire}) and **Daylami (Ire)** (Doyoun {Ire}) in the Turf, **Lend A Hand (GB)** (Great Commotion) in the Mile and

G1 Dubai World Cup winner **Almutawakel (GB)** (Machievellian) in the Classic. Both High-Rise and Lend A Hand had "an easy work" yesterday morning at Newmarket and are "on target," according to Godolphin racing manager Simon Crisford, and will ship to Florida Monday to join Daylami and Almutawakel. "A month ago, we had more possibles," Crisford added. "Now we're down to four legitimate contenders." Daylami will also be entered in the Classic, although the Turf is his preferred race. "The tight turns and a really firm track will be a new thing for him," said Crisford. "But he's a handy type of horse and should do well." Frankie Dettori will ride Lend A Hand and Daylami, Jerry Bailey keeps the mount on Almutawakel and John Velazquez is penciled in for High-Rise.

Greenwood Lake Likely to Skip Cup

G1 Champagne winner **Greenwood Lake** (Meadowlake) is unlikely to contest the Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Trainer Nick Zito, who admits he's wary of the fact that no Juvenile winner has gone on to win the Kentucky Derby, said the colt is likely run in the Nov. 27 GII Remsen at Aqueduct instead. Go for Gin, another Zito trainee, and Thunder Gulch both completed the Remsen-Derby double this decade. "I have the utmost respect for the Breeders' Cup and its staff and I think it's the single best day of racing in the country, but you have to admit good things have not happened to horses who have won that race," Zito said. "I've won three Triple Crown races and didn't run any of the three in the Juvenile. It's been a successful pattern and one I'm leaning toward following again." Zito said that Greenwood Lake was pre-entered because "we didn't want to do anything stupid," adding that a final decision would be made in the next few days.

DEHERE SOLD TO JAPAN

Dehere (Deputy Minister--Sister Dot, by Secretariat) has been sold for an undisclosed sum by Coolmore Stud to the JBBA Stallion Station and is currently in quarantine in Australia before going to Japan. Coolmore Stud spokesman James Bester told *The Australian* newspaper the offer was "too attractive to refuse" and added "he was wanted there as quickly as possible. He had his final cover on Thursday and went immediately into quarantine. We are contacting clients with mares booked for late season service to Dehere to be accommodated by a choice of our other stallions." Dehere first shuttled to Australia in 1995, standing at Aus\$25,000, his fee this season. The Eclipse champion two-year-old of 1993, Dehere has sired graded stakes winner Millions and stakes winner Arrested Dreams.

MELBOURNE CUP FAVORITE OUT

Melbourne Cup favorite **Kayf Tara (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) will likely miss Tuesday's Aus\$3 million race after suffering a suspensory ligament during training at Sandown Racecourse. Godolphin will fly its own veterinarian to Australia to assess the injury Wednesday, although the dual Irish St. Leger winner has been attended to by local veterinarians. Stable representative Brad Marzato said Kayf Tara's injury was noticed late Monday and it appeared worse following a trot and canter Tuesday. "We noticed inflammation and we want to assess the extent of that," said Marzato. Bookmakers have suspended betting on Victoria Derby--Melbourne Cup doubles and admit they're poised for a bonanza if Kayf Tara is withdrawn as the international raider has been heavily backed in Cups doubles with Caulfield Cup winner Sky Heights (NZ). Bookmaker Michael Eskander said he would lose more than Aus\$500,000 if Kayf Tara won the Melbourne Cup. Also out of the Cup is **Ruy Lopez (NZ)** (Oregon). Trainer Bart Cummings declined to elaborate on the nature of his charge's injury or whether the horse would race again this spring. Cummings will still be represented in his bid to win an 11th Melbourne Cup by **Zazabelle (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}).

On the Breeders' Cup Work Tab

Shug McGaughey sent out two of his three Breeders' Cup hopefuls to work yesterday at Gulfstream. **Furlough** (Easy Goer) went four furlongs in :47 2/5, according to McGaughey. The filly will take on the boys in the Sprint. Stablemate **Divide and Conquer** (Danzig) worked four furlongs in :48 2/5 and is aiming for the Mile. McGaughey's Juvenile Fillies hopeful **Finder's Fee** (Storm Cat) will work this weekend.

From the Bob Baffert barn: Sprint hopeful **Forestry** (Storm Cat) went five furlongs in :58 4/5...Juvenile contender **Forest Camp** (Deputy Minister) worked seven furlongs in 1:24 4/5 and galloped out a mile in 1:38...**Chilukki** (Cherokee Run), aiming for the Juvenile Fillies, went seven furlongs in 1:24 4/5...**Captain Steve** (Fly So Free) went seven furlongs in 1:24 4/5 and is expected to start in the Juvenile. "All these horses got a good work today," said Baffert. "This was their strong work. All these will have another work, but Forestry will not."

At Belmont Park yesterday, Baffert's **River Keen (Ire)** (Keen {GB}) went six furlongs in 1:12. As for the quarter crack that could derail River Keen's Classic hopes, Baffert said, "We are keeping our fingers crossed. Toes crossed. Anything else that we can cross. We'll probably ship him down here (Florida) next Tuesday after we work him again Monday."

Also aiming for the Classic, GI Belmont S. winner **Lemon Drop Kid** (Kingmambo) went five furlongs in :59 at Gulfstream yesterday. "It was an excellent work and I'm very pleased with it," said trainer Scotty Schulhofer. "He's really doing great now and he certainly loves this track."

Artax (Marquetry) (Sprint) went five furlongs over the Belmont training track in :59.51.

At Payson Park yesterday, GI Super Derby winner **Ecton Park** (Forty Niner) went six furlongs in 1:17 3/5.

Corstens Suspended:

Trainer Leon Corstens, who trained **Laebeel (NZ)** (**Zabeel {NZ}**) until he was suspended 10 days before the mare's runner-up finish in the G1 Caulfield Cup, is the latest casualty of the trenbolone steroid implant scandal. He was suspended by Victoria stewards for a total of nine months yesterday and will likely confront stewards again on a conduct charge after storming out of the inquiry. However, Corstens has received the lightest penalty to date among those ousted over the steroid scandal as stewards ruled he should serve the previous, unrelated suspension concurrently. He was found guilty on three charges but could return as early as February next year.

Australian Breeder Kelso Dead:

Prominent Australian breeder John Kelso died of an apparent heart attack at Scone in the NSW Hunter Valley on Oct. 24. He was 70. Kelso's death comes just weeks after the death of his father Jack Kelso at Scone. The elder Kelso was 96. The son played a major role in the development of Australian racing and breeding over the past 30 years and held many positions on industry bodies and local associations. He founded the Thoroughbred International Stud, which is now Emirates Park, as well as a breeding and training center on the property that is now Arrowfield Stud.

An Addition to the Family:

Just hours before **Sunline (NZ)** (**Desert Sun {GB}**) claimed the G1 Cox Plate, her dam **Songline** foaled a bay colt by **Octagonal (NZ)** at Inverness Stud in the NSW southern highlands. Sydney surgeon Jack Woolridge bought **Songline** three years ago for NZ\$25,000.

Dancing Show Dead:

Dancing Show (Nijinsky II) died at Coolmore Australia Stud in the NSW Hunter Valley on Friday. Her Danehill filly has a foster mother. **Dancing Show** was among Australasia's most significant broodmares as the dam of Group 1 winners **Umatilla (NZ)** (**Miswaki**) and **Hurricane Sky (Aus)** (**Star Watch {Aus}**). **Dancing Show** also foaled **Shantha's Choice (Aus)** (**Canny Lad {Aus}**), the dam of dual Group 1 winning colt **Redoute's Choice (Aus)** and was the dam of the Inglis Easter saletopper, a Aus\$1.2 million **Thunder Gulch** filly now named **Makarova (Aus)**. She also has a Woodman yearling filly. **Umatilla** is the sire of last Thursday's G2 **Moonee Valley Gold Cup** winner **Streak (Aus)**.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

It has been almost a quarter of a century since Flirting Around gave one of the most memorable displays of sprinting in our experience to capture the G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot. That performance earned the French-trained Flirting Around honors as England's champion older horse, but since he was by Round Table, a rather disappointing sire of sires, Flirting Around had to go to South Africa to find a place at stud. There, Flirting Around (who is incidentally a half brother to Silver Saber, the broodmare sire of champion sprinter and leading freshman sire Cherokee Run), met with only modest success. He did, however, sire one really good horse in the shape of Wolf Power, a champion in South Africa at two and four, and Horse of the Year in that country at five.

In 1984 Wolf Power, following in the footsteps of his countryman Hawaii, travelled to the U.S. to begin his stud career at Gainesway for the 1985 breeding season. Wolf Power never enjoyed the luxury of receiving fashionable mates and his distaff pedigree, containing mostly European names, was doubtless a mystery to most North American breeders. Nonetheless, Wolf Power has been far from a failure and to date has sired at least 34 stakes winners from 12 crops, among them graded stakes winners Freedom Cry, Ask Anita, Wolf Brigade, Magnate and Lupine Lady. And this year he has a pair of particularly talented juvenile fillies in Miss Wineshine and Wolf Alert, winner of the GIII Miss Grillo S. on Sunday at Belmont Park.

As we said, Wolf Power's distaff pedigree is a mostly European one and an outcross to many North American pedigrees, but in the case of Wolf Alert we do find some interesting duplications. Wolf Alert's dam, the black-type placed Nancy's Place, is a daughter of Mr. Leader and is inbred 4x4 to Marcel Boussac's great runner and sire Djebel. In both cases the sources of Djebel are combined with another important Boussac horse Asterus. The horses in question are Mr. Leader's sire Djeddah (by Djebel out of an Asterus mare), and Djenne, dam of Nancy's Place's broodmare sire Olden Times, who is by Djebel out of a mare by Asterus's son Jock II. So in the third generation of her pedigree Nancy's Place has the closely related Djeddah and Djenne (both Djebel/Asterus crosses).

A look at Wolf Power's pedigree reveals that his third dam Alarmist is by Djask, a full brother to Djebel. What's more, Alarmist is out of a mare by Asbestos II, a son of Asterus, so Alarmist is bred on a very similar cross to Djeddah and Djenne. Alarmist was only a minor winner in South Africa, but she was a sister to the extremely talented Djerrid; Djeddah won numerous major races including the Champion S.; and Eclipse S. and Djenne never ran, but produced Olden Times and multiple stakes winner Prove It Girl, so this focusing of genetic relatives--Alarmist, Djeddah and Djenne--in the fourth generation of Wolf Alert's pedigree is through some fairly proven sources.

Wolf Power was imported in an era which believed in the power of the "international outcross" so it is ironic to note that he has done some of his best work when given mares which create inbreeding and linebreeding to genetic relatives. In addition to Wolf Alert, who we have covered above, we can also note that Miss Wineshine's pedigree has the brothers Johns Joy and The Doge, as well as the very closely related Abernant and Tudor Minstrel. Oddly enough, Miss Wineshine's brother Delta Wolf is Wolf Power's third leading earner, and his highest earner Northern Wolf has Johns Joy 4x4. Just to complete the story, Wolf Power's only Grade I winner, the filly Freedom Cry, has the sisters Saracen Miss and Saracen Flirt 4x4.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

Kachemak Bay (c, 2, Island Whirl--Snow Colony, by Pleasant Colony), winner of the Gill Pilgrim S., is another horse with linebreeding to genetic relatives from the Boudoir II family. His sire is out of a mare by Your Alibhai, and his dam is by a son of His Majesty, who is out of Your Alibhai's three-parts sister, Flower Bowl.

Yaletown (g, 3, Chief Honcho--Golden Madam, by Shelter Half), winner of the Autumn Leaves S. on Monday, has a fascinating pedigree. His sire is by Chief's Crown (by a son of Northern Dancer out of a Secretariat mare) and his granddam is by Medaille d'Or (by Secretariat out of a Northern Dancer mare). In addition to having Secretariat 4x4, Yaletown also has Secretariat's half brother Sir Gaylord in the fourth generation.

Maddie May (f, 2, Not For Love--Lady By Design, by Fast Play), who became the first stakes winner to represent her freshman sire when taking the Maid of the Mist S. at Belmont Park, has a pedigree which is practically saturated with La Troienne. To start with, she has Buckpasser (a great-grandson of La Troienne) 4x4x4. Then she has Glamour (out of Striking) 5x6, and finally there is a more distant strain of Busher, a full sister to Striking and three-quarters sister to Busanda (dam of Buckpasser).

Entrepreneur (c, 2, Cure the Blues--Iniki, by Miswaki), winner of the Sleepy Hollow S. at Belmont Park, is another example of using Cure the Blues to combine Speedwell (the granddam of Cure the Blues) and her three-quarters brother Secretariat (sire of Entrepreneur's second dam). Other examples include graded stakes winners Rock and Roll and Golden Missile, multiple stakes winner Captain Starbuck, and Case Of The Blues, a first stakes winner for 1999 freshman sire, In Case.

The pattern of duplicating Lalun through her sons Never Bend and Bold Reason seems to be well on to its way to earning its own column. **Aristotle (c, 2, Sadler's Wells--Flamenco Wave, by Desert Wine)**, winner of the G1 Racing Post Trophy has it in a slightly unusual pattern as along with Bold Reason through Sadler's Wells, he has Never Bend as the broodmare sire of Desert Wine. Second black-type scorer for Sadler's Wells with the pattern was **Peach Out Of Reach (f, 3, Sadler's Wells--Cocotte, by**

Troy), winner of the Ballyroan S. at Leopardstown, who has a second dam by Mill Reef and so has Lalun 4x5. Meanwhile, the Radley S. at Newbury was captured by **Corinium (f, 2, Turtle Island--Searching For A Star, by Rainbow Quest)**. Turtle Island is a son of Sadler's Wells' full brother Fairy King, and Corinium's dam is out of a Mill Reef mare. We believe that Corinium is the second stakes winner to emerge from two crops sired by Turtle Island, the other being the 2000 Guineas hero Island Sands, who also has Never Bend in his dam. A reverse version of the cross, Never Bend over Sadler's Wells, struck when **Dedi Boy (c, 2, Slip Anchor--Satin Pointe, by Sadler's Wells)** won the Premio Campobello in Rome on Sunday. Slip Anchor is a son of the Mill Reef stallion, Shirley Heights.

Winner of the Sunny Slope S. at Santa Anita on Friday was **Joopy Doopy (c, 2, Gilded Time--Joop, by Zilzal)**. He has Gilded Time's broodmare sire What A Pleasure and his three-quarters brother Bold Lad 3x5 in his pedigree.

AGA KHAN COLT TOPS TATTERSALLS DAY

TWO HIRAPOUR (Ire) (Kahyasi {Ire}), a lightly raced three-year-old colt owned by the Aga Khan and trained by John Oxx in Ireland, made top price of 150,000 guineas on the second day of the Tattersalls Autumn Horses in Training Sale in Newmarket yesterday. Sally Carey outbid another agent, Peter Doyle, with former trainer Simon Christian also in the running for a long time. Hirapour, a 13-furlong Fairyhouse maiden winner in August and second in a similar Leopardstown race over a mile and a quarter on his only other run, is likely to race over hurdles but a decision has yet to be taken about a trainer. Four-year-old **Brave Reward (USA)** (Lear Fan {USA}), trained by Sir Michael Stoute, went for 125,000 guineas to agent Charlie Gordon-Watson on behalf of Saudi Arabian clients after winning two of his 12 starts. Buyers from around the world were in action yesterday. G2 Royal Lodge S. winner **Mutaahab (Can)** (Dixieland Band {USA}) was another who excited plenty of attention. Patrick Cooper of the British Bloodstock Agency (Ireland) was successful at 115,000 guineas and the three-year-old will be joining trainer Patrick Shaw in South Africa. **The Fly (GB)** (Pharly {Fr}), fifth in the Derby and third in St Leger in 1997, was one of those destined to continue his career in America. Bought for 70,000 guineas by agent Bill O'Gorman, the five-year-old will race for Californian trainer Darrell Vienna. The same combination went to 105,000 guineas for the four-year-old **Secret Saver (USA)** (Green Dancer {USA}). Californian-based Rainbow Ridge Ranch will gain dual winner **Flaming Quest (GB)** (Rainbow Quest {USA}) who was bought for 85,000 guineas while Roger Attfield, five-times champion trainer in Canada, secured the two-year-old **Muntej (GB)** (Muhtarram {USA}) for 65,000 guineas via agent Luke Lillingston. Attfield said, "This is my first visit to Tattersalls and I really came to a buy a filly. I was underbidder on another lot, but I couldn't really go home empty-handed. This colt just needs time to grow a bit." The aggregate and average continued to rise for a second consecutive day. Overall gross receipts are ahead by 29.5 percent versus 1998, while the average through two days is up an impressive 27 percent. Another marathon session starts at 9:15 a.m. today. (*Statistics p2*)

BOOKMAKERS NOT READY TO INCREASE OFFER

Warwick Bartlett, chairman of the bookmakers committee, yesterday suggested that the bookmakers are not yet prepared to increase their levy offer, worth around £5 million (9.5 percent). The Levy Board meets again today to see if a levy settlement can be sorted out, with the deadline on Sunday. Bartlett said, "It was a generous offer, six times above the rate of inflation and I've no instructions to improve on it. There has been much talk of bookmakers' so-called profits but there is a cloud over our industry in the form of off-shore and Internet betting. The challenge is for the government to keep money in the UK by lowering betting taxes. I say we should join together to reduce tax and make the UK the world's betting hub."
